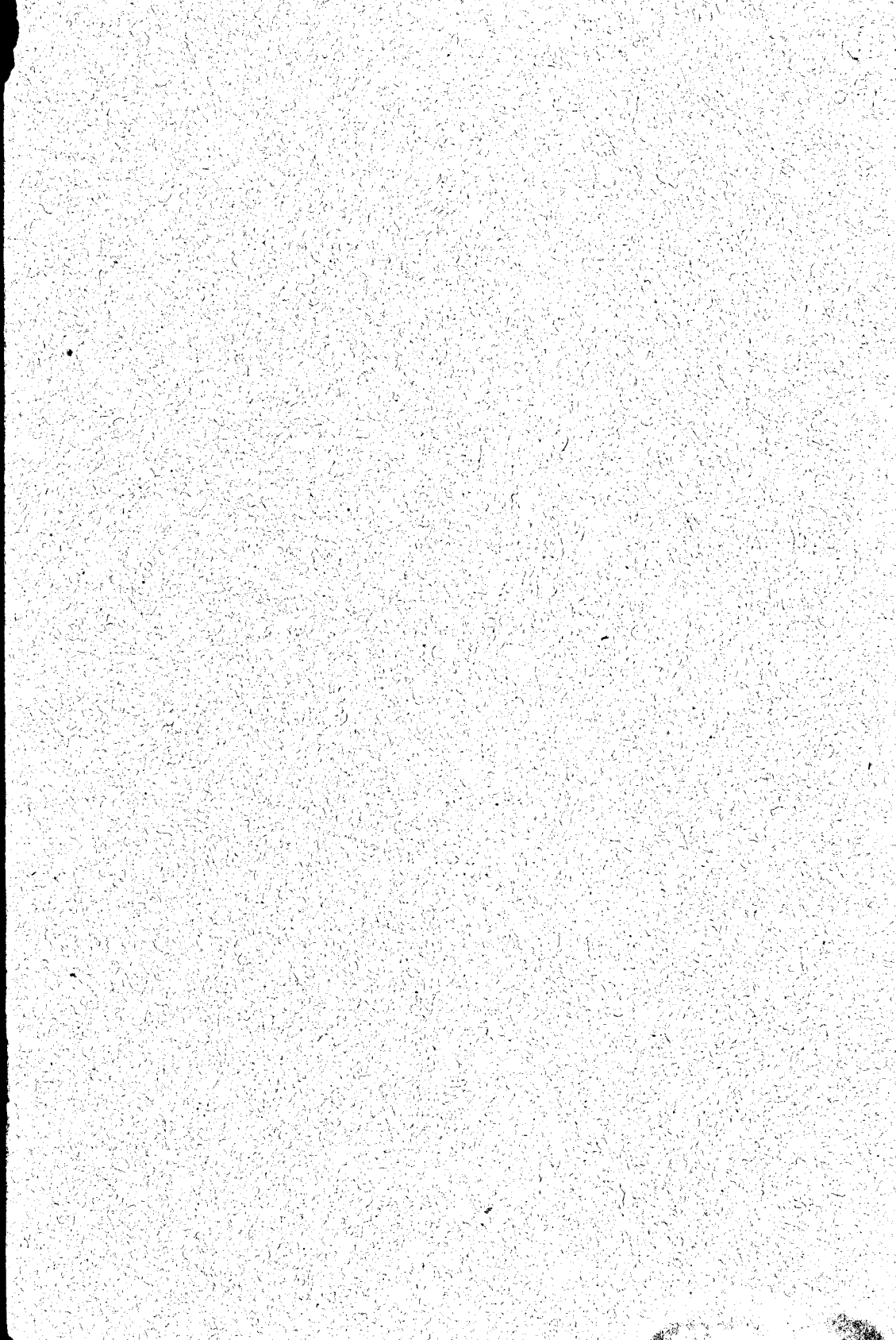

OBITUARY OF ELDER J. S. ELLIS
