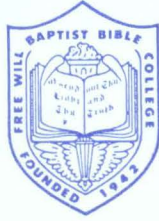

OBITUARY OF ELD. J. F. HILL.

Eld. J. F. Hill, of Wayne County, was born in 1847, died Dec. 8, 1918. Eld. Hill was a man of unusual ability. He was very prominent in his county. He was a man that provided well for his household. He tried to make those that resided with him enjoy the natural blessing of life, and especially did he teach them to enjoy the spiritual blessing that God would bestow upon them. He connected himself with the Free Will Baptist church at a very early age, and lived a faithful member until death. The writer was at his bedside just three days before his death. He realized that the end was near at hand, yet with calmness he expressed his readiness to meet the Master, that he had labored for so long.
