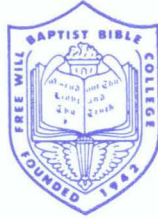

## RESOLUTIONS

Resolution by C. H. Coats:—Realizing that we have some retired ministers in our Conference that need help, be it therefore resolved:

1. That each church raise one dollar per month for retired or needy ministers.

2. That the pastors of the various churches put the matter before the church and urge that the amount be raised.

Resolution by L. K. Stallings:—Resolved that the church letters be handed to the clerk on first roll call, together with their contributions, in order to save time of an extra roll call.

Resolution by W. H. Lancaster:—Resolved that the Moderator of this Conference, as he is elected from time to time, be and is hereby made ex-officio chairman of the Executive Board.

Resolution by M. L. Johnson:—1. Resolved that the Cape Fear Confer-

ence elect from its laymen a committee of five, who shall act as a pastoral Service Board, whose duty it shall be to recommend pastors to the various churches.

2. They shall meet annually on the 2nd Saturday in June, at some place to be designated by the Board.

3. Each Church shall be required to furnish the following information:

(a) Present pastor. (b) Number of years served. (c) Number of members belonging to church. (d) Condition of church. (e) Location of church. (f) Salary paid for the past two years.

4. The Board after considering the reports shall recommend to each church a pastor.

After being discussed briefly the resolution was tabled till the 1st day of the next session of the Annual Conference, and after again being considered by the body, if it shall be thought feasible, then, such steps as will be necessary to make it effective will be sought, otherwise it remains null and void.

## REPORTS

Temperance:—We, your committee on Temperance, beg leave to report as follows: We recommend that this Conference go on record as being opposed to the repeal of the 18th amendment, and urge our people to vote accordingly. We also recommend and endorse the action taken by the State Convention at its last session, and urge that our members adhere to the obligation they have taken in accepting the Church Covenant, relative to the sale and use of intoxicating drink.

Obituaries:—We your committee on obituaries, report as follows: Since our last Annual Session of Conference, God in His wisdom has seen fit to call from us our much beloved brother, Eld. J. R. Wallace.

Eld. Wallace was born July 11th, 1870. He united with the Free Will Baptist Church at an early age. To his church he was ever true and loyal. In the bloom of his life, God called him to the ministry. Eld. Wallace answered the call by saying, Here am I, make me what Thou would have me be. In the year 1910, he was ordained, and sent forth to the full work of the ministry, and at the Annual Session held with the Church at St. Paul, Sampson County in 1910, he joined the Conference as an ordained minister. # REPORT OF S. S. CONVENTION 1933
