Superintendent's Report to Cape Fear Conference

Seventy-six children were cared for last year. From the Cape Fear Conference, eight of these were within the bounds geographically of the conference.

Your budget of \$6,000 was computed on a ten months' basis, so that we could close the books as of August 31. \$4,890.23 was paid in and credited to your account. The 1948-49 budget for your Conference is \$4,800.

Construction on the chapel, the dairy barn, and Albemarle Cottage, was mentioned as progressing satisfactorily to the Board.

We have endeavored to raise fruits, vegetables, and stock for our use, including milk and eggs. Some meats are kept in the locker and some fruits and vegetables. A small amount of canned field peas, corn and tomatoes were put up by the women and children.

The last child admitted was from the Cape Fear Conference. May I urge you to give liberally in our November drive and the May Campaign. Each of you are invited to attend the Thanksgiving Service on November 25th.

Board of Superannuation

Report of the North Carolina Board of Superannuation to the Cape Fear Conference of Free Will Baptists for the year 1948-49.

Total receipts from the district -----\$591.24

This is a decrease from the previous year of \$27.84.

Our budget for the new year calls for \$7,500 to be raised for Superannuation by all the departments of our denomination. Of this amount the Cape Fear Conference churches have been asked to raise \$650 during the month of October.

Educational Report

During the conference year several of our churches conducted Daily Vacation Bible Schools with excellent results. It is the desire and aim of your board to direct and supervise the phase of our educational program with the expressed hope of having such a school in every church in the entire conference this coming year.

At last conference you directed that we have special meetings of the Superintendents of our Church Schools and Ministers in early December of 1947. This was complied with and the meeting was held in our Smithfield Church, with most of the ministers of the conference, and the superintendents of our schools present. At this meeting we worked out a conference-wide training program with three classes to operate simultaneously, viz.: in Goldsboro, Smithfield and Shady Grove.

We gave the first unit of the training program which was Sunday School Organization and Administration. 217 were graduated from this course of study. Graduation exercises were held in Smithfield High School before a large representative audience.

We found ways and means of financing the entire training program independent of the Conference, and are happy to report that to date all bills are paid, and we have a small balance in the treasury for promotional purposes.

The State Sunday School Convention has asked that we organize a District Sunday School Convention in conformity to our State and National program. We, therefore, request this Conference to grant us the permission to supervise the organization of such a Convention, and that such permission be granted on condition that the proposed district Sunday School Convention be subordinate to the Conference.

The second unit of our training course is now in progress with classes at Shady Grove, Smithfield and Goldsboro. We recommend that all teachers, officers, prospective teachers and our ministers enroll Friday night, November 5, at the places designated and begin training for a great awakening program in the denomination.

We further recommend that our people continue their support of the Bible College at Nashville, Tennessee.
