- 4. VISITING BRETHREN ARE INVITED TO SIT AS AD-
- 5. THOSE WHO SPEAK SHALL RISE AND ADDRESS THE MODERATOR. PERSONAL REFLECTION SHALL BE AVOIDED IN ALL DEBATES.
- 6. IF ANY PROPOSITIONS OR MOTION UNDER DEBATE CONTAINS TWO OR MORE POINTS, IT SHALL BE DIVIDED AT THE REQUEST OF ANY MEMBER AND A VOTE TAKEN.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE:

FROM LONG EXPERIENCE, WE, MEMBERS OF THE FREE WILL BAPTIST DENOMINATION; BEING REGU-LARLY BAPTIZED UPON THE PROFESSION OF OUR FAITH IN CHRIST AND REALIZING THE NECESSITY OF A BOND OF UNION AND FELLOWSHIP AMONG US AS AN ASSOCIATION OF CHURCHES AND TO PRE-SERVE AND MAINTAIN CORRESPONDENCE AND COORDI-NATION AMONG US, DO THÉREFORE ORDAIN THIS CON-STITUTION FOR OUR BETTER DENOMINATIONAL GOVERN-MENT. ARTICLE 1

THIS ORGANIZATION SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE CENTER ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

ARTICLE II

THE OBJECT AND PURPOSE OF THIS ORGANIZATION SHALL BE TO UNIFY THE WORK OF OUR CHURCHES AND TO DEVISE AND EXECUTE MEASURES FOR EXPANDING OUR WORK IN THE CAUSE OF CHRIST INTO BROADER FIELDS.

ARTICLE |||

THE VOTING MEMBERSHIP OF THE CENTER ASSO-CIATION SHALL CONSIST OF THREE DELEGATES FROM EACH LOCAL CHURCH. STANDING DELEGATES SHALL BE CHURCH CLERKS AND ALL ORDAINED MINISTERS AND THEIR WIVES AND ORDAINED DEACONS AND THEIR WIVES AND UNMARRIED WIDOWS OF DECEASED ORDAINED MEMBERB--ALL IN GOOD STANDING.

ARTICLE IV

AT THE QUARTERLY MEETINGS EACH CHURCH SHALL REPRESENT WITH A LETTER LISTING ALL THEIR DELEGATES AND REQUIRED DUES. AT THE ANNUAL MEETING, ALL STATISTICAL INFORMATION FOR EACH CHURCH SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THEIR LETTER.

ARTICLE V

THE CENTER ASSOCIATION BHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO SETTLE ANY AND ALL QUESTIONS OF DISCIPLINE, DOCTRINE OR PRACTICE THAT MAY PROPERLY COME

BEFORE IT FROM ANY OF THE CHURCHES COMPOSING THIS OR-GANIZATION, OR ACT UPON AN APPEAL THAT MAY BE MADE BY ANY MEMBER OF ANY CHURCH WHO FEELS THAT HE HAS BEEN UNJUSTLY CHARGED. SAID APPEAL SHALL HAVE BEEN WRITTEN AND PROPERLY SIGNED BY THE PERSON OR BODY MAKING THE APPEAL.

ARTICLE VI

THE CENTER ASSOCIATION SHALL HOLD ONE MEETING ANNUAL-LY AND THREE MEETINGS QUARTERLY, DATE AND PLACES TO BE SELECTED AT ANNUAL MEETINGS.

ARTICLE VII

OFFICERS - THE OFFICERS OF THE CENTER ASSOCIATION TION SHALL CONSIST OF THE MODERATOR, ASSISTANT MODERATOR, CLERK, ASSISTANT CLERK, AND TREASURER, EACH OF WHOM SHALL BE ELECTED AT THE OPENING OF EACH SETTING OF THE ANNUAL ASSOCIATION.

ARTICLE VIII

THE EXECUTIVE BOARD SHALL BE COMPOSED OF FLVENDERA MEMBERS. EACH MEMBER SHALL BE AN ORDAINED MINISTER IN GOOD STANDING IN THE CENTER ASSOCIATION AND THEIR TERMS OF TENURE SHALL BE:

- 1) ONE FOR ONE YEAR
- ONE FOR TWO YEARS
- 1) ONE FOR THREE YEARS
- (1) ONE FOR FOUR YEARS
- 1) ONE FOR FIVE YEARS

SUCCESSION TO OFFICE THEREAFTER SHALL BE DETERMINED AS ORDER REQUIRED.

ARTICLE IX

SHOULD NECESSITY ARISE WHICH CALLS FOR AND RE-QUIRES IMMEDIATE ACTION, THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE ASSOCIATION SHALL CONVENE UPON CALL OF ITS CHAIRMAN' AND SHALL TAKE WHATEVER ACTION IT DEEMS NECESSARY IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE CAUSE OF CHRIST. THE ACTION, HOWEVER, SHALL NOT CONFLICT WITH THE PURPOSE AND THE EDICTS OF THE CONSTITUTION AS SET FORTH IN THE PRE-CEDING ARTICLES. Company of the Control of the Cont

ARTICLE X

THE EXECUTIVE BOARD WILL NOT RECOMMEND TO LICENSE OR ORDAIN ANY MINISTER WHO DOES NOT BELIEVE OR PRACTICE ALL OF OUR DOCTRINE.

ARTICLE XI

COMMITTEES - COMMITTEES AS NECESSARY

SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE MODERATOR UNLESS

OTHERWISE PROVIDED FOR AND SHALL HOLD OFFICE

UNTIL THEIR WORK IS COMPLETED OR THEIR SUC
CESSORS ARE APPOINTED.

ARTICLE XII

THIS CONSTITUTION MAY BE ALTERED OR AMENDED AT ANY REGULAR SESSION OF THE CENTER ASSOCIATION BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT AND VOTING. ALL PROPOSED ALTERATIONS OR AMENDMENTS SHALL BE PRESENTED IN WRITING TO THE BODY ONE DAY OR MORE IN ADVANCE.

CHURCH COVENANT

WE AGREE FAITHFULLY TO DISCHARGE OUR OBLI-GATIONS IN REFERENCE TO THE STUDY OF THE SCRIP-TURE, SECRET PRAYER, FAMILY DEVOTION, AND SOCIAL WORSHIP, AND BY SELF-DENIAL, FAITH, AND GOOD WORKS ENDEAVOR TO "GROW IN THE KNOWLEDGE OF

OUR LORD AND SAVIOUR, JESUS CHRIST."
