REVEREND HERMAN RUDOLPH FAIRCLOTH

These minutes respectfully dedicated to the memory of Reverend H. R. Faircloth February 15, 1882—October 20, 1957 On February 15, 1882, in LaGrange, North Carolina, a son was born to Mary Ann Whitley and Benjamin Franklin Faircloth. This was their first born. A daughter born later completed the family. They named the child Herman Rudolph Faircloth, a name that was to be loved among many Free Will Baptists.

Herman grew up in LaGrange and received his education in the local schools. When he became old enough he found employment at a local buggy shop where he became an expert buggy maker. During those years he met Lula Gray and they were married in 1902. From this union there were nine children, three boys and six girls born. There were twins born but died at birth, and one daughter, Doris Lee, who died at the age of two.

In 1912, at Bethel Church in Johnston County, he was ordained to the ministry. This began a life of unusual devotion and work to the call of the ministry. In his work he organized two churches, LaGrange and Smithfield in 1928, and was pastor of twenty-five churches. His first pastorate was Daly's Chapel, and his last was Old Field.

He moved to Johnston County in 1920 in order to be near the churches that he served. It was in 1945 that he retired from active pastoral work, but he continued to conduct revivals and do supply work. On October 12, 1952, God saw fit to call home his dear companion. Then on October 20, 1957, he went to join his beloved and be with the Lord.

Those who knew him best loved him for his humility and his love for lost souls. They praise him for his ability to adjust to any situation. He was a fearless preacher who traveled by horseback and buggy to preach Christ, and in the last days of his life in a modern age was found faithful to the Christ he loved. Isaiah 61:1, 2 was truly a description of his life's work: "The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me; because the LORD hath anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek; he hath sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to them that are bound; to proclaim the acceptable year of the LORD, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all that mourn."

# PROCEEDINGS

The one hundred third annual session of the Cape Fear (Original) Free Will Baptist Conference convened with the Shady Grove Church, Sampson County, North Carolina, on Thursday and Friday, October 31 and November 1, 1957.

### Thursday Morning Session, October 31

The Cape Fear Conference opened its annual session at 10:00 a.m., Thursday morning, with the singing of the hymn, "He Keeps Me Singing."

Rev. J. C. Griffin conducted the morning devotions, using for his Scripture text the second chapter of Hebrews, and closing with the singing of "Amazing Grace."

A very hearty welcome was extended to the visiting ministers and delegates by the host pastor, Rev. N. B. Beaman. The response was given by Brother J. D. Ballance.

The moderator made a very appropriate address to the session at this time using as his text, Romans 1:16.

Then the moderator recognized the following visitors: Rev. Bruce Barrow, Central Conference; Rev. James E. Raper, Arcadia, South Carolina; Rev. J. C. Griffin, Eastern Conference; Rev. W. Burkette Raper, Mount Olive College.

After a short recess the congregation joined together in singing the hymn "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus," prayer by Rev. Clyde Clearman,

hymn "Love Lifted Me." After this, the worship offering was taken, prayer by Rev. Leonard B. Woodall, followed by singing "I Am Thine, O Lord."

The introductory sermon was brought by Rev. Thomas E. Beaman. Scripture was Exodus 14:15; subject: "We Shall Go Forward," which was a great challenge to us.

Following this, the congregation joined in singing "Rescue the Perishing." Benediction by Rev. R. W. Allman.

Recess for lunch.

### Afternoon Session

The afternoon session opened with the congregation singing "Take the Name of Jesus With You." Prayer by Rev. Bruce Barrow.

The devotions were given by Rev. R. W. Allman, Scripture 1 Kings 20:14; subject, "Responsibility of a Christian."

The report of the ordination board was given by Rev. Herman Hersey and adopted with reservations as to constitutional amendment which will be voted on in second day's session. We were very happy to welcome two new ministers, Rev. Cecil Rose and Rev. R. W. Allman. (See report.)

At this time Rev. Bruce Barrow was recognized and brought an oral report from the State Convention and the Free Will Baptist Press.

The report of the executive board was given by Rev. Thomas E. Beaman and adopted. (See report.)

The report of the board of education was given by Rev. Thomas E. Beaman and was adopted, with reservations as to amendment which is to be voted on in seconds day's session. (See report.)

The report of the mission board was given by Rev. A. B. Bryan and adopted. (See report.)

A report of the contributions of the churches to the conference was given by Rev. Herman Hersey. A motion was made, seconded and passed that this report be amended by the secretary, to show all the contributions sent in by the time the minutes were to be printed. Adopted. (See report.)

Brother Wade Stephenson was recognized at this time and made some very stirring remarks concerning our educational needs.

A motion was made, seconded and passed that the executive board be authorized to have a copy of the constitution and bylaws gathered together and printed in the minutes of the 1957 session of this conference.

A motion was also made, seconded and passed that the minutes of the 1957 session of the Cape Fear Conference be dedicated to the memory of Rev. H. R. Faircloth.

There being no other business, a motion was made, seconded and passed to adjourn the first day's session of the conference to meet again Friday morning at 10:00 a.m. Rev. Leonard B. Woodall led the congregation in singing "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." Benediction by Mrs. Elizabeth Casey.

### Friday Morning Session, November 1

The second day's session of the Cape Fear Conference reassembled at 10:00 a. m. with the moderator presiding. The session began with the congregation singing "All Hail the Power."

The morning devotions were conducted by Rev. Chester Phillips; Scripture reading from Ephesians 2; concluded by singing of hymn, "Blessed Assurance."

The business session was called to order by the moderator and the following visitors were recognized:

Rev. Wilbert Everton, Central Conference; Rev. Paul Jenkins, Western Conference; Rev. Angus Prevatte, Reynard, North Carolina.

The reading of the minutes of the first day's session was omitted.

The first order of business was a vote on the constitutional change as carried in the report of the board of ordination, brought in the first day. The vote was favorable and the change was carried. (See report.)

The next was a vote on an amendment to the bylaws affecting the board of education, this was also passed. (See report.)

Rev. W. Burkette Raper was recognized at this time and he gave a report of the condition and needs of Mount Olive Junior College, which was received as information.

The report of superannuation was given by Rev. Wilbert Everton and received as information.

The report of the Church Finance Association was given by Rev. W. Burkette Raper and received as information.

The report from the Free Will Baptist Children's Home was given by Mrs. S. A. Smith.

At this time we were dismissed for a short recess. Benediction by Brother Waitus Lee.

Conference was reopened with congregation singing "There Is a Fountain." Responsive reading No. 497; prayer by Rev. J. Walter Stanley, followed by the singing of "If Jesus Goes With Me." After this the worship offering was taken.

The morning sermon was brought by Rev. L. R. Ennis. Scripture was taken from Acts 1:8; Romans 1:16; 1 Corinthians 15:1-4; subject, "The Gospel We Believe." After a very inspiring message, the congregation joined in singing "Make Me a Channel of Blessings." Benediction by Rev. W. H. Lancaster.

Recess for lunch.

### Afternoon Session

The conference reassembled for the afternoon session with the congregation singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms," followed by prayer led by Rev. Wilson Parker. Rev. Leonard B. Woodall conducted the afternoon devotions using for his Scripture, Psalm 24.

At this time the report from the Free Will Baptist College, Nashville, Tennessee, was given by Rev. J. R. Davidson. A special appeal was made that each church send an offering of \$100.00 to the school. The report was received as information.

The report of the woman's auxiliary was given by Mrs. Herman Hersey. (See report.)

At this time Mrs. Carl Dudley, state president of the woman's auxiliary, was recognized.

The treasurer's report was given by Brother H. T. Hinson and adopted. (See report.)

The report of the nominating committee was given by Brother E. E. Best and adopted. (See report.)

The report of the resolutions committee was given by Rev. L. R. Ennis and adopted. (See report).

The report of the temperance committee was given by Rev. Thomas E. Beaman and adopted. (See report.)

The report of the obituary committee was given by Rev. J. Walter Stanley and adopted. (See report.)

On motion the executive board was authorized to appoint delegates to the state and national conventions in due process of time.

Also a motion was made and passed that the minutes of this session of the conference be approved by the executive board and the usual number be printed and distributed to the churches.

Petitions were received for the next session of the conference. By vote the next session will convene with St. Mary's Church in Johnston County.

A motion was made and passed that the session give a rising vote of thanks for their service to the following board members who are retiring:

Mrs. Earl Lockamy, Board of Education; Rev. A. B. Bryan, Mission Board; Brother H. T. Hinson, Mission Board.

At this time Rev. A. B. Bryan was recognized and asked for a letter of transfer to the Albemarle Conference. A motion was passed to grant his request, with our regrets at seeing him leave.

There being no other business, a motion was made, seconded and passed that this session be adjourned.

The congregation joined together in singing the hymn, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." Benediction by Rev. W. H. Lancaster.

The next session will convene with St. Mary's Grove Church, Johnston County, North Carolina, on Thursday morning before the first Sunday in November, 1958.

# REPORTS

### **Report of the Ordaining Council**

We beg to submit herewith our annual report.

We have had several meetings during the past year and attended to all routine matters claiming our attention.

During the year we examined and ordained two ministers, namely: Brothers Thurman Hall and Cecil Rose, with appropriate ceremonies. We ask that their names be added to the list of ordained ministers.

We submit the following resolution:

"Whereas, consistency of caption as applied to official boards created by the several Free Will Baptist conferences of North Carolina is both desirable and required in consequence of an act adopted by the Cape Fear Conference, as requested by the State Convention, in its annual sssion in 1955 which prescribes the use of the appellation 'Ordaining Council' instead of 'Board of Ordination'; therefore be it resolved:

"1. That Article 6 of the constitution of the Cape Fear Conference be amended to read 'Ordaining Council' in lieu of 'Board of Ordination.'

"2. That all contingent usage be changed to confrom to the amendment herein prescribed."

### **Report of the Executive Board**

During the year we have held two sessions in which sessions we attended to all routine matters claiming our attention.

In the meeting on March 18, 1957, held in our Goldsboro Church, we received the report of a special committee composed of Rev. Thos. Beaman Sr., Rev. A. B. Bryan, Rev. L. R. Ennis, Rev. Herman Hersey and Mrs. Norvell Dawson appointed on September 10, 1958, to revise the "Go-Forward Program."

The committee recommended that the program continue as already established with the exception of the financial division of funds, and that beginning with the 1957 session all general funds received through the conference, union meetings and any other subordinate body that may be hereafter established, be divided as follows: Fifty per cent of total sum for work for the conference:

1. Twenty per cent for Administration

2. Fifteen per cent for Education

3. Fifteen per cent for Missions

Twenty-five per cent of total sum for the State Convention program:

1. Ten per cent for State Missions

2. Five per cent for Children's Home

3. Five per cent for Mount Olive Junior College

4. Three per cent for Superannuation

5. Two per cent for Cragmont Assembly

Twenty-five per cent of total sum for the National Association program:

1. Ten per cent for Foreign Missions

2. Ten per cent for Bible College

3. Three per cent for National Home Missions

4. Two per cent for National Superannuation

The committee's report was adopted with the understanding it was to be submitted to the conference for ratification.

In the March 18 meeting we also authorized the trustees of the conference to execute a deed in fee simple to the trustees of the Community Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, Buies Creek, N. C., conveying our equity to the said church.

In a meeting in Smithfield, N. C., on September 9, 1958, we attended to general routine matters regarding the 1957 session.

Suggestions were mailed to every Sunday school superintendent and teacher to aid them in promoting this program. A total of 395 pieces of mail were sent. We furnished 3,000 tracts to our churches.

### 3. Student Loan Fund

We have loaned to Miss Eula Mae Martin from our Student Loan Fund the sum of \$125.00. The loan is secured by note with good endorsement. According to the terms of the note it bears 1% interest while the student is in training or until September 1, 1958, at which time a new note is to be made bearing interest at 6%, with payments of \$15.00 per month on principal until the note is fully paid.

Miss Martin is in training for a missionary nurse. She is the daughter of our Rev. W. A. Martin.

At the last meeting of the board of education we transferred \$200.00 to the Student Loan Fund account. We want every member of the Cape Fear Conference to have a share in building up this fund. Money for education of our youth is needed.

Each church is being asked to conrtibute the sum of 20c per member

to the Student Loan Fund. This is a small amount from each church; but it would give us an additional \$900.00 in this fund. Each church should raise their quota of 20c per member as soon as possible.

4. Proposed Amendments to the Bylaws Governing the Board of Education

We recommend that bylaw 13 read as follows:

"The board shall be responsible for the promotion and administration of a Student Loan Fund with which to aid worthy students in securing an education."

We recommend that bylaw 14 read as follows:

"The board shall lend money only upon the following terms and conditions:

"A. Students must be adjudged worthy as to character and ability, and must attend an institution of learning approved by the board.

"B. A promisary note must be made by the student, with one or more good endorsements, or other good security satisfactory to the board. The rate of interest shall be 1% while the student is in training. After completion of training a new note shall be made bearing 6% interest with monthly or quarterly payments to be made until obligations are fully discharged."

We recommend that the present bylaw 13 become No. 15.

#### 5. PROGRAM FOR 1957-58

A number of things have been assigned to the work of the board of education. We here submit a month by month summary of activities sponsored by the board of education.

November, 1957—Pastors' and Deacons' Conference—An excellent program has been prepared. I will be held in our Smithfield Church, Tuesday, November 4, beginning at 7:30 p.m: An interesting talk will be given by one of our laymen on "The Problems of Youth Today," and Rev. Ronald Creech will preach. This is one conference pastors and deacons cannot afford to miss.

November, 1957—Church and Sunday School Libraries—Bulletins, book lists and complete instruction regarding the operation of church libraries will be mailed the latter part of the month.

January, 1958—Music and Worship Workshops—These will be held on an area institute basis, two nights in each area. Topics to be taught are:

1. History of Church Music

2. What is Worship?

3. Arranging Orders of Service

4. Training the Amatuer Choir

5. Effective Song Leading.

Bulletins will be mailed as to time and place in January.

February, 1958—Study Courses for Children—One of the talented women of our conference is writing a study course entitled, "What My

Church Believes." A complete teachers guide will be prepared and a training class for teachers will be held. These teachers in turn will teach this course to the children of their church.

February, 1958-League Emphasis-Training classes and reactivating our present leagues.

March, 1958—Sunday School Teacher's Training Month—One of our capable ministers, Brother Chester Phillips, is writing a study course on Free Will Baptist Doctrine using the treatise as a guide. This course will be taught in five areas: Raleigh, Smithfield, Lee's Chapel, Goldsboro and Kinston.

April, 1958—Sunday School Workshop—A giant Sunday school workshop is being planned for a Sunday afternoon.

May, 1958—Pastors' and Deacons' Conference—Program to be announced.

June, July and August, 1958-Vacation Bible School Emphasis!

June, July and August, 1958—Personal Evangelism Study Courses—The Personal Evangelism Manual, written by Herman L. Hersey, will be reactivated and taught on a local church basis. This Manual belongs to the board of education and is available at 50c a copy.

September, 1958—Sunday School Training Month—Plans for this will be announced.

October, 1958—Area Bible Conferences—This will be the greatest project ever undertaken in our conference program. We will meet in three areas (Lee's Chapel, Smithfield and Goldsboro) for two nights in each area. On these nights we will have outstanding Bible teachers to speak to us. We will expect to have overflow attendance at these area Bible conferences. 6. BUDGET

### Bylaws Governing the Board of Missions

1. The board shall be composed of five members. The first named shall be for a term of one year, the second for two years, the third for three years, the fourth for four years, the fifth for five years and thereafter, for a term each of five years.

2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, and an executive secretary, who shall have general charge of the promotional work of the board. Provided, however, that any two offices may be combined at the option of the board, and provided, further, that the executive secretary may, or may not, be a member of the board.

3. The board shall meet as often as may be deemed necessary and attend to all matters pertaining to missions within the territory of the Cape Fear Conference, but must meet at least twice a year.

4. The treasurer of the conference shall hold all funds designated for Cape Fear missions and pay out same on order of the board, or when said order is duly signed by the chairman and the secretary of the board. Annual reports shall be rendered to the conference of all funds received and disbursed.

5. All persons doing work that merit compensation must first apply to the board on approved forms, and receive authorization to do work under regulations of the board before they can be compensated for same with mission funds.

6. Mission points, or stations, may be opened and maintained by the board for such a length of time as may be deemed best, employ evangelists, missionaries, and such field workers as may be deemed necessary for the proper promotion of the mission work.

7. The board shall not make any investment in property, nor promote any investment in property, without first giving due consideration to the safety of the investment, property titles, and other matters relative to the security of any investment.

8. No person shall be at liberty to enter upon any approved mission point, without first consulting the board and receiving its approval as to place, plans and purposes.

9. The board shall render annual reports to the conference, and interim reports to the executive board when requested.

10. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the mission program, provided that same shall not be inconsistent with these bylaws. 11. These bylaws may be amended or revised at any annual session of the conference, provided that such amendments and revisions, as may be deemed necessary, shall lie on the table at least three hours before the vote is taken, during which time they shall be read at least twice, and provided that such amendments shall require a two-thirds vote.

# Constitution and Bylaws

### Of the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists Of North Carolina

### ARTICLE I

Name—This organization shall be known as the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina and by this name shall it be designated in all its work, government and fraternal relations.

### ARTICLE II

Composition—This conference shall be composed of the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, all general officers of the conference, the members of standing boards, or committees, the president of each subordinate general organization, and the following churches together with those that may subsequently be admitted.

Bethel (Johnston), Bethel (Lenoir), Casey's Chapel, Corinth, Daly's Chapel, Goldsboro, Hopewell, Johnson's Union, Lanwood, Chapel, Lee's Chapel, Oak Grove, Pleasant Grove, Powhatan, Prospect, Riverside, Robert's Grove, Raleigh, Shady Grove, Smyrna, Smithfield, St. John, St. Mary's Grove, St. Paul, Steven's Chapel, Tee's Chapel, West Clinton, Wooten's Chapel, Yelverton's Grove.

### ARTICLE III

Purpose—The general purpose of this conference shall be the exaltation of Christ, the great head of the church; the edification of its members, through effective teaching and mutual encouragement in the use of the manifold means of grace; the unification of the methods and programs of its affiliated churches and subordinate organizations; and the coordination of persistant efforts in church extension, Christian education, benevolence and evangelism.

### ARTICLE IV

Representation—Every church affiliated with the Cape Fear Conference shall represent in its annual sessions with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof, and each subordinate general organization shall represent with three delegates. Reports of approved delegates shall be rendered by each church and subordinate organization at the yearly session of the conference.

#### ARTICLE V

Officers—The general officers of this conference shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of two years. The term of office for all general officers shall begin at the close of the annual session at which they are elected. Temporary officers, representatives or messengers may be elected at the option of the conference for whatever purposes deemed essential.

### ARTICLE VI

Boards and Subordinate General Organizations—It shall be the method of this conference to simplify its work by the assignment of specific functions to representative units of authority which shall hereafter be known as standing boards and subordinate general organizations. A board of trustees, a board of education, a board of missions and an ordaining council consisting of five members each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be five years but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the tenure of office of one member annually.

Section 1.—Standing boards and subordinate general organizations shall have authority to write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to the authority and approval of the conference.

Section 2.—The executive board shall be composed of the general officers of the conference, the president of each subordinate general organization and the chairman of the board of education, the board of missions, and the board of ordination. Membership on this board shall be contingent upon and by virtue of the aforesaid offices held by its members.

Section 3.—Temporary committees shall be appointed at the option of the conference for whatever purposes deemed expedient.

### ARTICLE VII

Finance—Each church shall contribute to the conference program \$10 annually for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. All funds shall be allocated by the executive board for the purposes and objects approved by the conference.

### ARTICLE VIII

Admission of Churches—Any properly constituted church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Free Will Baptists and a desire to conform to the policy and program of the Cape Fear Conference may submit its petition for membership through an official delegation at any annual session of the conference. If the petition for membership be approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates and declare them duly seated.

### ARTICLE IX

Fraternal Delegations and Visitors—Fraternal delegations and visitors shall be extended all the privileges of the conference except that of voting, serving on committees or holding elective offices.

### ARTICLE X

Meetings—The Cape Fear Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday and Friday before the first Sunday of November. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session, or by the executive board. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive board should such a change become necessary.

### ARTICLE XII

Amendment—This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present, provided that the proposed amendment shall not be found in conflict with the general policy of Free Will Baptists.

#### Bylaws

Section 1.—The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Cape Fear Conference; to appoint temporary committee, delegates and representatives; to fill irregular vacancies that may occur between the general sessions of the conference; to serve as ex-officio member of all standing boards and subordinate general organizations; to sign official documents that require the signature of the moderator; encourage amicable relations among ministers of the conference; the co-operation of the churches and subordinate general organizations in the promotion of the program and work of the conference.

Section 2.—The duties of the assistant moderator shall be those of the moderator when the latter shall so direct or when he is absent.

Section 3.—The secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Cape Fear Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. He shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents, not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require his signature; and act as exofficio member of the executive board.

Section 4.—The duties of the assistant secretary shall be those of the secretary when the latter shall so direct, or is absent.

Section 5.—The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, the executive board, or any standing board or subordinate general ordanization invested of the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report according to the conference. He shall serve as ex-officio member of the executive board.

Section 6.—The executive board shall have power to act in the behalf of and for the Cape Fear Conference from one regular session to another. It shall organize at will and discharge the administrative duties assigned to it. It shall supervise the work of the union meeting, plan its programs, and allocate to the objects approved by the conference all undesignated funds both of the conference and the union meeting.

Section 7.—The board of trustees shall hold in trust, all personal and

real property, gifts and bequests, and convey or expend said property or assets as the Cape Fear Conference may direct.

Section 8.—Standing boards shall have power to organize at will, to write their own bylaws, and to carry out the general purposes for which they are constituted. They shall remain subordinate to the conference and report their accomplishments at its annual sessions.

Section 9.—The following temporary committees shall be appointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: Obituary, temperance, resolutions, credentials, nominations and letter digest.

Section 10.—The general officers of the Cape Fear Conference shall be elected for a term of two years and said term shall begin immediately following the session at which they are elected.

Members of standing boards shall be elected for a term of five years and said term shall begin at the close of the session of the conference at which they are elected. It is provided, however, that the first member elected shall serve for a term of one year, the second for a term of two years, the third for a term of three years, the fourth for a term of four years, and the fifth for a term of five years; and that successions in office thereafter shall take place as order requires—each for a term of five years.

Section 11.—All reports, resolutions and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

Section 12.—The voting sign shall be "Aye" and "Nay," or any other sign the moderator may deem appropriate to the question.

Section 13.—No minister, officer or delegate shall be at liberty to retire from the building during a session of the conference without the consent of the moderator.

Section 14.—These bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds favorable vote of the members present at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference.

# UNION MEETING

### Cape Fear Conference Original Free Will Baptists

### CONSTITUTION

### ARTICLE 1

Name—This organization shall be known as the Union Meeting of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

### ARTICLE II

Purpose—The purpose of this union meeting is the creation of an effective agency through which the Cape Fear Conference may successfully promote its work. It shall thus be and remain subject to the authority and use of the conference—except in the election of its general officers—as a consistent medium devoted to the advancement of the conference program of evangelism, education, benevolence and church extension.

### ARTICLE III

Composition—This union meeting shall be composed of churches affiliated with the Cape Fear Conference, the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, and all general officers and members of standing committees of both the conference and the union meeting.

### ARTICLE IV

Representation—The churches of the Cape Fear Conference shall represent in the quarterly sessions of the union meeting with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall each represent with one delegate.

### ARTICLE V

Finance—Each church shall send with its delegation to the quarterly sessions of this union meeting one per cent of its annual budget exclusive of funds for building and equipment, or a total of four per cent of the church budget for the full year of four union meeting sessions. Sunday schools, leagues and auxiliaries shall represent with whatever amounts they may choose. All funds shall be allocated by the executive board of the conference, but said allocations shall be approved by the union meeting in regular session or by the conference.

#### ARTICLE VI

Officers—The general officers of this union meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, at the last session of the union meeting before the annual session of the Cape Fear Conference.

#### ARTICLE VII

Boards and Committees—All standing committees and boards created

by the conference shall avail themselves of the advantages of promoting their work through the union meeting.

The general officers of the union meeting shall be added to the executive board of the conference and this composit committee shall constitute the executive committee of the union meeting. This committee shall have power to act for and on the behalf of the union meeting between its regular sessions. It shall also be the duty of the executive committee to prepare and supervise the programs of the union meeting and to allocate all undesignated funds.

#### ARTICLE VIII

Meetings—The union meeting shall hold its regular sessions Saturday before each fifth Sunday in the churches of the Cape Fear Conference. The host church shall be selected from time to time, according to the alphabetic succession of the initial letter of the name of each church. This method of selecting the place of meeting may be changed, when deemed expedient or necessary, by an act of the union meeting in session or the executive committee.

### ARTICLE IX

Amendment—This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference by a majority vote of the members present, provided that the proposed amendment presented in writing by the union meeting.

### Bylaws Governing the Board of Education

1. The board shall be composed of five members. Their terms of office shall be as provided for in the constitution of the conference.

2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and executive secretary, who shall have charge of the promotional work of the board. Provided, however, that any two offices may be combined at the option of the board, and provided further, that the executive secretary may, or may not be, a member of this board.

3. The treasurer of the conference shall, unless otherwise provided for, hold all funds of the board and disburse same on order of the board, or when duly signed by the chairman and secretary of the board. Annual reports of all receipts and disbursements shall be made to the conference in session and interim reports to the executive board when requested.

4. The board shall meet as often as necessary for the proper dispatch of the work assigned to it by conference direction, but must meet at least twice a year.

5. The board shall make, or cause to be made, adequate records of the meetings of this board, detail records, reports, etc., of all activities of the board and its officers, and preserve same as permanent records.

6. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of co-operating

with our state and national educational institutions in the promotion of general Christian education.

7. The organization, direction and the training program of Free Will Baptist leagues shall be under the direction and supervision of this board.

8. The general supervision of the Sunday school promotional activities, organization of new Sunday schools, training programs for workers, and any and all other Sunday school promotional programing shall be the responsibility of this board.

9. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of making, or cause to be made, emphasis on the Christian family life.

10. This board shall be responsible for conducting area institutes, and conferences, on a conference-wide scale, annually to instruct and help our people when necessary to have a better understanding of our conference, state or national programs.

11. It shall be the responsibility of this board to direct and supervise all training programs of the conference.

12. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the responsibilities assigned to it, provided, however, that the same shall not be inconsistent with bylaws, nor the constitution of the conference.

13. The board shall be responsible for the promotion and administration of a Student's Loan Fund with which to aid worthy students in securing an education.

14. The board shall lend money only upon the following terms and conditions:

A. Students must be adjudged worthy as to character and ability, and must attend an institution of learning approved by this board.

B. A promissory note must be made by the student, with one or more good endorsements, or other good security satisfactory to the board. The rate of interest shall be 1% while the student is in training. After completion of training, a new note shall be made bearing 6% interest with monthly or quarterly payments to be made until obligations are fully discharged.

15. These bylaws may be amended or revised at any annual session of the conference, provided that such amendments, or revisions as may be deemed necessary, shall lie on the table at least three hours before a vote is taken, during which time they shall be read twice, and provided further, that such amendments or revisions shall require a two thirds vote.
