## **PROCEEDINGS**

The Cape Fear Conference opened its one hundred and twenty-fifth session on Thursday morning, November 1, 1979, at 9 a.m. with the singing of the hymn, "Jesus, Jesus." The session met at the Saint Mary's Grove Original Free Will Baptist Church on Route 3, Benson, North Carolina, with the Rev. C. Felton Godwin, moderator, presiding.

The opening prayer and Scripture were led by the Rev. Jeff Scarborough, pastor of the Shady Grove church.

The welcome was extended by the host pastor, the Rev. Edward C. Taylor.

The response to the welcome was given by the Rev. A. B. Bryan.

The session was called to order by the moderator.

Wilkins, Theodore (Faith)

The Rev. Billy R. Nowell, chairman of the Credentials Committee, explained the registration procedures adopted by the one hundred and fourteenth session of the Conference as offered by the Resolutions Committee, which stated:

"Be it resolved, that in all future sessions of the Cape Fear Conference, the Credentials Committee be instructed to issue a badge of identification to all duly registered ministers, delegates, and visitors.

"Be it further resolved, that no person will be allowed to vote who does not properly display said badge. It is understood that visitors shall be granted all rights and privileges except that of voting.

"Be it further resolved, that upon the adoption of this resolution, it shall become the duty of the Credentials Committee to explain the registration at the opening of each session of the Cape Fear Conference."

Board of Education: Edward C. Taylor, Milton Wiggs, Ruth Warrick, Faye Baumgartner, and C. M. Coats.

Ordaining Council: L. B. Woodall Jr., C. Felton Godwin, John David Hill, and Henry Armstrong.

The roll call of churches included the following: Bethel, Casey's Chapel, Christian Chapel, Daly's Chapel, Eastwood, Faith, Goldsboro, Hopewell, Johnston Union, Lanwood Chapel, Lee's Chapel, Mount Olive, Oak Grove, Palmer Memorial, Pleasant Grove, Powhatan, Riverside, Robert's Grove, Saint Mary's Grove, Saint Paul, Shady Grove, Smithfield, Smyrna, Steven's Chapel, Tee's Chapel, West Clinton, Wooten's Chapel, and Yelverton Grove.

The roll of missions included: Catalpa, Eastover, Happiness, Haymount, and Victory.

Following the moderator's remarks of challenge and requests, the following temporary committee appointments were made by the moderator with the first person named on the committee serving as chairman:

Credentials Committee: Billy R. Nowell, Edward L. Painter, and J. B. Caton.

Temperance Committee: C. M. Coats, Hubert Stanley, and J. C. Hathaway.

Resolutions Committee: John Adcox, Wilson Dowdy, and J. Walter Stanley.

Obituary Committee: L. B. Woodall Jr., John David Hill, and Taylor Hill.

Nominating Committee: W. A. Martin, W. O. Lassiter, and A. B. Bryan.

Ushers for the Conference: Joe Hobbs and Norlyn Matthews.

Song Leader and Pianist: Johnnie Woodall and Mrs. Faye Johnson.

The moderator noted that the following ministers were represented by letter, Frank Harrison, Robert M. Murray, Arnold Price, and J. E. Timmons.

The Mount Olive College report was presented by the president of the college, Dr. Burkette Raper, who in giving his progress report noted the day marked the thirty-third anniversary of his ordination into the ministry. Dr. Raper's report was received as information.

The Children's Home report was presented by the superintendent, the Rev. Stewart Humphrey. This report was received as information.

The Rev. Humphrey also introduced Mr. Harold Dunn, who presented a report on the Retirement Homes. Mr. Dunn's report was received as information to the Conference.

The moderator recognized the following ministers: The Revs. Hubert Burress, Walter Reynolds, Stewart Humphrey, and Norman Ard.

The moderator called for Denominational Enterprise reports.

The Church Finance report was presented by the Rev. Hubert Burress. This report was received as information.

The Home Missions report was given by the Rev. Taylor Hill. This report was also recorded and received as information.

The Foreign Missions report was given when the Rev. Henry Armstrong gave a condensed progress report.

The Free Will Baptist Press report was presented by the Rev. Walter Reynolds. This report was received as information.

Mr. Reynolds also gave the Superannuation report, which was received as information to the Conference.

The moderator and the Rev. Hubert Burress presented progress reports dealing with Cragmont Assembly.

The moderator called for a ten-minute recess.

Following the recess, the session was called back to order by the moderator, and the congregation joined in singing the hymn, "Tell Me the Story of Jesus."

An offertory prayer was by the Rev. Earl Glenn.

Special music for the Conference was by the Saint Mary's Grove quartet accompanied by Mrs. Faye Johnson. Their selections included "I'm Depending on Him" and "What Will I Leave Behind."

The Rev. Henry Armstrong preached the morning sermon on the topic, "Judge Me, O God," using Scripture from Psalms 43:1-4.

The benediction and blessing on the noon meal were offered by the Rev. L. B. Woodall Jr.

The afternoon session was opened with the singing of the hymn, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms."

Scripture and prayer were by the Rev. John Rayford Lee.

The moderator called for standing reports.

The Executive Committee report was given by the assistant secretary. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Ordaining Council report was given by the Rev. L. B. Woodall Jr., secretary to the Council. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Cape Fear Sunday School Convention report was given by the Rev. John Adcox. The report was accepted and is recorded. (See Reports.)

The Rev. Edward C. Taylor presented the Cape Fear Mission Board report. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Woman's Auxiliary report was given by Mrs. Thelma Jackson in the absence of the president. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Cape Fear Ministers' Conference report was given by the Rev. J. Walter Stanley. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Board of Education report was presented by Mr. Milton Wiggs. The Board's report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The moderator called for temporary committee reports.

The report of the Temperance Committee was presented by the Rev. C. M. Coats. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Resolutions Committee report was given by the Rev. John Adcox. Three resolutions were presented to the session and each was adopted and recorded. (See Reports.)

The Rev. L. B. Woodall Jr., chairman of the Obituary Committee, was in charge of a memorial service in memory of the Rev. Kemery Ard, the Rev. Cooper Thompson, and the Rev. M. E. Godwin. The report was accepted with the congregation rising in a moment of silent prayer in memory of the three beloved ministers. The memorial prayer was offered by the Rev. Taylor Hill. (See Reports.)

The Credentials Committee report was given by the Rev. Billy R. Nowell. The report showed 31 ministers present, 5 visiting ministers, 2 licensed ministers, 33 delegates, and 24 visitors. Six ministers were represented by letter. (See Reports.)

A report of the Nominating Committee was given by the Rev. W. A. Martin. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The moderator opened the business session and asked for any business that should be brought before the session.

The Rev. Edward C. Taylor moved that the secretary and treasurer of the Union Meeting receive \$5 for each meeting attended, plus mileage. The motion was seconded and adopted. (See Reports.)

The Rev. Taylor Hill presented a presentation signed by himself, the

Rev. Charles Parrish, and the Rev. Alton Howard. The presentation read as follows: "Due to the fact that the Rockfish Conference has become nonexistent so far as our State Convention is concerned, we respectfully request the consideration of the Cape Fear Conference to release its missions and churches which are within the old Rockfish boundaries upon their request for the purpose of reestablishing the Rockfish Conference, or a new conference under a new name. Such a possibility has already been endorsed by the North Carolina State Home Missions and Church Extension Department. If such action should be taken, it would be done in cooperation

with the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists

Executive Board."

Following discussion on the topic, the Rev. Edward C. Taylor moved that the Cape Fear Conference give support in the exploration of the Rockfish Conference. The Rev. A. B. Bryan requested that the motion be amended that any exploration be conducted under the supervision of the Cape Fear Conference Executive Committee. The motion, with the amended section, was seconded and adopted.

The Rev. Swade Benson asked those seated in the session to offer special prayer in behalf of retired minister Herman Wooten.

The Rev. John Adcox moved that a "love offering" be taken for the Rev. Mr. Wooten. The motion was adopted and the moderator instructed the ushers to place offering plates in the vestibule in order that the offering might be received following the closing of the session, due to time involved.

Mr. H. T. Hinson, Conference treasurer, presented the financial report. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Rev. Jeff Scarborough invited the Conference to be held with the Shady Grove church in 1980 for its one hundred and twenty-sixth session.

The moderator extended appreciation to each person who had assisted in the session.

By motion, the session adjourned with the congregation singing the hymn, "Amazing Grace." The closing prayer was offered by the Rev. Alton Howard.

#### MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee of the Cape Fear Conference met January 5, 1979, at Oak Grove church.

A motion was made by the Rev. Foy Futrelle and seconded by Mr. H. T. Hinson that the Rev. W. A. Martin be appointed to fill the unexpired term of the Rev. Kemery Ard on the Executive Committee. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. H. T. Hinson and seconded by the Rev. Foy Futrelle that the minutes of the 124th session of the conference be approved for printing. The motion carried.

A motion was made by the Rev. Foy Futrelle and seconded by Ray G. Smith that three copies of the yearbook be purchased for each church and mission in addition to those ordered by individual churches. The motion carried.

A motion was made by H. T. Hinson and seconded by Ray G. Smith that the Rev. Foy Futrelle be appointed to fill the unexpired term of the Rev. Kemery Ard on the Ordaining Council. The motion carried.

A motion was made by the Rev. Foy Futrelle and seconded by H. T. Hinson that the Executive Committee accept the recommendation of the Cape Fear Missions Board to accept the Eastover Mission into the Cape Fear Conference. The motion carried.

## REPORT OF ORDAINING COUNCIL (April 23, 1979)

The Ordaining Council held its first meeting on April 23, 1979. The Rev. C. Felton Godwin called the meeting to order and led the group in prayer.

Those present were the Revs. C. Felton Godwin, Henry Armstrong, Foy Futrelle, and L. B. Woodall Jr. The Rev. W. A. Martin served as proxy for the Rev. David Hill until Mr. Hill could get to the meeting.

C. Felton Godwin was renominated and reelected as chairman by acclamation. L. B. Woodall Jr. was nominated and elected by acclamation as secretary to the council. Henry Armstrong was nominated and elected by acclamation as vice chairman of the council. Foy Futrelle was nominated and elected by acclamation as assistant secretary of the council.

The Rev. Roger C. Heath had written the chairman about his ministerial standing in the Cape Fear Conference. It was moved, seconded, and adopted that Mr. Heath's ministerial credentials be registered in good standing in the Cape Fear Conference. The secretary was ordered to send to Mr. Heath a notice notifying him that his credentials were in good standing in the conference. (The secretary sent this letter of notice on Wednesday, April 25, 1979.)

It was moved, seconded, and adopted that the Rev. Paul Grubbs be given a letter of transfer from the Cape Fear Conference to join the Western Conference. (The letter was mailed on Friday, April 27, 1979.)

A letter from the Haymount Free Will Baptist Mission in Fayetteville, North Carolina, was received by the council requesting the council to examine Mr. Dean Kennedy for license to preach. Mr. Kennedy was examined by members of the council and was found qualified to be licensed by the Haymount mission to preach. (This letter of notice to permit the Haymount mission to license Mr. Kennedy was mailed on Friday, April 27, 1979.)

The Smyrna Free Will Baptist Church of Route 2, Dunn, North Carolina, notified the council that it had renewed Mr. James C. Blackman's license to preach for another year.

The council received a letter from Eastwood Free Will Baptist Church of Fayetteville, North Carolina, requesting the council to examine Mr. John Adcox Jr. for ordination. Mr. Adcox was examined the same day and scored well on the examination. It was moved, seconded, and adopted that Mr. Adcox be ordained. Mr. Adcox's ordination service was set for Sunday evening, May 13, 1979, at 7:30 o'clock at the Eastwood church.

The council was read a letter by Chairman Godwin from the Johnston Union Free Will Baptist Church requesting the council, if the council could see fit, to examine Mr. Mike Scott for ordination and ordain him as soon as possible so that he could carry the full duties as pastor at the Johnston Union church.

The council studied and discussed the request and informed the Johnston Union church that the council could not ordain Mr. Scott until he had been licensed one year.

The secretary of the council was directed to write the Johnston Union church clerk with reference to the council's decision concerning Mr.Mr. Scott's ordination. (This letter was mailed to Mrs. Jean Evans, Johnston Union church clerk. Mr. Thomas Austin, Chairman of Johnston Union's Deacon Board, acknowledged the letter.)

Mr. Theodore Wilkins was examined for ordination by the council on Monday, April 23, 1979. He made a passing score on the written part of the examination, but was asked by the council to return or to report back to the council on January 23, 1979, to discuss further the oral part of the examination. The council advised Mr. Wilkins that if a church desired his service as a pastor for that church to write the chairman of the council and that Chairman Godwin would arrange a convenient date for Mr. Wilkins to come before the council before the July meeting.

A motion was made, seconded, and adopted for the council to adjourn at 7:15 p.m.

On April 28, 1979, at a called meeting, Chairman Godwin called the council into a short session after the Union Meeting on Saturday, April 28, 1979, at Saint Paul Free Will Baptist Church and shared a letter from the Eastwood Free Will Baptist Church in Fayetteville, North Carolina, notifying the council that the Eastwood church had called Mr. John Adcox Jr. as pastor pending his ordination.

Letters for Mr. Dean Kennedy's character references were mailed on April 30, 1979. Responses from all three persons who received the letters have been received by the secretary.

The Ordaining Council met again on July 23, 1979. The meeting was called to order by Chairman C. Felton Godwin at 1:15 p.m.

The Rev. Foy Futrelle led the group in the opening prayer.

Board members present in the meeting were: C. Felton Godwin, Henry Armstrong, Foy Futrelle, and L. B. Woodall Jr.

The Rev. T. C. Farmer came before the council to notify the council that he had been called and had accepted the call to pastor Tee's Chapel church, Route 2, Smithfield, North Carolina. Mr. Farmer presented his ministerial credentials in good order from the Pee Dee Conference to become a member of the Cape Fear Conference. It was moved, seconded, and adopted to receive Mr. Farmer pending the Conference's action on his request in the Conference sitting on November 1, 1979.

Mr. Mike Scott appeared before the council and was informed to be ready to take the ordination examination on Monday, September 24, 1979.

The Rev. Swade Benson requested the council to send a letter of good standing to the Rev. Marvin Waters, Secretary to the Ordaining Council of the Albemarle Conference in order that Mr. Benson could pastor in the Albemarle Conference. It was moved, seconded, and adopted that Secretary Woodall send such a letter. (This letter was given to Mr. Benson to take to Mr. Waters on July 23, 1979.)

It was moved, seconded, and adopted that the meeting adjourn at 2:35 p.m.

Another meeting of the Ordaining Council was held on September 24, 1979, at the First Free Will Baptist Church in Smithfield, North Carolina.

Chairman C. Felton Godwin called the meeting to order at 1:17 p.m.

The Rev. David Hill led the members in prayer.

Members present in the meeting were Chairman Felton Godwin, Henry Armstrong, Foy Futrelle, David Hill, and L. B. Woodall Jr.

It was moved, seconded, and adopted that the Rev. Charles H. Parrish be received back into the Cape Fear Conference to pastor Victory mission pending the Conference action on November 1, 1979.

The council examined Mr. Mike Scott orally on September 24, 1979, on the oral part of the ordination examination. He made an excellent score on the oral part and was examined on a portion of the written part of the examination, but because of time, the council could not examine all the written part of the examination. The council by motion, seconded, and adopted to adjourn until Saturday afternoon, September 25, 1979, following the Union Meeting to complete the scoring of the remainder of the examination for Mr. Scott.

On Saturday afternoon, September 29, 1979, at 1:15, Chairman Felton Godwin called the Ordaining Council into session to finish the scoring of the remainder of Mr. Mike Scott's examination. Mr. Scott scored well on the written part of the examination.

It was moved, seconded, and adopted that Mr. Mike Scott be ordained into the gospel ministry.

Those to serve in the ordination service to ordain Mr. Scott into the ministry when the Johnston Union church can make the arrangements were as follows: Chairman Felton Godwin is to be in charge of the service and give the charge, the Rev. Henry Armstrong is to preach the sermon, the Rev. Foy Futrelle is to pray the ordination prayer, and the Rev. L. B. Woodall Jr. is to present the Bible.

## CONSTITUTION

#### PREAMBLE

We, the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist denomination of North Carolina, desiring to be in fellowship in a bond of union, do ordain this constitution.

#### NAME

This shall be the constitution of the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist Churches of North Carolina.

#### PURPOSE

The object of the Cape Fear Conference shall be to promote Christ's kingdom among men by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

#### ARTICLE I. COMPOSITION

This conference shall be composed of affiliated ordained ministers and churches within its bounds, who are in good standing, and of all general officers, and members of standing boards or committees of the conference. It shall operate under the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina. No church corporation whose articles of incorporation or constitution and bylaws conflict with the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina shall be permitted membership in the Cape Fear Conference.

#### ARTICLE II. REPRESENTATION

Each church shall represent with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. The delegation from each church shall carry to the conference a letter certifying their appointment, and giving the statistics and financial condition of the church, together with a statement of all funds received and disbursed for denomination and benevolent purposes during the year.

### ARTICLE III. OFFICERS

The officers shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, who shall be elected for a term of two years, entering upon the duties of said office at the close of the session in which they are elected. Temporary officers, representatives or messengers may be elected at the option of the conference for whatever purposes deemed essential.

## ARTICLE IV. STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the policy of this conference to elect as many boards and committees as may be necessary in carrying out its program. These shall keep records of their proceedings and make a report at each annual session of the conference.

A board of trustees, a board of Christian education, a board of missions and

church extension, and a board of ordination consisting of five members each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be five years, but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the tenure of office of one member annually.

Section 1—Standing boards shall write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to their conference.

Section 2—The executive committee shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, secretary, treasurer, and one member elected by the conference at the time of the official election of officers.

Section 3—Temporary committees shall be appointed at option of the conference for whatever purpose deemed necessary.

## ARTICLE V. FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the conference annually according to its membership.

### ARTICLE VI. ADMISSION OF CHURCHES

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina and desires to help promote the program and work of the Cape Fear Conference and the North Carolina State Convention may present its petition to the regular session of the conference. If the petition for membership is approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates.

## ARTICLE VII. DISMISSION OF CHURCHES

A church may be dismissed from membership in the conference by vote of the conference.

#### ARTICLE VIII. VISITORS

The Cape Fear Conference may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of the body save that of voting and holding office.

## ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS

The Cape Fear Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday before the first Sunday in November. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session or by the executive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary.

#### **BYLAWS**

Section 1—The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Cape Fear Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates, and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and committees; and, in general, to perform the duties of the office of moderator.

Section 2 - The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the

moderator when that officer is not present, and he shall assist the moderator when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the moderator, the assistant moderator shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the conference.

Section 3—The secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Cape Fear Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. The secretary shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require the secretary's signature; and serve as a member of the executive board.

Section 4—The duties of the assistant secretary shall be the duties of the secretary when that officer is not present, and he shall assist the secretary when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the secretary, the assistant secretary shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the conference.

Section 5—The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, the executive committee, or any standing board invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report to the conference.

Section 6—It shall be the duty of the executive committee to transact the business of the conference when the conference is not in session, and make report at annual conference. The executive committee shall plan the program for the annual session of the conference.

Section 7—The board of trustees shall hold in trust all conference and real property, gifts and bequests of the conference, and convey or expend said property or assets as the Cape Fear Conference may direct.

Section 8—It shall be the duty of the board of ordination to examine, ordain, and discipline ministers in keeping with the provisions of the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, along with whatever additional requirements may be made by the conference. The board of ordination shall examine ordained ministers seeking membership in this conference and make recommendations in keeping with their findings.

Section 9—It shall be the duty of the board of missions and church extension to cooperate with the churches of the conference to promote the establishment of churches within the bounds of the conference. The board of missions and church extension shall cooperate with the state board of missions to raise money, arrange itineraries, and keep the work of missions before our churches.

Section 10—It shall be the duty of the board of Christian education to keep our people informed as to our educational needs, and endeavor to promote the cause of and stimulate interest among our people in the cause of Christian education. The board of Christian education shall cooperate with the educational institutions of our denomination and use all funds for the best interests of Christian education.

Section 11—The following temporary committees shall be appointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: credentials, nominating, resolutions, temperance, obituary, and letter digest.

Section 12—A board or committee will be recognized as having a quorum when there is a majority of the members present for a meeting, providing all the members of said board or committee have been duly notified concerning the said meeting.

Section 13—All reports, resolutions, and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

Section 14—Each minister and delegate in good standing shall duly attend each day while the conference is in session or be subjected to censure by the conference and reported to his local church.

Section 15—If any member, in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his seat in that session.

Section 16—No member shall be excused from any session of the conference without leave of the moderator.

Section 17 - The conference shall adjourn by a majority vote.

Section 18—Each officer and member of standing committees and boards in good standing shall be entitled to a seat and vote in the conference.

Section 19- The conference shall open and close with suitable devotional services.

Section 20—This constitution and its bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds favorable vote of the members present, provided that said amendment shall be presented on the first day of the annual session for action on the following day.

## UNION MEETING

# CAPE FEAR CONFERENCE OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION

#### ARTICLE I

Name—This organization shall be known as the Union Meeting of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

## ARTICLE II

Purpose—The purpose of this union meeting is the creation of an effective agency through which the Cape Fear Conference may successfully promote its work. It shall thus be and remain subject to the authority and use of the conference—except in the election of its general officers—as a consistent medium devoted to the advancement of the conference program of evangelism, education, benevolence and church extension.

## ARTICLE III

Composition— This union meeting shall be composed of churches affiliated with the Cape Fear Conference, the ordained and licensed ministers who are

members of churches that belong to the conference, and all general officers and members of standing committees of both the conference and the union meeting.

## ARTICLE IV

Representation—The churches of the Cape Fear Conference shall represent in the quarterly sessions of the union meeting with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall each represent with one delegate.

#### ARTICLE V

Finance—Each church shall send with its delegation to the quarterly sessions of this union meeting one percent of its annual budget exclusive of funds for building and equipment, or a total of four percent of the church budget for the full year of four union meeting sessions. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall represent with whatever amounts they may choose. All funds shall be allocated by the executive board of the conference, but said allocations shall be approved by the union meeting in regular session or by the conference.

#### ARTICLE VI

Officers—The general officers of this union meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, at the last session of the union meeting before the annual session of the Cape Fear Conference.

#### ARTICLE VII

Boards and Committees— All standing committees and boards created by the conference shall avail themselves of the advantage of promoting their work through the union meeting.

The general officers of the union meeting shall be added to the executive board of the conference and this composite committee shall constitute the executive committee of the union meeting. This committee shall have power to act for and on the behalf of the union meeting between its regular sessions. It shall also be the duty of the executive committee to prepare and supervise the programs of the union meeting and to allocate all undesignated funds.

#### ARTICLE VIII

Meetings—The union meeting shall hold its regular sessions Saturday before each fifth Sunday in the churches of the Cape Fear Conference. The host church shall be selected from time to time, according to the alphabetic succession of the initial letter of the name of each church. This method of selecting the place of meeting may be changed when deemed expedient or necessary, by an act of the union in session or the executive committee.

#### ARTICLE IX

A mendment—This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference by a majority vote of the members present,

provided that the proposed amendment be presented in writing by the union meeting.

## Bylaws Governing the Board of Education

- 1. The board shall be composed of five members. Their terms of office shall be as provided for in the constitution of the conference.
- 2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and executive secretary, who shall have charge of the promotional work of the board; provided, however, that any two offices may be combined at the option of the board, and provided further, that the executive secretary, may, or may not be, a member of this board.
- 3. The treasurer of the conference shall, unless otherwise provided for, hold all funds of the board and disburse same on order of the board, or when duly signed by the chairman and secretary of the board. Annual reports of all receipts and disbursements shall be made to the conference in session and interim reports to the executive board when requested.
- 4. The board shall meet as often as necessary for the proper dispatch of the work assigned to it by conference direction, but must meet at least twice a year.
- 5. The board shall make, or cause to be made, adequate records of meetings of this board, detail records, reports, etc., of all activities of the board and its officers, and preserve same as permanent records.
- 6. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of cooperating with our state and national education institutions in the promotion of general Christian education.
- 7. The organization, direction, and the training program of the Free Will Baptist League shall be under the direction and supervision of this board.
- 8. The general supervision of the Sunday school promotional activities, organization of new Sunday schools, training programs for workers, and any and all other Sunday school promotional programming shall be the responsibility of this board.
- 9. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of making or cause to be made emphasis on the Christian family life.
- 10. This board shall be responsible for conducting area institutes and conferences, on a conference scale, annually to instruct and help our people when necessary to have a better understanding of our conference, state, or national programs.
- 11. It shall be the responsibility of this board to direct and supervise all training programs of the conference.
- 12. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the responsibilities assigned to it, provided, however, that the same shall not be inconsistent with bylaws, nor the constitution of the conference.
- 13. The board shall be responsible for the promotion and administration of a Student's Loan Fund with which to aid worthy students in securing an education.

- 14. The board shall lend money only upon the following terms and conditions:
- a. Students must be adjudged worthy as to character and ability, and must attend an institution of learning approved by this board.
- b. A promissory note must be made by the student, with one or more good endorsements or other good security satisfactory to the board. The rate of interest shall be 1 percent while the student is in training. After completion of training, a new note shall be made bearing 6 percent interest with monthly or quarterly payments to be made until obligations are fully discharged.
- 15. These bylaws may be amended or revised at any annual session of the conference, provided that such amendments, or revisions, as may be deemed necessary, shall lie on the table at least three hours before a vote is taken, during which time they shall be read twice, and provided further that such amendments or revisions shall require a two-thirds vote.

# Bylaws Governing the Board of Missions

- 1. The board shall be composed of five members. The first named shall serve for a term of one year, the second for two years, the third for three years, the fourth for four years, the fifth for five years, and thereafter, each for a term of five years.
- 2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, and an executive secretary, who shall have general charge of the promotional work of the board, provided, however, that any two offices may be combined at the option of the board, and provided, further, that the executive secretary may, or may not, be a member of the board.
- 3. The board shall meet as often as may be deemed necessary to attend to all matters pertaining to missions within the territory of the Cape Fear Conference and mission points that have been approved for membership in the Cape Fear Conference.
- 4. The treasurer of the conference shall hold all funds designated for Cape Fear missions and pay out same on order of the board, or when said order is duly signed by the chairman and the secretary of the board. Annual reports shall be rendered to the conference of all funds received and disbursed by the treasurer.
- 5. Churches and / or individuals are encouraged to expedite the work of missions in the fulfillment of the Great Commission of our Lord in appropriate communities throughout the conference. No reimbursement, however, shall be made for expenses incurred without the approval of the Board of Missions.
- 6. Mission points, or stations, may be opened and maintained by the board for such a length of time as may be deemed best, and evangelists, missionaries, and such field workers as may be deemed necessary for the proper promotion of the mission work may be employed.
- 7. The board shall not make any investment in property, nor promote any investment in property, without first giving due consideration to the safety of the investment, property titles, and other matters relative to the security of

any investment.

- 8. The board shall render annual reports to the conference and interim reports to the executive board when requested.
- 9. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the mission program, provided that same shall not be inconsistent with these bylaws.
