The one hundred thirteenth session of the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with First Free Will Baptist Church of Fayetteville, on November 2 and 3, 1967.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION, NOVEMBER 2, 1967

The Cape Fear Conference opened its annual session Thursday moming at 10 a. m. with the singing of the hymn, "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus."

The devotions were given by Rev. James E. Howard, pastor of St. Mary's Grove Free Will Baptist Church, Route 3, Benson.

CAPE FEAR CONFERENCE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY REPORT

The Cape Fear District Woman's Auxiliary has held two conventions this year. The spring convention was held the second Wednesday in April at Mount Olive College. The fall convention was held the second Tuesday in October at the First Free Will Baptist Church in Goldsboro.

There were 21 auxiliaries reporting with a membership of 419. These sponsored 13 Youth Fellowship Auxiliaries, 10 Ambassadors for Christ, one Cherub Auxiliary, and one Scout Troop.

There were four declamation participants and two essay entries from which two were state winners.

Twenty-six campers went to Cragmont; 8 children at the Children's Home are sponsored by auxiliaries; 3 auxiliaries supplement a minister's superannuation check; and 4 ministers' widows are likewise supported.

Four hundred eighty-three dollars were sent to the State Auxiliary Convention project for Missions.

All denominational enterprises are being supported. A total of \$6,940.22 was contributed to all causes this year.

Since the auxiliary convention has one objective, the promotion of our denomination for the cause of Christ, we urge every minister in this district to attend the semiannual meetings and encourage the local auxiliaries to send maximum representation.

PARTIAL REPORT OF THE ORDAINING COUNCIL

The Ordaining Council has held eight meetings and conducted one ordination service during the year.

On November 4, 1966, the following items were acted upon:

- 1. The Rev. James A. Evans was elected to succeed himself as chairman of the Ordaining Council for the 1966-67 conference year.
- 2. The Rev. Cedric D. Pierce Jr. was elected as secretary of the Ordaining Council for the 1966-67 conference year.

On January 23, 1967, the following items were acted upon:

- 1. Brother Robert (Bobby) David Jones was examined for ordination. Having successfully passed, he was ordained at the union meeting held with Smyrna Church on January 28, 1967. His name is to be placed on the roll of ordained ministers.
 - 2. The ordination service for Brother Bobby Jones was planned.
 - 3. Brother John David Hill was examined for ordination.
- 4. Brother Harold Mac Wallace was examined for ministerial license. The council approved and recommended him to Johnston Union Church for license to preach the gospel in the Original Free Will Baptist Church for a period of one year. His name is to be placed on the roll of licensed ministers.

On January 28, 1967, the following items were acted upon:

- 1. The council approved the renewing of the ministerial license of Brother Jesse Caton for an additional year by the First Free Will Baptist Church, Fayetteville, North Carolina.
- 2. It was reported that Brother John David Hill had successfully passed the ordination examination. He was approved for ordination pending the call of a local church. (His name will remain on the roll of licensed ministers of the Cape Fear Conference.)
- 3. The Revs. DeWayne Eakes and James Howard were approved for union meeting membership pending letters from their respective union meetings.

On February 23, 1967, these items were acted upon:

A. Examination for license to preach.

(1) The examination for license to preach the gospel in the Original Free Will Baptist Church shall be administered by the Ordaining Council in accordance with the 1955 revision of the "Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina" as set forth on Pages 47, 48, and 49.

(2) In addition to the above requirements, each candidate for license to preach must submit to the Ordaining Council an official information sheet, plus any additional details which

the council may deem (necessary, and) estimated with

B. Examination for ordination. This will be the best the interestive

- : (1) At the time the candidate is granted a license to preach, he will be given the "guide sheet for the candidate's ordination to the gospel ministry in the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina" to use as a study guide. He will be responsible to write the answers to the questions on the guide sheet and to send a copy to the secretary of the Ordaining Council within one year to be graded by a member of the council. This information can then be used as study material in preparation for the final ordination examination.
- (2) The final examination will be given at the end of one year or at the request of the candidate, whichever comes first, and will consist of both oral and written questions based upon the guide sheet. The final grade will be determined by the answers written from the guide sheet and the oral and written examinations.
- (3) Ordination will be administered by the Ordaining Council upon the satisfactory completion of a minimum of one year as a licensed minister and of the ordination examination as outlined under Numbers 1 and 2. It is the candidate's responsibility to be sure his license does not expire prior to ordination.
- 2. The council approved the renewing of the ministerial license of Brother Charlie Parrish by Steven's Chapel Church.
- 3. Council member C. M. Coats was appointed to contact the Rev. J. C. Hathaway to meet with the Ordaining Council on April 24, 1967, regarding his continued absence from the Cape Fear Conference.

On April 24, 1967, the following items were acted upon:

1. The Rev. J. C. Hathaway met with the council and pleaded his

case for continued absence from the Cape Fear Conference meetings with a promise to be present or represented hereafter. The council agreed that Brother Hathaway be restored in good standing with the conference.

- 2. Brother Jesse Caton commended his examination for ordination.
- 3. Brother Charles N. Pittman was examined for ministerial license. The council recommended him to Tee's Chapel Church for license to preach the gospel in the Original Free Will Baptist Church for a period of one year. His name is to be placed on the roll of licensed ministers.
- 4. Brother William L. Littleton was examined for ministerial license. The council recommended him to Yelverton's Grove Church for license to preach the gospel in the Original Free Will Baptist Church for a period of one year. His name is to be placed on the roll of licensed ministers.

 5. Brother Elijah Floyd Smith was examined for ministerial license.

- 6. His name is to be added to the roll of licensed ministers.
- 7. The examination for ministerial license was given to Brother Alton C. Bennett. He was recommended by the council to Pleasant Grove Church for license to preach the gospel in the Original Free Will Baptist Church for a period of one year. His name is to be added to the roll of licensed ministers.
- 8. It was reported that a letter of commendation had been received from the Central Conference for the Rev. Cedric D. Pierce Jr.
- 9. The Collins Bible No. 3898-X was adopted to give to the newly ordained ministers.

On July 24, 1967, the following items were acted upon:

- 1. The Rev. Fred S. Powers was provided with a Substitute Certificate of Ordination from the Cape Fear Conference Ordaining Council. The original, granted by the South Carolina Conference on November 8, 1950, was destroyed by fire.
- 2. The council reviewed the ordination examination of Brother Jesse Caton and discussed plans to help him with his ordination.
- 3. The Rev. J. Walter Stanley appeared before the council concerning the matter of his church membership. Inasmuch as he has met the requirements and is now a full member of Faith Free Will Baptist Church, Route

2, Four Oaks, North Carolina, his name was removed from the watch care list of the Ordaining Council, and the ordaining Council, and the ordaining council and the ordain of the Ordaining Council, and the Ordaining Counc

On October 23, 1967, the following items were acted upon:

- 1. It was reported that a letter of transfer had been received for union meeting membership from the First Union of the Western Conference for the Rev. DeWayne Eakes.
- 2. Brother Harold Mac Wallace was examined for ordination. Having successfully passed, he was approved for ordination. Tentative plans are for his ordination service to be on December 30, 1967, at the union meeting at Wooten's Chapel.
- 3. Brother Emmitt W. Bartlett was cleared to work as a license minister in the Cape Fear Conference at West Clinton Church under the supervision of the Rev. James Gay.
- 4. The council again reviewed the papers and correspondence regarding Brother Jesse Caton and decided to invite him to meet with the Ordaining Council on either November 2 or 3, 1967, at the Cape Fear Conference Annual Session.
- 5. The names of the Revs. W. R. Martin, Boyd Shook, and J. W. Everton came to the council through the Executive Committee for letters of transfer, but were deferred until the next meeting at the Conference pending more information.
- 6. The Executive Committee accepted the resignation of the Rev. James A. Evans as a member of the Ordaining Council and appointed the Rev. Harry A. Jones to fill his unexpired term to be effective at the close of this October 23, 1967 Council meeting. The Rev. C. M. Coats was elected chairman pro tem.

On November 2, 1967, the following items were acted upon:

- 1. The Rev. James Howard was received into full Conference membership pending his letter from the Eastern Conference.
- 2. At his request, the Rev. J. W. Everton was granted a letter of transfer to the Central Conference to be effective at the close of this session.
- 3. The Rev. L. J. Carlyle and Dr. W. Burkette Raper represented in this session of the Cape Fear Conference by letter.
- 4. The Rev. W. R. Martin was granted a letter of transfer to the Western Conference.

REPORT OF BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Board of Education is working out details for the awarding of

an annual scholarship in the amount of \$200 to a qualified student from the Cape Fear Conference.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist denomination of North Carolina, desiring to be in fellowship in a bond of union, do ordain this constitution.

This shall be the constitution of the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist Churches of North Carolina.

PURPOSE)

The object of the Cape Fear Conference shall be to promote Christ's kingdom among men by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

ARTICLE I. COMPOSITION

This conference shall be composed of affiliated ordained ministers and churches within its bounds, who are in good standing, and of all general officers, and members of standing boards or committees of the conference. It shall operate under the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina. No church corporation whose articles or incorporation or constitution and bylaws conflict with the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina shall be permitted membership in the Cape Fear Conference.

ARTICLE II. REPRESENTATION and A hour function

Each church shall represent with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. The delegation from each church shall carry to the conference a letter certifying their appointment, and giving the statistics and financial condition of the church; together with a statement of all funds received and disbursed for denomination and benevolent purposes during the year.

ARTICLE III. OFFICERS

The officers shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, who shall be elected for a term of two years, entering upon the duties of said office at the close of the session in which they are elected. Temporary officers, representatives, or messagers, may be elected at the option of the conference for whatever purposes deemed essential.

ARTICLE IV. STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the policy of this conference to elect as many boards and committees as may be necessary in carrying out its program. These shall keep records of their proceedings and make a report at each annual session of the conference.

A board of trustees, a board of Christian education, a board of missions and church extension, and a board of ordination consisting of five members

each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be five years, but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the tenure of office of one member annually.

Section 1—Standing boards shall write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to their conference.

Section 2—The executive committee shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, secretary, treasurer, and one member elected by the conference at the time of the official election of officers.

Section 3—Temporary committees shall be appointed at option of the conference for whatever purpose deemed necessary.

ARTICLE V. FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the conference annually according to its membership.

ARTICLE VI. ADMISSION OF CHURCHES

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina and desires to help promote the program and work of the Cape Fear Conference and the North Carolina State Convention, may present its petition to the regular session of the conference. If the petition for membership is approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates.

ARTICLE VII. DISMISSION OF CHURCHES

A church may be dismissed from membership in the conference by vote of the conference.

ARTICLE VIII. VISITORS

The Cape Fear Conference may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of the body save that of voting and holding office.

ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS

The Cape Fear Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday and Friday before the first Sunday in November. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session or by the executive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary.

BYLAWS

Section 1—The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Cape Fear Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates, and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and committees; and in general to perform the duties of the office of moderator.

Section 2—The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the moderator when that officer is not present and he shall assist the

of Christian education. The board of Christian education shall cooperate with the educational institutions of our denomination and use all funds for best interest of Christian education.

Section 11—The following temporary committees shall be appointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: credentials, nominating, resolutions, temperance, obituary, and letter digest.

Section 12—A board or committee will be recognized as having a quorum when there is a majority of the members present for a meeting, providing all the members of said board or committee have been duly notified concerning the said meeting.

Section 13—All reports, resolutions, and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

Section 14—Each minister and delegate in good standing shall duly attend each day while the conference is in session or be subject to censure by the conference and reported to his local church.

Section 15—If any member, in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his seat in that session.

SECTION 16—No member shall be excused from any session of the conference without leave of the moderator.

Section 17—The conference shall adjourn by a majority vote.

Section 18—Each officer and member of standing committees and boards in good standing shall be entitled to a seat and vote in the conference.

Section 19—The conference shall open and close with suitable devotional services.

Section 20—This constitution and its bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds favorable vote of the members present, provided that said amendement shall be presented on the first day of the annual session for action on the following day.

Section 3—The secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Cape Fear Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. The secretary shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents, not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require the secretary's signature; and serve as a member of executive board.

Section 4—The duties of the assistant secretary shall be the duties of the secretary when that officer is not present, and he shall assist the secretary when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the secretary the assistant secretary shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the conference.

Section 5—The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, the executive committee, or any standing board invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report to the conference.

Section 6—It shall be the duty of the executive committee to transact the business of the conference when the conference is not in session, and make report at annual conference. The executive committee shall plan the program for the annual session of the conference.

Section 7—The board of trustees shall hold in trust all conference and real property, gifts and bequests of the conference and convey or expend said property or assets as the Cape Fear Conference may direct.

Section 8—It shall be the duty of the board of ordination to examine, ordain and discipline ministers in keeping with the provisions of the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, along with whatever additional requirements may be made by the conference. The board of ordination shall examine ordained ministers seeking membership in this conference and make recommendations in keeping with their findings.

Section 9—It shall be the duty of the board of missions and church extension to cooperate with the churches of the conference to promote the establishment of churches within the bounds of the conference. The board of missions and church extension shall cooperate with the state board of missions to raise money, arrange itineraries, and keep the work of missions before our churches.

Section 10—It shall be the duty of the board of Christian education to keep our people informed as to our educational needs, and endeavor to promote the cause of and stimulate interest among our people in the cause

Purpose—The purpose of this union meeting is the creation of an effective agency through which the Cape Fear Conference may successfully promote its work. It shall thus be and remain subject to the authority and use of the conference—except in the election of its general officers as a consistent medium devoted to the advancement of the conference program of evangelism, education, benevolence and church extension.

ARTICLE III

Composition—This union meeting shall be composed of churches affiliated with the Cape Fear Conference, the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, and all general officers and members of standing committees of both the conference and the union meeting.

ARTICLE IV

Representation—The churches of the Cape Fear Conference shall represent in the quarterly sessions of the union meeting with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall each represent with one delegate.

ARTICLE V

Finance—Each church shall send with its delegation to the quarterly sessions of this union meeting one percent of its annual budget exclusive of funds for building and equipment, or a total of four percent of the church budget for the full year of four union meeting sessions. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall represent with whatever amounts they may choose. All funds shall be allocated by the executive board of the conference, but said allocations shall be approved by the union meeting in regular session or by the conference. Officers—The general officers of this union meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, at the last session of the union meeting before the annual session of the Cape Fear Conference. lada evize iza diredik ban erologian ta

Boards and Committees—All standing committees and boards created by the conference shall avail themselves of the advantage of promoting their works through the union meeting by the Ana bases of theory with the last

The general officers of the union meeting shall be added to the executive

board of the conference and this composite committee shall constitute the executive committee of the union meeting. This committee shall have power to act for and on the behalf of the union meeting between its regular sessions. It shall also be the duty of the executive committee to prepare and supervise the programs of the union meeting and to allocate all undesignated funds.

Meetings—The union meeting shall hold its regular sessions Saturday before each fifth Sunday in the churches of the Cape Fear Conference. The host church shall be selected from time to time, according to the alphabetic succession of the initial letter of the name of each church. This method of selecting the place of meeting may be changed when deemed expedient or necessary, by an act of the union meeting in session or the executive committee.

ARTICLE IX

Amendment—This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference by a majority vote of the members present, provided that the proposed amendment be presented in writing by the union meeting.

BYLAWS GOVERNING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

1. The board shall be composed of five members. Their terms of office shall be as provided for in the constitution of the conference.

- 2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and executive secretary, who shall have charge of the promotional work of the board. Provided, however, that any two officers may be combined at the option of the board, and provided further, that the executive secretary may, or may not be, a member of this board.
- 3. The treasurer of the conference shall, unless otherwise provided for, hold all funds of the boards and disburse same on order of the board, or when duly signed by the chairman and secretary of the board. Annual reports of all receipts and disbursements shall be made to the conference in session and interim reports to the executive board when requested.

4. The board shall meet as often as necessary for the proper dispatch of the work assigned to it by conference direction, but must meet at least

twice a year.

5. The board shall make, or cause to be made, adequate records of meetings of this board, detail records, reports, etc., of all activities of the board and its officers, and preserve same as permanent records.

6. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of cooperating with our state and national educational institutions in the promotion of

general Christian education.

7. The organization, direction, and the training program of Free Will Baptist League shall be under the direction and supervision of this board.

8. The general supervision of the Sunday school promotional activities, organization of new Sunday schools, training programs for workers, and any

and all other Sunday school promotional programming shall be the responsibility of this board. A selection to be a selection of the selectio

solar 9. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of making, or cause to be made emphasis on the Christian family life.

10. This board shall be responsible for conducting area institutes, and conferences, on a conference scale, annually to instruct and help our people when necessary to have a better understanding of our conference, state, or national programs.

national programs.

11. It shall be the responsibility of this board to direct and supervise

all training programs of the conference.

12. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the responsibilities assigned to it, provided, however, that the same shall not be inconsistent with bylaws, nor the constitution of the conference.

13. The board shall be responsible for the promotion and administration of a Student's Loan Fund with which to aid worthy students in security

and education.

- 14. The board shall lend money only upon the following terms and conditions:
- A. Students must be adjudged worthy as to character and ability, and must attend an institution of learning approved by this board.
- B. A promissory note must be made by the student, with one or more good endorsements, or other good security satisfactory to the board. The rate of interest shall be 1% while the student is in training. After completion of training a new note shall be made bearing 6% interest with monthly, or quarterly payments to be made until obligations are fully discharged.
- 15. These bylaws may be amended or revised at any annual session of the conference, provided that such amendements, or revisions, as may be deemed necessary, shall lie on the table at least three hours before a vote is taken, during which time they shall be read twice, and provided further that such amendements or revisions shall require a two-thirds vote.

BYLAWS GOVERNING THE BOARD OF MISSIONS

- 1. The board shall be composed of five members. The first named shall be for a term of one year, the second for two years, the third for three years, the fourth for four years, the fifth for five years and thereafter for a term each of five years.
- 2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, and an executive secretary, who shall have general charge of the promotional work of the board. Provided, however, that any two officers may be combined at the option of the board, and provided, further, that the executive secretary may, or may not, be a member of the board.
- 3. The board shall meet as often as may be deemed necessary and attend to all matters pertaining to missions within the territory of the Cape Fear Conference, but must meet at least twice a year.
- 4. The treasurer of the conference shall hold all funds designated for

Cape Fear missions and pay out same on order of the board, or when said order is duly signed by the chairman and the secretary of the board. Annual reports shall be rendered to the conference of all funds received and disbursed.

- 5. All persons doing work that merit compensation must first apply to the board on approved forms, and receive authorization to do work under regulations of the board before they can be compensated for same with mission funds.
- 6. Mission points, or stations, may be opened and maintained by the board for such a length of time as may be deemed best, employ evangelists, missionaries, and such field workers as may be deemed necessary for the proper promotion of the mission work.
- 7. The board shall not make any investment in property, nor promote any investment in property, without first giving due consideration to the safety of the investment, property titles, and other matters relative to the security of any investment.
- 8. No person shall be at liberty to enter upon any approved mission point without first consulting the board and receiving its approval as to place, plans, and purposes.
- 9. The board shall render annual reports to the conference and interim reports to the executive board when requested.
- 10. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the mission program, provided that same shall not be inconsistent with these bylaws.
