PROCEEDINGS

The Cape Fear Conference opened its one hundred and twenty-sixth session on Thursday morning, October 30, 1980, at 9 a.m. with the singing of the hymn, "Amazing Grace." The session was held at Shady Grove Original Free Will Baptist Church on Route 5, Dunn, North Carolina, with the Rev. C. Felton Godwin, moderator, presiding.

The opening prayer and Scripture were led by the Rev. Billy R. Nowell, pastor of Powhatan church.

The welcome was extended by the host pastor, the Rev. Jeff Scarborough.

The response to the welcome was given by the Rev. Foy C. Futrelle.

The session was called to order by the moderator.

Mrs. Lillian Stanley, assistant secretary and chairman of the Credentials Committee, explained the registration procedures adopted by the one hundred and fourteenth session as offered by the Resolutions Committee, which states the following:

"Be it resolved, that in all future sessions of the Cape Fear Conference, the Credentials Committee be instructed to issue a badge of identification to all duly registered ministers, delegates, and visitors.

"Be it further resolved, that no person will be allowed to vote who does not properly display said badge. It is understood that visitors shall be granted all rights and privileges except that of voting.

"Be it further resolved, that upon the adoption of this resolution, it shall become the duty of the Credentials Committee to explain the registration at the opening of each session of the Cape Fear Conference."

The enrollment of ordained and licensed ministers was called with several corrections being made in the enrollment.

The roll call of churches included the following: Bethel 2, Casey's Chapel 2, Daly's Chapel 1, Eastwood 1, Faith 1, Goldsboro 3, Hopewell 0, Johnston Union 2, Lanwood Chapel 1, Lee's Chapel 3, Mount Olive 1, Oak Grove 2, Palmer Memorial 1, Pleasant Grove 2, Powhatan 2, Riverside 2, Robert's Grove 2, Saint Mary's Grove 3, Saint Paul 2, Shady Grove 4, Smithfield 2, Smyrna 1, Steven's Chapel 1, Tee's Chapel 3, West Clinton 2, Wooten's Chapel 2, and Yelverton Grove 1.

Missions included: Catalpa 1, Eastover 1, Haymount 1, and Victory 1.

The moderator extended greetings to the visiting ministers.

Following the moderator's remarks of challenge and requests, the following temporary committee appointments were made by the moderator, with the first person named on the committee to serve as chairman:

Credentials Committee: Mrs. Lillian Stanley, Arnold Price, and Mrs. Ruth Scarborough.

Temperance Committee: Charles N. Parrish, William Atlas Hogg (in the place of W. O. Lassiter, previously appointed, who was sick), and J. Walter Stanley.

Resolutions Committee: C. M. Coats, Hubert C. Stanley, and Luby Tyner.

Obituary Committee: J. B. Caton Sr., John Rayford Lee, and Alton Howard (to replace J. C. Hathaway, previously appointed, who was sick).

Nominating Committee: Henry Armstrong, Taylor Hill, and L. B. Woodall Jr.

Ushers for the Conference: Norvell Dawson and C. Nelson Stewart

Song Leader: Johnny Woodall

Pianist: Mrs. Jean Wise

The Mount Olive College report was presented by the president of the college, Dr. Burkette Raper. Dr. Raper gave steps for the college to become a four-year program in 1984, during his report. The report was received as information.

The moderator called for Denominational Enterprise reports.

The Church Finance report was presented by the Rev. Hubert Burress. This report was received as information.

The Home Missions report was given by the Executive Director, the Rev. Taylor Hill. This report was also recorded and received as information.

The Foreign Missions report was given when the Executive Director, the Rev. Joseph Ingram, gave a progress report. The report was received as information.

The Free Will Baptist Press report was presented by the Rev. Walter Reynolds. This report was received as information.

The Rev. Walter Reynolds also gave the Superannuation report, which was received as information.

State Convention President, the Rev. David Charles Hansley, gave a report of the State Convention. His report and information were received as information and will become a part of the State Convention report in the Yearbook.

The moderator declared a fifteen-minute recess.

Following the recess, the session was again called to order by the moderator. The congregation joined in singing the hymn, "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus."

Following the collection of the morning offering, Dr. Opey Jeanes of Mount Olive College, prayed the offertory prayer.

Special music was provided by the Shady Grove trio accompanied at the piano by Mrs. Jean Wise.

The Rev. Mike Scott, pastor of Johnston Union church, preached the morning sermon on the topic, "Free Will Baptists Could Turn the World Upside Down," using Scripture from Acts 17:5-9.

Following the sermon, the host pastor, the Rev. Jeff Scarborough, made announcements concerning the noon meal. The benediction and blessing on the food were offered by the Rev. Joseph Ingram.

The afternoon session was opened with the singing of the hymn, "Onward Christian Soldiers."

Scripture and prayer were given by the Rev. T. C. Farmer, pastor of Tee's Chapel church.

The moderator called for reports from standing committees.

The Executive Committee's report was presented by the Conference secretary, Mrs. Ray G. Smith. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Ordaining Council report was given by the Rev. L. B. Woodall Jr., secretary to the Council. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Cape Fear Sunday School Convention report was given by the president of the Convention, the Rev. Arnold Price. The report was accepted and is recorded. (See Reports.)

The Rev. Billy R. Nowell presented the Cape Fear Missions Board report. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Woman's Auxiliary report was given by the president, Mrs. C. I. Godwin. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Cape Fear Ministers' Fellowship Conference report was given by the Rev. J. Walter Stanley. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Board of Education's report was presented by Mr. Milton Wiggs. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Rev. Scott Sowers, a representative from the Free Will Baptist Press, commented with regard to the progress at Cragmont Assembly. His report was received as information to the Conference.

The Children's Home report was presented by the Executive Director, the Rev. Stewart Humphrey. This report was received as information.

The moderator called for temporary committee reports.

The report of the Temperance Committee was presented by the Rev. Charles N. Parrish. The report was adopted. (See Reports.) A motion was made by the Rev. L. B. Woodall Jr. that the Con-

A motion was made by the Rev. L. B. Woodall Jr. that the Conference contribute \$100 to the Christian Action League and that the funds be drawn from the administrative account. The motion was seconded and passed.

The Resolutions Committee report was given by the Rev. Luby Tyner. A total of four resolutions was presented to the session and each was adopted are recorded. (See Reports.)

The Rev. Alton Howard gave the report of the Obituary Committee and presented the following:

"We, the Obituary Committee, are happy to report that there have been no deaths among our ministers of the Cape Fear Conference during the past year.

"It is requested that all present in this Conference today stand for a moment of silent prayer in appreciation to God for His great mercy to us, and that the Rev. J. B. Caton Sr. lead us in a prayer of praise for His gracious mercy."

The Credentials Committee report was given by Mrs. Lillian Stanley. The report showed 6 officers present, 30 ministers present, 6 visiting ministers present, 1 licensed minister present, 45 delegates, and 37 visitors. (See Reports.)

The Rev. Henry Armstrong gave the Nominating Committee's report. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The moderator opened the business session and asked for any business that should be brought before the session.

Mr. H. T. Hinson moved that mileage for Conference travel be increased from 15° per mile to 20° per mile. The motion was seconded by the Rev. Billy R. Nowell and was passed.

The Rev. C. Bryant Hines, pastor of Casey's Chapel, invited the one hundred and twenty-seventh session of the Conference to convene at Casey's Chapel. Mr. H. T. Hinson moved to accept the invitation, which was unanimously accepted.

Mr. H. T. Hinson, Conference Treasurer, presented the financial report. The report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Rev. T. C. Farmer moved that two \$300 scholarships be awarded to worthy applicants annually. Mrs. Ruth Warrick seconded the motion, which carried.

The Conference Treasurer, Mr. Hinson noted that loan funds were available to worthy sutdents with the interest rate at 1 percent while in school and 6 percent after graduation.

The Rev. Jeff Scarbourough moved that the Conference forward a love offering of \$50 to a retired minister, the Rev. Herman Wooten. Mr. H. T. Hinson, Treasurer, asked permission to amend the motion to send Brother Wooten \$100, and that the amount forwarded to Brother Wooten come from the Missions Department. Brother Scarborough accepted Mr. Hinson's amendment to the motion. The motion was seconded and carried.

There being no further business, the session was declared adjourned by the moderator as the congregation sang the hymn, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds."

The closing prayer was offered by the Rev. Stewart Humphrey.

MINUTES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

(September 16, 1980)

The Executive Committee of the Cape Fear Conference met September 16, 1980, at the home of the moderator for the purpose of taking care of any business to come before the committee and to make plans for the 126th session of the Conference.

The moderator, the Rev. C. Felton Godwin, called the meeting to order, with all members present, as well as the assistant secretary, Mrs. Stanley.

The Rev. W. A. Martin prayed the opening prayer.

The minutes of the December 18, 1979, meeting were reviewed by the secretary and were accepted.

The first item of business included the reading of a letter of resignation from the Board of Education from the Rev. Taylor Hill.

Mr. H. T. Hinson nominated Mr. C. Nelson Stewart to fill the unexpired term of Brother Hill. Mr. Stewart was called by telephone by the moderator and accepted the position.

A letter from the clerk of the Christian Chapel church was read by the moderator. The letter stated that they were withdrawing from the Conference. The Rev. Billy R. Nowell moved that the letter be accepted as information and that the church be dropped from the Conference records. The motion was seconded and unanimously accepted by the committee.

The program for the 126th session of the Conference was planned.

Following a motion to adjourn by Mr. H. T. Hinson, the Rev. Billy R. Nowell prayed the prayer of benediction.

REPORT OF ORDAINING COUNCIL

(November 14, 1979)

On November 14, 1979, the Council secretary received a letter of transfer from the secretary of the Ordaining Council of the Western Conference for the Rev. Jeff Scarborough to unite with the Cape Fear Conference. Brother Scarborough was received into the Conference at St. Mary's Grove church during the 1979 setting of the Conference on November 1, 1979, pending that letter.

The council secretary sent a letter of transfer of the Rev. Earl Glenn's ministerial membership from the Cape Fear Conference to the Central Conference on November 20, 1979.

The council secretary received a letter from Faith Free Will Baptist Church on November 23, 1979, notifying the Ordaining Council that the church had renewed Mr. Theodore Wilkins' license.

A letter was received from the Eastern Conference Ordaining Council secretary requesting a transfer of the Rev. Dallas Pinkham's ministerial membership from the Cape Fear Conference to the Eastern Conference. The letter of transfer was mailed on December 10, 1979.

A letter was received from the Smyrna Free Will Baptist Church notifying the secretary of the Ordaining Council that Mr. Cecil Blackmon's license had been renewed. The secretary notified the church clerk that Mr. Blackmon's license was in good standing.

A letter was received from Mr. Cecil Blackmon requesting a guide to study to prepare to take the ordination examination. The secretary sent a listing of books and other publications for Mr. Blackmon to study.

(March 23, 1980)

The meeting was called to order by the chairman, the Rev. Felton Godwin, at 1:25 p.m.

The Rev. C. M. Coats led the council in prayer.

Those present were chairman C. Felton Godwin, C. M. Coats, Foy C. Futrelle, John Rayford Lee, and L. B. Woodall Jr.

The minutes of the September 24, 1979, meeting and minutes for information and requests that had come to the Ordaining Council secretary since the 1979 session of the Conference were read and approved.

It was moved that the secretary write the Conference clerk to find out if there were any Conference ministers who were not in good standing in the Conference because of their absence in the setting of the Conference or had not called or written explaining their absence. The motion was adopted.

A letter was received from the Eastwood church clerk stating that in a called business session on February 21, 1980, the church voted to accept the resignation of John Adcox as pastor.

A committee composed of C. Felton Godwin, C. M. Coats, and L. B. Woodall Jr. was requested to arrange a meeting with Mr. Adcox as soon as possible. The committee endeavored to arrange the meeting, but due to the fact that Mr. Adcox could not be contacted, a meeting could not be arranged. On March 26, 1980, the council secretary received Mr. Adcox's ordination certificate in the mail; therefore, Mr. Adcox is no longer an ordained minister in the Cape Fear Conference.

(June 23, 1980)

The meeting was called to order by chairman C. Felton Godwin at 1:30 $\rm p.m.$

The Rev. C. M. Coats led those present in the opening prayer.

Members present were the chairman, C. Felton Godwin, C. M. Coats,
Foy Futrelle, and L. B. Woodall Jr.

The minutes of the March meeting were read and approved.

A motion was made that the secretary write the Eastwood church of Fayetteville and request Mr. John Adcox's license be forwarded to the Ordaining Council. The motion was adopted. Instead of writing a letter, the secretary called the clerk and the pastor of the church requesting the license. The church did not have Mr. Adcox's license. Mr. Adcox's wife was contacted since the secretary was informed that she had the license. She refused to return the license to the church. The council secretary has refused to pursue the matter any further unless the Conference provides an attorney to pursue or counsels the secretary to do so.

A motion was made to adjourn at 3 p.m.

The Rev. C. Felton Godwin prayed the closing prayer.

(June 28, 1980)

On this date during the Union meeting at Tee's Chapel church, the Union clerk, Mrs. Dola Dudley gave the secretary of the Ordaining Council the following information:

Mr. Phil Miller, licensed by the Palmer Memorial church of Garner, has moved away and his license is no longer valid.

Mr. Richard Overman has gone independent. Mr. Overman's actions make him no longer a member of the Cape Fear Conference.

Mr. R. W. Allman has transferred his ministerial membership from the Cape Fear Conference to the Western Conference.

Following action on these three items, the meeting adjourned with the Rev. L. B. Woodall Jr. praying the closing prayer.

(August 25, 1980)

The meeting was called to order by the chairman, C. Felton Godwin, at $1:25\,\,\mathrm{p.m.}$

The Rev. Foy Futrelle led those present in prayer.

Present were C. Felton Godwin, Foy Futrelle, and L. B. Woodall Jr.

The minutes of the June meeting were read and approved.

It was moved that the names of Phil Miller and Richard Overman be dropped from the listing of Cape Fear Conference Ministers. The motion was seconded and adopted.

The Rev. Phil Wood, the new pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Smithfield, appeared before the Ordaining Council requesting membership in the Cape Fear Conference. It was moved and seconded

to grant Mr. Wood's membership of transfer from the Eastern Conference to unite with the Cape Fear Conference.

The council secretary has received a letter from the Eastern Conference transferring the Rev. Rod Jones's ministerial membership from that Conference to the Cape Fear Conference. Mr. Jones met with the Ordaining Council in a called meeting.

Mr. Mark Hobbs came before the Ordaining Council to be examined for ordination. He did well on the examination and has been certified for ordination. Mr. Hobbs called the secretary on Tuesday, October 38, 1989, notifying the secretary that he has been called to pastor the First Free Will Baptist Church of Rocky Mount, North Carolina. He has requested the Ordaining Council to arrange a service in his home church, Hopewell, to ordain him as soon as possible.

The Rev. Foy Futrelle led the council in the closing prayer Ordaining Council Proceedings During 1980 Session of Conference.

The chairman, C. Felton Godwin, called the meeting to order at 1 p.m.

The Rev. John Rayford Lee led in the opening prayer.

The Rev. C. Bryant Himes appeared before the Council to report his relationship in the Central Conference and requested that he be cleared to work in the Cape Fear Conference. A motion was made and seconded to accept the request of Brother Hines. The motion carried.

A letter was received from the Western Conference regarding the transfer of the Rev. Davie Brinson to the Cape Fear Conference. A motion to receive Brother Brinson was made and seconded to accept Brother Brinson. The motion carried.

It was reported that Brother John Gilliland had forwarded his credentials to the council secretary. The credentials were received, and Mr. Gilliland is no longer a minister within the ranks of the Cape Fear Conference.

The Rev. C. M. Coats prayed the closing prayer and the meeting was adjourned.

A letter from Mark Hobbs was read stating that he was student teaching and would be unable to attend the Conference.

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Messages were received that Brothers J. C. Hathaway and W. O. Lassiter were sick and unable to attend.

The Rev. Jeff Scarborough gave the offertory prayer. The offering was received in the amount of \$48.06.

Mr. Price recognized Milton Wiggs, State Sunday School Treasurer. He brought greetings from the State Sunday School Convention.

Dr. Opey Jeanes brought greetings from Mount Olive College. Mr. Price opened the business session.

Mrs. Margaret Lassiter, secretary, called the roll of churches. Twelve churches were represented. The minutes of the 1979 Convention were read and approved.

Mr. Price recognized the twenty-two Sunday school teachers and ten superintendents that were present. He presented the following plaques:

- 2. BE IT RESOLVED that each person present assume the responsibility of making their Sunday school better by encouraging regular attendance of all church members.
- 3. BE IT RESOLVED that the second Sunday in July be a day in which each Sunday school promotes Sunday school history.
- 4. BE IT RESOLVED that each superintendent give a brief report of what his staff has done to promote, to uplift, and to win the lost at the next convention.
- 5. BE IT RESOLVED that a complete report of this convention be compiled for the 1981 YEARBOOK.
- 3. BE IT RESOLVED that the Sunday school which does not represent at the convention cannot receive the yearly attendance increase award, but that the award be given to the Sunday school present and deserving.
- 7. BE IT RESOLVED that this Body stand in fervent prayer led by our president that God will stir all our members' hearts to fulfill our work for him in a more meaningful way, and thank God for our accomplishments to date.

The Rev. Jeff Scarborough made a motion that they be accepted. The motion passed.

Finance Committee:

Mrs. Lillian Stanley gave a balance in the Treasury of \$259.61. Milton Wiggs made a motion that it be accepted. Motion passed.

The congregation sang "I Will Sing the Wondrous Story." Everyone was invited to the altar for prayer regarding the resolutions.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist denomination of North Carolina, desiring to be in fellowship in a bond of union, do ordain this constitution.

NAME

This shall be the constitution of the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist Churches of North Carolina.

PURPOSE

The object of the Cape Fear Conference shall be to promote Christ's kingdom among men by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

ARTICLE I. COMPOSITION

This conference shall be composed of affiliated ordained ministers and churches within its bounds, who are in good standing, and of all general officers, and members of standing boards or committees of the conference. It shall operate under the Statement of Faith and Dicipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina. No church corporation whose articles of incorporation or constitution and bylaws conflict with the Statement of Faith and Dicipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina shall be permitted membership in the Cape Fear Conference.

ARTICLE II. REPRESENTATION

Each church shall represent with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. The delegation from each church shall carry to the conference a letter certifying their appointment, and giving the statistics and financial condition of the church, together with a statement of all funds received and disbursed for denomination and benevolent purposes during the year.

ARTICLE III. OFFICERS

The officers shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, who shall be elected for a term of two years, entering upon the duties of said office at the close of the session in which they are elected. Temporary officers, representatives or messengers may be elected at the option of the conference for whatever purposes deemed essential.

ARTICLE IV. STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the policy of this conference to elect as many boards and committees as may be necessary in carrying out its program. These shall keep records of their proceedings and make a report at each annual session of the conference.

A board of trustees, a board of Christian education, a board of missions and church extension, and a board of ordination consisting of five members each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be five years, but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the tenure of office of one member annually.

Section 1—Standing boards shall write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to their conference.

Section 2—The executive committee shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, secretary, treasurer, and one member elected by the conference at the time of the official election of officers.

Section 3—Temporary committees shall be appointed at option of the conference for whatever purpose deemed necessary.

ARTICLE V. FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the conference annually according to its membership.

ARTICLE VI. ADMISSION OF CHURCHES

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina and desires to help promote the program and work of the Cape Fear Conference and the North Carolina State Convention may present its petition to the regular session of the conference. If the petition for membership is approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates.

ARTICLE VII. DISMISSION OF CHURCHES

A church may be dismissed from membership in the conference by vote of the conference.

ARTICLE VIII. VISITORS

The Cape Fear Conference may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of the body save that of voting and holding office.

ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS

The Cape Fear Conference shall meet in annual session on hursday before the first Sunday in November. The host church shall e selected by vote of the conference in annual session or by the excutive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be hanged by an act of the executive committee should such a change ecome necessary.

BYLAWS

Section 1—The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the lape Fear Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates, and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing bards and committees; and, in general, to perform the duties of the fice of moderator.

Section 2—The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the uties of the moderator when that officer is not present, and he shall saist the moderator when called upon. In the event of the resignation death of the moderator, the assistant moderator shall fill the vacantuit the next session of the conference.

Section 3—The secretary shall record the proceedings of all essions of the Cape Fear Conference and preserve an accurate record fail proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. The secretary hall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents not otherwise reserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conjuct the official correspondence and sign such documents and intruments as require the secretary's signature; and serve as a number of the executive board.

Section 4—The duties of the assistant secretary shall be the uties of the secretary when that officer is not present, and he shall ssist the secretary when called upon. In the event of the resignation or eath of the secretary, the assistant secretary shall fill the vacancy unlithe next session of the conference.

Section 5—The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that elongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, ne executive committee, or any standing board invested with authorize to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate count of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report of the conference.

Section 6—It shall be the duty of the executive committee to cansact the business of the conference when the conference is not in

session, and make report at annual conference. The executive commit tee shall plan the program for the annual session of the conference.

Section 7—The board of trustees shall hold in trust all conference and reproperty, gifts and bequests of th conference, and convey or expend said property or assets as the Cape Fear Conference may direct.

Section 8—It shall be the duty of the board of ordination to examine, ordain, and discipline ministers in keeping with the provisions of the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, along with whatever additional requirements may be made by the conference. The board of ordination shall examine or dained ministers seeking membership in this conference and make recommendations in keeping with their findings.

Section 9—It shall be the duty of the board of missions and church extension to cooperate with the churches of the conference to promote the establishment of churches within the bounds of the conference. The board of missions and church extension shall cooperate with the state board of missions to raise money, arrange itineraries and keep the work of missions before our churches.

Section 10—It shall be the duty of the board of Christian education to keep our people informed as to our educational needs, and endeavor to promote the cause of and stimulate interest among our people in the cause of Christian education. The board of Christian education shall cooperate with the educational institutions of our denomination and use all funds for the best interests of Christian education.

Section 11—The following temporary committees shall be ap pointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: credentials, nominating, resolutions temperance, obituary, and letter digest.

Section 12—A board or committee will be recognized as having a quorum when there is a majority of the members present for a meeting, providing all the members of said board or committee have been duly notified concerning the said meeting.

Section 13—All reports, resolutions, and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

Section 14—Each minister and delegate in good standing shall duly attend each day while the conference is in session or be subjected to censure by the conference and reported to his local church.

Section 15—If any member, in the judgment of the conference shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his seat in that session.

Section 16—No member shall be excused from any session of the conference without leave of the moderator.

Section 17—The conference shall adjourn by a majority vote.

Section 18—Each officer and member of standing committees and boards in good standing shall be entitled to a seat and vote in the conference.

Section 19—The conference shall open and close with suitable devotional services.

Section 20—This constitution and its bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds favorable vote of the members present, provided that said amendment shall be presented on the first day of the annual session for action on the following day.

UNION MEETING

CAPE FEAR CONFERENCE OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I

Name—This organization shall be known as the Union Meeting of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

ARTICLE II

Purpose—The purpose of this union meeting is the creation of an effective agency through which the Cape Fear Conference may successfully promote its work. It shall thus be and remain subject to the authority and use of the conference—except in the election of its general officers—as a consistent medium devoted to the advancement of the conference program of evangelism, education, benevolence and church extension.

ARTICLE III

Composition—This union meeting shall be composed of churches affiliated with the Cape Fear Conference, the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, and all general officers and members of standing committees of both the conference and the union meeting.

ARTICLE IV

Representation—The churches of the Cape Fear Conference shall represent in the quarterly sessions of the union meeting with one

delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall each represent with one delegate.

ARTICLE V

Finance—Each church shall send with its delegation to the quarterly sessions of this union meeting one percent of its annual budget exclusive of funds for building and equipment, or a total of four percent of the church budget for the full year of four union meeting sessions. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall represent with whatever amounts they may choose. All funds shall be allocated by the executive board of the conference, but said allocations shall be approved by the union meeting in regular session or by the conference.

ARTICLE VI

Officers—The general officers of this union meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, at the last session of the union meeting before the annual session of the Cape Fear Conference.

ARTICLE VII

Boards and Committees—All standing committees and boards created by the conference shall avail themselves of the advantage of promoting their work through the union meeting.

The general officers of the union meeting shall be added to the executive board of the conference and this composite committee shall constitute the executive committee of the union meeting. This committee shall have power to act for and on the behalf of the union meeting between its regular sessions. It shall also be the duty of the executive committee to prepare and supervise the programs of the union meeting and to allocate all undesignated funds.

ARTICLE VIII

Meetings—The union meeting shall hold its regular sessions Saturday before each fifth Sunday in the churches of the Cape Fear Conference. The host church shall be selected from time to time, according to the alphabetic succession of the initial letter of the name of each church. This method of selecting the place of meeting may be changed when deemed expedient or necessary, by an act of the union in session or the executive committee.

ARTICLE IX

Amendment—This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference by a majority vote of the members present, provided that the proposed amendment be presented in writing by the union meeting.

Bylaws Governing the Board of Education

- 1. The board shall be composed of five members. Their terms of office shall be as provided for in the constitution of the conference.
- 2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and executive secretary, who shall have charge of the promotional work of the board; provided, however, that any two offices may be combined at the option of the board, and provided further, that the executive secretary, may, or may not be, a member of this board.
- 3. The treasurer of the conference shall, unless otherwise provided for, hold all funds of the board and disburse same on order of the board, or when duly signed by the chairman and secretary of the board. Annual reports of all receipts and disbursements shall be made to the conference in session and interim reports to the executive board when requested.
- 4. The board shall meet as often as necessary for the proper dispatch of the work assigned to it by conference direction, but must meet at least twice a year.
- 5. The board shall make, or cause to be made, adequate records of meetings of this board, detail records, reports, etc., of all activities of the board and its officers, and preserve same as permanent records.
- 6. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of cooperating with our state and national education institutions in the promotion of general Christian education.
- 7. The organization, direction, and the training program of the Free Will Baptist League shall be under the direction and supervision of this board.
- 8. The general supervision of the Sunday school promotional activities, organization of new Sunday schools, training programs for workers, and any and all other Sunday school promotional programming shall be the responsibility of this board.
- 9. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of making or cause to be made emphasis on the Christian family life.
- 10. This board shall be responsible for conducting area institutes and conferences, on a conference scale, annually to instruct

and help our people when necessary to have a better understanding of our conference, state, or national programs.

- 11. It shall be the responsibility of this board to direct and supervise all training programs of the conference.
- 12. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the responsibilities assigned to it, provided, however, that the same shall not be inconsistent with bylaws, nor the constitution of the conference.
- 13. The board shall be responsible for the promotion and administration of a Students' Loan Fund with which to aid worthy students in securing an education.
- 14. The board shall lend money only upon the following terms and conditions:
- a. Students must be adjudged worthy as to character and ability, and must attend an institution of learning approved by this board.
- b. A promissory note must be made by the student, with one or more good endorsements or other good security satisfactory to the board. The rate of interest shall be 1 percent while the student is in training. After completion of training, a new note shall be made bearing 6 percent interest with monthly or quarterly payments to be made until obligations are fully discharged.
- 15. These bylaws may be amended or revised at any annual session of the confrence, provided that such amendments, or revisions, as may be deemed necessary, shall lie on the table at least three hours before a vote is taken, during which time they shall be read twice, and provided further that such amendments or revisions shall require a two-thirds vote.

Bylaws Governing the Board of Missions

- 1. The board shall be composed of five members. The first named shall serve for a term of one year, the second for two years, the third for three years, the fourth for four years, the fifth for five years, and thereafter, each for a term of five years.
- 2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, and an executive secretary, who shall have general charge of the promotional work of the board, provided, however, that any two offices may be combined at the option of the board, and provided, further, that the executive secretary may, or may not, be a member of the board.
- 3. The board shall meet as often as may be deemed necessary to attend to all matters pertaining to missions within the territory of

the Cape Fear Conference and mission points that have been approved for membership in the Cape Fear Conference.

- 4. The treasurer of the conference shall hold all funds designated for Cape Fear missions and pay out same on order of the board, or when said order is duly signed by the chairman and the secretary of the board. Annual reports shall be rendered to the conference of all funds received and disbursed by the treasurer.
- 5. Churches and/or individuals are encouraged to expedite the work of missions in the fulfillment of the Great Commission of our Lord in appropriate communities throughout the conference. No reimbursement, however, shall be made for expenses incurred without the approval of the Board of Missions.
- 6. Mission points, or stations, may be opened and maintained by the board for such a length of time as may be deemed best, and evangelists, missionaries, and such field workers as may be deemed necessary for the proper promotion of the mission work may be employed.
- 7. The board shall not make any investment in property, nor promote any investment in property, without first giving due consideration to the safety of the investment, property titles, and other matters relative to the security of any investment.
- 8. The board shall render annual reports to the conference and interim reports to the executive board when requested.
- 9. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the mission program, provided that same shall not be inconsistent with these bylaws.
