

After the enrollment a recess of 10 minutes was given.

At 11 o'clock A. M. congregational singing was directed by Elder T. E. Beaman.

Devotional services conducted by Elder H. R. Faircloth.

A special musical selection was sung by Elder G. C. Joyner, Title, "Thats Why I love Him So."

At 11:30 Elder M. L. Johnson, who had been appointed by the program committee to preach the association sermon, proceeded and preached a very interesting sermon. Text Ezekiel 3-15. "I sat where they sat and remained there astonished among them seven days." Subject: "God's Challenge to the Church."

After the sermon a recess of one hour was given for dinner.

#### AFTERNOON

#### First Day

The Association reassembled at 1:30.

Song by congregation.

Devotional services were conducted by Elder Levi Carlysle.

The Moderator at this time recognizes the visitors from other associations and each responded with words of appreciation.

Brother C. K. Dunn of the Free Will Baptist Press gave a very interesting talk in regard to the Printing Press and its work in general. We find that the Press is in good financial condition and is making progress in all phases of its work.

The reports from the various churches are received and read before the body. (See Statistical table).

A petitionary letter is received from West Clinton Free Will Baptist Church, recently organized by Elder R. H. Jackson, asking admittance into this Association, with eleven members and a church building about completed. On motion the church be received and its delegates, Mrs. R. L. Tew and J. L. Tew, be duly seated and the hand of welcome extended them by the Moderator.

Elder J. A. Evans, Superintendent of the Free Will Baptist Orphanage, discussed the orphanage work in general; also told the association that the orphanage trustees had asked this association to raise by November 25th the amount of \$800.00 to be used to help complete the dining hall at the orphanage which is now being erected.

At the close of Brother Evans address, a collection of \$22.36 was taken for the general support of the Home.

On motion we accept the \$800.00 to raise and that a committee of three be appointed to sit with the Association Orphanage Board to help work out plans by which we may raise the amount asked for at once, and that the committee report said plans tomorrow. The following are appointed on said committee: C. E. Lee, W. J. Langdon and W. H. Lancaster.

Temperance committee make their report. (See report).

Report of Smithfield Church by Elder G. C. Joyner. (See report).

The Moderator now recognizes Elder Chester Pelt, who spoke to us in a very interesting way on the general conditions of our churches and the great need of doing more constructive work.

The Moderator appoints Elders T. E. Beaman, M. E. Godwin and C. H. Coats a committee on resolutions.

On motion we close the work of the Association until 9 o'clock A .M. tomorrow.

Closed with prayer by Mrs. W. H. Lancaster.

At 7:30 P. M. several songs were sung by the congregation, also special music by the Powhatan Church.

Devotional services were conducted by Elder L. H. Wetherington, after which Elder C. H. Coats preached a very interesting sermon. Text Job. 31-14. "What then shall I do when God riseth up? And when visiteth, what shall I answer him?"

#### SECOND DAY, NOVEMBER 1st.

The association reconvened at 9 o'clock A. M.

Song service led by Elder R. N. Hinnant.

Devotional service conducted by Elder J. R. Forrest.

Prayer by Elder R. N. Hinnant.

Minutes of yesterday are read and after some minor corrections were approved.

The business was continued under the head of reports from churches which were read before the body until completed.

The moderator recognizes Elders Hinnant, Worley, Rivenbark and Pike

of the Western Association and they responded with words of greeting and appreciation.

The moderator asked for reports from the delegates who attended the other association. They all responded that were present.

Mission Boards make their reports. (See report).

Report or Ordaining Council. (See report).

Report of Orphanage and Special Orphanage Committee. (See report).

The Orphanage report was unanimously adopted and several pledged themselves to go back to their respective churches and help raise the amount asked for.

Elder J. R. Forrest asked for a letter of dismissal to unite with the Eastern Association and Eld. C. B. Thompson asked for a letter to unite with the Central Conference.

On motion and carried that both Eld. Forrest and Eld. Thompson be granted their letter as both are living and working in the respective associations.

The Association recessed for 10 minutes after which the congregation reassembled.

Several musical selections were sung.

Devotional services were conducted by Elder M. E. Godwin.

Elder G. C. Joyner introduced to the audience Elder Thomas Steele who preached a very interesting sermon. Text Col. 1-1, "Paul an Apostle of Jesus Christ by the Will of God."

After the service was over a collection in the amount of \$23.97 was taken for the benefit of Elder H. R. Faircloth.

One hour is given for dinner.

Benediction by Elder H. M. Hall, Evangelist and Bible lecturer.

#### AFTERNOON SECOND DAY

The Association reassembled at 1:30 o'clock.

Singing by the congregation.

Devotional services conducted by Elder Herman Wooten.

The Committee on ministeral labor made their report. (See report).

On motion Brother C. E. Lee notified each church of the amount they are expected to raise of the \$800.00 for orphanage dining hall.

The entire program committee which was composed altogether of ministers offered their resignation which was accepted.

On motion the committee be reduced from five to three and that they be laymen.

The following were elected: W. J. Langdon, W. B. Crumbler and H. T. Hinson.

A collection in the amount of \$12.34 was taken and divided between Elder W. R. Glover and Elder N. D. Wiggs. A collection in the amount of \$21.26 was taken for the benefit of Eld. W. R. Coats.

Report of Treasurer and Finance Committee (See report).

Brother C. E. Lee was elected to fill the unexpired term of brother Kirby West, as a member of the Executive Committee, caused by Bro. West being elected Moderator and automatically becoming chairman of the Executive Committee.

Apportionment Committee made their report (See report).

Bros. J. G. Warren and John Lawhon are elected to fill vacancies on the Apportionment Committee in the place of Brother Kirby West and Elder J. R. Forrest.

Elder T. E. Beaman was elected to fill the vacany on the Educational Board caused by Elder C. B. Thompson's resignation.

Petitions for the next session of the association was called for and Shady Grove, being the only one petitioning, it was voted for with an unanimous vote.
