

Orphanage Committee-We your Orphanage Board, realizing very keenly the need of our Orphanage, beg leave to report as follows: 1—The buildings need repair. 2-New buildings are needed. 3-The lawn needs im-4-The drive-way needs to be improved. 5-The farm and orchard needs better attention in order that more food and feed may be produced. 6—We need more and better improved live stock, especially better dairy cows. 7-We need better equipped work shops and sewing rooms for the boys and girls. 8-We commend the Board and Superintendent for all they have done especially in their efforts to pay off all debts against the institution. 9-We realize that in order for the above mention needs that are outstanding together, with many others not here mentioned to be met, it will take the full cooperation of all our ministers and laiety, therefore we reccommend. I-That each Church send at once to the Orphanage an amount equal to ten cents per member, in keeping with the request of the Superintendent and Board. 2-We also urge that a liberal free will offering be made on or about Thanksgiving in addition to the 10 cents per capita. 3— We ask that each Church hold a special Thanksgiving service. 4—In addition to your cash offering we recommend that we send a load of food, feed and clothing, or anything that can be used. But we suggest that you be very careful with perishable foods as often it will not keep in a usable condition.

5—We recommend that all our churches take a child to clothe or to help in some way. 6—We also suggest that this conference go on record as approving some kind of a program to be worked out by the Board and Superintendent (after the present indebtedness has been paid) to raise sufficient funds to meet the needs of the institution as quickly as possible. 7—We suggest that the membership of our churches who own property and are in position to do so, when they write their last will and testament remember the orphan boy or girl with a portion of the goods God has blessed them with, either in a gift in fee simple or as an endowment.
