# **PROCEEDINGS**

The one hundred-thirtieth session of the Cape Fear Conference convened with Tee's Chapel Church on November 1, 1984.

The meeting was opened with the congregation singing "Praise Him, Praise Him," led by Johnny Woodall, who served as music director for the day.

The opening prayer and Scripture were given by the Rev. Danny Braswell.

The Rev. T. C. Farmer, host pastor, welcomed everyone to Tee's Chapel, and the Rev. Felton Godwin responded.

The session was called to order by the moderator, and the Rev. Jeff Scarborough, chairman of the Credentials Committee, explained the registration procedures adopted by the Conference at the one hundred and fourteenth session as offered by the Resolutions Committee which stated: "Be it resolved that in all future sessions of the Cape Fear Conference, the Credentials Committee be instructed to issue a badge of identification to all duly registered ministers, delegates and visitors."

"Be it further resolved, that no person will be allowed to vote who does not properly display said badge. It is understood that visitors shall be granted all rights and privileges except that of voting."

"Be it further resolved, that upon the adoption of this resolution, it shall become the duty of the Credentials Committee to explain the registration at the opening of each session of the Cape Fear Conference."

The following visiting ministers were present: The Rev. Gary M. Bailey, president of the State Convention; the Rev. Bobby Taylor, Free Will Baptist Children's Home; the Rev. Walter J. Sutton, Retirement Homes; the Rev. Charles Barnard, former missionary to the Philippines; and the Rev. Bobby Futrell, Western Conference.

The moderator addressed the conference extending greetings to the visitors and challenging those present to work together in love to further the cause of Christ. He said, "Unity comes through love."

Charles Barnard Retirement Homes, by the Rev. Walter J. Sutton State League Convention, by Mrs. Margaret Ard The body was dismissed for a short recess.

The Conference reassembled with the singing of "He Keeps Me Singing." Following the worship offering and offertory prayer by the Rev. Ed Taylor, the host church provided special music.

The moderator declared a time of special prayer in behalf of those who were sick and had special needs. The Rev. L. B. Woodall led in prayer.

The moderator presented the Rev. Ed Miles, who brought the morning message, using Scripture from the Gospel according to John 13:34-35 on the subject, "Love."

The report of the Cape Fear Ministers' Conference was given by Ted Bryant and adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Board of Education was given by Ruth Warrick and adopted. (See Reports.)

The moderator called for reports from the appointed temporary committees.

The report of the Temperance Committee was given by Dean Kennedy and adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Resolutions Committee was given by Leonard B. Woodall and adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Obituary Committee was given by Davie Brinson and adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Credentials Committee was given by Jeff Scarborough and adopted. (See Reports.)

# REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (May 29, 1984)

A letter was read from Yelverton Grove Church requesting the examination of Kenneth Littleton for ordination. The request was granted, and the candidate was examined by the board and approved for ordination.

The meeting was closed with prayer by the Rev. Davie Brinson.

# (January 23, 1984)

The meeting was called to order by the Rev. C. M. Coats, chairman, at the Smithfield Bible and Bookstore at 1:30 p.m. The Rev. Davie Brinson led in prayer.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Henry Darrell Robbins Jr. of Tee's Chapel Church was approved for a minister's license.

The Rev. Jerry Allen closed the meeting with prayer.

# (July 28, 1984)

The meeting was called to order by the Rev. C. M. Coats at Powhatan Church following the Cape Fear Union Meeting. The Rev. Dewey Boling led in prayer.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

A letter was read from Catalpa Church presenting Gary Patterson to be approved by the council to receive a minister's license from his church. The Board requested that Mr. Patterson complete a ministerial candidate profile and report back at the September meeting.

A letter was read from Community Church and the pastor, the Rev. Billy Ray Jordan, requesting information regarding the status of Joe Gerald. After discussing the matter the chairman instructed the secretary to send a letter to the church stating that Mr. Gerald is no longer a minister in good standing with the Cape Fear Conference.

# (September 24, 1984)

The meeting was held at First Church in Smithfield at 1:30 p.m. The Rev. C. M. Coats, chairman, called the meeting to order and offered prayer.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Board recommended that the names of Theodore Wilkins and Robert Haun be dropped from the roll of licensed ministers.

Gary Patterson appeared before the Council and was approved to be licensed by Catalpa Church.

A report was given regarding the illness of a council member, the Rev. John Rayford Lee. Upon his request, due to his ill health, the Board made the following recommendation: That someone be elected at the 1984 session of the Cape Fear Conference to fill the unexpired term of Brother John Rayford Lee.

The meeting closed with prayer by the Rev. Davie Brinson.

# REPORT OF THE CAPE FEAR MISSIONS BOARD

The Cape Fear Missions Board met November 11, 1983, at the Princeton Mission with 4 members present. The Rev. Ted Bryant led in prayer. The Rev. Alton Howard spoke to

those present on the subject "The Great Commission" in respect to their responsibility as a Board.

It was requested that a list of churches and their contributions to missions be listed in the Yearbook. (See below.)

A motion was made and carried to purchase a fan to repair the heater in the trailer at Princeton.

The Board offered their support in the fall revival that was announced for the Princeton Mission. On Friday night of the revival the Rev. Floyd Smith was officially named as missionary for the Princeton Mission. A motion was made and carried that the Rev. Smith be given a Christmas gift of \$50.

The meeting closed with prayer.

The Mission Board met at Henry's Restaurant in Newton Grove January 27, 1984, with all members present. The Rev. T. C. Farmer led in prayer. A short devotion from Romans 8:31-39 was given by the Rev. Alton Howard.

# CONSTITUTION

# PREAMBLE

We, the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist denomination of North Carolina, desiring to be in fellowship in a bond of union, do ordain this constitution.

# NAME

This shall be the constitution of the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist Churches of North Carolina.

# PURPOSE

The object of the Cape Fear Conference shall be to promote Christ's kingdom among men by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

### ARTICLE I. COMPOSITION

This conference shall be composed of affiliated ordained ministers and churches within its bounds, who are in good standing, and of all general officers, and members of standing boards or committees of the conference. It shall operate under the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina. No church corporation whose articles of incorporation or constitution and bylaws conflict with the Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina shall be permitted membership in the Cape Fear Conference.

# ARTICLE II. REPRESENTATION

Each church shall represent with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. The delegation from each church shall carry to the conference a letter certifying their appointment, and giving the statistics and financial condition of the church, together with a statement of all funds received and disbursed for denomination and benevolent purposes during the year.

# ARTICLE III. OFFICERS

The officers shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, who shall be elected for a term of two years, entering upon the duties of said office at the close of the session in which they are elected. Temporary officers, representatives or messengers may be elected at the option of the conference for whatever purposes deemed essential.

# ARTICLE IV. STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the policy of this conference to elect as many boards and committees as may be necessary in carrying out its program. These shall keep records of their proceedings and make a report at each annual session of the conference.

A board of trustees, a board of Christian education, a board of missions and church extension, and a board of ordination consisting of five members each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be five years, but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the tenure of office of one member annually.

Section 1—Standing boards shall write their own bylaws and administer their respective programs of work, but each shall remain subject to their conference.

Section 2—The executive committee shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, secretary, treasurer, and one member elected by the conference at the time of the official election of officers.

Section 3—Temporary committees shall be appointed at option of the conference for whatever purpose deemed necessary.

# ARTICLE V. FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the conference annually according to its membership.

# ARTICLE VI. ADMISSION OF CHURCHES

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina and desires to help promote the program and work of the Cape Fear Conference and the North Carolina State Convention may present its petition to the regular session of the conference. If the petition for membership is approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates.

## ARTICLE VII. DISMISSION OF CHURCHES

A church may be dismissed from membership in the conference by vote of the conference.

# ARTICLE VIII. VISITORS

The Cape Fear Conference may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of the body save that of voting and holding office.

# ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS

The Cape Fear Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday before the first Sunday in November. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session or by the executive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary.

# **BYLAWS**

Section 1: The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Cape Fear Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and committees; and, in general, to perform the duties of the office of moderator.

Section 2—The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the moderator when that officer is not present, and he shall assist the moderator when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the moderator, the assistant moderator shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the conference.

Section 3—The secretary shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Cape Fear Conference and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. The secretary shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference; hold in trust all documents not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference; conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require the secretary's signature; and serve as a member of the executive board.

Section 4—The duties of the assistant secretary shall be the duties of the secretary when that officer is not present, and he shall assist the secretary when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the secretary, the assistant secretary shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the conference.

Section 5—The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference and pay out same by order of the conference, the executive committee, or any standing board invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report to the conference.

Section 6—It shall be the duty of the executive committee to transact the business of the conference when the conference is not in session, and make report at annual conference. The executive committee shall plan the program for the annual session of the conference.

Section 7—The board of trustees shall hold in trust all conference and real property, gifts and bequests of the conference, and convey or expend said property or assets as the Cape Fear Conference may direct.

Section 8-It shall be the duty of the board of ordination to examine, ordain, and discipline ministers in keeping with the provisions of the Statement of Faith and

Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, along with whatever additional requirements may be made by the conference. The board of ordination shall examine ordained ministers seeking membership in this conference and make recommendations in keeping with their findings.

Section 9—It shall be the duty of the board of missions and church extension to cooperate with the churches of the conference to promote the establishment of churches within the bounds of the conference. The board of missions and church extension shall cooperate with the state board of missions to raise money, arrange itineraries, and keep the work of missions before our churches.

Section 10—It shall be the duty of the board of Christian education to keep our people informed as to our educational needs, and endeavor to promote the cause of and stimulate interest among our people in the cause of Christian education. The board of Christian education shall cooperate with the educational institutions of our denomination and use all funds for the best interests of Christian education.

Section 11—The following temporary committees shall be appointed annually by the moderator and shall render reports during the sitting of the conference: credentials, nominating, resolutions, temperance, obituary, and letter digest.

Section 12—A board or committee will be recognized as having a quorum when there is a majority of the members present for a meeting, providing all the members of said board or committee have been duly notified concerning the said meeting.

Section 13—All reports, resolutions, and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

Section 14—Each minister and delegate in good standing shall duly attend each day while the conference is in session or be subjected to censure by the conference and reported to his local church.

Section 15—If any member, in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his seat in that session.

Section 16—No member shall be excused from any session of the conference without leave of the moderator.

Section 17—The conference shall adjourn by a majority vote.

Section 18—Each officer and member of standing committees and boards in good standing shall be entitled to a seat and vote in the conference.

Section 19—The conference shall open and close with suitable devotional services.

Section 20—This constitution and its bylaws may be altered or amended by a twothirds favorable vote of the members present, provided that said amendment shall be presented on the first day of the annual session for action on the following day.

# UNION MEETING

# CAPE FEAR CONFERENCE OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION

# ARTICLE I

Name—This organization shall be known as the Union Meeting of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

# Article II

Purpose—The purpose of this union meeting is the creation of an effective agency through which the Cape Fear Conference may successfully promote its work. It shall thus be and remain subject to the authority and use of the conference—except in the election of its general officers—as a consistent medium devoted to the advancement of the conference program of evangelism, education, benevolence and church extension.

# ARTICLE III

Composition—This union meeting shall be composed of churches affiliated with the Cape Fear Conference, the ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that belong to the conference, and all general officers and members of standing committees of both the conference and the union meeting.

### ARTICLE IV

Representation—The churches of the Cape Fear Conference shall represent in the quarterly sessions of the union meeting with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall each represent with one delegate.

# ARTICLE V

Finance—Each church shall send with its delegation to the quarterly sessions of this union meeting one percent of its annual budget exclusive of funds for building and equipment, or a total of four percent of the church budget for the full year of four union meeting sessions. Sunday schools, leagues, and auxiliaries shall represent with whatever amounts they may choose. All funds shall be allocated by the executive board of the conference, but said allocations shall be approved by the union meeting in regular session or by the conference.

# ARTICLE VI

Officers—The general officers of this union meeting shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary, an assistant secretary, and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of one year, at the last session of the union meeting before the annual session of the Cape Fear Conference.

# ARTICLE VII

Boards and Committees—All standing committees and boards created by the conference shall avail themselves of the advantage of promoting their work through the union meeting.

The general officers of the union meeting shall be added to the executive board of the conference and this composite committee shall constitute the executive committee of the union meeting. This committee shall have power to act for and on the behalf of the union meeting between its regular sessions. It shall also be the duty of the executive committee to prepare and supervise the programs of the union meeting and to allocate all undesignated funds.

# ARTICLE VIII

Meetings—The union meeting shall hold its regular sessions Saturday before each fifth Sunday in the churches of the Cape Fear Conference. The host church shall be selected from time to time, according to the alphabetic succession of the initial letter of the name of each church. This method of selecting the place of meeting may be changed when deemed expedient or necessary, by an act of the union in session or the executive committee.

# ARTICLE IX

Amendment—This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Cape Fear Conference by a majority vote of the members present, provided that the proposed amendment be presented in writing by the union meeting.

# Bylaws Governing the Board of Education

- The board shall be composed of five members. Their terms of office shall be as provided for in the constitution of the conference.
- 2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and executive secretary, who shall have charge of the promotional work of the board; provided, however, that any two offices may be combined at the option of the board, and provided further, that the executive secretary, may, or may not be, a member of this board.
- 3. The treasurer of the conference shall, unless otherwise provided for, hold all funds of the board and disburse same on order of the board, or when duly signed by the chairman and secretary of the board. Annual reports of all receipts and disbursements shall be made to the conference in session and interim reports to the executive board when requested.
- 4. The board shall meet as often as necessary for the proper dispatch of the work assigned to it by conference direction, but must meet at least twice a year.
- 5. The board shall make, or cause to be made, adequate records of meetings of this board, detail records, reports, etc., of all activities of the board and its officers, and preserve same as permanent records.
- 6. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of cooperating with our state and national education institutions in the promotion of general Christian education.
- 7. The organization, direction, and the training program of the Free Will Baptist League shall be under the direction and supervision of this board.
- 8. The general supervision of the Sunday school promotional activities, organization of new Sunday schools, training programs for workers, and any and all other Sunday school promotional programming shall be the responsibility of this board.
- 9. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of making or cause to be made emphasis on the Christian family life.
- 10. This board shall be responsible for conducting area institutes and conferences, on a conference scale, annually to instruct and help our people when necessary to have a better understanding of our conference, state, or national programs.
- 11. It shall be the responsibility of this board to direct and supervise all training programs of the conference.
- 12. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the responsibilities assigned to it, provided, however, that the same shall not be inconsistent with bylaws, nor the constitution of the conference.
- 13. The board shall be responsible for the promotion and administration of a Student's Loan Fund with which to aid worthy students in securing an education.
  - 14. The board shall lend money only upon the following terms and conditions:
- a. Students must be adjudged worthy as to character and ability, and must attend an institution of learning approved by this board.
- b. A promissory note must be made by the student, with one or more good endorsements or other good security satisfactory to the board. The rate of interest shall be 1 percent while the student is in training. After completion of training, a new note shall be made bearing 6 percent interest with monthly or quarterly payments to be made until obligations are fully discharged.
- 15. These bylaws may be amended or revised at any annual session of the conference, provided that such amendments, or revisions, as may be deemed necessary, shall lie on the table at least three hours before a vote is taken, during which time they

shall be read twice, and provided further that such amendments or revisions shall require a two-thirds vote.

# **Bylaws Governing the Board of Missions**

- 1. The board shall be composed of five members. The first named shall serve for a term of one year, the second for two years, the third for three years, the fourth for four years, the fifth for five years, and thereafter, each for a term of five years.
- 2. The officers shall be chairman, assistant chairman, recording secretary, and an executive secretary, who shall have general charge of the promotional work of the board, provided, however, that any two offices may be combined at the option of the board, and provided, further, that the executive secretary may, or may not, be a member of the board.
- 3. The board shall meet as often as may be deemed necessary to attend to all matters pertaining to missions within the territory of the Cape Fear Conference and mission points that have been approved for membership in the Cape Fear Conference.
- 4. The treasurer of the conference shall hold all funds designated for Cape Fear missions and pay out same on order of the board, or when said order is duly signed by the chairman and the secretary of the board. Annual reports shall be rendered to the conference of all funds received and disbursed by the treasurer.
- 5. Churches and/or individuals are encouraged to expedite the work of missions in the fulfillment of the Great Commission of our Lord in appropriate communities throughout the conference. No reimbursement, however, shall be made for expenses incurred without the approval of the Board of Missions.
- 6. Mission points, or stations, may be opened and maintained by the board for such a length of time as may be deemed best, and evangelists, missionaries, and such field workers as may be deemed necessary for the proper promotion of the mission work may be employed.
- 7. The board shall not make any investment in property, nor promote any investment in property, without first giving due consideration to the safety of the investment, property titles, and other matters relative to the security of any investment.
- $8.\,$  The board shall render annual reports to the conference and interim reports to the executive board when requested.
- 9. The board shall be empowered to make such rules and regulations as it may deem expedient for the proper prosecution of the mission program, provided that same shall not be inconsistent with these bylaws.
