





Orphanage Committee-We your Orphanage Board, realizing very keenly the need of our Orphanage, beg leave to report as follows: 1-The buildings need repair. 2-New buildings are needed. 3-The lawn needs improvement. 4-The drive-way needs to be improved. 5-The farm and orchard needs better attention in order that more food and feed may be produced. 6-We need more and better improved live stock, especially better dairy cows. 7-We need better equipped work shops and sewing rooms for the boys and girls. 8-We commend the Board and Superintendent for all they have done especially in their efforts to pay off all debts against the institution. 9-We realize that in order for the above mention needs that are outstanding together, with many others not here mentioned to be met, it will take the full cooperation of all our ministers and laiety, therefore we reccommend. I-That each Church send at once to the Orphanage an amount equal to ten cents per member, in keeping with the request of the Superintendent and Board. 2-We also urge that a liberal free will offering be made on or about Thanksgiving in addition to the 10 cents per capita. 3-We ask that each Church hold a special Thanksgiving service. 4-In addition to your cash offering we recommend that we send a load of food, feed and clothing, or anything that can be used. But we suggest that you be very careful with perishable foods as often it will not keep in a usable condition.

5—We recommend that all our churches take a child to clothe or to help in some way. 6—We also suggest that this conference go on record as approving some kind of a program to be worked out by the Board and Superintendent (after the present indebtedness has been paid) to raise sufficient funds to meet the needs of the institution as quickly as possible. 7—We suggest that the membership of our churches who own property and are in position to do so, when they write their last will and testament remember the orphan boy or girl with a portion of the goods God has blessed them with, either in a gift in fee simple or as an endowment.

Also some of our people are breaking the Sabbath by unduly patronizing filling stations on the Sabbath, and are attending places of unholy amusements, such as ball games, bathing pools and other questionable places on the Holy Sabbath.

Therefore, We recommend that this body go on record as opposing the A B C stores, or any other form of legalized, or unlegalized uses of intoxicating liquors as beverages.

We also recommend that this body request all of its members not to patronize places where they will not observe at least in some degree the Sabbath Day.

We recommend also that our ministers and Christian workers ever keep before our people the great need of living temperate lives.

Preamble

We, the Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, having realized that there is an imperative need of certain objectives to be accomplished, and further having realized the necessity of a unified program to consumate these objectives, we therefore adopt the resolutions as are set forth below.

1. That we recommend to each Association and Conference of the Free Will Baptist of N. C. the election of a board, to be known as a General Board.

2. That this Board is to be composed of the following members:

(a) Two from the Western Association

(b) Two from the Eastern Association

(c) Two from the Cape Fear Association

(d) Two from the Central Conference

(e) One from the State Association, at large

(f) One from the French Broad Association

(g) One from the Bever Creek Association

(h) One from the Toe River Association

(i) One from the Jacks Creek Association

(j) One from the Rock Fish Conference

(k) One from the Pee Dee Conference

3. That seven of these members present at any meeting shall compose a quorum for the transacting of business.

4. Should any of the above named bodies have held their 1937 session, that we ask the Moderator or President of the aforesaid bodies, to take the necessary steps to have their member or members elected at an early date.

5. The duties of this General Board shall be to work out a unified program covering the most outstanding needs of our Church, namely: Education, Orphanage, Missions, Evangelism, Superannuation, Church Management.

6. It shall be the duty of this Board to present to the various Associations and Conferences of the State, each year, their plans and recommendations, for the consideration and approval by the bodies in session.

7. All members first elected to this board shall serve two years and thereafter the following shall elect one new member each year, (the first member elected shall serve three years): Western, Eastern, Cape Fear Associations, and the Central Conference. All other Conferences and Associations every 2 years.

8. That we petition all bodies to elect to this Board men or women that are intensely interested in our church, its future progress and welfare.





Proceedings

The Eighty-fourth Annual Session of the Cape Fear Original Free Will Baptist Association convened with the church at Lee's Chapel, Sampson County on November 3, 1938, at 10:00 a. m. The song service was led by Rev. Clarence Bowen of the Western Association and prayer was offered by Elder G. C. Joyner. Elder M. E. Godwin, pastor of Lee's Chapel Church, delivered the address of welcome, and Elder M. L. Johnson gave the response.

The Moderator made a few remarks in behalf of the welfare of the Sccretary, W. A. Jackson, who was absent on account of sickness. Obituary:

We your committee on Obituaries beg leave to report as follows:

It is with deep sorrow we report the death of Elder D. R. Ennis. Brother Ennis was born in Johnston County, North Carolina, on March 14th, 1871. In 1890 he professed faith in Christ and United with the Baptist Church at Pine Forest in Harnett County where his family had settled. He was first married to Miss Allie M. Byrd on January 4, 1893. To this union was born 7 children, 6 of whom are now living. Sister Ennis died May 8, 1932.

Brother Ennis' second marriage was to Miss Lila Gardener on April 7, 1934. His second wife also died April 14, 1937. In the days of his early manhood he surrendered to the Divine call to preach the Gospel. He also took membership with Prospect Free Will Baptist Church, and on March 16, 1910 he was ordained as an orthodox Free Will Baptist minister and uniting with the Cape Fear Conference at its annual session in the fall of 1910. Brother Ennis soon became a very active minister and was one of the outstanding men of our conference.

He faithfully served several churches as pastor and also was very prominent in the Evangelistic field.

Among some of the churches he served as pastor are: Lee's Chapel, Corinth, Robert's Grove. Oak Grove, St. Paul, Prospect and Rock Ridge.

Brother Ennis also organized and helped to organize several churches during his active ministry.

In 1919 he was elected a member of the Ordaining Council which position he held until 1934 at which time he retired from active work on account of his health. He however did not quit altogether but continued to hold services when he was able to do so. On January the 17, 1939 the Lord called Brother Ennis to his final reward. His funeral was preached by Elder G. C. Joyner, assisted by Elder Henry Melvin. He was buried in the church cemetery at Prospect Church.

In the death of Elder Ennis we feel that we have lost a faithful friend and servant, and a loyal co-worker. We realize that our loss is his eternal gain.

We your committee on resolutions beg to submit the following resolutions: Resolution No. 1. Subject: Education

Realizing the great need of education and our special need of an edueational institution where our ministry can be trained, and where the youth of our church may receive their education in an institution where Christianity may be paramount, be it resolved:

Second: That each minister pastoring churches in this Association be requested to give the matter serious consideration and, if possible, see that the schools of their churches are properly represented in future conventions.

Third: That all ministers of this Association, and those pastoring churches in this Association be requested to attend the next Convention, convening with the church at Shady Grove Second Saturday in October, and give their moral support to the said Convention.

Resolution No. 3. Subject: Home Missions and Church Extension

where the gospel is needed to be preached, and where churches of our faith should be established, and whereas, we have too long neglected these needy fields, therefore, be it resolved:

Church, Monday, November 20th at 10:00 a. m. for the expressed purpose of surveying the field, and planning and devising ways and means of adequately meeting the needs, as they may find them.

Second: That those having any information of interest in this subject, kindly report the same to some member of the said committee, or that they attend the meeting and report same.

Third: That ministers or laymen interested in this subject be invited to attend the meeting at Smithfield.

Resolution No. 4. Subject: Amusements

Whereas, there seems to be a growing tendency on the part of some ministers of our country and many of our church people, to indulge in too many amusements of a worldly nature, such as professional ball games, the dances, race track, shows, and many other forms of world amusement, which we recognize to be questionable, therefore be it resolved:

First: That we go on record as strongly opposed to such amusement as may be questionable, and that we request our people to refrain from such, and to give themselves more diligently to the things which are of God, and not of the world.

Second: That in the home, the pulpit, and the church schools we teach and admonish the youth of the evilness of questionable amusements, and endeavor to instill into their minds and hearts a regard for the moral laws and the full teachings of the Word of God regarding amusements.

We, your committee on resolutions, recognize the fact that the foregoing resolutions will be valueless unless put into practice, and we recommend, that if adopted, our preachers and delegates endeavor to put them into practice, and that one year hence, we check up to see that they have been put into practice in our churches.





Temperance Report

We, your Temperance Committee make the following report and recommendation: 1. We realize that our nation is now facing a serious problem and that rationing of all necessities is inevitable. Sin, worldiness, and drinking of Alcoholic beverages are all on the increase. Some in authority seem to think our Service men should drink to be good fighters and have failed to do anything about the liquor laws that would make the purchase of strong drink any more difficult, without regard for the rights or privileges of others and claiming that control is better than prohibition, when actually there is no control. We regret that liquor is hauled on trucks with good tires, exempt from rationing regulations and sold without discretion, advertised in newspapers and magazines, to the disgust of all Christian people.

2. We, therefore recommend that this Conference go on record against the sale and use of strong drink in any form and that our ministers and Church leaders make every possible effort to see that the Discipline is enforced with respect to the sale and use of strong drink.

3. That we endorse the action taken by the North Carolina State Association relative to Temperance in it's 1942 session.

4. That we support the dry forces in their efforts to outlaw strong drink in North Carolina.

Report of Committee on Missions

We, your Committee on Missions, report as follows:

1. We deplore the fact that too little attention has been given to missions during this past Conference year. No definite mission points have been established, and not a single church has been organized.

2. We are confident that the good Lord whom we are endeavoring to serve is not pleased with the fact that we have been so negligent of the worthy cause of missions.

3. We recommend that our ministry as well as the laity lift up their heads and "Behold the fields, so white unto harvest," and go out into these fields and labor with the Lord of harvest.

4. That Daly's Chapel church, which has gone down, has started a movement to revive and re-organize, and this place will be a mission point of this Conference for the ensuing year, and that the Rev. Thomas E. Beaman will direct the activities of this movement, and will be assisted by some of the members of the new Bethel Church of Kinston, N. C. The prospects for the revival of this church are good. A community-wide Sunday School will be organized there this coming Sunday, and regular church services will be held each Third Sunday afternoon.

5. We recommend that where possible each minister of this Conference look out and find one or more mission points, where the prospects of organizing a church are good and that these places be worked during the Conference year.

6. We are of the opinion that we ought to have anywhere from one to

five new churches coming into the Conference each year, and we ask that we all pledge ourselves today to do something about the Worthy Cause of Missions.

1. The budget approved by State Association calls for \$27,000 with which to operate through August 31, 1943.

2. The Board of Trustees decided to ask churches to buy Defense Bonds in the name of the Orphanage and at such time as the Board deems it wise to convert these bonds into cash to build the Chapel.

3. We have learned that the budget was increased to take care of the rising cost of living at the rate of 10 per cent which would mean that we should raise a minimum of 10 per cent more per church than was raised last year.

4. We urge that each church and its organizations buy Defense Bonds minimum of \$18.50, \$37.00, and \$74.00.

5. We recommend each organization buy according to its financial ability.



CONSTITUTION OF 1855

Article I. This body shall be known as Cape Fear Free Will Baptist Conference.

Article II. The object of this Conference shall be to promote Christ's Kingdom among men by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

Article III. This Conference shall be composed of the ministers who are members of the churches belonging to the body and of delegates from these churches, each church being entitled to three delegates.

Article IV. The delegates from each church shall bear to the Conference a letter certifying their appointment, showing the condition and statistics of the church and giving a statement of all funds raised during the year for denominational or other benevolent purposes.

Article V. The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Treasurer, Corresponding and Recording Secretary who shall remain in office until their successors are elected.

Article VI. This Conference may at each regular meeting elect as many Boards or Standing Committees as may be necessary in carrying out its benevolent purposes. They shall keep a record of their proceedings and make a report at each regular meeting of this Conference.

Articl VII. Any church desiring to become a member of this member shall present her petition at a regular session of Conference through delegates appointed for that purpose. If she be received the Moderator shall extend to her delegates the hand of fellowship.

Article VIII. The Conference may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of this body save that of voting.

Article IX. This Constitution may be amended at any regular session by a vote of four-fifths of the membership present.

Amendments that the Secretary has been able to locate.

Article III. This Article is amended to permit each Conference to allow as many delegates from the churches as the Conference thinks proper.

Article V. This Article is amended to elect officers for a term of two years and said election to take place one year prior to their entering upon the duties of said office.







REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL BOARD

After the last session of our Conference we received from our State and national Educational Boards, the quota assigned to the Cape Fear Conference, for the Expansion of our Free Will Baptist College, Nashville, Tenn., which amount was \$3,500.00. We met as soon thereafter as possible, and assigned a quota to each of our twenty-five churches, and immediately notified each church of our actions, and the amount of their quota, together with a suggestion that as much of the amount be raised this year as feasible, and if practical, all of the amount be raised so that the matter might be behind them.

Knowing that the responsibility of raising our educational money rests with each pastor, who is the official head of the church, we caused a letter to be sent to each minister pastoring churches in our Conference, whether he was a member of our Conference, or of some other Conference, informing him of the amount of the quota of each church he pastored in this conference. By these methods we have made proper and official notification to each church.

We have promised to make an open report to this, and each succeeding session, of the Conference, until the campaign ends, as well as to our Union Meetings, which report will show what each church has done. Our report on the liquidation of the quota is as follows:

We desire that our Conference be a leading example to all other Conferences in North Carolina, as well as the United States, in matters involving our National Educational program, and to this end we earnestly request of our pastors, and churches to raise their educational money as soon as possible, and send it to our state treasurer, Rev. Rashie Kennedy, 713 Simmons St., Goldsboro, N. C.

We need at our Bible school more buildings, and equipment to meet the physical needs for housing our constantly increasing enrollment of students who go to our school to be trained for full time service in our church. To meet these needs of the physical plant we must have a large outlay of money during the balance of this year and the next. Your good will, prayers, and continued financial support is greatly needed.

We desire to go on record as endorsing and recommending to our National Educational Board, the making of our Bible College of Nashville, Tenn., a four-year Bible School by the addition of two more years word to the present curriculum, making a total of four years of training to those students who may so desire it.

We recommend that in the future all ministerial students of our conference be requested and encouraged to attend our Bible School at Nashville, Tenn., where practical, and that we encourage a full college course at said school, before entering upon full pastoral duties, whenever this can be made possible.

Since our Bible school offers courses of Christian training, in Sunday School Organization and Administration, Music, Young People and Adult Women's work, we pass on to our people the need of a number of trained workers in these fields of endeavor, and we request those of our lay-leaders to look into the possibility of taking a course of training at our Bible school, and thus better preparing themselves for service in our church.

We believe that through our Bible school the Cause of Christ as represented by our Church, can best be served; for when men and women have been fully trained for full time leadership, both in the home land and in the foreign, and when a large number of them have been trained and sent out in world-wide Missionary endeavor, together with a large number here in the home land to help our home ministers then greater numbers can be reached and won to Christ. To this end we earnestly beseech all ministers and laymen to work for a greater Bible College at Nashville, Tenn., to serve our noble denomination in the training of full time Christian workers, missionaries and ministers.

That we continue our support to the Free Will Baptist Bible College, Nashville, Tenn., and that our churches, if possible, finish paying their allotment of the expansion program funds by session in 1948.

That some of our churches have conducted some time during the summer, Daily Vacation Bible Schools with very good results. We would like to urge that all churches plan for such schools during the summer of 1948, and that they file with us a report so that same can be embodied in your educational report in the session of 1948. We find a great need for a course in Teachers Training to be given in cur Sunday Schools annually. We recommend that all Sunday School Superintendents meet together in some central location with the Conference Educational Board, and the Union Sunday School Board to make plans for progress and improvement in our Sunday Schools; the time and place of this meeting to be set by the Confercnce today.

Educational Report

During the conference year several of our churches conducted Daily Vacation Bible Schools with excellent results. It is the desire and aim of your board to direct and supervise the phase of our educational program with the expressed hope of having such a school in every church in the entire conference this coming year.

At last conference you directed that we have special meetings of the Superintedents of our Church Schools and Ministers in early December of 1947. This was complied with and the meeting was held in our Smithfield Church, with most of the ministers of the conference, and the superintendents of our schools present. At this meeting we worked out a conferencewide training program with three classes to operate simultaneously, viz.: in Goldsboro, Smithfield and Shady Grove.

We gave the first unit of the training program which was Sunday School Organization and Administration. 217 were graduated from this course of study. Graduation exercises were held in Smithfield High School before a large representative audience.

We found ways and means of financing the entire training program independent of the Conference, and are happy to report that to date all bills are paid, and we have a small balance in the treasury for promotional purposes.

The State Sunday School Convention has asked that we organize a District Sunday School Convention in conformity to our State and National program. We, therefore, request this Conference to grant us the permission to supervise the organization of such a Convention, and that such permission be granted on condition that the proposed district Sunday School Convention be subordinate to the Conference.

The second unit of our training course is now in progress with classes at Shady Grove, Smithfield and Goldsboro. We recommend that all teachers, officers, prospective teachers and our ministers enroll Friday night, November 5, at the places designated and begin training for a great awakening program in the denomination.

We further recommend that our people continue their support of the Bible College at Nashville, Tennessee.

Report of Mission Board

We beg to report as follows:

There appears to have been an increased interest in missions among our people. The exact figures of our churches to State and National Mission programs are not available. But we do know that they are increasing.

Your Mission Board has been generally working toward a better system whereby we will be able in the not too distant future to furnish you annually with these figures.

Earlier in the year arrangement was made for state mission aid for our Wooten's Chapel Church, the refinancing of their loan and the better establishment of their work and we are happy to tell you that this church has made wonderful progress, and that new life and interest has come to the church.

There are many places in our territory where mission work is needed, and where churches of our faith could be profitably established. May we join our hearts and hands in making possible work at these places.

We wish to submit the following to you for your consideration.

Rules and Regulations governing the Mission Board:

1. The Board shall be composed of four (4) members, elected for a period of four years, with two (2) members retiring each year.

2. The officers shall be: Chairman, Assistant Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer. Any two officers may be combined when it appears to be the best interest of the Mission work.

3. The Board shall meet as often as may be deemed necessary and attend to all matters pertaining to missions within the territory of the Cape Fear Conference, but must meet at least twice a year.

4. The Conference Treasurer shall hold all funds designated for Cape Fear Missions, and pay out same on order of the Board, or when said order is duly signed by the chairman and secretary of the Board. Annual reports shall be made to the conference of all funds.

5. All ministers doing mission work for which they desire to be compensated by the Mission Board, must first apply to the Mission Board, and receive their permission to do the work under due regulations of the Board, before they can be compensated with mission funds.

6. Mission points, or stations, may be opened and maintained by the Board for such a length of time as may be deemed best. Employ evangelistic Missionaries, and such workers as may be deemed necessary for the proper promotion of the mission work. 7. Annual reports shall be rendered to the Conference by the Board.

8. These rules and regulations may be revised and amended at any annual session of the Conference, provided, however, that a motion to amend, or altar, must first lie on the table three (3) hours before the vote is taken, and during which time it must be read at least twice, and provided further that to amend or altar these rules and regulations a two-thirds vote must be had.

Approved by the ministerial Association, October 27, 1947.

Your Mission Board having been governed by the foregoing rules and regulations, since their approval by the ministerial association on October 27, 1947, now feel that we should ask the conference to approve of same, herewith submit them for your due consideration.

Recommendations

First. Full and complete co-operation with the State and National Mission programs, and that we in turn ask a full recognition of this Board.

Second. That the Conference allocate an amount annually for Cape Fear Missions.

Third. That our churches and their auxiliaries and individuals make periodical contributions to Cape Fear Missions, inorder that we may have funds with which to operate. We cannot operate without funds, any more than a mill can operate without logs.

Fourth. That we request our people and particularly our ministers to report to us every place where there appears to be an opportunity for missions for our church.

Fifth. That our people be and are hereby requested to pray much, privately and publicly, in all church gatherings for the cause of Missions and evangelism. By Committee

Auxiliary Report

The Woman's Auxiliary of the Cape Fear Conference reports a good years work, with an auxiliary in every church except two. Hopewell and Lee's Chapel each have two auxiliaries. This money was used in the fallowing way: Sent for home missions, \$809.53; Orphanage, \$730.66; Bible Schools, \$267.50; Aged ministers, \$77.40; Foreign Missions, \$495.18; Raleigh Church, \$27.80; Local Work, \$1,411.90; Auxiliary literature, \$43.71. Mrs. Hoggard, field Worker, received \$24.50.

Our goal for the next six months is an active auxiliary in every local church in the Cape Fear Conference.

UNION MEETING Cape Fear Conference Original Free Will Baptists CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE ONE-

Name—This organization shall be known as the Union Meeting of the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina. ARTICLE TWO—

Purpose—The purpose of this Union Meeting is the Constitution of an effective agency through which the Cape Fear Conference may successfully promote its work. It shall thus be and remain subject to the authority and use of the conference, except in the election of its general officers., as a consistent medium devoted to the advancement of the Conference program of evangelism, education, and benevolence.

ARTICLE THREE

Composition—This union meeting shall be composed of the churches affiliated with the Cape Fear Conference, the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, and all general officers and members of standing committees of both the conference and the union meeting.

ARTICLE FOUR-

Representation—The churches of the Cape Fear Conference shall represent in the quarterly sessions of the Union Meeting with one delegate for each one hundred members or fractions thereof. Sunday Schools, Leagues, and Auxiliaries shall each represent with one delegate.

ARTICLE FIVE-

Finance—Each church shall send with its delegation to the quarterly sessions of of this Union Meeting one per cent of its annual budget, or a total of four per cent of the church budget for the full year of four Union Meeting sessions. Sunday Schools, Leagues, and Auxiliaries shall represent with whatever amounts they may choose. All funds shall be allocated by the Apportionment Committee of the Conference, but said allocations shall be approved by the union meeting in regular session.

ARTICLE SIX-

Officers—The officers of this union meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, at the last session of the union meeting before the annual session of the Cape Fear Conference.

ARTICLE SEVEN-

Boards and Committees—All standing committees and boards created by the conference shall avail themselves of the advantages of promoting their work through the union meeting.

The general officers of the union meeting shall be added to the executive committee of the conference and this composit committee shall constitute the executive committee of the union meeting. This committee shall have power to act for and on the behalf of the union meeting between its regular sessions. It shall also be the duty of the Executive Committee to prepare the programs of the union meeting.

ARTICLE EIGHT-

Meetings—This union meeting shall hold its regular sessions Saturday before each fifth Sunday in the churches of the Cape Fear Conference. The host church shall be selected from time to time, according to the alphabetic succession of the initial letter of the name of each church. This method of selecting the place of meeting may be changed, when deemed expedient or necessary, by an act of the union meeting in session or the evecutive committee.

ARTICLE NINE-

This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference by a majority vote of the members present, provided that the proposed amendment be presented in writing by the union meeting.

We, your committee on credentials report through their committee, have made application for Lanwood Chapel Church for admittance into the Cape Fear Conference.

We recommend that their church be admitted and their delegates be seated.



Rev. William Ruffin Coates' Life and Labors

WILLIAM RUFFIN COATES

WILLIAM RUFFIN COATES was born in Johnston County, North Carolina, near St. Mary's Grove Free Will Baptist Church on December 2, 1866. He was a very bright boy, and whene he was a young man he took advantage of every educational opportunity in his reach, but was, as he often expressed it, a very sinful man until the Lord arrested him at the age of 28, and gloriously saved him by His power and grace.

Then, he united with St. Mary's Grove Free Will Baptist church of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists, and was soon elected clerk of the church. A little later he was elected superintendent of the Sunday School. He led the singing and taught the Bible class for four years, at which time he was called to the Gospel ministry. He was ordained on January 16, 1898. He served as pastor of churches in Johnston County as follows: St. Mary's Grove, Bethel, Hopewell, Tee's Chapel, River Side, Johnston Union; in Harnett County: Prospect, Pleasant Grove; in Sampson County: Shady Grove, Oak Grove, St. Paul; in Wayne County: St. John, Casey's Chapel; in Wilson County: Saratoga, Aspin Grove, People's Chapel; in Nash County: Flood's Chapel, Stony Hill.

In 1912 he was appointed a member of the Executive Committee of the Cape Fear Conference. He was moderator of the Conference for four years. He was a member of the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Orphanage when the Institution was established in Middlesex, N. C. He served on the Board of Ordination of the Cape Fear Conference for 25 years, which position is one of responsibility and trust.

In 1920, feeling the call to a broader field of service, he left his native State to do Evangelistic work in the State of Georgia, taking with him a layman of note and great profit as a singer, Bro. R. E. (Bob) Thomas. He held revival meetings in South Georgia churches of the Original Faith as follows: Pleasant Hill, Neal's Chapel, Shady Grove and Oak Grove with great success.

When Rev. Coates was young in the ministry, he dedicated his life to God and His cause. He secured a History of Free Will Baptists by Rev. I. D. Stewart, covering a period from 1780 to 1830. Using the information contained in this and several other histories of our church, he was well informed as to Doctrine and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptists. In 1912, when what is known as the "Unknown Tongue Faction" undertook to dominate the church, Rev. Coates led the Conference to victory in several courts of the land by being well posted on the Doctrine and practice of the Free Will Baptists from Queen Mary's reign in England to the time of this contest.

Rev. W. R. Coates, retired from the active ministry in 1936, due to ill

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE CAPE FEAR CONFERENCE OF THE ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS OF NORTH CAROLINA

ARTICLE I

Name—This organization shall be known as the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina and by this name shall it be designated in all its work, government, and fraternal relations.

ARTICLE II

Composition—This Conference shall be composed of the Ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the Conference, all general officers of the Conference, the members of standing boards, or committees, the president of each subordinate general organization, and the following churches together with those that may subsequently be admitted.

Bethel (Johnston), Bethel (Lenoir), Casey's Chapel, Corinth, Daly's Chapel, Goldsboro, Hopewell, Johnson's Union, Lanward Chapel, Lee's Chapel, Oak Grove, Pleasant Grove, Powhatan, Prospect, Riverside, Robert's Grove, Raleigh, Shady Grove, Smyrna, Smithfield, St. John, St. Mary's Grove, St. Paul, Stevens Chapel, Tee's Chapel, West Clinton, Wooten's Chapel, Yelverton's Grove.

ARTICLE III

Purpose—The general purpose of this Conference shall be the exaltation of Christ, the great head of the church; the edification of its members, through effective teaching and mutual encouragement in the use of the manifold means of grace; the unification of the methods and programs of its affiliated churches and subordinate organizations; and the coordination of persistant efforts in church extension, Christian education, benevolence and evangelism.

ARTIVLE IV

Representation—Every church affiliated with the Cape Fear Conference shall represent in its annual sessions with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof, and each subordinate general organization shall represent with three delegates. Reports of approved delegates shall be rendered by each church and subordinate organization at the yearly session of the Conference.

ARTICLE V

Officers—The general officers of this conference shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of two years. The term of office for all general officers shall begin at the close of the annual session at which they are elected.

Temporary officers, representatives, or messengers may be elected at the option of the Conference for whatever purposes deemed essential.

ARTICLE VI

Boards and Subordinate General Organizations—It shall be the method of this Conference to simplify its work by the assignment of specific functions to representative units of authority which shall hereafter be known as standing boards and subordinate general organizations. A Board of Trustees, a Board of Education, a Board of Missions, and a Board of Ordination consisting of five members each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be five years but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the tenure of office of one member annually.

Section 1.—Standing boards and subordinate general organizations shall have authority to write their own by-laws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to the authority and approval of the conference.

Section 2.—The Executive Board shall be composed of the general officers of the conference, the president of each subordinate general organization and the chairman of the Board of Education, the Board of Missions, and the Board of Ordination. Membership on this Board shall be contingent upon and by virtue of the aforesaid offices held by its members.

Section 3.—Temporary committees shall be appointed at the option of the conference for whatever purposes deemed expedient.

ARTICLE VII

Finance—Each church shall contribute to the Conference program \$10 annually for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. All funds shall be allocated by the Executive Board for the purposes and objects approved by the Conference.

ARTICLE VIII

Admission of Churches.—Any properly constituted church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by the Free Will Baptist and a desire to conform to the policy and program of the Cape Fear Conference may submit its petition for membership through an official delegation at any annual session of the Conference. If the petition for membership be approved, the Moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates and declare them duly seated.

ARTICLE IX

Fraternal Delegations and Visitors—Fraternal delegations and visitors shall be extended all the privileges of the Conference except that of voting, serving on committees, or holding elective offices.

ARTICLE X

Meetings—The Cape Fear Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday and Friday before the first Sunday of November. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session, or by the Executive Board. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the Executive Board should such a change become necessary.

ARTICLE XII

Amendment—This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present, provided that the proposed amendment shall not be found in conflict with the general policy of Free Will Baptist.

BY-LAWS

Section 1.—The duties of the Moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Cape Fear Conference; to appoint temporary committee, delegates and representatives; to fill irregular vacancies that may occur between the general sessions of the Conference; to serve as ex-officio member of all standing boards and subordinate general organizations; to sign official documents that require the signature of the Moderator encourage amicable relatives among ministers of the Conference the cooperation of the churches and subordinate general organizations in the promotion of the program and work of the Conference.

Section 2.—The duties of the Assistant Moderator shall be those of the Moderator when the latter shall so direct or when he is absent. Section 3.—The Secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Cape Fear Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. He shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the Conference; hold in trust all documents, not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the Conference. Conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require his signature; and act as exofficio member of the Executive Board.

Section 4.—The duties of the Assistant Secretary shall be those of the secretary when the latter shall so direct, or is absent.

Section 5.—The Treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the Conference and pay out same by order of the Conference, the Executive Board, or any standing board or subordinate general organization invested of the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report accordingly to the Conference. He shall serve as ex-officio member of the Executive Board.

Section 6.—The Executive Board shall have power to act in the behalf of and for the Cape Fear Conference from one regular session to another. It shall organize at will and discharge the administrative duties assigned to it. It shall supervise the work of the Union Meeting, plan its programs, and allocate to the objects approved by the Conference all undesignated funds both of the Conference and the Union Meeting.

Section 7.—The Board of Trustees shall hold in trust, all personal and real property, gifts and bequests, and convey or expend said property or assets as the Cape Fear Conference may direct.

Section 8.—Standing Boards shall have power to organize at will to write their own by-laws, and to carry out the general purposes for which they are constituted. They shall remain subordinate to the Conference and report their accomplishments at its annual sessions.

Section 9.—The following temporary committee shall be appointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: Obituary, Temperance, Resolutions, Credentials, Nominations, and Letter Digest.

Section 10.—The general officers of the Cape Fear Conference shall be elected for a term of two years and said term shall begin immediately following the session at which they are elected.

Members of standing boards shall be elected for a term of five years and said term shall begin at the close of the session of the Conference at which they are elected. It is provided, however, that the first member elected shall serve for a term of one year, the second for a term of two years, the third for a term of three years, the fourth for a term of four years, and the fifth for a term of five years; and that succession in office thereafter shall take place as order requires—each for a term of five years.

Section 11.—All reports, resolutions, recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the Conference in written form only.

Section 12.—The voting sign shall be "Aye and Nay," or any other sign the Moderator may deem appropriate to the question.

Section 13.—No minister, officer, or delegate shall be at liberty to retire from the building during a session of the Conference without the consent of the moderator.

Section 14.—These By-Laws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds favorable vote of the members present at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference.

Statement Describing Promotional Work

Although the general work of the Cape Fear Conference is divided, by Constitutional provision, into specific fields of endeavor—namely: Christian Education, Missions, and Church Extension, and benevolence, it is recognized that a more lucid description of "promotional work" would not only be appreciated by our people but would also inspire a higher degree of cooperation on their part in the prosecution of a go-forward program. When however, the departmental boards shall have fully defined their respective phases of work and determined their methods and mediums of activity, "promotional work" will have become general knowledge throughout the Conference. For immediate purposes the following are submitted.

1. The Executive Board of the Conference shall seek to coordinate the work of all standing boards and subordinate general organizations. Duplication of efforts, faithfulness to recognized responsibilities, and a reasonable appeal for church support will be undertaken.

2. The cultivation of a high degree of Christian fellowship among the ministers of the Conference and the laity shall be socially and educationally promoted. The activities of individual ministers and local churches shall be widely publicized with the view of inspiring a more gracious service.

3. A competent survey of every Church community shall be made with the view of enlisting active and prospective church members in a mutual program of community betterment.

4. The improvement of local church organization, the training of teachers and officers, remodeling and enlarging churches, supervising Christian recreational activities and building new churches all of these shall be undertaken as "promotional work."

5. Essential literature shall be written and made available to the churches as a means of securing enlightened cooperation in a truly progressive program.

Union Meeting—Cape Fear Conference Original Free Will Baptist

Constitution

ARTICLE I

Name—This organization shall be known as the Union Meeting of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

ARTICLE II

Purpose—The purpose of this Union Meeting is the creation of an effective agency through which the Cape Fear Conference may successfully promote its work. It shall thus be and remain subject to the authority and use of the Conference—except in the election of its general officers—as a consistent medium devoted to the advancement of the Conference program of evangelism, education, benevolence, and church extension.

ARTICLE III

Composition—This union meeting shall be composed of churches affiliated with the Cape Fear Conference, the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the Conference, and all general officers and members of standing committees of both the conference and the union meeting.

ARTICLE IV

Representation—The churches of the Cape Fear Conference shall represent in the quarterly sessions of the Union Meeting with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. Sunday Schools, Leagues, and auxiliaries shall each represent with one delegate.

ARTICLE V

Finance—Each church shall send with its delegation to the quarterly sessions of this Union Meeting one per cent of its annual budget exclusive of funds for buildings and equipment, or a total of four per cent of the church budget for the full year of four union meeting sessions. Sunday Schools, Leagues and Auxiliaries shall represent with whatever amounts they may choose. All funds shall be allocated by the Executive Board of the Conference, but said allocations shall be approved by the union meeting in regular session, or by the Conference.

ARTICLE VI

Officers—The general officers of this Union Meeting shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, at the last session of the Union Meeting before the Annual session of the Cape Fear Conference.

ARTICLE VII

Boards and Committees—All standing committees and boards created by the Conference shall avail themselves of the advantages of promoting their work through the Union Meeting.

The general officers of the Union Meeting shall be added to the Executive Board of the Conference and this composit Committee shall constitute the Executive Committee of the Union Meeting. This committee shall have power to act for and on the behalf of the Union Meeting between its regular sessions. It shall also be the duty of the Executive Committee to prepare and supervise the programs of the Union Meeting and to allocate all undesignated funds.

ARTICLE VIII

Meetings—The Union Meeting shall hold its regular sessions Saturday before each fifth Sunday in the churches of the Cape Fear Conference. The host church shall be selected from time to time, according to the alphabetic succession of the initial letter of the name of each church. This method of selecting the place of meeting may be changed, when deemed expedient or necessary, by an act of the Union Meeting in session or the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX

Amendment—This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference by a majority vote of the members present, provided that the proposed amendment presented in writing by the Union Meeting.

Report of Delegates to Albemarle Conference

Rev. C. H. Coats was appointed by the Executive Committee of the Conference to represent the Cape Fear Conference at the Albemarle Conference. He makes the following report:

The Conference was well attended and was in all very forward in all its deliberations. All reports showed that progress is being made in all phases of its work.

The people were kind and cooperative during the sitting, and the hospitality was everything to be expected, also plenty of good food was served.

There was one report made that should be of interest to this Conference. Rev. R. P. Harris read the Rules of Church Discipline as was revised by the Revision Committee, the revised work was accepted and approved.

I also attended the Rock Fish Conference, and was received in a most cordial manner. I was appointed to preach the introduction sermon and received many compliments from preachers and laymen who were very much interested in the Doctrine of the Original Free Will Baptist, as I preached it. They passed the work of the Revision Committee. I attended the Western Conference and was also received in a cordial and hospitable manner, the fellowship of the brethren was good and the Conference well attended. They also passed and approved the work of the Revision Committee.

health and old age, however, his mind was very active and his memory was excellent until the end of life. He passed away at his home in the city of Raleigh, N. C., September 11, 1950, at the age of 84, having suffered for more than two years with cancer of the stomach. He leaves his widow and three daughters and one son, also several grandchildren.



A resolution regarding aid to church building projects was adopted.

By motion the Treasurer of the Conference was authorized to pay for the meals of the Executive Board members at all the sessions of the Board.

A motion was passed authorizing the Secretary of the Conference to have one thousand registration cards printed.

Funds were allocated as follows: The Board of Missions, \$200; The Board of Education, \$100; Student Loan Fund, \$25.

Goldsboro, N. C., Mar. 26, 1951.

At this meeting a motion authorizing a letter of dismissal and commendation to the Central Conference for Rev. Rashie Kennedy was passed.

Motion adopted which directed the Sunday School funds received in our Union Meetings to be placed in the general fund of the Conference conforming to the new constitution.

On motion C. H. Coates was elected assistant Moderator to fill the unexpired term of Rev. Rashie Kennedy.

On motion, Rev. Stedman C. Davis was elected to the Board of Ordination to fill the unexpired term of Rev. Rashie Kennedy.

By motion, the Moderator was authorized to appoint a special committee to work with himself in preparing new report blanks both for the Conference and the Union Meetings. Thos. E. Beaman, C. H. Coates, and the Secretary of the Union Meeting were appointed. The duties of this committee are to prepare the blanks in keeping with the new system of records and reports conforming to state and national setup.

The program committee, to outline programs of the Conference, was appointed, and also for the Union Meetings. This committee met during the intermission and prepared their reports and submitted them to the session in the atternoon for approval.

Goldsboro, N. C., April 30, 1951.

At this meeting a resolution was passed authorizing the acquiring of title to a lot for a building site in Clinton, N. C., and subsequently a motion was passed authorizing the Board of Missions to act in its official capacity approaching the people in the town of Clinton regarding the building of a Free Will Baptist Church.

Smithfield, N. C., July 23, 1951

A resolution was passed authorizing the re-location of the 1951 session of the Conference to convene with Bethel Church, Johnston County.

A resolution was passed authorizing title deed to Trustees of West Clinton Free Will Baptist Church, thus closing the equity of the Conference in the lot in the town of Clinton, N. C.

Powhatan Church, July 28, 1951.

Motion was passed authorizing Thos. E. Beaman to purchase a loose leaf minute book for recording and preservation of all the minutes and proceedings of the Executive Board at the expense of the administrative department of the Conference.

Smithfield, N. C., Sept. 24, 1951.

A motion was made that we purchase loose leaf binder for keeping record of the Conference minutes.

The Union Meeting program for September 29, 1951 was revised.

A motion was passed stipulating that in the future all advertising, of whatever nature, regarding our Conference, Union Meetings, and activities of our Boards. news items, and press conferences, be authorized by the Executive Board, or some person, or persons, designated, or authorized, to handle them.

A motion was made that we add to our "GO-FORWARD" Program the Christian Family Life.

We authorized the Board of Education to circularize our churches regarding the division of educational funds.

Raleigh, N. C., Sept. 29, 1951.

This meeting was held to authorize the donation of \$100 to Raleigh Church.

Smithfield, N. C., Oct. 29, 1951.

At this meeting a letter of resignation from Rev. Stedman C. Davis was read offering his resignation on the Board of Missions and Board of Ordination. Brother Davis' resignation was due to his present employment which made it almost impossible for him to render proper service.

We elected Rev. Albert T. Coates to fill the unexpired term on the Board of Missions, and Rev. Walter W. Reynolds on the Board of Ordination.

We authorized Rev. Thos. E. Beaman as press agent to have charge of all advertising and press conferences for the Conference.

In acordance with the requirement of the Constitution making it mandatory for the Executive Board to allocate all undesignated funds, motion was passed automatically allocating all undesignated funds on hand, and such funds as may hereafter come into the Treasury undesignated, on the following basis:

I-Administrative Fund, 40% (This fund is to include general operational cost and expenses of the Conference and the Executive Board in its promotional activities, and will include such items as cost of printing minutes, programs, any and all other public meetings, postage, stationary, expenses of all boards and special committees not otherwise provided for-and such expenses are generally termed "administrative")

II-Board of Missions, 30%

III-Board of Education, 30%

RESOLUTIONS REGULATING AID TO CHURCH BUILDING PROJECTS

Adopted by Executive Board November 26, 1950

Whereas, The Constitution of the Cape Fear Conference provides that the Executive Board shall allocate all undesignated funds to the work and objects supported by the Conference; and,

Whereas, A major phase of the Conference work is that of missions and church extension;

THEREFORE RESOLVED:

That all churches and mission points that desire financial aid from the Conference as a means of acquiring building cites, church edifices, chapels, educational buildings, and improvements shall qualify as applicants according to requirement (4) below, and according to one of the other three requirements under numerals (1), (2), (3)

(1) Title to property shall be vested in the Board of Trustees of the Cape Fear Conference.

(2) Title to property shall be vested in the Trustees of the church and the Trustees of the Conference.

(3) Title to property shall be vested in the Trustees of local church, but the Executive Board of the Conference shall maintain full supervision of the church budget, including all debt payments, maintenance of property, operational expenses, salaries, and gifts.

(4) That building plans and estimates of cost shall be approved by the Executive Board.

DISCUSSION OF RESOLUTIONS REGULATING AID TO CHURCH BUILDING PROJECTS.

(1) Title to property vested in Board of Trustees of Cape Fear Conference.

The purpose of this rule is to answer the question, "Who shall hold title to recessary property used by an unorganized mission point congregation?" Answer: Trustees of the Conference. This rule is further justified by the very fact that Conference money would necessarily be invested in such property.

(2) Title to property vested in Trustees of the local church and the Trustees of the Conference.

This rule applies to duly organized churches that are confronted with the purchase of suitable locations on which to build and the subsequent construction of church edifices. This rule would likewise be practical for established churches that might consider moving to more suitable property, said change of location being understood as entailing greater expense than the local church would be able to pay without aid from the Conference. It is to be noted also that this iule could work advantageously in the liquidation of defaulted local church indebtedness.

(3) Church budget supervised by Executive Board of the Cape Fear Conference.

The practical effects of this rule are many and varied. The chief aim, however, of this rule is to insure the financial success of the local church in handling any of its building needs, and at the same time, to justify the confidence of the churches of the Conference in the use of church extension and Conference mission funds. The Executive Board, by this method, would undertake and effect the expenditure of funds provided for this purpose with the view of advancing the Kingdom of God, while guarding a high degree of Christian fellowship and inspiring the liberality of the churches.

(4) Building plans.

By this rule the Conference, through its Executive Board, approves all building plans for those churches that receive gifts from Conference funds that are to be applied toward the construction of church buildings.

III-COLLEGE QUARTET

We cooperated with the Bible College in arranging for the itinerary for the College Quartet to give a program in the following churches:

Bethel (Lenoir Co.), Goldsboro, Shady Grove, Smithfield, Hopewell.

As shown in the foregoing report, the offering of \$30 from Bethel (Lenoir Co.) and \$39 from Shady Grove was received by this office.

The other churches received offerings, but did not send them via this office as required, and while the College received the offerings, yet the Cape Fear Conference loses the credit for same.

IV-STUDENT LOAN FUND

This fund will be loaned to worthy students in our Bible College. We will need in the end of 1951, \$500. In 1952 we will need an additional \$1,000, and individuals, Sunday Schools, Woman's Auxiliaries, and churches are urged to make contributions to this fund. This is a Cape Fear Conference project. The need is urgent. We have two worthy students in our Bible College; namely, James Earl Raper, and Mary Lou Raper, which we must help.

V-TRAINING PROGRAM

1-New Courses In Training-We are ready to begin at any time classes in Sunday School Evangelism and will be followed by another unit on missions. These training classes will be held at Kinston, Goldsboro, Smithfield, and Shady Grove. We aim to train in these two courses more than five hundred people. Classes will begin in November.

2-Doctrine and Administration-We will continue our training program in doctrine and church administration.

3-Other Courses-Special text material is in preparation and courses will be offered later on important phases of our church work.

4-Free Will Baptist Leagues-Courses of instruction will be offered in this field at an early date.

VI-YOUTH MEETINGS

In our "GO-FORWARD" Program we have five special objectives as follows:

1-To enlist 2000 young people in a vast program of activity and christian living.

2-To conduct at least four youth revivals in this division

3-To strive to win one hundred converts for Christ

4-To increase church attendance and growth in all departments of church life and activity through the young people

5-To multiply the trained and consecrated leadership of youth

In the special rallies held we have had thousands of young people to attend. Through this over-all casting to interest the young people, we have been reasonably successful. We are getting results. All this work will be followed with specific organization and training of our youth.

We have just commenced this work. Please remember; it is still in the infant stage, and please be patient with us. We are doing what we can, as best we can, with what we have to do with.

VII-THE FAMILY LIFE

The following resolution was adopted by the Executive Board in the meeting held September 24, 1951:

WHEREAS, there is a serious decline in the religious and spiritual life of the homes of America, and,

WHEREAS, our Free Will Baptist homes are no exception, and ,

WHEREAS, there is a definite need for a return to the devotional, religious, and spiritual life of the home, and,

WHEREAS, there is the necessity for training and direction of parents and future homemakers, therefore be it resolved:

1-That we add the family life EMPHASIS to our "GO-FORWARD" Program as one of the specific objects of the Program

2-That the Board of Education be charged with the responsibility of developing and promoting this phase of the Program

3-That when, and if practical, suitable literature, teaching, and training **be** given to our ministers and Sunday School teachers and officers, and others.

We shall do our best to carry out the requirements of this assignment.

AUXILIARY REPORT

The Cape Fear Woman's Auxiliary met in its two semi-annual meetings at Smithfield and St. Marys Grove. The Meetings were well attended and a new auxiliary was received at each meeting, making a total of twenty-six (26) organized auxiliaries. The total number of members is 550. Total receipts for the year amount to \$2,428.03 and disbursements amounted to \$2,113.23.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION

We have been engaged during the year with many problems for which we have sought the solution. We have approached every problem on a long-ranged basis. We have been confident that the solution to all of these problems was of momentous concern. Momentous for the reason that the success, or failure, of the new "GO-FORWARD" Program of the Conference depends upon the promotional activities of the Mission Board and the full cooperation of the ministers of the Conference, and such ministers as are pastoring churches within our Conference. With this in mind, we give you some of the special objectives of the Board as contemplated in the said "GO-FORWARD" Program.

1-Rehabilitation Of Present Churches: Every church in our Conference is operating under a very low percentage of their maximum ability. While it is true some are operating on a higher basis of efficiency than others, yet we need a program of rehabilitation of the churches. A program of rehabilitation will bring enlivened vision and new life, and if understood and faithfully promoted, our churches are capable of blooming, so to speak, like a rose in the valley.

2-Relocation Of Some Churches: Some of our churches are improperly located. Because of changing conditions, the building of new roads, and the general advancement in the communities in which they are located, the relocation of the church is most desirable. In most instances, the task of such relocation and the subsequent proper development of the church building and the church program is such that the churches need outside assistance. It is one of the proposed plans of the program to assist such churches and their pastor in such a relocation problem. **3-Rebuilding And Remodeling Churches:** The most of our churches need a rebuilding and remodeling program. The problems are complex. Within the congregations there are usually found carpenters who know very little about the proper design of a church building, but they can and will be helpful in preparing the plans of a church building. It is the aim of the Board of Missions to arrange for, and always in cooperation with the pastor and the local church, architectural services, etc, and in all cases, to have the plans approved by the Executive Board of the Conference. All churches should be rebuilt or remodeled on a standard modern basis with facilities for properly housing the Sunday School and other activities of the church. It should be the desire of every pastor and all the officials of our Conference to cease the building or remodeling of churches on such a fashion as to discredit our cause rather than adding credit and prestige to same.

4-Landscaping And Beautification Of Grounds: Every plot of ground on which one of our church buildings is located, regardless of the size or type, should be landscaped and beautified. Such grounds should thereafter be well kept. The attractiveness of such grounds or plots will add much to the public eye appeal and will show not only to the members, but to the general public that we do care, love, and respect that which we have dedicated to our Lord and Master. Your Mission Board will advocate and help the churches in the planning and developing of the church property.

5-Lord's Acre And Harvest Day Projects: One of the best means of financing the expansion program of any church is by means of these projects. They are sound and biblical. We have available literature on these projects. Some is for free distribution, and some will be for sale. Any minister or church member who desires to inform themselves and promote the project may not only have this literature available, but may likewise have the experience, wisdom, and cooperation of the Mission Board in the planning and development of these projects.

6-New Church Building Goals: We believe that with the foundation which we have laid, that if our Mission Board is permitted to continue its program without interruption, that beginning with the year 1952 we can build a minimum of five churches a year. We recognize the fact that it is one thing to organize a church, another to build, and another to maintain it, and that the organizing and building of churches and bringing them into our Conference as "white elephants" is dishonorable. We therefore propose that every new organization shall be properly organized, properly located, and that its building program, as it may be launched, shall be on a modern basis, and that the financing of same shall be conducted on a sane business basis. Whatever we do, we must do sanely and wisely and for the glory of our Lord and Master.

7-Promotion Of The Go-Forward Program: The entire resources of the constituency of the Conference should be placed squarely behind the program. We should move in unison; for in unity there is strength. The aim of the Board is to promote the conference program as it relates to Missions and church extension, and to coordinate its work with every other department of the entire program.

8-Cooperation With Other Agencies: Full cooperation should be had with our state and foreign mission program.

9-Distribution Of Literature: We recognize the effectiveness of the spreading of the Gospel through the printed page. This is as fundamental as the oral preaching of the Gospel. We can, and should, distribute annually thousands of pieces of Christian literature. We should produce much of this literature. We will produce and distribute literature bearing on the faith and doctrine of our beloved Denomination.

10-A Full Time Promotional Missionary: We have reached the place when we must think and plan in definite terms for the employment of a full time missionary on a salary and expense basis to promote this work. The members of the Mission Board are merely supposed to be directors of the program and the Board as is now constituted is made up of busy pastors or laymen. They cannot do this work. It is a full time job and if we get results, it must be placed on that basis.

11-Financing The Program: Our people are grand people. They will finance this work once they understand that it is being done on a safe and sound basis. We frankly believe that every dollar we need will be forthcoming. Ways and means will be announced and promoted from time to time.

12-Youth Revivals: There is a feeling and a demand upon us that we conduct a number of youth revivals in strategic places during the summer of each year, and that we use our young college students if these are available. Such places as are now in the making, when complete, will be announced. If these are successful, we must have the full and complete cooperation of our older ministers and our churches. We plead for this cooperation.

13-Missions And Evangelism Courses: The Board of Education will offer to our people in the near future two new courses of study; one in the field of Sunday School Evangelism, the other in missions. Since these subjects are related to our work, we shall go all out to make them effective.

14-The Christian Family: Although this responsibility is specifically assigned to the Board of Education, there is a need for full cooperation by this Board in stressing great Emphasis on a return to the Christian Family Life, and we shall feel obligated to the fullest extent.

During the year we have received for State Missions, \$5.50; for Foreign Missions, \$89.93; Cape Fear Missions, \$306.95.

We are confident that much more than \$89.93 has been given to our State and Foreign Mission work, but since it was not sent via this office as required the Cape Fear Conference has lost the credit.

A budget of \$600 for the year 1951-52 has been prepared and apportioned to the churches. We shall need this money as soon as our churches can make it available to us.

In conclusion, we beg to say to you that we can grow, we can develop into a strong and powerful people. It is up to us. Let us accept the challenge and go forward, remembering the statement of our God to Moses, "Speak unto the children of Israel, that they go forward."

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF ORDINATION

November 2, 1951

To the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists-Greetings:

We beg to report as follows:

We have held one meeting on July 18 for the purpose of giving a preliminary examination to prospective candidates for the ministry. At this meeting we examined Brothers Robert M. Fader, W. C. Odem, Lenard Woodall and W. A. Martin. These brethren having passed satisfactory preliminary examinations, we issued to their respective churches permission to grant the said applicants license to preach the gospel.

In this connection, we wish to respectfully call your attention to the requirements as stated in the new National Treatise, page 49, chapter 11, section 1-2.

"When a church desires that one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it requests the quarterly meeting or association of which it is a member to examine, by council, such member. The examination for license should refer to the piety and doctrines, the convictions and purposes respecting the work of the ministry, and the reputation for character and ability of the candidate, and his present and prospective educational and professional qualifications. The examination for ordination should include all that is required for license, and also satisfactory examination respecting the life and labors of the candidate, and his attainments, at least in the departments of english, education, doctrinal and pastoral theology and homiletics."

According to this regulation, churches cannot license or re-license a minister without the permission and written authority of this Board. We have no choice in the matter.

We have ordained one minister this year, Brother J. C. Hathaway.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

In accordance with the requirements and stipulations of the Constitution and the By-Laws of the conference, your Executive Board has endeavored to discharge the functions and duties required of the Board. We have been required to attend to many routine matters, as well as some very weighty matters. It is the purpose of this report, not to burden you with the routine matters, but to report on the more weighty and important matters.

In the meeting held on February 22, 1952, in our Smithfield Church, we were presented with a petition from the Raleigh Church, requesting the Executive Board to come to their rescue. After adopting suitable resolutions regarding a new set-up for the Raleigh Church, we authorized our Executive Secretary, Thomas E. Beaman, to arrange for a joint meeting with the Raleigh Church on February 29.

On February 29, we held a joint session with the church in Raleigh. At this time we presented the mutual regulations and agreements which we had drawn up and adopted in the meeting on February 22. The church adopted unanimously, the agreements. In these agreements we stipulated that joint ownership was to be acquired. A new financial set-up followed.

The necessary regulations and agreements having been established, we handed the entire assignment over to our Executive Secretary with instructions to proceed to execute them and to make his report when he had finished the assignment. We are attaching hereto, and making a part of this report, a specific report on the Raleigh Church, which gives the gist of his report.

In other meetings during the year, we handled routine matters with some consideration given to further arrangements and interests of the Raleigh Church.

On October 27, we held a meeting in Smithfield at which meeting we authorized the Moderator and Secretary of the conference to make application to our National Home Mission Board for a gift of \$500.00 for the Raleigh Church. We also, authorized the renewal of the applications to the State Mission Board and to our own Conference Mission Board for the renewal of our applications.

At this meeting we received into conference membership, Rev. Herman Hersey and Rev. Earl Glenn.

RALEIGH CHURCH

The First Free Will Baptist Church, located at 802 North Bloodsworth Street, Raleigh, North Carolina, did on the 16th day of February, 1952, petition the Executive Board of the conference for council, and assistance in the re-organization and administration of their church, throughout the period of their struggle to become securely established.

On February 22, the Executive Board did by suitable resolution accept the petition, and set up necessary rules and regulations for a working mutual agreement with the church at Raleigh, one of which joint title was to be acquired to the property.

A joint meeting of the Executive Board and the Raleigh Church was held on February 29, in the church building at Raleigh, resulting in the adoption of the plans and agreement which had been submitted in writing. The vote was unanimously in favor of the proposed arrangements.

Joint title has been acquired to the property. A new financial system set up. All indebtedness was ascertained and set up in order on the books. The pulpit was supplied by a joint pulpit committee until a regular pastor was secured. Rev. Herman Hersey was installed as resident pastor on July 1, on a full time basis.

The church has made wonderful progress under the new set up and under the leadership of the present pastor. Attendance, both in the Sunday School and the worship services has increased 300 per cent. This program, and the money having been retained in the treasury to be used in promotional work, has enabled us to salvage our Raleigh Church. But for this, we would have already lost the church and the investments which had been made.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE AND CIVIC-RIGHTEOUSNESS COMMITTEE

As your Temperance and Civic-Righteousness Committee and as ordained ministers of the gospel in the State of North Carolina, we believe that the Holy Bible is the divinely inspired Word of God and should be reverenced as such. Therefore, we recommend to your heading and admonition Romans, chapter 6 (verses 11-13 especially).

Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, that ye should obey it in the lusts thereof.

Neither yield ye your members as instruments of unrighteousness unto sin: but yield yourselves unto God, as those that are alive from the dead,

We believe that it is hard to be a pleasing servant if one is a reluctant disciple. We believe that he will be limited in influence and success if he does not lay aside the weights of the world and the questionable deeds which will mar his fruit-bearing. Unless parents practice temperance and civic righteousness, they cannot expect their children to do so. Likewise, ministers and laymen, as well as other Christian leaders, should lead strictly temperate lives. Society demands this of them, for their influence constantly speaks for or against moral reform and the improvement of society.

In every walk and relationship of life, whether in the home, the office, the factory, the field, the pulpit, or the legislative assembly, men should stand for civic righteousness and temperance. REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION

October 30, 1952

We have endeavored to make progress in all of the fourteen point program of your board. The accomplishments are far from what we would have them to be. However, we are happy to report that progress has been made. Some of the accomplishments will be made specifically stated on the specific report on the *Go*-

Forward Program.

1. TITHING CAMPAIGN: Your Board sponsored a Tithing Campaign. During the month of February, every minister of the conference and those pastoring in our conference was asked to preach a sermon on Tithing. Every Sunday School superintendent and teacher requested to cooperate through the Sunday School and all were requested to make a report in order that we might give to our people a report.

The following ministers made their report as requested: Leonard B. Woodall, Jr., Robert M. Fader, Gideon Stevens, W. A. Martin, J. Walter Stanley, C. M. Coates, C. H. Coates, Lloyd Vernon, L. R. Ennis, Thos. E. Beaman, Earl Glenn, W. O. Lassiter, Albert T. Coates, J. C. Hathaway.

Reports reveal the following:

- 1. Eighteen sermons on tithing were preached and heard by more than 3,000 people who were in attendance.
- 2. Ninety-seven new tithers were acquired. (Note: If their yearly income averaged \$1,000 per year—it would mean an increase in church offering of \$9,70 per year.)
- 3. Approximately 7,000 tracts and pieces of literature were distributed. The distribution of literature still goes on. Some pastors and teachers have written in as many as three times for additional tracts and pamphlets.
- 4. One hundred eighty-four of the 224 pastors, teachers and superintendents of Sunday School participated in the campaign which was the largest total number on record ever to co-operate in a single plan simultaneously on a Conference-wide scale.
- 5. We will reap in the future abundantly as a result of the investment we made in this endeavor.

II. \$100-A-MONTH CLUB: This club was organized under the directions of the Board of Missions, as a part of its planned program, to meet a long felt need for a fund especially ear-marked to aid the beginning of new churches. We have set a goal of \$100 a month. Hence, the name \$100-A-Month Club. Of course, we did not expect to reach the goal the first year, but gradually, we believe that we will have a membership sufficient to receive \$100 a month to this specially earmarked fund. This fund now amounts to \$323. The expenses for promoting this club has been paid by our regular Mission Funds. Hence, all money received is now in the hands of the treasurer of the Conference. Let us clearly understand now, that this money is *not* for use in helping churches already organized, but to be used in helping churches get organized and set up. The regular Mission Funds will be used for helping the now existing churches.

III. THE LORD'S ACRE PROJECTS: We sponsored three special regular conferences for study and understanding of the plans and methods. One was held at Oak Grove, one at Lee's Chapel and one at Smithfield. The pastors of the churches in each area, the Lord's Acre Committees and other interested individuals attended these conferences. Besides the holding of these special regional conferences, a special contact was made with approximately fifty individuals who did not attend these conferences. The result of these conferences has been that our people have been better informed as to the plans and purposes of the projects.

Several of our churches sponsored the Lord's Acre plan and in some instances they had a Harvest Day Sale. Reports have not been turned in from all of the churches, therefore, we cannot make a full report now.

Tee's Chapel deserves special recognition. A large number of members planted an acre. Others had chickens and hogs. Each project was marked with a sign "The Lord's Acre." The pastor and his church held a dedication service of each plot of ground so earmarked. Field scenes were also taken in motion picture. These crops have not all been harvested and therefore, no financial report can be given. Our Shady Grove Church also went all out for the Lord's Acre Project, marking each plot of land that was set aside for the "Lord's Acre." After the crops were gathered and converted into cash, the combined offering was made at the church worship services on Sunday, October 26. The total Lord's Acre and Harvest Offering was \$2,323.16.

Lee's Chapel Church had a very good Harvest Day Sale. The receipts from the sale which included the proceeds from the Lord's Acre Projects amount to \$1,182.

Daly's Chapel Lord's Acre and Harvest Sales netted them \$275.00.

IV. THE RALEIGH CHURCH: It has been necessary for us to aid our Raleigh Church in supplementing the pastor's salary and we have allocated for this purpose \$50.00 per month from June through October. It will also be necessary for us to continue this allocation for some time to come.

V. OTHER APPLICATIONS: We have other applications for assistance and we probably will be getting others during the coming year. If we help those who are appealing to us for assistance, we must have an additional income from our churches.

VI. DONATIONS TO MISSIONS: According to the best available information, the Conference Churches contributed to missions, including Foreign Missions, State and National Missions, and Cape Fear Missions, the sum of \$1,098.88 during the year.

Do we believe in Foreign Missions? Do we believe in our State Mission Program? Do we believe in our own Cape Fear Mission Program? Yes, indeed we do, to the large and staggering sum of \$1,098.88.

TRAINING PROGRAM

I. Free Will Baptist League

A course of instruction will be offered in the month of January in League Leadership Training. Institutes will be held at Kinston, Goldsboro, Smithfield, Raleigh and Lee's Chapel. We shall strive for a combined enrollment of 300. We have a very definite plan which we will follow.

II. Sunday School Training Course

Beginning the latter part of January, we will give another course in the ETTA cycle. The subject will be "World Wide Missions." The training centers will be the same as for the Leagues.

III. Students in the Bible College and Student Loan Fund

This year we have five students in our Bible College, Nashville, Tennessee. We must give some aid and assistance to these students. It will be necessary for us to increase our Student Loan Fund in order to help them continue their studies in our Bible College.

Churches, Sunday Schools, Leagues, Woman's Auxiliaries and individuals are requested to contribute this year to this fund. The earlier you can get in your contribution, the better, as it will be needed in the very near future.

IV. The Family Life

During the year we have giver. considerable emphasis to family life. One Union Meeting Session was devoted to the general discussion and emphasis and this phase of our *Go-Forward Program*.

We have authorized the procurement of available texts, pamphlets and booklets on the Family Life and authorized the writing of some for our own particular use. These we expect to distribute during the coming Conference Year.

This particular item of the *Go-Forward Program* was assigned to your Board of Education and we will continue to do our best to carry out the requirements of the assignment.

Institutes were held at Kinston, Goldsboro, Smithfield and Lee's Chapel, in which Institutes a course of instructions in "Sunday School Evangelism" was given. The enrollment was very gratifying, and the work accomplished by the students was commendable. We held a big rally in Smithfield following the completion of the course. The rally was well attended.

During the year, our churches contributed the following amounts to education: Goldsboro \$364.46; Robert's Grove \$64.00; Oak Grove \$7.35; Hopewell \$35.00; St. Mary's Grove \$35.00; Bethel \$82.00; Riverside \$5.00; Smithfield \$50.71; Johnson's Union \$56.83; Casey's Chapel \$41.20; Powhatan \$37.00 Total \$778.55.

We are confident much more money was given to education than is reflected in the above figures, but they gave it in such a way that we could not get the actual figures. Thus, the Cape Fear Conference looses the credit which rightfully would belong to us.

We issued several bulletins for the information and enlightening of our people.

We also mailed out several thousand bulletins and pamphlets about our college work in Nashville, Tennessee.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF ORDINATION, OCTOBER 31, 1952

To the Cape Fear Conference Original Free Will Baptists, Greetings:

We have held eight meetings of the board this year for the transactions of the business pertaining to the ministry. There has been a great deal of work required of us and we have performed the duties to the very best of our ability.

We have authorized the renewal of the license of all licentiate members, whose licenses had expired.

Brother Robert M. Fader, Kinston, North Carolina, having satisfactorily completed his examinations, we authorized his ordination. He was ordained in Bethel Free Will Baptist Church, Kinston, North Carolina on the 29th day of June, 1952, with Rev. C. H. Coates, Rev. L. R. Ennis, and Rev. Thos. E. Beaman officiating at the Ordination rites.

Brothers Leonard Woodall, Jr., and W. A. Martin completed satisfactorily their examinations. We ordained them in our Smithfield Church on October 27, 1952, with beautiful and appropriate ceremony administered by Rev. C. H. Coates, Rev. L. R. Ennis, Rev. Walter W. Reynolds, Rev. W. H. Lancaster, and Rev. Thos. E. Beaman.

We have been supervising and directing the studies and further requirements of a number of our younger ministers who have been ordained and those whose ordination is pending and these brethren have made considerable progress in their studies.

We are happy to report that during the year, none of our ministers have died.

The ministers of the Conference have met in four regular sessions during the year and one emergency session for fellowship and consultation in matters pertaining to the general work of our conference.

We have done more work this year as a board than any one year during the history of the Conference and we have had to devote a considerable amount of time and expense during the year to properly discharge the duties and functions of this board. We have the satisfaction that we have accomplished a great deal and feel that much of the labors will bear much fruit. Besides ordaining Brother Robert M. Fader, Brother Leonard Woodall, Jr., and Brother W. A. Martin to the Gospel Ministry, whose names we request be enrolled on the official list of ministers, we have also recommended the admission to membership in the conference Rev. Herman Hersey, pastor of our Raleigh Church, and Rev. Earl Glenn, pastor of our Smithfield Church. These latter two ministers having been admitted to membership by the Executive Board, we request their official registration.

We wish to again respectfully call to the attention of our churches, the requirements as stated in the new National Treatise, page 49, chapter 11, section 1-2.

When a church desires that one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it requests the quarterly meeting or association of which it is a member to examine, by council, such member. The examination for license should refer to the piety and doctrines, the convictions and purposes respecting the work of the ministry, and the reputation for character and ability of the candidate, and his present and prospective educational and professional qualifications. The examination for ordination should include all that is required for license, and also satisfactory examination respecting the life and labors of the candidate, and his attainments, at least in the departments of English, education, doctrinal and pastoral theology and homiletics.

According to this regulation, churches cannot license or re-license a minister without the permission and written authority of this Board. We have no choice in the matter.

We are also happy to report that the harmony and fellowship of the ministers of your conference is excellent.

We wish to respectfully call your attention to provisions in the Constitution of the Conference Article 7, which reads as follows: "Each church shall contribute to the Conference program \$10.00 annually for each 100 members, or fraction thereof."

This means that if a church has less than 100 members, they pay the \$10.00

for the fraction thereof. But if the church has 101, and less than 200 members, they will pay \$20.00.

The above is in no sense meant to reflect on anyone, or any church. It is a factual matter as provided in the Constitution. We are sure that many churches did not so understand.

We would respectfully request those churches which have overlooked, or failed to send in the correct amount, mail in the balance due as soon as possible.

In the first day session we received from Lee's Chapel Church, \$40.00 for Cape Fear Missions. The worship offering was \$32.30. \$80.00 was received as Conference Funds. The above receipts were not included in the Treasurer's report, for the reason they were received after the report had been mimeographed.

The reports reveal the following additional information:

1. Total Value of church property \$217,000.00; 2. Received by letters-42; 3. Statement-none; 4. Baptized-166; 5. Dismissed-99; 6. Died-28; 7. Increased Net-197; 8. Decreased-93; 9. Male Members-1,693; 10. Females-2,721; 11. Under 13-58; 12. Total membership-4,432; 13. Sunday School enrollment-3,632; 14. Woman's Auxiliaries-575; 15. League Membership-305; 16. Ministerial Support-\$24,840.48.

Note: Totals of other items are shown in other reports. We are not repeating here.

Some Accomplishments and Future Plans Under the Go-Forward Program

Daly's Chapel: Purchased an additional acre of ground. Sowed grass, planted shrubs, completely remodeled church, new windows, doors, underpinning, painted, new pews, new aisle rug. They plan to improve cemetery, add two Sunday School rooms and a small tool house. Rev. Thos. E. Beaman, pastor.

Oak Grove: Fixed the pulpit, new pews, bought five new chairs and table. Rev. M. E. Godwin, pastor.

Riverside: Hauled gravel, built four Sunday School rooms, new ceiling in main church, sanded and finished floors, new pulpit stand and new furniture, new rugs, three oil heaters, new light fixtures, new steps and porch extension, repainted entire building, bought new chairs for Sunday School rooms and new song books. Immediate plans are to add two more Sunday School Rooms over the present ones. Rev. C. M. Coates, pastor.

Bethel (Johnston): Building Sunday School rooms now. Graded grounds and established lawn and parking area. Rev. Lloyd Vernon, pastor.

Shady Grove: Painted inside and out-1950. Activity building (outside now complete). Plans are to finish activity building and furnish with rest rooms and kitchen. Rev. L. R. Ennis, pastor.

St. Mary's Grove: Pulled up stumps and leveled yards. Future plans are to set out trees. Rev. J. B. Ferrell, pastor.

Raleigh: Living quarters for pastor repaired. Remodelled church and class rooms. Enlarged pulpit, painted two class rooms, put two rugs in class rooms, remodelled front of church. Rev. Herman Hersey, pastor.

Corinth: Built a road to church, turned church around, built a cement front

and had church underpinned. Rev. C. H. Coates, pastor.

West Clinton: Purchased pews for church, added five Sunday School rooms, closed in two rest rooms. Plans are to paint outside and inside and complete rest rooms; put shrubbery on grounds and dispose of old buildings. Rev. J. Walter Stanley, pastor.

Smithfield: Laid walks and stepping stones, landscaped yards, church remodelled, constructed a parsonage for approximately \$10,000. Full time pastorate, Rev. Earl Glenn.

Prospect: Has constructed and paid for new modern brick building at a cost of approximately \$25,000. Converted the old church building into an educational building. Rev. C. H. Coates, pastor.

St. John's: Build an annex, enlarged auditorium, installed new lighting and heating systems. Built vestibule, acquired additional land, landscaped and beautified with shrubbery. Cost approximately \$8,000.00. Sunday school increased from membership of 113 to 135. Church attendance from 22 to 225. Rev. Thos. E. Beaman, pastor.

Bethel (Lenoir): Constructed a chapel at a cost of \$5,500.00. Plans are to construct educational building and later remodelling sanctuary. Rev. Thos. E. Beaman, pastor.

Yelverton's Grove: Constructed a new church building. Rev. J. Walter Stanley, pastor.

Lee's Chapel: Built additional Sunday School rooms. Acquired additional land. Installed new heating system. Installed new pews. Rev. C. H. Coates, pastor.

St. Paul: They plan to remodel the building and build Sunday School rooms. Rev. Warren Mallard, pastor.

Goldsboro: Added one Sunday School room, new heating system, under the pastorate of Rev. Rashie Kennedy. They plan to build first unit of Educational Building, under the pastorate of Rev. Walter W. Reynolds.

Casey's Chapel: Plans are for the redecoration of the present building inside and for installation of heating system, underpinning building. Rev. Dan Beaman, pastor.

Other Churches: Made improvements, including Powhatan, Johnson's Union, and Steven's Chapel. Detailed information not available.

S. S. 1951 enrollment was 3,299–1952 enrollment 3,632, a gain of 333. Records show gains each year under the *Go-Forward Program*, a justification for the program.

The majority of our teachers and officers of the Sunday Schools have been taking training to better prepare themselves for more effective usefulness. Our ministers, largely speaking, are taking the courses of instructions given by the Board of Education. The training program will be re-activated in January, and will include special training in League Leadership.

I have spent approximately three and one-half months this year in the interest of the Cape Fear Conference and the Program. I have furnished the Conference office space, the use of Water, Lights, telephone service, office equipment, etc., without charge. The expenses in the proper conduct of the business have been held to a minimum. The items of expenses will be shown in the Treasurer's expenses.

The accomplishments truly justify the investments in time, talents, labor and money.

Indeed, we are going *forward* with the work of the Kingdom as represented by the Cape Fear Conference.



The Report of the Executive Board

We tender the following report of service rendered and business transacted on the behalf of the Conference, and the *Christian Cause* during the past year.

Feb. 23, 1953—Meeting at Home of Rev. C. H. Coates

Plans approved and authorized involving an appeal to the churches of the conference for funds to meet the current installment of the Raleigh church debt. The following were appointed to visit two churches each for this purpose: H. T. Hinson, Bruce Gromodella, Owen Thomas, Warren Jackson, Kirby West, J. D. Balance, Franklin Young, and Mrs. Carl Dudley.

Application to the Church Finance Association for loan to re-finance the indebtedness of the Church of Raleigh, was authorized.

The LORD ACRE AND HARVEST DAY plan of securing funds to meet larger church budgets and special allocations was appraised and the Board of Missions authorized to promote the plan along the line pursued in 1952, and Albert T. Coates, chairman, was directed to proceed with this promotional work.

At the request of St. John Church, the Executive Board of the conference agreed to undertake to restore fellowship, and working condition, among the members of the church. Rev. L. R. Ennis was authorized to make plans for a meeting with the said St. John Church.

March 10, 1953—Meeting at St. John Church

The Executive Board was authorized by vote of the church to direct the affairs of the church for as long a period of time as deemed necessary for the purpose above stated.

July 6, 1953—Meeting at Home of Rev. L. R. Ennis

November Union meeting program was prepared. Report on the Raleigh Church was presented and discussed. A motion was passed to tender an agreement for the Raleigh Free Will Baptist Church to increase the pastor's salary to \$60.00 a week as of July 1, 1953.

Plans and specifications of a proposed Educational Building for the Bethel Church, Kinston, N. C., were examined and approved, subject to the recommendations that the architect revise the plan on the departmental basis rather than the class basis.

August 30, 1953—Meeting at St. John Church

The Executive Board presided according to authorization of the church and the working conditions were re-established, the descenting members having transferred their membership to a church of another denomination during the interval, since the church conference of March 10, 1953. Trustees of the church were elected and the former pastor, Rev. Thomas E. Beaman, elected and has resumed the pastoral care.

Report of the Cape Fear Mission Board October 29, 1953

Whereas, on Sept. 17, 1953, our beloved brother and member of your Mission Board, Brother N. C. Strickland, passed away:

We recommend that a resolution of respect be passed at this conference for his faithful service rendered to God while serving the Cape Fear Conference.

May we bow our heads in a moment of silent prayer and meditation at this time.

Your Mission Board held its first meeting Feb. 5, 1953, for the purpose of planning our Conference Mission Program. Every member was present from the Raleigh Church and Rev. L. R. Ennis representing the Conference Executive Board.

In this meeting we set as our aim:

- 1-To promote the mission program of the conference in all our churches.
- 2-To help in setting up proper mission points when they were brought to our attention.
- 3-To help organize sound Free Will Baptist churches.
- 4-To promote the Lord's Acre Project and Harvest Sale.
- 5-To cooperate with the State and National Mission Boards and ask every church in the conference to cooperate, for Jesus said, "Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel."

The following is a copy of the minutes of the Mission Board meetings:

Smithfield-Feb. 5, 1953

The meeting was opened with prayer and roll call of members with every member present.

The progress of the Raleigh Church was discussed and Rev. Herman Hersey, pastor, gave a very informative report of the work.

His report showed that there were 39 members when he assumed the pastorate, 44 new members had come into the church, and the Sunday school had an enrollment of 76 with an average attendance of 67. A strong league was also reported.

There was \$521.86 raised in the state-wide mission drive for the debt retirement and the Raleigh Church raised \$288.23 of this amount.

The State Mission Board made an appropriation of \$150.00 in Sept. 1952.

Plans were made for the Raleigh Church to make application to the State Mission Board for future support and your Mission Board chairman was instructed to send out letters to pastors and others in an effort to raise additional funds for the debt retirement of the church.

The meeting was closed with prayer.

Smyrna-March 28, 1953

This meeting was opened with prayer and a discussion followed in regards to the raising of additional money to help the Raleigh Church meet its installment on April 5, 1953.

Further discussions were held in regards to offering financial aid to Smyrna and Lanwood Chapel Churches.

Our chairman read a copy of his letter of appeal that went out to every minister pastoring in our conference in regards to raising money for the debt retirement of the Raleigh Church.

The Mission Board met on Sept. 29, 1953, and again on Oct. 27, 1953, for the purpose of discussing and preparing its report to this conference.

Lord's Acre and Harvest Day Projects

St. John's-Approximately \$800.00 cleared. Projects not completed. Fellowship and co-operation excellent.

Daly's Chapel—Approximately \$260.00 cleared. Projects not completed. Fellowship and co-operation excellent.

Beautification of Church Grounds

St. John's-Assumed the planned program. The grounds are now well kept. Additional shrubbery will be planted, and the place once again becoming a place of scenic beauty.

Daly's Chapel-The planned program, which is extended over a 5 year period, is being followed up. Additional plants have been set. Grass sown and this place is becoming a place of beauty.

Bethel (Lenoir County)—This church has a good lawn and shrubbery around the present building. This church has a planned program of beautification.

Hopewell—Built a recreation building with large assembly room that can be divided into 3 classrooms. There is a 6-foot hall through the length of the building and an electrically equipped kitchen. There is also a ladies' and men's lounge and bathroom. This building project cost approximately \$4,500.00.

The Woman's Auxiliary sponsored a barbecue supper at Four Oaks that netted about \$750.00; the harvest sale of tobacco netted about \$220.00; the harvest sale of produce netted about \$900.00; cash donations about \$700.00; total \$2,570.00.

Free Will Baptist Bible College-

Our Bible College opened in September with 60 new students, representing 18 states and Cuba. There were 150 students of which 52 were from North Carolina. The college has made tremendous gain and is doing a marvelous job. We urge our people to give their loyal support to the college. We have here today for free distribution, a good supply of the college bulletins which tells a good story of the college work.

Mount Allen Junior College-

The Board of Education of the North Carolina State Convention in September of this year, purchased the old school property in the town of Mt. Olive, N. C., for the sum of \$25,000 dollars, paying down, \$4,000 and financing \$21,000 over a period of 18 months. It is the intention of the Board of Directors to begin operation of the school on November 9, 1953.

Training Program

Free Will Baptist Leagues Training Program-

In the month of January we held Institutes at Kinston, Goldsboro, Smithfield, Raleigh, and Lee's Chapel Churches. The enrollment far exceeded our goal of 300. This training program will be continued in 1954.

Sunday School Training Program-

Institutes were held in Kinston, Goldsboro, Raleigh, Smithfield, and Lee's Chapel Churches. The course of instruction offered was on *World Missions*. The enrollment was approximately 150.

The Family Life-

It is the aim of your Board, to give much emphasis on this subject in the next year's program. We are gathering materials now for use in conducting institute training in 1954.

Students in Bible College-

We have been working with young people and directing their attention toward the Bible College, and we have some students in College now, and are expecting more to enter in the near future. We shall presently find their training will pay our denomination big dividends.

Correspondence Courses-

The Free Will Baptist College, Nashville, Tennessee, is now offering Correspondence Courses, and we urge those who are interested to write direct to the College for information and enrollment blanks. This training will afford those who would like farther preparation for Christian service and opportunity for limited training.

Report of the Board of Ordination, 1953 Session

Greetings to the Cape Fear Conference of Free Will Baptists:

We are happy to tell you that none of our ministers have died during the year for which we are grateful to our heavenly Father. The health of our ministers is about as usual.

We have performed the regular routine duties during the year, and have rendeavored to be faithful in the performance of our duties.

During the year we have ordained two ministers, namely: Brothers Wm. F. Speicher and James Earl Raper, with appropriate ceremonies. We ask that their names be recorded in the list of ministers.

In order to have an organized and up-to-date record of the regulations governing our work, we have gone through the minutes and records, and have set them in regular order. This does not embody any new regulations, but are the regular duties assigned to the Board. They are as follows:

By-Laws for the Ordaining Council

1. The Ordaining Council shall be at liberty to organize and operate independent of any and all boards, and shall be required to answer only to the annual Conference of Churches in regular session or the Executive Board.

2. It shall be the duty of the Council to examine all applicants for license as prescribed in the National Treatise.

3. The Council shall examine all applicants for ordination, when a request is made by some church that wishes his services as pastor, and shall issue to him a suitable certificate of ordination.

4. The Council shall not be at liberty to ordain any man to the gospel ministry who cannot furnish sufficient proof of a Divine call and reasonable preparation which qualifies him for any and all duties required of a pastor.

5. The Council shall have power to issue certificates of ordination to applicants on a time basis, or probation, and request him to study as long as the Council deems necessary.

6. The Council shall have power to recall any certificate which it has issued to any man, when and if he has failed to comply with any and all agreements made between the Council and bearer.

7. The Council shall be charged with the responsibility of disciplinary measures of all ministers and their ministerial labors.

8. These By-Laws shall be in full effect when approved by the annual Conference in regular session.

9. Any amendment to these By-Laws shall be presented to the annual Conference in writing and shall be approved by at least a 75% vote of the delegates and preachers present. All amendments shall be on the table 6 hours before the vote is taken.

Brother Coates agreed to take responsibility of promoting the emphasis for re-activation of the \$100 a month club. Quite a bit of correspondence has gone out to our churches in interest of this project, but, to report the actual returns, would be impossible at this time. We would rejoice were our people to align themselves until at least 100 persons were giving at least \$1.00 each month with which to spread the Gospel and organize new churches in the bounds of the Cape Fear Conference. There are several places at this time presenting a challenge to us in opportunities afforded.

We agreed on full co-operation in whatever projects might develop of interest for setting up of new stations, and voted to assist in the development of a new church at Buies Creek. We rejoiced that the organization is reported.

Having received no reports of projects entered into and improvements made, we are only able to report in a general way. It has come to our attention that Shady Grove realized above \$2,000.00 in returns from a harvest sale. The women of the Goldsboro Church promoted an improvement program of some \$700.00 value at their parsonage and furnished a guest room, while the church added a \$1,500,00 musical instrument to the church assets. It is reported that St. John and Daly's Chapel engaged in a Lord's acre program, however harvesting of the crops is incompleted. We regret failure to be able to make full report of all of our churches' activities which should come through our board, but we pledge a more complete accounting in the future.

It is encouraging to be able to say that at least nineteen of our twenty-eight churches have responded in promotional effort as stewards of the Gospel of Christ. No doubt the nine have done something, but failed to keep books as they should. The nineteen reporting supported financially in a missionary way by giving \$816.25 to Foreign Missions, \$142.97 to National Home Missions, \$241.66 to State Missions, and \$67.86 to Cape Fear Missions. This makes a grand total of \$1,268.56.

We would love to recommend that every church establish one designated hour of prayer weekly in which prayer is made for spiritual revival among us, for an effective program for spreading the Gospel, and that our people may begin giving themselves to the Lord and to their churches as personal soul-winners.

Your Board of Education offers below a suggested pledge form for Sunday school teachers and officers to sign. It is presented as a courtesy service only and may be revised or altered to meet your needs. Those pastors and superintendents who are now using such a pledge form find it most effective. They are getting results. Under this plan they allow no one to hold office or to teach in Sunday school unless they sign the pledge, nor to continue to serve unless they live up to their pledge.

Sunday School Teacher and Officer's Pledge

Realizing the great responsibility that has been placed upon me as a teacher

or officer and that the church has placed its confidence in me, I humbly and prayerfully sign the articles of this covenant and will, with God's help, be faithful and true to my office:

- 1. I will now re-dedicate my life to God and ask Him to use me as His servant.
- 2. I will prayerfully and faithfully study each Sunday school lesson. I will use the Word of God, also my experience and knowledge as a means of improving the spiritual lives of my students and lead the lost to Christ.
- 3. I will attend all services of my church and will encourage my pupils to do likewise.
- 4. I will co-operate with the pastor and superintendent in all things. I will attend every Sunday school council meeting. I will attend any training classes that are offered to make me a more efficient teacher or officer.
- 5. I will notify the superintendent and my assistant teacher or officer when I am sick or on vacation.
- 6. I will visit my pupils as opportunity presents itself and will try to get new ones in my class.
- 7. I will co-operate with the extension superintendent in helping him get the lessons to those who are sick.
- 8. I will abstain from all worldly amusements and will do nothing that will be a reproach to my Christian testimony.
- 9. I will use only the teaching material that has been approved. I will learn the doctrines and belief of our Church and will teach the same to my pupils.
- 10. I will teach and practice stewardship principles as taught in the Bible with respect to my money, time, and talents.
- 11. I will resign if at any time I am unable or unwilling to cheerfully carry out the articles of this pledge.

Note: It is suggested that this pledge be signed once a year by every officer and teacher. This can effectively be done at an annual installation service.

Proposed By-Laws Governing the Board of Education

1. The Board shall be composed of five members. Their term of office shall be as provided for in the Constitution.

2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, an executive secretary, who shall have charge of the promotional work of the Board. Provided, however, that any two offices my be combined at the option of the Board, and provided further, that the executive secretary may, or may not be, a member of this Board.

3. The treasurer of the conference, shall, unless otherwise provided for, hold all funds of the Board and disburse same on order of the Board, or when duly signed by the chairman and secretary of the Board. Annual reports of all receipts and disbursements shall be made to the conference in session and interim reports to the Executive Board when requested.

4. The Board shall meet as often as necessary for the proper dispatch of the work assigned to it by conference direction, but must meet at least twice a year.

5. The Board shall make, or cause to be made, adequate records of the meet-

ings of this Board, detail records, reports, etc., of all activities of the Board and its officers, and preserve same as permanent records.

6. This Board shall be charged with the responsibility of co-operating with our state and national educational institutions in the promotion of general Christian Education.

7. The organization, direction, and the training program of Free Will Baptists Leagues shall be under the direction and supervision of this Board.

8. The general supervision of the Sunday school promotional activities, organization of new Sunday schools, training programs for workers, and any and all other Sunday school promotional programing shall be the responsibility of this Board.

9. This Board shall be charged with the responsibility of making, or cause to be made, emphasis on the Christian family life.

10. This Board shall be responsible for conducting area institutes, and conferences, on a conference-wide scale, annually to instruct and help our people when necessary to have a better understanding of our conference, state or national programs.

11. It shall be the responsibility of this Board to direct and supervise all training programs of the conference.

12. The Board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the responsibilities assigned to it, provided, however, that the same shall not be inconsistent with these By-Laws, nor the Constitution of the conference.

13. These By-Laws may be amended, or revised, at any annual session of the conference, provided that such amendments, or revisions as may be deemed necessary, shall lie on the table at least three hours before a vote is taken, during which time they shall be read twice, and provided further, that such amendments or revisions shall require a two thirds vote.
