# PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Forty Fifth session of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists convened at Hopewell Original Free Will Baptist Church Smithfield, N.C., on November 9, 1999.

The session was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. Al Markuson. The congregation sang "He Keeps Me Singing," led by song leader Peyton Lee. Scripture and prayer were offered by Ken Dabbs, licensed minister from Vandora Springs Free Will Baptist Church. He based his devotional on Proverbs 13:17. We were welcomed to the church by Rev. Scott Casey the pastor of Hopewell, the host church. The response was given by Rev. Henry Armstrong.

The rules of the Credentials Committee were explained by Rev. Scott Casey as adopted by the One Hundred and Fourteenth Session of the Conference. These rules state: "In all future sessions of the Cape Fear Conference, the Credentials Committee shall be instructed to issue a badge of identification to all duly registered ministers, delegates, and visitors, and that no person be allowed to vote who does not properly display said badge. It is understood that visitors shall be grated all rights and priveleges except the right to vote. It shall be the duty of the Credentials Committee to explain the registration at the opening of the Cape Fear Conference."

The Moderator asked the clerk to read the two (2) proposed Constitutional changes that the conference was asked to consider. After the reading, a motion was made and seconded to place both proposed changes on the table to be removed and discussed in the afternoon session. The roll call of the officers, mnisters, standing boards, and churches was called out by the clerk. The Moderator recognized the visitors and welcomed them to the Conference.

The following temporary committees were appointed to serve during the session with the first person named serving as chairman of each committee:

Credentials Committee: Scott Casey, Doug Seymour, Bobby Holmes

Temperance/Resolutions Committee: Jim Bogel, Edmundo Gonzalez, John Massengil Nominating Committee: Frank Harrison, Al Warrick, Roy Clifton

Obituary Committee: Jesse Caton. Jesse Fulcher, Gene Britt

The Moderator, Rev. Al Markuson then gave his remarks to the conference. He spoke from Matthew 22:35. He challenged us to love one another and to uphold the word of God. He encouraged us to remember the harvest is so great but laborers are few. He told the group that in the latest statistics stating that 1/2 of all the churches in the U.S. reported no new converts in 1998. There was not a single major city in the U.S. who reported more church members than 10 years ago. 70 churches in America close every week, 51,000 people a week leave the church never to come back again. We need to be the Lighthouse for Christ in our neighborhoods.

We then proceeded with the reports of the Denominational Ministries. The Rev. Leon Grubbs, President of the Convention of OFWB came forward and spoke to us on the need to support our ministries and the overall work of Christ within the Original Free Will Baptist Denomination. He then introduced the representatives of the Ministries that were present and allowed them to speak on behalf of each organization. Those present were Dr. Bobby Taylor, Children's Home, Rev. Al Markuson, Home Missions, Rev. Bruce Dudley, Retirement Homes, Rev. Edmundo Gonzalez, Foreign Missions, Rev. Frank Harrison, Mount Olive College, Rev. John Williams, Cragmont, Rev. Grubbs then spoke to us on the work of the Convention of OFWB. The reports were enjoyed by all present. Rev. Harold Jones had recently been in the hospital so he was unable to attend and Rev. David Hansley was not present because of a revival meeting in the Piedmont region of our state.

We were then given a small break asking everyone to come back into the sanctuary when they begin to hear the piano music, this will signal the start of our worship time. Our worship time began with the singing "At The Cross". The offering was taken and prayer was offered for God's blessings by Rev. James Corbett. The Moderator then turned the service over to the host church for special singing. Rev. Al Markuson then introduced Rev. Dean Kennedy the speaker for the conference, he also introduced Doug Seymour who was leading a new Blended Fellowship in Goldsboro. Doug then shared with the conference a song in which he used sign language to sing the song. After the song his family was called forward and the Executive Committee of the conference, members of the Home Mission Board and the pastor of the mother church, Haymont FWB Church were asked to come and lay hands on this family in prayer. After the prayer Rev. Kennedy spoke to the session. Rev. Kennedy spoke on Mark 4:3-8 challenging the conference to be sowers of God's word and not hearers only. His message asked us to be faithful to God's Word and multiply. The best way to multiply is to be a mother church as Haymount has. His message was inspiring and gave all at the conference a great deal to consider. Rev. Scott Casey then gave instruction on lunch and closed us in prayer giving the

key. Scott Casey then gave instruction on funch and closed us in prayer giving the blessing for the meal as he prayed.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session began with singing, "Lily of the Valley", by song leader Peyton Lee. Otis Hamm then lead the group in our devotional, he is a licensed minister from St. Mary's OFWB Church. He used Jonah 3:5-10 as his text, sharing with us to stop and listen to the Lord. He asked us to stop and smell the blessings not the roses. We need to praise God for his blessings and also we need to be ready for these blessings. He closed his devotional in prayer.

Rev. Fred Baker, Assistant Moderator then lead the afternoon session. He spoke to the group on the Lighthouse movement of prayer. It is a nationwide attempt to pray for every person in the United States to accept Jesus Christ as their savior. He outlined the 3 main goals:

Prayer - Talk to God about your neighbor before you talk to your neighbor about God.
Care for them - Get to know them and let them know your prayers for them. 3. Share - Share the gospel to those who need Him. There will be a lighthouse that will be given to each church in our conference to keep for one month, reminding them of this movement and to pray to be a lighthouse in our community for Christ.
The Moderator then asked for the reports of all the Standing Boards of the Conference: Executive Committee: Rev. Phillip Boyking (See Report)

Ordaining Council: Rev. Frank Harrison (See Report) Cape Fear Ministers: Rev. Billy Nowell (See Report) Cape Fear Youth and Board of Education: Mrs. Martha Parsons (See Report)

The reports of the temporary committees were given as follows: Temperance/Resolutions: Rev. Jim Bogel (See Report) Credentials: Rev. Scott Casey (See Report) Obituary: Rev. Jesse Fulcher (See Report) Nominating: Rev. Frank Harrison (See Report)

In our business session the moderator called for Old Business. The Moderator asked the clerk to read the first proposed change to the Constitution that was on the table. A motion was made and properly seconded to remove the Constitutional Change off the table. The motion was voted upon and approved. A motion was properly made and seconded to accept the first change. After some discussion the motion was voted upon and passed. The Moderator then asked the clerk to read the second change to the constitution. After the reading a motion was made and properly seconded to accept the second change. After some discussion on the motion it was voted upon and accepted. The Moderator then called for any further Old Business, there being none he then called for New Business. The Moderator invited any minister who wished to join the conference to make their intentions known at this point. There were three ministers who joined the Conference, they were Dan Jordan, Joe Ballance, and Joe Myrick. Upon a proper motion and second to accept these men, a vote was taken and they were accepted in the Conference and given the right hand of fellowship by the Moderator. There was then a discussion on helping Riverside FWB Church who is in our Conference and had been damaged by the recent flooding from Hurricane Floyd. The Treasurer then was asked to give his report. (See Report) After his report a motion was made to accept it and seconded. The motion passed. A motion was made to add an additional \$500.00 to the \$500.00 the Union Meeting had voted to give to Riverside. The motion met with a proper second and the motion was approved. A motion was then made and properly seconded to give a rising vote of thanks to Rev. Al Markuson who was our moderator the past 2 years. The motion passed.

A motion was then made that all unfinished business be left to the Executive Committee. That motion was properly seconded and approved. With this, a motion was made, properly seconded, and passed to adjourn. Closed in prayer by Rev. Henry Armstrong.

#### **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT FOR CONFERENCE 11/9/99**

The Executive Committee met on November 11, 1998 at Vandora Springs FWB Church with Rev. Chris Casey and with Vandora Springs to discuss some issues they were facing. After much discussion, and prayer the issues were resolved and the meeting closed in prayer.

The Executive Committee of the Cape Fear Conference met at Lee's Chapel OFWB Church on January 4, 1999. Present for the meeting was Al Markuson, Fred Baker, Phillip Boykin, and Sam Weeks. J.B. Caton was absent due to a funeral. The meeting was opened in prayer by Fred Baker. The

President called for the reading of the minutes from the Cape Fear Conference meeting in November. After some discussion and some corrections, the minutes were approved as read. It was suggested that from now on the listing of officers and board members in the yearbook would reflect the new officers and board members for the coming year instead of the officers at the time of the meeting. It was noted that anyone reading the minutes would assume that the officers and board members listed will be the officers and board members for the next year. It was also noted because of the need for a brief history, for all the pastors who have passed away in the past year, that the Obituary Committee be informed of their duties as early as possible for the next conference. It was even suggested that each church be given a space on the Conference Annual Letter to include information on the death of a pastor or Executive Committee member.

In New Business a motion was made by Fred Baker and seconded by Sam Weeks to revise the Conference Annual Letter sent out to each church. Some suggestions were given, but the Executive Committee will finalize the revisions at their next meeting. The motion was passed. The clerk was instructed that if possible we need to make the program for the Conference available to those attending the August Union Meeting. It was also suggested we place the program in the FWB Magazine as early as possible. Some discussion followed on how we could help the current financial situation of the conference. It was suggested we increase the contributions by each church to \$50.00 per hundred member for each church. No official decision was made until we know more information about the future of our Union Meetings. A motion was made by Sam Weeks that the Executive Committee suggests to the Union Meeting of our Conference that the Union Meeting on August 28th be moved to Sunday Night August 29th at Lee's Chapel FWB Church, and this meeting will be a Conference wide Camp Meeting/Revival. This meeting will be held with Rev. Frank Harrison the Evangelist, Robert's Grove FWB Church in charge of special music, a possible Conference wide Youth Choir to sing and Mr. Peyton Lee leading the congregational songs. The Moderator of the Conference will be The Master of Ceremonies at this meeting. The motion was met with a proper second and it was passed.

The Executive Committee then discussed the opening on the Board of Ordination of the Conference. The Rev. Billy Nowell resigned the appointment that will end in 1999. A motion was made and properly seconded that Rev. Henry Armstrong fill the unexpired term until the 1999 Conference meeting. The motion passed. The Treasurers Report was given by Rev. Phillip Boykin and the report was approved as read. There being no further business, the meeting was closed in prayer by Sam Weeks.

The Cape Fear Executive Committee met on August 8, 1999 at Lee's Chapel FWB Church. Attending the meeting were the Revs. Al Markuson, Fred Baker, Jessie Caton, Sam Weeks, and Phillip Boykin. The meeting was opened in prayer by Jessie Caton. The Moderator asked the clerk to read the minutes from our last meeting. The minutes were approved as read. The Treasurer gave his report and it was accepted as read.

The committee began the discussion about the Cape Fear Conference on November 9, 1999 at Hopewell FWB Church, registration will begin at 8:30a.m. and the meeting will begin at 9:00a.m. A motion was made that at the Conference meeting that a revision in the constitution be announced and voted upon. The revision will state: The Conference will ask that each church contribute \$50.00 for each 100 members or fraction therof, 100 members and less \$50.00, 101-199 members \$100.00, 200-299 members \$150.00, ect. The motion was made by Fred Baker and seconded by Jessie Caton the motion was approved. A motion was made by Fred Baker and seconded by Sam Weeks that the Clerk of the Conference send each Church Clerk and Pastor a letter stating any major changes and/or motions that are made at the Conference. Also in the letter a suggestion will be made that the changes and/or motions be read at each churches next regularly scheduled business Conference. The motion was voted upon and approved.

The Executive Committee was informed that the Cape Fear Conference is entitled to 8 representatives from our Conference and 8 representatives from the Union to the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists on September 14-16. The Convention is asking that each Conference pay the registration fee for these delegates even if they are not appointed. The treasurer was then instructed to pay the fee and the Executive Committee will try and secure the delegates. After this discussion a motion was made by Sam Weeks and seconded by Fred Baker that the Cape Fear Conference representative to the Executive-Committee of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists be a member of the Executive Committee of the Conference. The reason for this motion is to help the Executive Committee of our Conference to be informed on what the convention is doing and asking of our Conference. The motion was voted upon and approved.

The committee then turned its attention to the planning of the 145th session of the Cape Fear Conference, November 9, 1999 at Hopewell FWB Church. The committee appointed the speakers and the temporary committees to serve at the next Conference. A letter and a poster will be made and sent to each church giving them information about our Camp Meeting in August. There being no further business a motion was made and properly seconded that we dismiss, the motion was approved and we were closed in prayer by Sam Weeks.

The Executive Committee met on September 30, 1999 with the deacon board and the pastor of Riverside FWB Church. The committe discussed with this group some conflicts they were having and gave them some direction and committed to pray for the church and its minsitry.

The Executive Committee met on November 6, 1999 at Robert's Grove FWB Church with Rev. Dean Kennedy, pastor of Haymont FWB Church. The committee needed to clarify some information concerning the new work that Haymont is sponsoring. After much discussion the committee appreciates Haymont on mothering this new work and will work with their church to help it to be successful.

## **CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGES AT CONFERENCE**

1. OLD VERSION: Article II. Representation: Each church shall represent with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. The delegation from each church shall carry to the Conference a letter certifying their appointment, and giving the statistics and financial condition of the church, together with a statement of all funds received and disbursed for denomination and benevolent purpose during the year.

NEW VERSION: Article II. Representation: Each church shall represent with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. Each church will return the Annual Report with all the information requested. This report should list all designated délegates who will be representing their church at the Conference.

2. OLD VERSION: Article V. Finance: Each church is required to send to the Annual Session of the Conference \$25.00 for each 100 members or fraction thereof, 100 members or less \$25.00, 101-199 \$50.00 ect.

NEW VERSION: Each church is required to send to the Annual Session of the Conference \$50.00 for each 100 members or fraction thereof, 100 members or less \$50.00, 101-199 \$100.00, ect.
