- 3. No motion shall be discussed without first being seconded.
- 4. When a motion has been made and seconded, the Moderator shall ask, "Any discussion or remarks?" If none, the question shall be disposed of as usual.
- If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and the vote taken separately.
- 6. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded on the minutes unless ordered by the party making the motion.
- No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 8. All questions shall be decided by the majority of members present.
- No member shall be absent while in session without leave of the Moderator, and if so his name shall be left off the minutes.
- Minutes shall be leisurely read and corrected if necessary before the close of the Association.
- 11. Arrangements shall be made at each session of the Association for two or more sermons and equivalent devotional exercise during each day.
- 12. Alteration may be made in these rules at any regular session.

QUARTERLY MEETINGS

NOVEMBER 1970

The first Quarterly Meeting met at the Camp Ground church. Rev. Scott Jones, Moderator, was in charge. All the churches except East Sulphur and Stonewall were represented.

The following business was transacted:

The Treasurer's report was read and approved.

The Examining Committee reported that they had studied the new Treatise of Faith of the National Association of Free Will Baptists and made the following recommendation:

"We recommend that when a minister transfers from another Association to the Center Association, or a minister from another denomination wishes to unite with the Center Association, the procedure outlined in the Treatise in Chapter 2, paragraph E through F, of the practices of Free Will Baptist be followed."

Motion carried to adopt this recommendation.

A Resolutions Committee was appointed for this session.

The following resolution was adopted:

"We recommend the churches be assessed the following amounts for the \$5,000.00 for the Gage account: Ada—\$1,800.00, Gaar Corner and Stratford—\$300.00 each, Center Association—\$400.00, and \$200.00 each for the rest of the churches.

A request from the Ada church for Bro. Joel Kircher be examined for Ordination, was referred to the Examining Committee.

Dr. J. D. O'Donnel, President of O.B.C., and Rev. Homer Young State Executive Secretary, were recognized and welcomed. Each spoke briefly on their work.

Rev. W. V. Wood was speaker for this session.

FEBRUARY 1971

This Quarterly Meeting met with the Cedar Grove church. Rev. Scott Jones, Moderator, called the body to order.

All the churches except Wilson were represented.

Rev. and Mrs. Otis Adams, new in our Association were introduced and welcomed. Bro. Adams is the new pastor at East Sulphur.

The Treasurer's report was read and approved.

The minutes of the last Quarterly Meeting was read.

The Examining Committee reported that they had examined Bro. Joel Kircher, and recommended he be ordained to prach the Gospel. Motion carried to accept this report.

Bro. Joel Kircher was elected to fill the place on the Christian Education, left vacant when Rev. Robert Grider moved out of our Association.

The Examining Committee reported they had examined Rev. Otis Adams and found him sound in doctrine, and instructed the clerk to write for a letter from the Mission Association. Motion carried to accept this recommendation.

Motion carried for the Executive Board and Bro. Virgil Hunt to examine the Articles of Faith for printing errors, and to make all necessary corrections, and to pass to the clerk before the next printing of the minutes.

Motion carried for the Christian Education Board work out a program and present it to the next Association to promote our Sunday Schools.

The speakers for this session were Rev. Delbert Akin and Rev. Otis Adams.

MAY 1971

This meeting convened with the Non church. Rev. Carl Shivers, Assistant Moderator, was in charge. All the churches except East Sulphur, Madill and Pauls Valley were represented.

The following business was transacted:

The minutes of the last Quarterly Meeting were read.

The Treasurer's report was read and approved.

A favorable letter was read concerning Bro. Otis Adams from the Progressive Association. Bro. Adams is coming into our Association.

Motion carried to send Bro. Virgil Hunt a card and love offering, from the Association. A total of \$38.56 was sent.

The speakers for this session were Rev. Billy Ray Wood and Rev. L. D. Stonecipher.

At each of these Quarterly Meetings, the delegation was warmly welcomed, and the Host Churches served wonderful meals, and we enjoyed the fellowship and worship together.

RULES GOVERNING CAMP GROUND PROPERTY

- No camping will be allowed on the west side of the brook that runs across the property.
- No person or persons will be allowed to take up residence, permanent or temporary, on the property, unless by special permission by the Board of Trustees.
- 3. Lots shall be located and numbered beginning with Lot 1, on east side of brook where it comes into property on north side and numbered eastward consecutively to the NE corner of property, thense southward still consecutively along the east side of property to the SE corner of said property, said lots shall be 4O feet square. A plat of same shall be kept by Board of Trustees, also a record of the disposal of lots.
- 4. Any Free Will Baptist belonging to any Church in our Association may build a cabin on this property subject to the following regulations:
 - A. No cabin or permanent camp shall be built on any part of the property except on lots mentioned in Rule No. 3.
 - B. No person may build a cabin or permanent camp without getting permission from the Board of Trustees.
 - C. No person shall have the right to move any cabin or permanent camp off the property at any time or for any purpose.
 - D. If and when the owner of a cabin or permanent camp shall move out of the State of Oklahoma he shall offer for sale said cabin or permanent camp and if not sold within one year from the date of his departure to some person who is a member of some church in the Center Association it shall become the property of the Association or he may give it to the Association or to some person, if such person is a member of some church in the Center Association.

CONSTITUTION

From long experience, we, the members of the Center Association being regularly baptised upon the profession of faith in Jesus Christ and being convinced of the necessity of combination of churches to perpetuate a union and communion among us, and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, we do therefore ordain this Constitution for better associational government.

ARTICLE I-MEMBERSHIP

This Association is composed of ordained ministers and deacons, duly elected officers of the Association, Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk and Treasurer, with delegates chosen by the different churches in our union, not exceeding three delegates from each church, upon presenting their letters shall be entitled to seats.

ARTICLE II-LETTERS OF REPRESENTATION

Letters from each church to express their number of fellowship, the number of ordained and licentiate preachers and their post office address: The number of members received upon confession of faith, by letter or recommendation, by restoration, or denominational choice, and the number dismissed by letter, excluded or died since last Association.

ARTICLE III--NAME

The members thus chosen and convened to be denominated the Center Association of Free Will Baptists, being composed of the sundry churches in Oklahoma.

ARTICLE IV-OFFICERS

The Association shall have a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, and a Board of Trustees of three (3) members elected to 3, 2, and 1 year terms, who are chosen by sufferage of the members present.

ARTICLE V-PETITIONARY LETTERS

Newly constituted churches may be admitted into the Association, which are to petition by letter and delegates, and if upon examination they are found to be orthodox and orderly, they may be received into the Association, the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.

ARTICLE VI—QUESTION

No question from any church shall come under consideration of the Association except it has first been discussed in its own church.

ARTICLE VII-MOTIONS

Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, unless it be withdrawn by the person making it.

ARTICLE VIII-MINUTES

The Association is to endeavor to furnish the churches with minutes of the Association in proportion to the number of members in each church, the distribution being at the discretion of the Association.

ARTICLE IX-CLERK

It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of the Association in a book to be kept by the Association for that purpose.

ARTICLE X—SIGNATION

The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if needed, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the close of the Association.

ARTICLE XI--AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Constitution may be made when necessary by a twothirds majority vote of the members present.

Amendment No. 1—Each ordained minister shall be a member of a church in the bounds of the Association, and if he shall hold his letter for a period of three months when opportunities afford him, he shall surrender his credentials to the quarterly or yearly meeting.

Amendment No. 2—The meeting date of this Association shall be Thursday night before the second Sunday in August of each year.

Amendment to Amendment No. 2—Quarterly Meetings of the Association shall meet on the third Saturday of each quarter ending in November, February, and May of each calendar year.

Amendment No. 3—No decision or ruling made and carried in the Annual Association shall be reversed by the Quarterly Meeting.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

ARTICLE I

We believe in the living God, the Father, Son and Holy Ghost; and these are equal in the Divine Essence, power and glory.—Romans 1:20; John 1:1.

ARTICLE II-THE BIBLE

The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.—II Tim. 3:16-17; 2 Pet. 1:20-21.

ARTICLE III-THE FALL

Section 1. We believe God created man and gave him holy commandments. Whereby, we should live holy, but man voluntarily disobeyed the commandments of God, transgressed the law and fell under just condemnation of the same, whereby all mankind are sinners, but not by constraint, but by choice.

—Gen. 3:1-13.

Section 2. Being partakers of the sinful nature attained by the fall. —Romans 5:14-19.

Section 3. And that man is unable to save himself with his own power; but we see Jesus by the suffering death, crowned with glory, that He by the Grace of God, tasted death for every man.—Heb. 2:9.

ARTICLE IV-PARDON

Section 1. We believe that Christ by His death, suffering and resurrection, purchased our pardon.—I Cor. 15:3.

Section 2. And offers it freely to all mankind upon the principle of repentance toward God with faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.—Eph. 5:2; Heb. 9:28.

Section 3. He now commands all men everywhere to repent; therefore, He sayeth: "Look unto me and be saved all the ends of the earth for I am God and there is none else."—Matt. 4:17; Isa. 45:22; Acts 20:21, 17:30.

ARTICLE V—REGENERATION

We believe that adult persons must be regenerated and born of the Spirit of God if they inherit eternal life.—John 3:3, 1:12-13; Rom. 5:1-13.

ARTICLE VI-INFANTS

We believe that infants and idiots are saved upon the mercies of the Son of God.—Jonah 4:11; Mark 10:14; Luke 18:16; I John 2:12.

ARTICLE VII—APOSTASY

We believe all Christians should persevere in grace and be faithful to the end if they inherit eternal life. "For blessed are they that do His commandments, that they may have a right to the tree of life and enter in through the gates of that city."—Rev. 22:14; Gal. 5:4; Heb. 12:14-28; James 5:19-20.

ARTICLE VIII-BAPTISMAL MODE

We believe that baptism by immersion is the apostolic mode, even the burial of believers in water, and that Christ, who is our life, showed His humble example to His children and bids us to walk therein.—Matt. 3:16, 28:19; Rom. 6:4-5. (Latin to plunge, to submerge, baptizo; Greek, to dip, baptism: Greek, a dipper, baption; Greek to wash, to dip.—Matt. 3:13-17, 28:19; Rom. 6:4-5; I Peter 3:21.

ARTICLE IX—MINISTRY CALL

We believe that God, in His goodness, displays His power of grace in a great degree in calling and qualifying His servants by the teaching of the Holy Ghost and by the instruction of His blessed word to go forth and proclaim life and salvation.—Eph. 3:7; 1 Tim. 1:8-9; Rom. 15:15-16.

ARTICLE X—COMMANDMENTS

We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper, and the washing of the Saint's feet, and keeping the Lord's day holy, and to abstain from all worldly lust and carnal cares, and to assemble ourselves together, is an ornament which prepares and beautifies the soldiers of the cross to march onward in the army of the Lord.—Matt. 26:26-29; John 13:2-17; I Tim. 5:9-10; Luke 22:7-20.

ARTICLE XI—BAPTISMAL RIGHT

Section 1. We believe that none have the right to baptism only those who have obtained a living hope in the Lord Jesus Christ.—Acts 10:47.

Section 2. And none have the right to administer the same only those who are called of God and have come under hands of the presbytery of elders.—Acts 13:1-4; Matt. 28:19-20.

Section 3. And we shall receive none other.—Matt. 3:13-17; Titus 1:5; Acts 14:23.

ARTICLE XII-LORD'S SUPPER-DUTY

We believe it the duty of each church to assemble themselves together once a month, and that it is the duty of the pastor of the church when setting the Lord's Supper and washing the saint's feet to invite all Christians.—I Cor. 11:27-28.

ARTICLE XIII-WOMAN'S PRIVILEGE

We believe the Bible teaches woman's privilege to preach the Gospel. —Judges 4:4, Rom. 16:12; II Kings 22:14; Acts 2:17-18.

ARTICLE XIV-FORNICATION

We believe that nothing but death and fornication gives a lawful right to a second marriage, and a second marriage under divorce for any other cause than fornication is a sin if continued in.—Matt. 19:3-11; Matt. 5:32; Luke 16:18; Mark 10:11; Romans 7:1-3; Proverbs 5:19-20; I Cor. 7:10-11; Mal. 2:14-17.

ARTICLE XV-RESURRECTION

We believe in the resurrection of all dead both just and unjust. —John 5:28-29.

The resurrection of the just to glory and immortality in the presence of God. —Matt. 25:34; Job 19:26.

And the unjust to everlasting shame and banishment from the presence of God.—Matt. 25:31-32; Matt. 25:41; I Cor. 15:52; II Thes. 1:4-11; Rev. 20:14-15.

Church Covenant

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God, in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanctions of use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotion, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church and the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprise supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling, that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprise, the support of missions, the success of Sabbath schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls and the conversion of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
