PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Thirty-ninth Session of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened at Powhatan Church, Clayton, NC, Thursday, November 4, 1993.

The session was opened with singing "When We All Get to Heaven," led by Dean Kennedy. The morning devotions were brought by the Rev. Wayne Hargrove, pastor of St. Mary's Grove.

The welcome was brought by the host church and response was from the Rev. Billy Nowell.

The session was called to order by the Moderator. The Rev. Pete Norris, chairman of the Credentials Committee, explained the rules of registration to the Conference. The roll was called of officers, ministers, standing boards, and churches. The Moderator recognized all visitors present and welcomed them to the Cape Fear Conference.

The Rev. Dewey Boling, moderator, gave some stirring remarks concerning the Free Will Baptist treatise. He stated that a lot of Free Will Baptists simply do not know what is written in the treatise. If we are Free Will Baptists, then we ought to live like Free Will Baptists.

The Secretary was instructed to read the proposed constitutional change. It read: "We recommend that due to the confusion over when the Cape Fear Conference is to meet each year that under the Constitution, Article IX, Meetings be changed from "on Thursday before the first Sunday in November" to read "on the first Thursday of November." Motion was made and seconded to lay on the table for afternoon session.

They sang "Talking About Heaven," "Until Then," and "Look for Me." The speaker for the morning worship was the Rev. Al Markuson. His message was from John 4:31. He challenged us to grow in the Lord. We need to grow—to grow as the body of Christ! Grow means Go Reach Qur World. We must be determined to labor for Christ and do it with the intelligence God has given all of us. The message is still the same, but the methods do change. We live in a changing world. We must not use antique methods in a modern world.

The Rev. C. Felton Godwin offered the blessing over the noon meal.

An invitation was extended by Palmer Memorial Church to host the one hundred and fortieth session of the Cape Fear Conference. Motion was made, seconded, and carried to accept their invitation.

Motion was made to adjourn. We all stood for dismissal prayer.

2. We recommend that due to the confusion over when the Cape Fear Conference is to meet each year that under the Constitution, Article IX, Meetings be changed from "on Thursday before the first Sunday in November" to read "on the first Thursday of November."

The Cape Fear Executive Committee will meet following the 139th Session to approve the Minutes of the meeting for printing in the Yearbook.

The Council received a request from Mr. Ronnie Hayes, a member of Pleasant Grove Church, to meet with him at the Union Meeting on September 29, 1993, that he may be examined to be licensed. The Council instructed the Revs. Fred Baker, Jeff Scarborough, Phillip Boykin, and Henry Armstrong to meet with Mr. Hayes in keeping with his request. (Baker, Armstrong, and Boykin were acting as proxies for Council members who could not be there).

The Rev. Jeff Scarborough requested to resign from the Council and that the Executive Committee of the Conference choose someone to finish out his term.

His resignation was accepted with regrets.

The Ordaining Council of the Cape Fear Conference met on Saturday, August 29, at Victory Mission, Hope Mills, NC.

In attendance were the Rev. Phillip Boykin, proxy; the Rev. Fred Baker, proxy; the Rev. Henry Armstrong, proxy; and the Rev. Jeff Scarborough, who acted as Moderator.

Mr. Ronnie Hayes was examined and by motion recommended that he be licensed by his local church, Pleasant Grove. The Council recommended that he pursue studies to meet the educational requirements of the Conference.

The Council cleared the Rev. Wayne Hargrove to serve as pastor in the Cape Fear Conference and as an ordained minister of the Conference upon his letter from the Central Conference. (His letter was received September 29, 1993.)

The Ordaining Council of the Cape Fear Conference met at First Church, Smithfield, NC, on October 25, 1993, with all members present. The Rev. Phillip Boykin will fill the unexpired term of the Rev. Jeff Scarborough.

CAPE FEAR MINISTERS' PROGRAM

The Cape Fear ministers met on January 25, 1993, with 12 ministers present. The program was given by the Rev. Edmundo Gonzalez. His topic was how the Free Will Baptist Church came from England to the U.S.

We met on May 24, 1993, with 14 ministers present. The program was given by the Rev. David Charles Hansley. He told us that the U.S. was fastly approaching the third largest mission field in the world for the gospel. He challenged us to meet the needs of our people. Also, the Rev. Al Markuson gave us a report on the Fayetteville, Cumberland County area, and the need for churches there.

We met on August 23, 1993, with 11 ministers present. The program was a video tape entitled "The Ministers." It made the point that all church members are ministers, not just the pastor. We had a lot of discussion and the need for a questionnaire was discussed and approved.

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We met on October 25, 1993, with 12 ministers present. The program was given by Dr. Bobby Taylor, from the Children's Home. His program focused on our families, and how we as ministers need to recognize the importance of ministering to our own families, as well as the church family. It is impossible for us to preach about having a good family when we neglect our own.
