

### PROCEEDINGS

The one hundred twelfth annual session of the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with Lee's Chapel Church on November 3, 4, 1966.

#### THURSDAY MORNING SESSION, NOVEMBER 3, 1966

The Cape Fear Conference opened its annual session Thursday morning at 10 a. m. with the singing of the hymn, "I Am Thine, O Lord."

The devotions were given by the Reverend James Guy, using Scripture from Hebrews 11:1.

The Reverend Henry Armstrong, host pastor, graciously welcomed everyone to Lee's Chapel Church. The Reverend James A. Evans gave the response.

The Reverend J. W. Everton, moderator, declared the meeting opened for business.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the proposed program, granting the moderator the privilege to make any necessary changes.

A partial report of the Ordaining Council was given by the Reverend Walter Reynolds. The report was adopted. (See partial report.)

A report from Mount Olive College was given by Miss Hilda F. Owens. The report was adopted. (See statistical report.) A collection for Mount Olive College was taken.

The State Missions report was given by the Reverend A. B. Bryan. The report was adopted. (See statistical report.)

The Reverend Walter Reynolds gave a verbal report from the Free Will Baptist Press. The report was received as information.

The Reverend Walter Reynolds gave the Superannuation report. The report was adopted. (See statistical report.)

Mrs. R. Y. Stephenson gave the report of the Woman's Auxiliary Convention. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The worship hour was opened with congregational singing "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus," led by the Reverend W. Royster Martin, with Mrs. H. T. Hinson, pianist. Prayer was by the Reverend W. H. Lancaster. The song, "When We All Get to Heaven" was sung by the congregation. The Reverend W. A. Martin brought an inspiring message using for his Scripture 1 Corinthians 6:19, 20. His topic was, "The Working of the Holy Ghost."

#### THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session was begun by singing the hymn, "He Keeps Me Singing." Devotions were by the Reverend Swade Benson. Prayer was offered by the Reverend W. H. Lancaster.

A partial report of the Credentials Committee was given by the Reverend M. E. Godwin. He reported 33 delegates, 20 ministers, 19 visitors, 5 officers, and 8 visiting ministers. A supplement report of the Ordaining Council was given by the Reverend Walter Reynolds. Motion carried to adopt report. (See report.)

A report of the Board of Education was given by Reverend Raeford Lee. Motion carried to adopt report. (See report.)

A motion was made to send registration fees for each delegate attending the General Conference. Motion carried.

The Reverend Taylor Hill confirmed that the 1967 session of the conference had been invited to the First Free Will Baptist Church in Fayetteville. The invitation was accepted.

The motion carried that the conference adjoun until Friday morning at 9:30 a. m.

The Children's Home report was given by the Reverend M. L. Johnson. Motion carried to adopt the report. (See statistical table.) An offering for the Children's Home was taken. The offertory prayer was by the Reverend E. C. Morris.

The worship hour opened by the congregation singing the hymn, "Love

Lifted Me." Prayer was offered by the Reverend Felton Godwin.

Dr. W. Burkette Raper, president of Mount Olive College, brought an inspiring message using Scripture from Mark 1:16. Dr. Raper pointed out that we can only have true meaning in our lives only by accepting the call of Jesus Christ.

The Reverend David Barrow prayed the benediction and asked God's blessings on the noon meal: Recessed for lunch. ad sibrža oba spiralo<u>u</u>.

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In the absence of the moderator, the Reverend James A. Evans, assistant moderator, opened the session with the congregation singing the hymn, "Jesus Saves." Mr. H. T. Hinson led in prayer.

A verbal report was given by Mr. A. F. Ballance for the Church Finance Association. Motion carried to accept the report as information.

The final report of the Credentials Committee was given by the Reverend M. E. Godwin. Motion carried to accept the report. (See report.)

The final report of the Ordaining Council was given by the Reverened Walter Reynolds. Motion carried to adopt report. (See report.) [1]. C. Hathaway, has not attended the conference for two years. A motion was made and carried that he be given an opportunity to appear before the ordaining council to give his reason for not attending the conference.

The following is quoted from recommendations made at the 1964 session of the conference: "... that the ministers of the Cape Fear Conference be required to attend the annual sessions of the conference in person or by letter; and if they fail to do so for two consecutive sessions, their names be dropped from the roll of ministers and their credentials called for; and that the ordaining council be charged with the responsibility of carrying out the provisions of the recommendation, assisted by the clerk of the conference."

A motion was made by the Resolutions Committee to give a standing

vote of appreciation to the host church for its generous hospitality. Motion carried.

The treasurer's report was given by Mr. H. T. Hinson. Motion carried to accept the report. (See report.)

A motion was made to give the treasurer a rising vote of appreciation for his work in the conference. Motion carried.

A motion was made to allow the Executive Committee to authorize the treasurer to place any surplus monies in a savings account. Motion carried.

The Nominating Committee report was given by Mr. W. Milton Wiggs. Motion carried to accept the report. (See report.)

A motion was made that the conference give a rising vote of appreciation to the Reverend Walter Reynolds and the Reverend Ed Taylor for their work on the Ordaining Council. Motion carried.

Dr. W. Burkette Raper invited the 1970 session of the conference to Mount Olive. Invitation was accepted.

A motion was made that the conference recommend to the churches to send \$2 each to Union Meetings designated for the chapel at Mount Olive College. Motion carried.

Motion was made and carried to leave all unfinished business to the Executive Committee.

By motion the conference adjourned.

The benediction was offered by the Reverend Lloyd Vernon.

Larry Coates was ordained into the ministry. The charge was made by the Reverend C. M. Coates. The Bible was presented by the Reverend W. O. Lassiter on behalf of the Board of Education. The prayer of ordination was prayed by the Reverend Walter Reynolds.

A motion was made and carried that the moderator and assistant moderator proceed investigating the petition and report back to the Executive Committee.

On May 6, 1966, representatives of the Executive Committee counseled with a group desiring to establish a church within the bounds of the Cape Fear Conference.

At the direction of this group, the names appearing on the before

mentioned petition was forwarded to Bethel Church with the request that they be dismissed from the church.

The committee met May 13, 1966, at Johnston Union Church. Present at this meeting were the pastor and deacons of Bethel Church and the Reverend Walter Reynolds.

A motion was made that the Executive Committee send the names of the members who requested that their names be removed from the petition to Bethel Church. Motion carried.

A motion was made that the copy of the petition and names be sent to Bethel Church as information. Motion carried.

Following the above mentioned action, the Executive Committee requested that the Cape Fear Mission Board counsel and work with the above group.

The committee met July 29, 1966, at Saint Paul Church. A motion was made that the standing boards and committees prepare their reports and present them to the conference in typed form. Motion carried.

In a meeting of the committee held on October 4, 1966, a motion was made that the Executive Committee accept the resignation of the Reverend Walter Reynolds from the Ordaining Council to be effective as of October 25, 1966. Motion carried.

A motion was made that the Executive Committee appoint the Reverend M. E. Godwin to fill the unexpired term of Brother Reynolds on the Ordaining Council. Motion carried.

### REPORT OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION

The Cape Fear District Woman's Auxiliary has held two conventions this year. The spring convention was held Wednesday, April 13, 1966, with Shady Grove Church and the fall convention was held with Casey's Chapel Church on Tuesday, October 11, 1966. These conventions were well attended and were both inspirational and informative.

There are 22 auxiliaries with a membership of 371 composing the convention which sponsors three youth organizations: the Youth Fellowship Auxiliary, Ambassadors for Christ, and the Cherub Auxiliary. These auxiliaries have a membership of 222 and are growing.

The convention supports the missionary program of the state and at present is assisting with the raising of funds for the Joe Barrows, who are contemplating the mission field.

The convention is continuing to give to the Thousand Dollar Club at Mount Olive College, contributed to the landscaping of the college campus, and gave books to the college library.

Five children at the Children's Home are sponsored by auxiliaires in the district. Support has been given to all projects of the Children's Home.

Assistance has been given to Cragmont Assembly in the current projects.

Statistically, the convention has contributed to all phases of our denominational work in the amount reported of \$4,637.84.

This shall be the constitution of the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist Churches of North Carolina.

#### dentification (India PURPOSE

The object of the Cape Fear Conference shall be to promote Christ's kingdom among men by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

#### ARTICLE I. COMPOSITION

This conference shall be composed of affiliated ordained ministers and churches within its bounds, who are in good standing, and of all general officers, and members of standing boards or committees of the conference. It shall operate under the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina. No church corporation whose articles or incorporation or constitution and bylaws conflict with the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptsts of North Carolina shall be permitted membership in the Cape Fear Conference.

#### ARTICLE II. REPRESENTATION

Each church shall represent with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. The delegation from each church shall carry to the conference a letter certifying their appointment, and giving the statistics and financial condition of the church; together with a statement of all funds received and disbursed for denomination and benevolent purposes during the year.

#### ARTICLE III. OFFICERS

The officers shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a tresurer, who shall be elected for a term of two years, entering upon the duties of said office at the close of the session in which they are elected. Temporary officers, representatives, or messengers, may be elected at the option of the conference for whatever purposes deemed essential.

#### ARTICLE IV. STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the policy of this conference to elect as many boards and committees as may be necessary in carrying out its program. These shall keep records of their proceedings and make a report at each annual session of the conference.

A board of trustees, a board of Christian education, a board of missions and church extension, and a board of ordination consisting of five members geach shall be elected gray. The term of office for members of these board shall be five years, but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the tenure of office of one member annually.

Section 1—Standing boards shall write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to their conference.

Section 2—The executive committee shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, secretary, treasurer, and one member elected by the conference at the time of the official election of officers.

Section 3—Temporary committees shall be appointed at option of the conference for whatever purpose deemed necessary.

## article v. finance

Each church shall contribute to the conference annually according to its membership.

#### ARTICLE VI. ADMISSION OF CHURCHES

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina and desires to help promote the program and work of the Cape Fear Conference and the North Carolina State Convention, may present its petition to the regular session of the conference. If the petition for membership is approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the dele-

#### ARTICLE VII. DISMISSION OF CHURCHES

#### ARTICLE VIII. VISITORS

The Cape Fear Conference may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of the body save that of voting and holding office.

#### ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS

The Cape Fear Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday and Friday before the first Sunday in November. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session or by the executive coinmittee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary. act of the executive comments and BYLAWS

Section 1—The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parilamentary procedure, over thes sessions of the Cape Fear Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates, and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and committees; and in general, to perform the duties of the office of moderator.

Section 2—The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the moderator when that officer is not present and he shall assist the moderator when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the moderator, the assistant moderator shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the conference.

Section 3—The secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Cape Fear Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. The secretary shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents, not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require the secretary's signature; and serve as a member of executive board.

Section 4—The duties of the assistant secretary shall be the duties of the secretary when that officer is not present, and he shall assist the secretary when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the secretary, the assistant secretary shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the conference.

Section 5—The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, the executive committee, or any standing board invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report to the conference.

Section 6—It shall be the duty of the executive committee to transact the business of the conference when the conference is not in session, and make report at annual conference. The executive committee shall plan the program for the annual session of the conference.

Section 7—The board of trustees shall hold in trust all conference and real property, gifts and bequests of the conference, and convey or expend said property or assets as the Cape Fear Conference may direct.

Section 8—It shall be the duty of the board of ordination to examine, ordain, and discipline ministers in keeping with the provisions of the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, along with whatever additional requirements may be made by the conference. The board of ordination shall examine ordained ministers seeking membership in this conference and make recommendations in keeping with their findings.

Section 9—It shall be the duty of the board of missions and church extension to cooperate with the churches of the conference to promote the establishment of churches within the bounds of the conference. The board of missions and church extension shall cooperate with the state board of missions to raise money, arrange itineraries, and keep the work of missions before our churches.

Section 10—It shall be the duty of the board of Christian education to keep our people informed as to our educational needs, and endeavor to promote the cause of and stimulate interest among our people in the cause of Christian education. The board of Christian education shall cooperate

with the educational institutions of our denomination and use all funds for best interest of Christian education.

Section 11—The following temporary committees shall be appointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: credentials, nominating, resolutions, temperance, obituary, and letter digest.

SECTION 12—A board or committee will be recognized as having a quorum when there is a majority of the members present for a meeting, providing all the members of said board or committee have been duly notified concerning the said meeting.

Section 13—All reports, resolutions, and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

Section 14—Each minister and delegate in good standing shall duly attend each day while the conference is in session or be subject to censure by the conference and reported to his local church.

Section 15—If any member, in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his seat in that session.

Section 16—No member shall be excused from any session of the conference without leave of the moderator.

Section 17—The conference shall adjourn by a majority vote.

Section 18—Each officer and member of standing committees and boards in good standing shall be entitled to a seat and vote in the conference.

Section 19—The conference shall open and close with suitable devotional services.

Section 20—This constitution and its bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds favorable vote of the members present, provided that said amendment shall be presented on the first day of the annual session for action on the following day.

Name—This organization shall be known as the Union Meeting of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

Purpose—The purpose of this union meeting is the creation of an effective agency through which the Cape Fear Conference may successfully promote its work. It shall thus be and remain subject to the authority and use of the conference-except in the election of its general officers-as a consistent medium devoted to the advancement of the conference program of evangelism, education, benevolence and church extension.

#### ARTICLE III

Composition—This union meeting shall be composed of churches af-filated with the Cape Fear Conference, the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, and all general officers and members of standing committees of both the conference and the union meeting.

#### ARTICLE IV

Representation—The churches of the Cape Fear Conference shall represent in the quarterly sessions of the union meeting with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall each represent with one delegate.

### ARTICLE V

Finance—Each church shall send with its delegation to the quarterly sessions of this union meeting one percent of its annual budget exclusive of funds for building and equpiment, or a total of four percent of the church budget for the full year of four union meeting sessions. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall represent with whatever amounts they may choose. All funds shall be allocated by the executive board of the conference, but said allocations shall be approved by the union meeting in regular session or by the conference.

#### ARTICLE VI

Officers—The general officers of this union meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, at the last session of the union meeting before the annual session of the Cape Fear Conference.

#### ARTICLE VII

Boards and Committees—All standing committees and boards created

by the conference shall avail themselves of the advantage of promoting their work through the union meeting.

The general officers of the union meeting shall be added to the executive board of the conference and this composite committee shall constitute the executive committee of the union meeting. This committee shall have power to act for and on the behalf of the union meeting between its regular sessions. It shall also be the duty of the executive committee to prepare and supervise the programs of the union meeting and to allocate all undesignated funds.

### ARTICLE VIII

Meetings—The union meeting shall hold its regular sessions Saturday before each fifth Sunday in the churches of the Cape Fear Conference. The host church shall be selected from time to time, according to the alphabetic succession of the initial letter of the name of each church. This method of selecting the place of meeting may be changed when deemed expedient or necessary, by an act of the union meeting in session or the executive committee.

### ARTICLE IX

Amendment—This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference by a majority vote of the members present, provided that the proposed amendment be presented in writing by the union meeting.

#### BYLAWS GOVERNING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

- of office shall be as provided for in the constitution of the conference.
- 2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and executive secretary, who shall have charge of the promotional work of the board. Provided, however, that any two officers may be combined at the option of the board, and provided further, that the executive secretary may, or may not be, a member of this board.
- 3. The treasurer of the conference shall, unless otherwise provided for, shold all funds of the boards and disburse same on order of the board, or when duly signed by the chairman and secretary of the board. Annual reports of tall receipts and disbursements shall be made to the conference in session and interim reports to the executive board when requested.
- 4. The board shall meet as often as necessary for the proper dispatch of the work assigned to it by conference direction, but must meet at least twice a year. It is not a second of the brook of the board of the bo
- meetings of this board, shall make, or cause to be made, adequate records of meetings of this board, detail records, reports, etc., of all activities of the board and its officers, and preserve same as permanent records?
- 6. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of cooperating

with our state and national educational institutions in the promotion of general Christian education.

- 7. The organization, direction, and the training program of Free Will Baptist league shall be under the direction and supervision of this board.
- 8. The general supervision of the Sunday school promotional activities, organization of new Sunday schools, training programs for workers, and any and all other Sunday school promotional programming shall be the responsibility of this board.
- 9. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of making, or cause to be made emphasis on the Christian family life.
- 10. This board shall be responsible for conducting area institutes, and conferences, on a conference scale, annually to instruct and help our people when necessary to have a better understanding of our conference, state, or national programs.
- 11. It shall be the responsibility of this board to direct and supervise all training programs of the conference.
- 12. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the responsibilities assigned to it, provided, however, that the same shall not be inconsistent with bylaws, nor the constitution of the conference.
- 13. The board shall be responsible for the promotion and administration of a Student's Loan Fund with which to aid worthy students in security and education.
- 14. The board shall lend money only upon the following terms and conditions:
- A. Students must be adjudged worthy as to character and ability, and must attend an institution of learning approved by this board.
- B. A promissory note must be made by the student, with one or more good endorsements, or other good security satisfactory to the board. The rate of interest shall be 1% while the student is in training. After completion of training, a new note shall be made bearing 6% interest with monthly, or quarterly payments to be made until obligations are fully discharged.
- 15. These bylaws may be amended or revised at any annual session of the conference, provided that such amendments, or revisions, as may be deemed necessary, shall lie on the table at least three hours before a vote is taken, during which time they shall be read twice, and provided further that such amendments or revisions shall require a two-thirds vote.

#### BYLAWS GOVERNING THE BOARD OF MISSIONS

- 1. The board shall be composed of five members. The first named shall be for a term of one year, the second for two years, the third for three years, the fourth for four years, the fifth for five years and thereafter for a term each of five years.
  - 2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secre-

tary, and an executive secretary, who shall have general charge of the promotional work of the board. Provided, however, that any two officers may be combined at the option of the board, and provided, further, that the executive secretary may, or may not, be a member of the board.

- 3. The board shall meet as often as may be deemed necessary and attend to all matters pertaining to missions within the territory of the Cape Fear Conference, but must meet at least twice a year.
- 4. The treasurer of the conference shall hold all funds designated for Cape Fear missions and pay out same on order of the board, or when said order is duly signed by the chairman and the secretary of the board. Annual reports shall be rendered to the conference of all funds received and disbursed.
- 5. All persons doing work that merit compensation must first apply to the board on approved forms, and receive authorization to do work under regulations of the board before they can be compensated for same with mission funds.
- 6. Mission points, or stations, may be opened and maintained by the board for such a length of time as may be deemed best, employ evangelists, missionaries, and such field workers as may be deemed necessary for the proper promotion of the mission work.
- 7. The board shall not make any investment in property, nor promote any investment in property, without first giving due consideration to the safety of the investment, property titles, and other matters relative to the security of any investment.
- 8. No person shall be at liberty to enter upon any approved mission point without first consulting the board and receiving its approval as to place, plans, and purposes.
- 9. The board shall render annual reports to the conferences and interim reports to the executive board when requested.
- 10. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the mission program, provided that same shall not be inconsistent with these bylaws.
