The moderator called for any unfinished business from the table. The clerk read the Executive Board report since it included the report of combining our Yearly and Quarterly Meetings as discussed in last year's Yearly Meeting.

The Executive Board met in joint session with the Cave Springs Quarterly Meeting Business Committee at the Pleasant Hill Church, March 23, 2001 at 7:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss a proposal to combine the Cave Springs Yearly Meeting and the Cave Springs Quarterly Meeting.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Bro. Walter Simpson. Bro. Doyle Williams called the meeting to order and called for nominations for meeting moderator and recording clerk. Bro. Bill Burkhead was elected moderator and Bro. Richard King was elected recording clerk.

Discussion was held concerning the proposal from the Yearly Meeting that both conferences be combined and the need to present a proposal to the next Quarterly Meeting conference.

M/S/C to recommend to Yearly Meeting that By-Law Article #18 be eliminated and change Standing Rule Article #4 to read "All church letters and all other letters requesting the next yearly Meeting are to be turned in prior to the 11:00 service.

M/S/C to recommend appropriating bodies that the Cave Springs Quarterly Meeting and the Cave Springs Yearly Meeting be combined into four meetings per year. Three Quarterly Meetings to be held on Saturday before the first Sunday in April, July, and October and one Yearly Meeting to be held on Saturday before the first Sunday in January. The Meeting adjourned with prayer.

The Executive Board met in joint session with the Cave Springs Quarterly Business Committee at the Pleasant Hill Church, October 19, 2001. The purpose of the meeting was the continued process of combining the Cave Springs Yearly Meeting and the Cave Springs Quarterly Meeting

The meeting was opened with prayer led by Bro. David Honeycutt. Bro Bill Burkhead asked for nominations for a moderator and Bro. Bill Burkhead was elected. Bro. Sherman Baker was appointed as the clerk.

The floor was opened for discussion on the direction on how to proceed. Motion made and second to change the current Constitution and By-laws serving the Yearly Meeting and the Quarterly Meeting so they could be combined into one set of Constitution and By-laws serving both the Cave Springs Yearly and the Cave Springs Quarterly Meetings. Motion carried. A committee was formed to go through these Constitutions and By-laws and draft a new set and bring them back for a future meeting to be held before the Yearly meeting.

Meeting was dismissed in prayer led by Bro. Dennins McGinley.

Bill Burkhead took charge of the meeting and opened the floor for discussion of the final revisions to the proposed Constitution, By-Laws, and Standing Rules. Final revisions were made and by general consent of those present it will be presented at the next combined meeting of the conference in January.

There was a question from the floor in regards to the money that is usually sent to the 4th Quarterly Meeting, as concern was made about becoming short of funds. M/S/C that this question be referred to the Executive Committee to bring back a report if any changes need to be made.

The Moderator asked for additional reports.

The Ordaining Council Report

On January 23, 2001 the Yearly Ordaining Council met at the Thayer Free Will Baptist Church with Bro. Bobby Ball and Bro. Ralph Underwood, Jr. to examine them to be ordained as Deacons for the Thayer Free Will Baptist Church. The board met with the men and found them both worthy of the office of deacon and recommended that Bro. Bobby Ball and Bro. Ralph Underwood, Jr. be ordained as Deacons. Yearly Ordaining Council members present were Bro. Wayne Adrian, Bro. Charles Trantham and Bro. Lance Rogers.

On January 23, 2001 the Yearly Ordaining Council met at the Thayer Free Will Baptist Church with Bro. Andrew Pearson to examine him to be ordained as a Minister of the Gospel. The board met with Bro. ARTICLES OF FAITH

THE BIBLE: The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.

GOD: There is one living and true God revealed in nature as the Creator, preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in Scripture as Father, Son and Holy Ghost, as one God infinitely wise and good whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

CHRIST: Christ is God manifest in the flesh, in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified He is now risen and glorified and is our ever present Savior and Lord.

THE HOLY SPIRIT: The Scriptures assign the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.

THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD: God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special act of grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires.

THE SINFULNESS OF MAN: Man was created innocent, by his disobedience, fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin, and become guilty before God.

THE WORK OF CHRIST: The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation.

THE TERMS OF SALVATION: The conditions of salvation are:

1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it.
2. Faith, or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God.
3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

ELECTION: God determined from the beginning to save all who would comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence, by faith in Christ men become His elect.

FREEDOM OF WILL: The human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit to live, or to resist them and perish.

SALVATION FREE: God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whomsoever will may come and take of the water of Life freely.

PERSEVERANCE: All believers of Christ who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.

Temperance Committee

The Temperance Committee would like to submit the following report. Temperance is defined in the Webster's Dictionary as "Total Abstinence from Alcoholic Beverages." The Bible warns us in Proverbs 23:29-35 of the problems and destruction that drunkenness brings to our families, and our society as a whole. I Corinthians 6:10 tells us that the drunkard shall not inherit the kingdom of God. Ephesians 5:18 "And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess, but be filled with the Spirit." Therefore, we believe as Christians we should abstain from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages as stated in our Free Will Baptist Church Covenant.

State of Religion

Religion can be defined as man's expression of his faith toward God and his attempt to approach his God. There is no shortage of religion in our world today, but much of it is unacceptable to God. True religion must be based upon a scriptural understanding and acceptance of our relationship with God through a personal faith in Jesus Christ and His atonement upon the cross.

James tells us that pure religion results when we live out our faith through holy living and good works. We must always evaluate our religion in the light of God's word and with the help of God's Holy Spirit. If we are to judge the state of religion of the church we must first judge the heart of each individual. As Paul said to the Corinthians concerning participating in the Lord's Supper, "But let a man examine himself...". So let us be constantly looking to the inward man in the light of scripture to determine the state of our religion.

Literature Committee

Isaiah 40:8 "The grass withereth, the flower fadeth, but the word of our God shall stand forever." We believe as children of God, that man's word shall fail, but God's word shall keep us for all eternity. And as Free Will Baptist we will base our doctrine upon this word of God.

GOSPEL ORDINANCE

BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER are ordinances to be perpetuated under the gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, or universal obligation and to be administered to all true believers.

THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH: The divine law requires that one day in seven be set aside from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities and for personal communications with God.

RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION: The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the final day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation, then the wicked shall "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

FREEWILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant. We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things; to avoid the appearance of evil; to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world; from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages; and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship, and by self-denial faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conference, public worship and the observances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, its ill, and its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love endeavoring to "KEEP THE UNITY OF THE SPIRIT" in the bond of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, as far as we are able, promote the success of the Church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme, counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of Peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless into the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

**CONSTITUTION
OF THE
CAVE SPRINGS ASSOCIATION
OF
FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCHES**

THIS ORGANIZATION SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE
Cave Springs Association of Free Will Baptist Churches
AND SHALL BE COMPOSED OF SUCH WELL REGULATED
CHURCHES AS MAY EMBODY THEMSELVES
UNDER THIS CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I

It shall be the purpose of this organization to cooperate with the state and national associations in their effort to combine and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptist Church for the promotion of Home and Foreign Missions, Christian Education, Sunday Schools, Church Training Service, Women's Auxiliary and such other benevolent activities as may be recognized and for the extension of the Kingdom of God in general.

ARTICLE II

The membership of this body shall be comprised of organized Free Will Baptist Churches maintaining gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine, in favor of benevolent enterprises such as Sunday School, missions, temperance, and education. A Church may be received into this body by presenting a petition asking for membership and by a majority vote of all Association members voting.

ARTICLE III

This Association shall have power to: i) Discipline its churches and exclude them for disorderly conduct if efforts to reconcile prove unsuccessful. ii) License and ordain ministers such as give evidence of being qualified and called of God and by request of the church of which he belongs. iii) Ordain deacons such as give evidence of being qualified and by request of the church of which he belongs. iv) Settle questions of discipline and doctrine as a church may refer to it. v) Make by-laws and rules as necessary, but not inconsistent with its constitution. The Association shall in no case have the power to: i) Reverse a decision of one of the churches. ii) Interfere in any way with the internal regulations of one of the churches. iii) Hold any ecclesiastical authority over the churches composing this Association.

**BY-LAWS
OF THE
CAVE SPRINGS ASSOCIATION
OF
FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCHES**

Organization and Officers

ARTICLE 1. The officers of this association shall be elected annually and serve at the pleasure of the Association. The officers shall consist of ; moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer and assistant treasurer. The clerk and treasurer shall have authority to choose their assistants. Each shall hold office until their successor is elected. The clerk shall receive an honorarium, as determined by the Association, for his service each year.

ARTICLE 2. The standing committees of the Association.

Section 1. The Executive Board shall be composed of five members that shall be elected from the body, plus the moderator, clerk and treasurer of this association. It shall be the duty of this board to transact the business of this body between the regular conferences. If any standing committee vacancies occur between conferences, this board shall have power to fill such vacancy until the next conference of the Association.

Section 2. The Ordaining Council shall be composed of five members elected from the body. It shall be the duty of this council to examine and pass upon or recommend suitable action to the association, on all credentials referred to them by the Association or the Executive Board. The Ordaining Council may license a minister but only while this body is in session. Three regular members must be present at any ordination service.

Section 3. The Finance Committee shall be composed of five members elected from the body. It shall be the duty of this to annually audit the Association Treasurer books and report to the Association. Other business of a financial nature may be referred to this committee on which they will report to the Association.

Section 4. All Standing Committee members, except the three Association Officers on the Executive Board (elected annually), shall be elected in the following manner: one for one year, one for two years, one for three years, one for four years and one for five years, thereafter, one member shall be elected each year, whose term of office shall be five years. If any vacancies occur between conferences, the Executive Board shall have power to fill such vacancy until the next conference of the Association.

ARTICLE 3. This Association shall elect officers and standing committee members at the annual conference in January. Those elected shall take office on February 1st.

ARTICLE 4. The Clerk, Assistant Clerk and Treasurer, as elected each year, are to serve as the printing committee.

ARTICLE 5. The Moderator shall have authority to appoint temporary committees prior to a conference of this Association (Whole committees can be appointed from any church delegation).

ARTICLE 6. Any committee doing business for the Association must be a committee formed by the Association.

ARTICLE 7. The Obituary committee shall be appointed at each annual conference of this Association. Other standing committees will be appointed as the body may direct.

ARTICLE 8. No member of this body shall be elected to hold more than one position at the same time, whether it be office or standing committee. No member of this body shall serve in the same office more than five consecutive years or more than two consecutive terms on any standing committee.

Meetings

ARTICLE 9. Each conference of the Association shall convene at nine in the morning on Saturday before the third Sunday in January, April, July and October. The fiscal year shall begin on January 1 and end December 31 each year. The January conference will be the annual meeting of this Association.

ARTICLE 10. Each conference of the Association shall be called to order by the Clerk or Assistant Clerk when present, and in their absence by the member having seniority in years.

ARTICLE 11. Each conference of this Association shall be opened by singing, reading a portion of God's Word and prayer. Each conference shall also be closed with prayer.

ARTICLE 12. All business shall be done in the spirit of meekness, otherwise it may be called to order by the moderator when not carried out in a Christian Spirit or when he thinks it is likely to lead to discord or division.

ARTICLE 13. All conference meetings shall be governed by the rules of parliamentary law as set forth in Robert's Rule's of Order, except where those rules are superseded by the rules of this Association.

ARTICLE 14. At each conference of this Association, all petitions and requests on particular subjects shall be referred to the appropriate committees. Special committees may be appointed at the pleasure of the body.

- ARTICLE 15.** All business suggested by churches shall be in writing.
- ARTICLE 16.** This Association may hold correspondence with any other religious bodies as it may deem advisable.
- ARTICLE 17.** This Association may sit with open doors except when the body elects to go into closed session.
- ARTICLE 18.** Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in its discussion by obtaining permission of the Moderator.
- ARTICLE 19.** It shall be the duty of the members of this Association to be present at the time appointed for each conference and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave of the Moderator.
- ARTICLE 20.** Any member wishing to speak in the conference shall address the Moderator as "Brother Moderator" but shall not speak again until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.
- ARTICLE 21.** No person shall be allowed to speak more than five (5) minutes at any one time nor more than twice on any subject without permission of the Moderator.
- ARTICLE 22.** No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee provided the one nominated be elected.
- ARTICLE 23.** This association shall decide at each conference where the next meeting shall convene. This may be by alphabetical order of member churches or by invitation from its member churches or other locations as the body may decide.

Voting

- ARTICLE 24.** The acting members of this Association shall be three (3) delegates from each church chosen by the churches, together with standing members which shall be; all licensed and ordained ministers and their respective wives, ordained deacons, church clerks, association clerk and standing committee members, belonging to this body. Each must be members in good standing of a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this body. Each acting member shall have one vote.
- ARTICLE 25.** A minimum of one representative from 40% of the Association member churches shall be required to constitute a quorum to transact any business of the Association. Any less number will adjourn.
- ARTICLE 26.** Any motion shall be properly seconded before being discussed and voted upon and must be carried by more than half of the votes being cast.
- ARTICLE 27.** The yeas and nays may be taken on any question before the Association by request of one-fifth of the members present.

Discipline

ARTICLE 28. This Association shall have power to grant ministers a yearly certificate at the same time a license is granted, both to expire at the same time.

ARTICLE 29. Each minister recommended by the church of which he is a member is to receive a yearly certificate.

ARTICLE 30. All Ministers and Deacons coming into the Association must be a member of and recommended by a church of this Association and go before the Ordaining Council for approval before being accepted by the Association.

ARTICLE 31. Since the scriptures in Romans 1:24-27 condemn homosexual practice, this body will not license or ordain any person who is involved in this sin.

Amendments

ARTICLE 32. This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended at any regular conference of this body by two-thirds vote providing notice of the contemplated change has been read and placed on the table one conference previous to the time voting.

**STANDING RULES
OF THE
CAVE SPRINGS ASSOCIATION
OF
FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCHES**

- ARTICLE 1.** The Order of Business is to be printed in the minutes of each conference. The Constitution, By-Laws and Standing Rules are to be printed with the minutes of the annual conference. At each conference copies of the previous conference minutes shall be made available to all delegates and copies of the Constitution, By-Laws and Standing Rules upon request.
- ARTICLE 2.** The fiscal year shall be from January 1 to December 31 and all reports are to be made using the same dates. All church letters and other letters to this Association are to be received no later than the opening of the conference. Churches are requested to mail their church letters to the Association Clerk one week before each conference convenes.
- ARTICLE 3.** That we adhere quite strictly to the principles of our Church Covenant as pastors, deacons and lay members.
- ARTICLE 4.** All standing committees appointed or elected by the Association shall hold office until released or replaced.
- ARTICLE 5.** To be elected to an office or a standing committee, a person must have been a member in good standing in the Association for one year.
- ARTICLE 6.** The Ordaining Council is to assume the duties performed by a Credential Committee and to use a set of questions approved by the Association in aid to their committee work.
- ARTICLE 7.** Each minister coming from another body, shall present a letter of recommendation from the body of which he is a member.
- ARTICLE 8.** Any licensed minister must actively preach for one year before being eligible to be ordained.
- ARTICLE 9.** Each church is to recommend its worthy ministers and deacons and also to list their non-recommended ministers and deacons to the association at the annual conference in January.
- ARTICLE 10.** If a minister is not recommended by his church, the church and the minister are to be investigated at length by the Executive Board and if the minister be worthy of a certificate, the Executive Board has power to grant a yearly certificate.

- ARTICLE 11.** Any church having deacons or ministers who do not do the work of a deacon or minister or does not walk uprightly as they are members of this Association; that church should report to the Executive Board their grievance.
- ARTICLE 12.** Any man who has two living wives or whose wife who has two living husbands shall not be ordained or recommended as a worthy minister or deacon to the Association.
- ARTICLE 13.** Before a deacon can be ordained, a church must place him on trial, proving him worthy as a deacon in the church, for one year.
- ARTICLE 14.** Any person who would give false answers to obtain licenses or ordination papers, after investigation and proven guilty, their papers shall be annulled immediately.
- ARTICLE 15.** All business referred to the Executive Board shall be in written form.
- ARTICLE 16.** Each standing delegate should register upon arrival at each conference.
- ARTICLE 17.** The Cave Springs Youth Association delegates will be accepted by the Association. At each conference they will give a report from their Association but not as voting delegates.
- ARTICLE 18.** Cave Springs Radio Program
- Section 1.** The Radio program is to be a continuing program as long as there is funding for the expenses or the Association votes to discontinue the program.
- Section 2.** The Radio Pastor receive an honorarium, as determined by the Association for his service each quarter.
- Section 3.** The Radio Program expenses are to be paid at the discretion of the treasurer according to the discounts available, if funds permit.
- Section 4.** The Radio Pastor should announce special church services throughout the Association. The churches are responsible for providing this information to the Radio Pastor.
- ARTICLE 19.** There shall be no offering taken during the Association Conference sessions, but the need shall be referred back to the churches.
- ARTICLE 20.** For a minister to participate in the Free Will Baptist Retirement Fund, their church must contribute 10% to the Co-op Fund. Therefore it is recommended that all churches participate in giving to the Co-op Fund.
- ARTICLE 21.** The Cave Springs Association shall pay the cost of flowers for funerals of minister's, deacon's and their respective wives.
- ARTICLE 22.** The Cave Springs Association is opposed to pari-mutuel gambling, lotteries, or gambling of any kind in Missouri.

CLIFTON CHURCH: Organized July 23, 1949 by Billie Rogers, F. D. Johnson and E. E. Simpson with 15 members. Billie Rogers was elected pastor. Nova Coble elected clerk. Billie Joe Lovelace elected treasurer. John Clark, Paul Caldwell and Emery Coble were selected as deacons.

FAITH CHAPEL CHURCH: Organized on September 9, 1973 by Rev. Clark Stephens, Howard Bowers, Davie Combs, Charles Hollis, Noah Miller, Darrell Strain, Donnie Morris, Meril Shaw and deacons Bro. Bob Dotson, Troy Sims, Cecil Cambess, Dave Uhlmann and N. H. Rhoads. Rev. Clark Stephens was selected as pastor and Troy Sims selected as deacon with 15 members.

GARFIELD CHURCH: Organized August 17, 1942 by Rev. Harry H. Beatty, Billie Rogers and Fred Dodson. Organized with 22 members. Edd Rogers and Noah Hollis as deacons.

LIBERTY CHURCH: Organized September 25, 1921 with members by Rev. J. R. W. Harbison, Rev. John Combs, Rev. James McGhee and Rev. G. H. Miller.

MYRTLE CHURCH: Organized in October, 1903. Levi Taylor and Henry Wisehart as deacons.

NORMAN CHURCH: Organized October 3, 1914 by Rev. W. P. Stogsdill and Rev. W. C. Norman with 18 members. D. M. Crews and G. W. Moore as deacons.
