

## RESOLUTION

Whereas, there are many problems with which the minister has to deal, such as the study and adjustment of the organization and administration of all lay activities, the proper disciplinary measures of the mass groups of our churches, the proper help and adjustments of new ministers in finding work. and getting acquainted with our people, the advancing of the cause of Mission both Home and Abroad; Christian Education; the support of the Orphanage; and all other benevolent causes of our great Church; as, well as the general expounding of the Gospel of our Lord, and Saviour Jesus Christ, and whereas, when the ministers are called of the Lord, they are examined and ordained by men of God, previously thus set apart, and Whereas, when the people want someone to pastor their church, or churches, they call upon someone set apart as afore stated; in the performing marriage ceremonies, and conducting funerals, as well as all other religious rites, they immediately turn to the Gospel Minister, called of God and set apart by godly men, and whereas there are many things, sacred and holy, which the minister is to handle and deal with, these by right and by teachings of the Sacred and Holy Scriptures belong to minister and he alone, and to depart from this principle, is to throw the sacred Scriptures to Junk Heap and for men to take the affairs in their own hands, and thus cheapen the sacred call and position of the gospel ministry. Therefore, in the light of the aforesaid statements and facts, be it resolved by this conference, that we give to the ministerial profession of this conference, the right to devise and arrange for the making of their annual reports to the Conference, after this session, and to handle their own affairs in keeping with their profession, and with the understanding and agreement that same is to be in conformity to the discipline of this Conference.

Be it resolved farther that a Ministerial Character Committee of five ministers be elected to-day, nominations of which shall be thru the duly appointed nominating committee, for the purpose of carrying out the above resolution, and that they make their report to the Conference at the next session.

Whereas: We do not wish to have any church of our denomination in had standing; therefore be it resolved:

First: That the Secretary of this Conference be instructed to furnish a letter of dismission and recommendation to the Secretary of the Eastern Conference for White Oak Grove.

Second: That we hereby declare that any church who in the future wishes to unite with another Conference must first secure a letter from this Conference and upon failure to do so it will be declared excommunicated.

Third: That this Conference will not receive any church from another Conference into full fellowship of the Conference without a letter from the Conference from which it comes.

Fourth: That we ask all ministers pastoring churches in this Conference to follow our Discipline in receiving and dismissing members from and to other churches.

### CONSTITUTION OF 1855

Article I. This body shall be known as Cape Fear Free Will Baptist Conference.

Article II. The object of this Conference shall be to promote Christ's Kingdom among men by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

Article III. This Conference shall be composed of the ministers who are members of the churches belonging to the body and of delegates from these churches, each church being entitled to three delegates.

Article IV. The delegates from each church shall bear to the Conference a letter certifying their appointment, showing the condition and statistics of the church and giving a statement of all funds raised during the year for denominational or other benevolent purposes.

Article V. The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Treasurer, Corresponding and Recording Secretary who shall remain in office until their successors are elected.

Article VI. This Conference may at each regular meeting elect as many Boards or Standing Committees as may be necessary in carrying outits benevolent purposes. They shall keep a record of their proceedings and make a report at each regular meeting of this Conference.

Articl VII. Any church desiring to become a member of this member shall present her petition at a regular session of Conference through delegates appointed for that purpose. If she be received the Moderator shall extend to her delegates, the hand of fellowship.

Article VIII. The Conference may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of this body save that of voting.

Article IX. This Constitution may be amended at any regular session by a vote of four-fifths of the membership present.

Amendments that the Secretary has been able to locate.

Article III. This Article is amended to permit each Conference to allow as many delegates from the churches as the Conference thinks proper.

Article V. This Article is amended to elect officers for a term of two years and said election to take place one year prior to their entering upon the duties of said office.
