a home for fallen girls, report as follows:

Whereas, the present Seaside Home, of Wilmington, being principally supported by the people of the Free Will Baptist Church, under the supervision of Sister Louzetta McLaughlin as matron, having done a good work, the fruits thereof being felt among us, yet the expense of caring for this home is in its present condition too great and at the same time the capacity too small. Therefore, be it

Resolved 1. That this body make an effort to purchase a suitable and convenient Home and at such place where it could be operated with the

least possible expense.

Resolved 2, That the Moderator appoint a soliciting committee to secure stock to purchase a home by individual subscriptions, shares to be \$10.00 and upwards.

Resolved 3, That said Home be run on non-sectarian principles.

Resolved 4, That said rescue home be operated under the fourfold gospel as taught by the Bible.

Resolved 5, That there be a Board of Trustees consisting of six in number, appointed to hold said property, and that we appoint three and that we give the Holiness Church of North Carolina the privilege to appoint the other three.

Resolved 6. That the money now on hand from the sale of the Beulah School property, less the indebtedness, be used as stock in said Home.

Resolved 7, That this body appoint an assistant matron to assist Sister McLaughlin in her work. Respectfully submitted.

#### OBITUARY OF ELDER W. H. AVERY.

Elder W. H. Avery died June 16, 1907. He was one of God's faithful ones. He united with the Free Will Baptist Church at Johnston Union in 1886, A. D. From this time he lived as near his Christian duty no doubt, as he knew how. He was indeed faithful to God. About ten years ago God called him to preach the gospel. He was ordained and set apart to the full work in 1900, and served faithfully until death. He was a great sufferer of that dreaded disease consumption.

We have good reason to believe that Bro. Avery died the death of the righteous and has gone to receive a righteous man's reward. In his death his family has sustained a loss that can not be filled, our Conference has lost a faithful preacher and the country a noble citizen. Yet we weep not as those who have no hope, for we believe that Jesus died and rose again and when He comes back again in His Father's glory He will bring our brother with Him.

We extend our sympathy to the bereaved family praying God's blessings upon them. We feel safe in saying that Bro. Avery is sweetly resting in Heaven. Why should we mourn? He cannot return to us but we can go to him.

#### OBITUARY OF ELDER H. M. DUDLEY.

Elder H. M. Dudley died August 30, 1907. He joined the Free Will Baptist Church at Roberts' Grove, in 1885, A. D. He was a very devoted man to religious worship. He never had the advantage of an education, scarcely knew his letters ten years before his death. Soon after his conversion which indeed was genuine, the Lord called him to preach the gospel but like Moses, deeply felt that he was not eloquent and slow of speech, and so illiterate till he like Jonah tried to get away from God and this Divine call. Yet God kept calling him till he surrendered all and stepped out on the promises of God. He trusted Him to give him power and words to speak. Bro. Dudley being unable to read the Bible, a most remarkable feature is that in his effort to study God's word the Lord most wonderfully bestowed a gift to read, and especially to quote the scriptures.

Bro. Dudley was most wonderfully used of God. He was a very successful man in his ministry. He lived his religion true to his church and calling as a servant of God. He was a poor man but he provided well for his household. In his death the Conference has lost a faithful servant, the family a devoted Christian father and the community a good citizen. We believe our loss to be his eternal gain. We extend our sympathy to the bereaved family, and may the blessings of God ever rest upon them.

# PASTOR'S REPORT FOR 1907
