We, the undersigned Board, beg leave to submit the following report: We have employed Prof. A. R. Flowers, of the Western Free Will Baptist Conference, as principal of the literary and graded departments of Beulah High School for the present year, and Prof. Julius Dudley, of the Musical Department. We recommend these teachers to all interested in an educational qualification, either literary or musical. We do especially urge our people to patronize said school, and to give it their strength and support, as the faculty takes the school on its merits. We are glad to say, the school is doing fairly well, but we are in need of more patronage.

We, seeing the need of some improvements on the building, have advertised and sold to the highest bidder six one-half acre lots at a purchase price of \$12.50 each, and have applied the money, or as much as it required, to underpin said building. The balance has been placed in the hands of the Treasurer for the purpose of painting the school building, so far as it will carry forth the work.

We ask this body to make such appropriations to the Board of Directors

as will complete said paint bill and to finish the interior of said school

building

We do further, though with regret, have to inform this body that the entire amount of shortage to Prof. J. E. B. Davis has not yet been paid in full. We ask this body to take some steps to raise the remainder of said shortage.
