## PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Forty Ninth Session of the Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists convened at First FWB Church, Smithfield, North Carolina on November 11, 2003.

The congregation opened in singing 'My Savior's Love' led by song leader, Brother Peyton Lee. Licensed Minister, Dr. Barry Croom from Shady Grove FWB Church offered 'Scripture and Prayer' from 2 Corinthians 12:7. The conference was welcomed by the Reverend Sam Weeks, pastor of host church, First FWB Church, Smithfield. The response was heard from Trustee Kenneth Johnson of Vandora Springs FWB Church.

Moderator, the Reverend Roy Clifton, called the session into order. The rules of registration were then explained by the Credentials Committee Chair, the Reverend Otis Hamm, as adopted by the One Hundred Fourteenth Session of the Cape Fear Conference. Clerk, Jesse Fulcher, called the roll of Officers and Standing Boards, Churches, and Ministers. The moderator recognized our visitors. There were no new members received into the conference during this session.

The Reverend Roy Clifton gave the moderator's remarks. Our churches and the individual believers were challenged to stay focused from the scripture passage, 1 Peter 2:1-5. He said, "A spiritual church needs spiritual people and this comes from the Word of God." We were challenged to become the 'six marks' of a spiritual church though prayer, fellowship, giving, Bible study, praise, and sowing. Brother Moderator closed his remarks with prayer.

The following temporary committees were appointed by Moderator Clifton.

Representatives from our denominational ministries were present and given an opportunity to speak on the behalf of each ministry. The following ministries were represented: Sunday School Ministry\_ Mary Dudley, Retirement Homes Ministry\_ Bruce Dudley, Children's Home and Minister's Program\_ Phillip Boykin, Cragmont Assembly\_ Bryant Hines, Foreign Missions\_ Chris Singleton, Mount Olive College\_ Dr. Burkette Raper, Home Missions and Evangelism\_ David Hansley, FWB Press and Church Finance\_ Fred Baker, Camp Vandamere\_ Wesley Taylor, Convention of OFWB\_ President Fred Baker, and Conference Representative\_ Sam Weeks. The Moderator extended a challenge to the churches to give water and food to the 'Disaster Relief' fund to help the storm victims. After these reports we moved into a fifteen minute break.

Worship service began with congregational singing 'Sunshine In My Soul' led by Brother Peyton Lee. The conference offering was received and special music was offered by the Blended Fellowship Signing Choir. The Reverend Jerry Stephenson, pastor of Vandora Springs FWB Church, brought the morning message from Romans 1:14-16. He stated "that the mission of the Church is to carry forth the Gospel." The Apostle Paul gave the church three "I ams... I am a debtor... I am ready... to preach the gospel ... and I am not ashamed ... of the gospel." He said "that there are two things that people ought to expect. The first is sound Biblical teaching from the Pastor and the second is that the Pastor ought to expect his people to adhere to sound doctrine." The worship hour was closed with an invitation and with prayer. The blessing for the food was given by Pastor Weeks.

### AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session began with the congregation singing 'Draw Me Nearer' led by Brother Peyton Lee. 'Scripture and Prayer' was offered by Licensed Minister, Dickie Privette, of Haymount FWB Church. The scripture passage selected was from Psalm 100, "Let us be thankful today."

Moderator Roy Clifton opened the floor for announcements before hearing the report of the Standing Boards (see attached reports for the Standing Boards). The Executive Committee and Mission Committee reports were given by the clerk and approved by the conference. The Ordaining Council report was given by the Reverend Frank Harrison. There was no Woman's Auxiliary report given. The Cape Fear Minister's Conference report was given by the Reverend Sam Weeks. The Cape Fear Youth report was given by Mrs. Martha Parsons as well as the Board of Christian Education report.

The reports of the Temporary Committees were then given (see attached reports for the Temporary Committees). The Temperance and Resolutions Committee had three resolutions that were read and motions made to accept all three. The Obituary Committee gave its report and it was approved as read. The Credentials Committee gave a report of the Annual Conference's attendance. Its report was approved as read. The Nominating Committee made its recommendations to the conference and it was voted by acclamation to accept the committee's recommendations. The Treasurer's report was then given and approved as reported. It was reported by Treasurer Sam Weeks that the conference offering was down this year as well as the contributions to Blended Fellowship Mission. A progress report was given concerning this mission work and a thank you extended to Mr. Kenny Woodard for contributing the framing materials. Volunteer workers will be needed beginning in January, 2004, to help with this work.

The conference then moved to the business session. Moderator Roy Clifton called for Old Business. There being none we moved into New Business. There was no New Business brought before the conference. The One Hundred Fiftieth Anniversary Session of the Cape Fear Conference will be held at the Shady Grove FWB Church in 2004. With no further business to be brought before the conference a motion was made and properly seconded that we adjourn our meeting leaving any unfinished business in the hands of the Executive Committee. The motion was approved and we dismissed with congregation singing 'We Have a Story to Tell All the Nations' and in prayer led by The Reverend Jesse Caton.

### **Executive Committee**

The Executive Committee of the Cape Fear Conference met twelve times since the last annual conference. The following business was attended to and the following motions were presented and carried by the committee:

On January 8, by invitation, the Executive Committee met with Covenant OFWB Church to discuss the acquisition of the church property from the Board of Home Missions and Evangelism. By motion, the church was to make all payments that were due and wait until the entire church is made aware of the payoff amount before acquiring the assistance of an attorney and the Executive Committee of the Cape Fear Conference to properly transact the business of purchasing the property. Other concerns were discussed with Covenant Church concerning the organization of the church.

On January 13, the Executive Committee met at Blended Fellowship Mission with representatives from the Mission and Wayne County to discuss building code discrepancies on the site and to devise a plan for complying with these codes. The Mission would need to show progress towards meeting the requirements of the building codes and a report given to the Wayne County Building Inspector by January 31. The Executive Committee discussed means to generate financial support for Blended Fellowship Mission to be able to finance the renovation of their facility to meet building code.

On the January 22 meeting of the Executive Committee, by motion, Otis Hamm was designated by the committee to assist Covenant Church in matters of property issues. It was also suggested that the committee schedule a meeting with Covenant Church to help resolve matters in this church. By motion, Sam Weeks would serve as representative for the Executive Committee in matters concerning the work at Blended Fellowship. By motion an interest free loan from First FWB Church, Smithfield, would be accepted by the conference to help finance the work at Blended Fellowship.

On March 14, the Executive Committee met with representatives of the Covenant FWB Church. The committee made a recommendation that Covenant Church establish a record of its present membership and new members joining with the church would be added to

to this record. By motion, former Clerk Cathy Markuson would be contacted to relinquish any records of Covenant Church to the church.

The Executive Committee met on March 24 at First FWB Church, Smithfield. A report was given by Pastor/Director Doug Seymour presenting the proposed layout of the facility at Blended Fellowship Mission. The committee discussed a letter to be sent to churches and pastors of the Cape Fear Conference concerning the raising of funds for the renovation work at Blended Fellowship. Churches were assigned to each of the committee members to personally follow-up on this request for funds.

The Executive Committee met on April 4 to discuss the celebration of the Cape Fear Conference's 150th Anniversary. The Annual Conference of the Cape Fear would be held at Shady Grove FWB Church, the conference's oldest founding church. By motion, Jesse Fulcher and Otis Hamm were appointed to complete the writing of the conference's history to be presented at the 2004 Session. By motion, Jesse and Otis were to remain to this temporary committee until the work of the committee is completed. Reports were given concerning the work at Blended Fellowship and the Treasurer's report was given. The Executive Committee discussed how the property for Covenant FWB Church should be deeded. Both the Conference and Covenant Church agree that the property should be jointly deeded (a reversal clause to be included in the deed of the property) to Covenant FWB Church and the Cape Fear Conference. It was confirmed that Otis Hamm would be the designated Executive Committee representative to assist Covenant Church in this matter.

On May 9, the Executive Committee met to further discuss the transaction of the property and to discuss the organization of the Covenant Church. It was decided that the committee would meet with Covenant Church to discuss with the officers of this church the duties and responsibilities of the officers of the church and the establishing a constitution and by-laws specific to their church. The Executive Committee met, by invitation, at Covenant FWB Church to discuss this matter with the officers of Covenant Church. A proposed guideline was given for the establishing of a constitution and by-laws specific to Covenant Church and the committee discussed the work of the pulpit committee in the search process. Afterwards, the Executive Committee met in a call business meeting with Covenant church to share the purpose of the previous afternoon meeting and to inform Covenant's members of its outcome. The Reverend Jerry Stephenson brought a message from 1 Corinthians 2:1-2 and 12:12-14 concerning the body of Christ being made up of many spiritual gifts working together. Meeting was closed with prayer and the laying on of hands for the sick.

A progress report was given to the Executive Committee at the June 23 meeting concerning the work at Blended Fellowship Mission. The work is making good progress and at this date approximately \$30,000.00 of the \$70-75,000.00 needed to complete this work has been raised.

The final meeting of the Executive Committee was on August 8, at the First FWB Church, Smithfield. It was reported by Otis Hamm that the transaction of the property for Covenant Church would be handled through Church Finance of OFWB. Closing would be handled by attorney of choice and a letter would be needed to authorize the Trustees of Covenant FWB Church and the Executive Committee of the Cape Fear Conference to sign the

deed. By motion, Otis Hamm would represent the Executive Committee in the signing of the deed. By motion, Secretary Jesse Fulcher, would draft a letter (to be properly notarized) stating as such: A 'Letter of Agreement' between the Cape Fear Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists and the Covenant OFWB Church stating that the church standing will be re-evaluated by the Conference five years after the signing of the deed to determine whether the property would be released solely to Covenant OFWB Church or retained in joint ownership with the Cape Fear Conference. The program for the 2003 Annual Session of the Cape Fear Conference was planned by the committee. First FWB Church, Smithfield, will be hosting the conference for 2003 and contacts would be made concerning the program. A report was given by representative Sam Weeks of the work at Blended Fellowship Mission. It was reported that the renovation work of this facility is progressing on schedule. Financial report was given concerning this work.

Mr. Richard Whitman, a member of Pleasant Grove Church, met with the Council and was approved to preach the Gospel.
