FREE WILL BAPTIST LEAGUE CAMPAIGN FOR NORTH CAROLINA YOUNG PEOPLE

The North Carolina State Convention in session at Pine Level, N. C., September 16 adopted the following resolution relative to our Organized Young People's Work:

RESOLUTIONS

Whereas, we believe that one of the keys to the future success of our churches is to be found in organized young people's work, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED,

I That we endorse the efforts of the General Conference Director of F.W.B.L. Work to provide a quarterly for use of local leagues, and that we pledge the support of this Convention to this effort.

II That we launch in this state a Special Campaign in the interest of F.W.B.L. Work to begin on November 1st, 1926 and continue for one year, and to have the following goals:

1. The organization of at least fifty new leagues in the State.

2. The making of at least twenty-five per cent of our leagues standard F.W.B.L's measured by a standard to be approved by the General Conference Director of F.W.B.L. work.

3. The raising of at least \$200.00 by special drives during the year to be used for the promotion of F.W.B.L. work in this state in ways approved by the Executive Board of this Convention, provided however, that 25 per cent of this special fund shall be given

to the General Conference work, and that actual expenses are to be paid out of the fund.

4. The preparation of a normal course in F.W.B.L. training for use in Y. P.'s Institutes and given by correspondence.

5. The enrollment of at least 100 leagues for the normal course.

6. The conducting of a Y. P. Rally in every Union Meeting District in the State for the purpose of increasing general interest in the F.W.B.L. work.

7. The emphasizing of Stewardship among the Y.P. of our church.

III That in order to reach these goals we elect a Director who will have general direction of the campaign, said director will receive all moneys raised in special drives and by donations in his campaign, and dispose of same as instructed by the executive Board and as provided for in this resolution.

EDUCATIONAL RESOLUTION

INTRODUCTION—Seeing the need of a broader and deeper intelligence of the fundamentals of the Christian religion and doctrine of the church of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the need of more unified knowledge among our people of the same,

BE IT RESOLVED:

I. That we endorse the Summer School at Ayden, and encourage the same by our co-operation.

II. We recommend for our young ministers who are not in position to attend school at Ayden, the reading course previously prescribed by this conference, the same to be in keeping with the college course by the use of the same subjects.

III. We recommend that the Free Will Baptist church organ be

subscribed for in every home, and that our ministers keep the people reminded of this duty.

IV. That we go on record and continue to keep before our people and the public our disapproval and condemnation of the teaching of any theory in our public and private schools that links man with the lower animal creation, or denies the inspired Word of God, and that we aid the Anti-Evolution League in petitioning the legislature of N. C. to prohibit such theories from being taught in our public schools.

V. That we encourage and insist on our young ministers attending school at Ayden, and that we as a church patronize the school by sending our own children when possible to the same. Furthermore that we seek to endow as well as maintain the College, so that we may have an "A-ONE" institution.

VI. Last, but not least, we urge that every home that has no family altar begin at once to teach in the home those things of our Lord, thus, reading the Bible, praying with and encouraging our children to live for God, thus educating them "in the nurture and admonition of our Lord" instead of Jazz and the pleasures of ungodliness.
