

Report of Temperance Committee

We, the Temperance committee, offer the following resolutions:

First.—That we ask our churches, Sunday schools, and other church auxiliaries, not to have their picnics or social gatherings at bathing beaches, swimming pools, or any other place of worldly amusements or haunts of sin.

Second.—That we ask our people not to desecrate Sunday by loafing at filling stations or other places with the ungodly, or by buying Sunday newspapers, gas, oil, bottle drinks, tobacco, etc.

Third.—That we advise our people that it is a violation of our church covenant, and the constitution of the United States to buy, sell, or use intoxicating liquors as a beverage, and that we ask all to support dry candidates in local and national elections.

Report of Committee on Education

Realizing that the greatest need of our church, especially our ministry, is Christian education; and that such education cannot be obtained through our state educational system; and seeing that our only hope, as a denomination, lies in an educational institution owned and controlled by Free Will Baptist who have not been corrupted by Modernism, therefore, be it resolved:—

First.—That we adopt all recent plans, resolutions, or actions of the State Convention, in regular annual session or special executive session concerning Eureka College as a Bible school, and our brethren who are financially burdened or incumbered with its present indebtedness.

Second.—That we recommend and encourage the circulation and study of the book, "Stewardship and Missions," which is sold by the Free Will Baptist Press at thirty-five cents per single copy.

Third.—That we advise our churches, Sunday schools, and Young People's Leagues that the best safeguard against Modernism and "science falsely so called" is a faithful study of God's Word (2 Tim. 2:15) and the use of our own literature published by the Free Will Baptist Press at Ayden, N. C.

Fourth.—That we indorse the Bible Correspondence School of the Moody Bible Institute, 153 Institute Place, Chicago, Ill., and encourage our ministers to enroll in such courses as they think would be most profitable to them.

- (1) Six prs. of overalls, six work shirts, six pr. shoes, and six suits of underwear.
 - (2) Ten bu. corn, ten bu. sweet potatoes, and ten, bu.of Irish potatoes.
 - (3) Any amount of canned fruit of any kind.

Second.—That all our Sunday schools send one of their weekly offerings each month to the Orphanage.

Third.—That each church adopt a child for clothing.

Fourth.—That each church hold a Thanksgiving Service and ask for a liberal offering from the congregation, besides the regular donation of at least a day's wage or its equivalent by each member of the church.

Fifth.—That this conference authorize the Orphanage Committee to investigate the activities of all preachers, Sunday schools and churches in regard to the Orphanage, and report to the conference at the next annual session.
