PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Thirty-eighth Session of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened at St. Mary's Grove Free Will Baptist Church, Benson, NC, Thursday, October 29, 1992.

The session was opened by our song leader, Peyton Lee, in singing "Stand Up for Jesus."

The morning Scripture and prayer were brought by Brother Keith Pelletier of Daly's Chapel Church.

Our welcome was offered by the pastor of the host church, the Rev. Billy Nowell.

The moderator asked the secretary to call the session to order. Brother Pete Norris of the Credentials Committee explained the rules of registration as adopted at the one hundred and fourteenth session, which state: "In all future sessions of the Cape Fear Conference, the Credentials Committee shall be instructed to issue a badge of identification to all duly registered ministers, delegates and visitors, and that no person be allowed to vote who does not properly display said badge. It is understood that visitors shall be granted all rights and privileges except that of voting. It shall be the duty of the Credentials Committee to explain the registration at the opening of the Cape Fear Conference."

The roll was called of officers, ministers, standing boards, and churches.

The moderator welcomed all visitors and delegates to the session. His remarks began with a thank you for all the prayers while he was ill. He was glad to be serving as moderator. After coming to this Conference, he has served 11 years on the Executive Committee, 11 years on the Ordaining Board. He explained that we are here to serve you but we must abide by the rules, or we will end up in confusion. He went on to say that we all have an opportunity to make a stand for Jesus. Let's make it the best. Let's be the best for the Lord!

The floor was opened for other business. Brother J. N. Bryant asked for time for questions from our various ministries at our future sessions. It was suggested by our moderator that each church invite the various leaders of the denominational ministries to come to the local church, where there would be plenty of time to answer all questions.
