OBITUARY OF ELDER J. M. LANGDON.

We, the Committee on Obituaries ask to submit the following:

With sad hearts we announce that death has visited us since last Conference and taken from our midst, Elder James Merritt Langdon. Brother Langdon died or fell asleep in Jesus October, 1910, born February, 1863.

Age at death 47 years and 8 months.

He gave his heart and life to the Savior at a very early age. He first joined the Christian Church and remained there for some time, but afterward, being fully convinced that the doctrine of the Free Will Baptist church was more in harmony with the teaching of the word of God, he connected himself with it. In living the Christian life he was conscious of the need of a deeper work of grace in his heart. Receiving the light of sanctification about twelve years ago he consecrated himself and his all to God, and was instantaneously delivered from inbred sin and sanctified wholly according to 1st Thes. 5:23; John 17:17.

After he received this blessed experience the burden of lost souls was heavy upon him, and being conscious of the divine call to preach the gospel, he applied to his church for license on Saturday before the second Sunday in June, 1900. He was ordained and set apart to the full work of the min-

istry in 1901.

He was called to the pastoral care of several churches and served them all faithfully. He preached the fourfold gospel and earnestly contended for it. Took Jesus by faith as his healer, and fully trusted God for his body as well as his soul.

Not having the light of Pentecostal baptism, and the visitation of the spirit, and power of God being so fully manifest in his life at times, he, as many others was persuaded that he had the baptism of the Holy Ghost,

as they received it on the day of Pentecost.

But during that memorable meeting at Dunn, N. C., which was held during the winter of 1906 and 1907, when the latter rain began to be poured out in this country, and the saints who had come together from the different parts of the United States to tarry for the promise of the Father, received the baptism of the Holy Ghost, and began to speak in other tongues as the spirit gave them utterance, according to Acts 2:4; 10:46; 19:6.

He was there convinced that he had not received the Pentecostal Baptism, and at once became an earnest seeker and was filled with the Holy Ghost

sometime dyring the year of 1907, and spoke in other tongues.

Brother Langdon enjoyed the indwelling comforter, and earnestly con-

tended for the doctrine till death.

In his death, the Conference sustains a loss but we feel assured that our loss is his eternal gain.

We do not mourn for him as one that we have no hope for, for we believe that he has fallen asleep in Jesus, and that He will bring him with Him when He comes.
