PROCEEDINGS

1975 CAPE FEAR CONFERENCE MINUTES THURSDAY MORNING SESSION (October 30, 1975)

The Cape Fear Conference opened its one hundred and twenty-first session on Thursday morning, October 30, at 10 a.m., with the singing of the hymn, "Saviour, Like a Shepherd Lead Us," with the Rev. Edmundo Gonzalez, moderator, presiding.

The opening prayer and Scripture was offered by the Rev. Swade Benson.

A welcome was extended by the Rev. Curtis Jones, pastor of the host church, Palmer Memorial.

The response to the welcome was given by the Rev. J. C. Hathaway.

The session was called to order by the conference's assistant secretary, Mrs. Ray G. Smith.

The Rev. W. O. Lassiter, chairman of the Credentials Committee, explained the registration procedures adopted by the one hundred and fourteenth session of the conference as offered by the Resolutions Committee which stated as follows:

"Be it resolved, that in all future sessions of the Cape Fear Conference, the Credentials Committee be instructed to issue a badge of identification to all duly registered ministers, delegates, and visitors.

"Be it further resolved, that no person will be allowed to vote who does not properly display said badge. It is understood that visitors shall be granted all rights and privileges except that of voting.

"Be it further resolved, that upon the adoption of this resolution, it shall become the duty of the Credentials Committee to explain the registration at the opening of each session of the Cape Fear Conference."

The roll of churches was called.

The moderator recognized the following visiting ministers:

Central Conference: O. B. Jones, Michael Pelt, and Hubert Burress.

Western Conference: Lloyd F. Hargis, Roy T. Clifton, Joseph Ingram, and Raymond T. Sasser.

Other visiting ministers were as follows: Joe Gerald, J. Elmer Thompson, Billy A. Jordan, and Foy C. Futrelle.

Following the moderator's remarks concerning voting procedures the following temporary committee appointments were made:

Credentials Committee: W. O. Lassiter, chairman; Paul Lassiter; and Glenn F. Dupree.

Nominating Committee: Billy R. Nowell, chairman; S. D. Allen; and Paul Grubbs.

Resolutions Committee: Edward C. Taylor, chairman; W. A. Martin; and J. B. Caton.

Obituary Committee: C. M. Coats, chairman; Garland Woodard; and Danny Coats.

Temperance Committee: Alton Howard, chairman; John David Hill; and Charlie B. Massengill.

The hymn, "Jesus Saves," was sung by the congregation, under the direction of the song and praisetime director, the Rev. Cooper Thompson.

The Rev. Lloyd F. Hargis brought a short sermon using Scripture taken from Acts 2:37-47.

The assistant moderator, the Rev. Earl H. Glenn, assumed the chair.

The report of Mount Olive College was given by the president, Dr. W. Burkette Raper. The report was received as information.

The Rev. Raymond T. Sasser gave a verbal report concerning the Free Will Baptist Press which was accepted as information.

Brother Sasser also presented the report of the Board of Superannuation which was received as information.

The hymn, "He Lives," was sung by the congregation, followed by a short sermon by the Rev. Edward L. Painter using Scripture from St. Luke 6:30-38.

The moderator resumed the chair.

The report of the Free Will Baptist Foreign Mission Board was presented by the Rev. Joseph Ingram. The report was received as information.

Before recessing for lunch, prayer and the blessing for the food was offered by Dr. Michael Pelt.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

The Thursday afternoon session began with the congregation singing the hymn, "I Love to Tell the Story."

Scripture and prayer was by the Rev. Cooper Thompson.

A partial report of the Credentials Committee was given by the Rev. W. O. Lassiter showing 36 ministers, 32 delegates, 23 visitors, and 7 visiting ministers present.

The report of the Conference Executive Committee was read. The minutes were approved. (See report.)

A partial report of the Ordaining Council was presented by the Rev. Henry Armstrong. The report was adopted; however, following opposition on the resolution from the State Convention pertaining to qualifications for licensing and ordination of ministers, a motion was made and carried to separate this resolution from the adopted partial report of the Ordaining Council. Following the reading of the ordination procedures and requirements submitted by the State Convention, and discussion on the issue, a motion was made and carried by a standing vote to favor the resolution, with the vote of the moderator breaking the tie. (See report.)

The moderator recognized a retired minister, the Rev. Herman Wooten, who brought encouraging comments to the conference.

The report of the Cape Fear Sunday School Convention was given by its president, Mr. John Adcox. The report was received as information. (See report.)

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION (October 31, 1975)

The second day's session began with the congregation singing, "Lead On, O King Eternal."

Scripture and prayer was by Mr. Atlas Hogg.

The report of the Cape Fear Mission Board was given by the Rev. Billy R. Nowell. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The report of the District Woman's Auxiliary Convention was given by Mrs. Mary Lou Jackson. The report was received as information. (See report.)

The report of the Cape Fear Ministers' Conference was given by the Rev. John David Hill. The report was received as information. (See report.)

The Board of Education's report was presented by the Rev. Gene B. Britt. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The Home Missions Department's report of the North Carolina State Convention was given by the director-treasurer, the Rev. Taylor Hill. The report was received as information.

The congregation sang the hymn, "Count Your Blessings."

The Rev. Kemery Ard brought an impressive sermon dealing with the topic, "Law of the Church," using Scripture from the sixth chapter of Luke.

The Children's Home's report was given by the superintendent, Mr. Sam Weeks . The report was adopted.

Mr. Weeks also reported concerning the progress of the Retirement Homes Program and recommended that the month of January be designated as "Retirement Homes Month." The recommendation was accepted.

The congregation sang "At Calvary," followed by a short sermon by the Rev. C. Felton Godwin using Scripture from 1 Peter 2:1-3.

The Nominating Committee's report was presented by the Rev. Billy R. Nowell. The report was accepted excluding that of an assistant treasurer. A motion was made to amend the constitution to include an assistant treasurer, but the motion was tabled for constitutional change.

The Resolutions Committee's report was given by the Rev. E. C. Taylor asking for a standing vote of thanks to the Palmer Memorial Church for its hospitality during this one hundred twenty-first session of the conference. The report was accepted by everyone standing. (See report.)

The Obituary Committee's report was presented by the Rev. C. M. Coats with a memorial tribute to the Rev. R. H. Jackson, with a prayer offered by the moderator. (See report.)

The Temperance Committee's report was given by the Rev. David Hill. The report was adopted. (See report.)

It was noted by the Rev. Hubert Burress, secretary of the Church Finance Association, Inc., that copies of the association's annual report are in the hands of those present.

The final Credentials Committee's report showed a total of 60 ministers, 8 visiting ministers, 57 delegates, and 42 visitors present for the two-day session. (See report.)

The treasurer's report was given by Mr. H. T. Hinson. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The closing hymn sung by the congregation was "God Be With You 'Til We Meet Again."

The closing prayer and blessing on the noon meal was offered by the incoming moderator, the Rev. C. Felton Godwin.
