Temperance Report

We, your Temperance Committee make the following report and recommendation:

1. We realize that our nation is now facing a serious problem and that rationing of all necessities is inevitable. Sin, worldiness, and drinking of Alcoholic beverages are all on the increase. Some in authority seem to think our Service men should drink to be good fighters and have failed to do anything about the liquor laws that would make the purchase of strong drink any more difficult, without regard for the rights or privileges of others and claiming that control is better than prohibition, when actually there is no control. We regret that liquor is hauled on trucks with good tires, exempt from rationing regulations and sold without discretion, advertised in newspapers and magazines, to the disgust of all Christian people.

2. We, therefore recommend that this Conference go on record against the sale and use of strong drink in any form and that our ministers and Church leaders make every possible effort to see that the Discipline is enforced with respect to the sale and use of strong drink.

3. That we endorse the action taken by the North Carolina State Association relative to Temperance in it's 1942 session.

4. That we support the dry forces in their efforts to outlaw strong drink in North Carolina.

Report of Committee on Missions

We, your Committee on Missions, report as follows:

1. We deplore the fact that too little attention has been given to missions during this past Conference year. No definite mission points have been established, and not a single church has been organized.

2. We are confident that the good Lord whom we are endeavoring to serve is not pleased with the fact that we have been so negligent of the worthy cause of missions.

3. We recommend that our ministry as well as the laity lift up their heads and "Behold the fields, so white unto harvest," and go out into these fields and labor with the Lord of harvest.

4. That Daly's Chapel church, which has gone down, has started a movement to revive and re-organize, and this place will be a mission point of this Conference for the ensuing year, and that the Rev. Thomas E. Beaman will direct the activities of this movement, and will be assisted by some of the members of the new Bethel Church of Kinston, N. C. The prospects for the revival of this church are good. A community-wide Sunday School will be organized there this coming Sunday, and regular church services will be held each Third Sunday afternoon.

5. We recommend that where possible each minister of this Conference look out and find one or more mission points, where the prospects of organizing a church are good and that these places be worked during the Conference year.

6. We are of the opinion that we ought to have anywhere from one to

five new churches coming into the Conference each year, and we ask that we all pledge ourselves today to do something about the Worthy Cause of Missions.

Report of Orphanage Board

The Orphanage Board of the Cape Fear Conference renders its brief report concerning the conduct and affairs of the Institution for the fiscal year 1941-42.

The Orphanage cared for an average of 85 children of which 5 were of this Conference.

1. The budget approved by State Association calls for \$27,000 with which to operate through August 31, 1943.

2. The Board of Trustees decided to ask churches to buy Defense Bonds in the name of the Orphanage and at such time as the Board deems it wise to convert these bonds into cash to build the Chapel.

3. We have learned that the budget was increased to take care of the rising cost of living at the rate of 10 per cent which would mean that we should raise a minimum of 10 per cent more per church than was raised last year.

4. We urge that each church and its organizations buy Defense Bonds minimum of \$18.50, \$37.00, and \$74.00.

5. We recommend each organization buy according to its financial ability.

MINISTERIAL REPORT 1942
