

At the request of the Committee on Obituaries, which was scheduled to report at this time, the chairman of the Superannuation Board, which was

scheduled to report tomorrow, made his report. The report was made by Eld. M. L. Johnson who showed a good report of the year's work of the Board, as it affected the Cape Fear Conference. Bro. Johnson stressed the importance of the young minister availing himself of the opportunity to participate in the benefits offered through an insurance policy made possible by the National Superannuation Board, said Board will pay one-half of all the expense. The ministers should see some member of this Board and get the conditions of the policy.

Reports are made by the delegates who attended other conferences. Only a very few attended.

The Moderator recognized Mrs. L. E. Ballard, Field Representative of the Orphanage, who spoke for a few minutes in regards to her work.

Reports from the various churches are read before the body.

The Credential Committee made their report recommending the admission into this body the newly organized church "Bethlehem" at Willow Springs, N. C., by Eld. Hermon Wooten. The hand of fellowship is extended to the delegates, Bro. W. E. Bond and Sister Clestine Harvell, welcoming them as a member of this body.
