Whereas, on January 12th, 1912, there was a special session of the Cape Fear Free Will Baptist Conference, at Shady Grove Church in Sampson County, at which a permanent organization was perfected with E. R. Wilson as Moderator and W. A. Jackson as Secretary.

And whereas, at said Conference a resolution was adopted calling for an Annual Conference at Bethel Church in Johnston County, about three miles south-east of Four Oaks, on the A. C. L. R. R., to be held on Thursday before the First Monday in October, it being the third day of October, 1912, now:
