PROCEEDINGS

1976 CAPE FEAR CONFERENCE MINUTES THURSDAY MORNING SESSION (November 4, 1976)

The Cape Fear Conference opened its one hundred and twenty-second session on Thursday morning, November 4, at 10 a.m., with the singing of the hymn, "Onward Christian Soldiers," with the Rev. C. Felton Godwin, moderator, presiding.

The opening prayer and Scripture was offered by the Rev. A. B. Bryan.

The welcome was extended by the Rev. C. M. Coats, pastor of the host church, Yelverton's Grove.

A response to the welcome was given by Mr. Milton Wiggs.

The session was called to order by the conference's secretary, Ray G. Smith.

The Rev. W. A. Martin, chairman of the Credentials Committee, explained the registration procedures adopted by the one hundred fourteenth session of the Conference as offered by the Resolutions Committee which stated as follows:

"Be it resolved, that in all future sessions of the Cape Fear Conference, the Credentials Committee be instructed to issue a badge of identification to all duly registered ministers, delegates, and visitors.

"Be it further resolved, that no person will be allowed to vote who does not

properly display said badge. It is understood that visitors shall be granted all rights and privileges except that of voting.

"Be it further resolved, that upon the adoption of this resoltution, it shall become the duty of the Credentials Committee to explain the registration at the opening of each session of the Cape Fear Conference."

Ordaining Council: W. O. Lassiter, Henry Armstrong, W. A. Martin, C. Felton Godwin, and Billy R. Nowell.

The roll of churches was called which included: Bethel, Casey's Chapel, Christian Chapel, Daly's Chapel, Eastwood, Faith, Goldsboro, Hopewell, Johnston Union, Lanwood Chapel, Lee's Chapel, Mount Olive, Oak Grove, Palmer Memorial, Pleasant Grove, Powhatan, Riverside, Robert's Grove, Saint Mary's Grove, Saint Paul, Shady Grove, Smithfield, Smyrna, Steven's Chapel, Tee's Chapel, West Clinton, Wooten's Chapel, and Yelverton's Grove.

Missions represented were Happiness Mission of Fayetteville and Victory Mission of Hope Mills.

The moderator recognized the following visiting ministers: Robert M. May, Walter Reynolds, Sam Weeks, Hubert Burress, Ray Wells, and Joseph Ingram.

Following the moderator's remarks, the following temporary committee appointments were made:

Credentials Committee: W. A. Martin, O. Kenneth Peedin, and J. Walter Stanley.

Nominating Committee: Henry Armstrong, Curtis Jones, and Kemery Ard.

Resolutions Committee: C. M. Coats, Edward C. Taylor, and L. B. Woodall Jr.

Temperance Committee: J. C. Hathaway, E. Floyd Smith, and John Adcox.

Obituary Committee: Taylor Hill, W. O. Lassiter, and A. F. Ballance.

Ushers for the Conference: R. Ray Warwick, Atlas Hogg, and Buddie Godwin.

Song and praise time began by the congregation singing, "More Like the Master." Testimonies were offered by several persons offering praise to God for His love and blessings.

The hymn, "At Calvary," was sung by the congregation under the leadership of song and praise time director, the Rev. Cooper Thompson.

The Children's Home Report was presented by the superintendent, the Rev. Sam Weeks. The report was received as information.

The Rev. Hubert Burress gave the Church Finance Association report. The report was received as information.

The Mission Director, the Rev. Joseph Ingram, presented the State Mission program report. The report was received as information.

The hymn, "Glory to His Name," was sung by the congregation followed by the morning sermon by the Rev. Luby Tyner.

Before recessing for lunch, prayer and the blessing for the food was offered by the Rev. Cooper Thompson.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

The Thursday afternoon session began with the congregation singing the hymn, "I Love to Tell the Story."

Scripture and prayer was by the Rev. John David Hill.

A partial report of the Credentials Committee was given by the Rev. W. A. Martin reporting the following present: 4 officers, 44 delegates, 15 visitors, 26 ministers, and 6 visiting ministers.

The Executive Committee's report was presented by the conference secretary. The report was adopted. (See report.)

A verbal report from the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation was given by the Rev. Walter Reynolds. Brother Reynolds also gave the Superannuation Board's report. Both were received as information.

The State Home Mission Department report was given by its secretary, the Rev. Taylor Hill. The report was received as information.

The report of the Board of Education was given by the Rev. Gene B. Britt. The report was adopted. (See report.)

A partial report of the Ordaining Council was given by the Rev. Billy R. Nowell. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The Rev. Herman Wooten gave a few remarks to the conference.

The report of the Cape Fear Sunday School Convention was given by Brother Frank Baumgartner. The report was adopted. (See report.)

A partial report of the Resolutions Committee was given by the Rev. C. M. Coats. The resolution read:

"Whereas past experience has indicated that two days is too much time for the amount of business conducted, and

"Whereas the working habits of the people have so changed in recent years that it works a hardship on the host churches, especially the smaller churches, to provide for two days, that

"Therefore be it resolved that ARTICLE IX of the Constitution be amended to read: 'That the Cape Fear Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday before the first Sunday in November. Should additional time be required, an extension may be granted at the time of meeting.'"

A motion was made and carried that the resolution be laid on the table until Friday to be acted upon. The motion carried.

The benediction was given by the Rev. Foy Futrell.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION (November 5, 1976)

The second day's session began with the congregation singing, "Heavenly

Sunshine."

Following a challenge to love God and our neighbor as ourselves by the moderator, the Rev. Alton Howard was in charge of Scripture and prayer.

The report of the Cape Fear Mission Board was given by Mr. A. F. Ballance. The report was adopted. (See report.)

Mrs. Mary Lou Jackson, president of the Woman's Auxiliary Convention, gave a report which was received as information. (See report.)

The president of the North Carolina State Convention, the Rev. Robert M. May, spoke briefly to the conference with reference to the 250th anniversary of Free Will Baptists in North Carolina to be held in 1977 at Kenan Stadium in Kenansville, N. C.

Brother May also spoke concerning the proposal of an executive secretary and a headquarters for the convention.

Dr. Burkette Raper, president of Mount Olive College, reaffirmed the 1977 session of the conference to be held at Mount Olive College which was previously made in 1974.

The report of the Cape Fear Ministers' Conference was given by the Rev. John David Hill. The report was received as information. (See report.)

A resolution presented on Friday in a partial report of the Resolutions Committee which was tabled was presented by the committee's chairman, the Rev. C. M. Coats.

The Rev. Edward C. Taylor moved that the motion be voted on. The motion was seconded and was passed.

The resolution provided that ARTICLE IX of the Constitution be amended to read: "That the Cape Fear Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday before the first Sunday in November. Should additional time be required, an extension may be granted at the time of meeting."

The final report of the Resolutions Committee was given by Brother Coats asking for a standing vote of thanks to the Yelverton's Grove church for its hospitality during this one hundred twenty-second session of the conference. The report was accepted by everyone standing. (See report.)

Song and praise time opened with the congregation singing, "Dwelling in Beulah Land," followed by several testimonies from those present.

A special love offering was taken in the amount of \$74.85 for retired minister, the Rev. Herman Wooten.

The congregation sang, "When We All Get to Heaven."

Dr. Raper gave the Mount Olive College report which was received as information.

The morning worship hour began with the singing of "Break Thou the Bread of Life."

The Rev. Cedric D. Pierce Jr. brought the morning sermon which was followed by an altar call where all ministers gathered in rededication as the congregation sang, "Take My Life and Let It Be."

The benediction and blessing on the noon meal was offered by Dr. Raper.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The final session was opened with the singing of the hymn "Are You

Washed in the Blood."

Scripture and prayer was by the Rev. J. B. Caton.

The Rev. Cedric D. Pierce Jr. moved that the treasurer be instructed to forward retired minister Herman Wooten a total of \$100 rather than the \$74.85 received in the love offering. The motion was seconded and was favored by a unanimous vote.

The Temperance Committee report was given by John K. Adcox Jr. The report was adopted. (See report.)

A motion was made by the Rev. L. B. Woodall Jr. that the conference contribute \$100 to the North Carolina Christian Action League. The motion was seconded and carried.

The final report of the Ordaining Council was given by the Rev. Billy R. Nowell. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The Obituary Committee report was given by the Rev. Cooper Thompson showing no obituary during the past year. The moderator asked for a standing vote of thanks to God for His watch and care over us.

The final report of the Credentials Committee showed the following in attendance: 5 officers, 33 ministers, 8 visiting ministers, 52 delegates, and 17 visitors.

The Nominating Committee report was given by the Rev. Henry Armstrong. The report was accepted. (See report.)

The treasurer's report was presented by Mr. H. T. Hinson. The report was adopted. (See report.)

A standing vote of appreciation was offered Brother Hinson for his longtime service to the conference as treasurer.

By motion the session adjourned with the singing of "Blest Be the Tie;" the closing prayer was offered by the Rev. J. Raeford Lee.

We realize that we live in a day of sin of every description. We believe that the television with many of its programs contributes to influencing the minds of our people, especially our younger generation by promoting crime, drinking, sex, pronography, and moral breakdown.

We recommend that each pastor encourage their church membership to write each network and the chairman of the Federal Communication Commission to voice our opposition to this type programming. The address is: Chairman, FCC, 1919 M. Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. 20554.
