

His subject was "A Changeless Christ in a Changing World." Prayer was offered by Elder Lloyd Vernon. One hour was then given for dinner.

Obituary:

We your committee on Obituaries beg leave to report as follows:

It is with deep sorrow we report the death of Elder D. R. Ennis. Brother Ennis was born in Johnston County, North Carolina, on March 14th, 1871. In 1890 he professed faith in Christ and United with the Baptist Church at Pine Forest in Harnett County where his family had settled. He was first married to Miss Allie M. Byrd on January 4, 1893. To this union was born 7 children, 6 of whom are now living. Sister Ennis died May 8, 1932.

Brother Ennis' second marriage was to Miss Lila Gardener on April 7, His second wife also died April 14, 1937. In the days of his early manhood he surrendered to the Divine call to preach the Gospel. He also took membership with Prospect Free Will Baptist Church, and on March 16, 1910 he was ordained as an orthodox Free Will Baptist minister and uniting with the Cape Fear Conference at its annual session in the fall of 1910. Brother Ennis soon became a very active minister and was one of the outstanding men of our conference.

He faithfully served several churches as pastor and also was very prominent in the Evangelistic field.

Among some of the churches he served as pastor are: Lee's Chapel, Corinth, Robert's Grove. Oak Grove, St. Paul, Prospect and Rock Ridge.

Brother Ennis also organized and helped to organize several churches during his active ministry.

In 1919 he was elected a member of the Ordaining Council which position he held until 1934 at which time he retired from active work on account of his health. He however did not quit altogether but continued to hold services when he was able to do so.

On January the 17, 1939 the Lord called Brother Ennis to his final reward. His funeral was preached by Elder G. C. Joyner, assisted by Elder Henry Melvin. He was buried in the church cemetery at Prospect Church.

In the death of Elder Ennis we feel that we have lost a faithful friend and servant, and a loyal co-worker. We realize that our loss is his eternal gain.

Report of Committee on Resolutions

We your committee on resolutions beg to submit the following resolutions: Resolution No. 1. Subject: Education

Realizing the great need of education and our special need of an educational institution where our ministry can be trained, and where the youth of our church may receive their education in an institution where Christianity may be paramount, be it resolved:

First: That we endorse the action of our National Association in its endeavor to establish such a National Institution.

Second: That we request the Apportionment committee to appropriate something from the proceeds of this Association for our National Educational movement.

Third: That each church of this Association raise their ten cents per capita sometime during the next year and forward same on to J. R. Davidson, Bryan, Texas, on or before June 1, 1940.

Fourth: That our church Auxiliaries be requested to supplement the ten cents per capita, where possible.

Resolution No. 2. Subject: Sunday Schools

Whereas, several of our Sunday schools do not represent in the Annual Convention, be it resolved:

First: That this sort of laxity be corrected where possible, and that each school be requested to send a representative to our annual Convention.

Second: That each minister pastoring churches in this Association be requested to give the matter serious consideration and, if possible, see that the schools of their churches are properly represented in future conventions.

Third: That all ministers of this Association, and those pastoring churches in this Association be requested to attend the next Convention, convening with the church at Shady Grove Second Saturday in October, and give their moral support to the said Convention.

Resolution No. 3. Subject: Home Missions and Church Extension Whereas, there are many places within the district of this Association, where the gospel is needed to be preached, and where churches of our faith should be established, and whereas, we have too long neglected these needy fields, therefore, be it resolved:

First: That there be a joint meeting of the Mission Committee of this Association, and of the Cape Fear Union, at Smithfield F. W. B. Church, Monday, November 20th at 10:00 a. m. for the expressed purpose of surveying the field, and planning and devising ways and means of adequately meeting the needs, as they may find them.

Second: That those having any information of interest in this subject, kindly report the same to some member of the said committee, or that they attend the meeting and report same.

Third: That ministers or laymen interested in this subject be invited to attend the meeting at Smithfield.

Resolution No. 4. Subject: Amusements

Whereas, there seems to be a growing tendency on the part of some ministers of our country and many of our church people, to indulge in too many amusements of a worldly nature, such as professional ball games, the dances, race track, shows, and many other forms of world amusement, which we recognize to be questionable, therefore be it resolved:

First: That we go on record as strongly opposed to such amusement as may be questionable, and that we request our people to refrain from such, and to give themselves more diligently to the things which are of God, and not of the world.

Second: That in the home, the pulpit, and the church schools we teach and admonish the youth of the evilness of questionable amusements, and endeavor to instill into their minds and hearts a regard for the moral laws and the full teachings of the Word of God regarding amusements.

We, your committee on resolutions, recognize the fact that the foregoing resolutions will be valueless unless put into practice, and we recommend, that if adopted, our preachers and delegates endeavor to put them into practice, and that one year hence, we check up to see that they have been put into practice in our churches.
