PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Thirty-seventh Session of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened at the Pleasant Grove Free Will Baptist Church, Erwin, NC, Thursday, October 31, 1991.

The session was opened by our song leader, Peyton Lee, in singing "Revive Us Again."

The morning Scripture and prayer were offered by Brother Pete Norris.

J. N. Bryant extended the welcome from Pleasant Grove Church.

Response was by the Rev. Ed Miles.

The moderator called the session to order. The Rev. Al Markuson, chairman of the Credentials Committee, explained the registration procedure of the Conference adopted at the one hundred and fourteenth session which states: "In all future sessions of the Cape Fear Conference, the Credentials Committee shall be instructed to issue a badge of identification to all duly registered ministers, delegates and visitors, and that no person be allowed to vote who does not properly display said badge. It is understood that visitors shall be granted all rights and privileges except that of voting. It shall be the duty of the Credentials Committee to explain the registration at the opening of the Cape Fear Conference."

The roll was called of officers, ministers, standing boards and churches.

The moderator extended a welcome to all visitors and delegates. His remarks included Romans 12:10, "Be ye kindly affectioned one to another." He said to let brotherly love continue and noted that we are here to carry out the Lord's work.

The following temporary committees were appointed with the first person named as chairman:

Song Leader: Peyton Lee

Pianist: Phyllis McLamb

A constitutional change was brought before the Conference by the Conference secretary. It reads as follows: Due to the fact that we do not have a two-day session, I recommend that Section 19 be changed to read as follows:

"This constitution and its bylaws may be altered or amended by two-thirds favorable vote of the members present, *provided that said amendment shall be presented during the morning session and action be taken during the afternoon session.*"

Also, Section 13 to read as follows:

"Each minister in good standing shall attend the conference or be represented by letter. Failure to do so will result in possible censure by the conference and be reported to his local church."

A motion was made and carried to lay this action on the table until the afternoon session.

The Rev. C. H. Overman presented a slide presentation of our various denominational ministries which include all of the above plus, Retirement Homes, Mount Olive College, Cragmont, and the Minister's Program.

Obituary Committee, by the Rev. Leonard Woodall (see Reports).

The morning worship hour began with a hymn, "He Keeps Me Singing." The offertory prayer was offered by the Rev. Phillip Boykin. Special music was rendered by Pam Strickland, of the host church. She sang, "He'll Do It Again" and "Who Put the Tears in the Eyes of the Lamb?" The Rev. Edmundo Gonzalez was unable to speak due to sickness. The message was then brought by the Rev. Michael Ledbetter. The message was entitled, "How Do We Measure Spirituality?" The Scripture used was from 2 Corinthians 13. (Love is the key. We need to love like Jesus.)

The following reports were given before adjourning for the noon meal: Temperance Committee (see Reports), Ordaining Committee (see Reports), Minister's Conference (see Reports). After prayer, we recessed for lunch in the church fellowship hall.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Brother Peyton Lee led in singing the chorus "Jesus Loves Me" and we continued with singing "Standing on the Promises."

The Scripture and prayer were offered by the Rev. Don Venable.

The following reports were given for adoption (see Reports); Executive Committee, by the Rev. W. Michael Ledbetter (motion was made and carried to bring business off the table; motion was made and carried to approve the constitutional changes); Woman's Auxillary, no written report; Board of Education, by Martha Parsons; Resolutions Committee, by the Rev. Frank Harrison; Nominating Committee, by the Rev. Billy Nowell. Motion was made by the Rev. David Kriger that a book be placed in the library of Mount Olive College in "Memory of the Rev. W. A. Martin." Motion was seconded and carried. Motion was made by the Rev. Ed Miles that we place a book in the library of Mount Olive College in "Honor of the Rev. C. Felton Godwin, for 18 years of service as Moderator of the Cape Fear Conference." A rising vote of thanks was given to Dola Dudley for her work as secretary of the Cape Fear Conference. A motion was made that we place a book in "Honor of Dola Dudley" in the library of Mount Olive College. This motion was seconded and carried.

The Treasurer's Report was given by H. T. Hinson.

Motion was made and carried that all unfinished business be left for the Executive Committee.

Motion was made and carried that we accept St. Mary Grove's invitation for the 138th Session of the Cape Fear Conference, which will be held Thursday, October 29, 1992.

Motion was made to adjourn. The session was closed with singing, "I Want to Be a Worker."

REPORTS

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

(November 20, 1990)

The Executive Committee of the Cape Fear Conference met at the home of the Rev. C. Felton Godwin on Tuesday, November 20, 1990. All members were present.

The minutes were read and approved from the proceedings of the Cape Fear Conference, which was held at the First Free Will Baptist Church, Goldsboro, NC. These minutes were approved for printing in the *Yearbook*.

Motion was made and carried to allow for secretarial services performed by our secretary, W. Michael Ledbetter. It was noted that a lot of time went into our minutes for publication in the *Yearbook*. A thank you came from Brother Ledbetter for the committee's thoughtfulness.

With no other business, we adjourned with prayer.

(September 24, 1991)

The Executive Committee met at the home of the Rev. C. Felton Godwin, with all members present except for the Rev. Don Venable. The meeting was opened with prayer by our moderator. We planned the upcoming Cape Fear Conference, which is to be held at the Pleasant Grove Free Will Baptist Church, Erwin, NC. Speakers were suggested, as well as the appointment of temporary committees for the Conference.

Dola Dudley informed the committee that due to her declining health, she would like to step down as assistant secretary. It was noted that she was secretary on two occasions and the last time was for 10 years. The committee thanked her for all her years of service and wished her the best in the days to come.

A recommendation was adopted to present at the Conference concerning the question that was brought forth at a recent Union Meeting about ministers who do not attend the Union Meeting and Cape Fear Conference. The recommendation reads as follows: "The Executive Committee recommends that any minister who does not attend at least one Union Meeting during the year will have his name dropped from the Union Meeting roll. The minister may re-enroll at a later date by approval of the Union Meeting."

A motion was made and carried that Brother Felton Godwin be given an honorarium of \$50 for services rendered as moderator of the Cape Fear Conference.
