

RESOLUTION PRESENTED BY W. C. WILLIS, R. E. THOMAS AND BEN CASEY, JR.

Whereas, the Cape Fear Union Meeting preferred charges for misappropriation of funds and insubordination against B. P. Parks; and whereas he was present at the time said charges were made, knowing that said charges would be brought before this Conference; and whereas he fails to present himself for a hearing or any defence against said charges, but instead sends a written statement that, "I am hereby resigning every office to which I have been elected by said Conference;" and whereas he has shown an unChristian and unbrotherly spirit by connecting himself with a church of another Conference, without a letter from his church, and brandsthe church from which he has withdrawn as an "Ananias and Sapphira Club," and under "Satanic influence."

Therefore, Be it Resolved, 1. That said B. P. Parks be and is hereby excommunicated from this Conference, and that his credentials be demanded by the clerk of this Conference.

2. That this resolution be published in the Baptist paper at once; and should he refuse to surrender his credentials, this fact also be immediately published in the church paper.

RESOLUTION REGARDING CERTAIN FUNDS.

Whereas B. P. Parks was made a special treasurer of a certain fund raised by the Cape Fear Original Free Will Baptist Conference in the year 1923 and 1924 for the purpose of erecting a boys' dormitory at the Orphanage, and more than \$2000.00 was placed in his hands; and whereas at the annual Conference in 1925 this fund was ordered paid to the Treasurer of the Orphanage Board, to be used by said Board in such a way as it should think best, provided that he be allowed to pay back to the donors at their request the amount of their individual donation.

Whereas, at the Conference in 1926 he made a report stating that he had paid back to the donors and to the Orphanage Board all of said funds, but since said report was made it has come to our knowledge that this report is untrue, as there are several churches and individual donors that have not received any part of the amount paid, far in excess of the amount paid to the Orphanage Treasurer.

Therefore, Be it Resolved, 1. Tht B. P. Parks, treasurer of the special fund, be and is hereby required to file with the Executive Committee of this Conference a report showing the total amount received and how said amount has been disbursed.

- 2. The Executive Committee is hereby directed and required to make such investigation and take such evidence as it may think wise and proper in order that a fair and just settlement may be made.
- 3. The Executive Committee is hereby empowered to take such action as may be necessary to collect any balance that they shall find unpaid.
