

Realizing the urgent need of a Free Will Baptist Educational Institution of higher learning in North Carolina, where the boys and girls of our denomination and others may pursue their studies after finishing High School,

We recommend that the Cape Fear Association co-operate with the other Associations and Conferences of the State of North Carolina in building, equipping and maintaining a school of Junior College grade, with a strong Bible department, to be centrally located in the state of North Carolina.
