COMMITTEE REPORTS

C. T. S.

The Center Association was represented in the State CTS Competition held on May 31, 1981 by Cedar Grove, Ada, and Stratford.

In the National Competition, held on July 20, 1981, at Louisville, Kentucky we were represented by Ada, Cedar Grove and Stratford.

Those placing from Ada were: Division 1 —Chorale, Juniors, 1st place; Kyle Sutton a No. 1 rating in Piano Solo; Kyle Sutton a No. 2 rating in Declamation; Robert Gray, 3rd in third grade Bible Memorization; and Teen Chorale, a No.2 rating. Cedar Grove placed 3rd in Chorale with a No. 1 rating; Stratford placed in the following: Billy Briggs, No. 1 in piano solo; Sextet, No. 2 rating, and Choir No. 2 rating.

We feel that the CTS is an important part of our church. We recommend the CTS as a effective means of training the youth of our churches for christian service. We urge every church in the Center Association to actively support and encourage the CTS Rallies, Youth Fellowship and Youth Camp.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

We the Sunday School Committee are pleased to report that all 19 churches in the Center Association of Free Will Baptists have a Sunday School program. On the average morning, there are 1,140 persons attending Sunday School in our association. This number is an increase of 63 over last year's average.

Item # 2

At the annual meeting of the Center Association in August, 1979, the Board of Trustees was asked to begin renovation of the camp kitchen and dining area. The associational body authorized the expenditures of up to \$15,000 for this project. The interior of the kitchen was remodeled during the summer of 1980. During the summer of 1981, the dining area surrounding the kitchen was rebuilt. The old dining area contained approximately 900 square feet of floor space and would seat about 75 people. The new dining area contains approximately 1460 square feet and will seat at least 140 people. To date, a total of \$14,592.98 has been spent on the improvement of our kitchen and dining area. However, the contractor has asked for an additional \$1,000 above the original estimate for construction of the dining area. We have discussed this matter with the contractor and the board feels that the additional payment is justified for the following reasons.

1. Changes were made in the original design of the structure after construction began. These changes were initiated by members of the Board of Trustees.
2. Costs of materials exceeded the original estimate by the contractor. The board feels that it must accept at least part of the responsibility for this because the contractor was given only a short time to present his estimate. Also, we had intended to completely remove the tree which was located adjacent to the old dining area on the east side. Despite the use of a wench truck, we were unable to remove the entire trunk of this tree. The decision was made to cut the tree off as close to the ground as possible. As a result, more fill and concrete was required than was originally estimated.

A minimum of three tasks remain to be done to complete this project. These are: 1) cover and seal around the exterior of the kitchen, 2) painting and caulking, and 3) removal of soil on the east side of the building and construction of a retaining wall. Estimated cost of these three tasks is \$670.00.

Item # 3

We recommend the development of a revised master camp utilization and improvement plan. This plan should be a comprehensive evaluation of the role of the camp property in the ministry of this association. Items covered should include, but not be limited to: 1) Methods of utilizing the camp; 2) Prioritized listing of improvements; 3) Estimated costs of maintaining, improving and operating the camp; 4) Methods of financing, and 5) Present and potential local, state, and federal regulations affecting youth camp operation.

We therefore, suggest that this associational body authorize the appointment of a special committee to work with the Board of Trustees for the purpose of developing the above described plan. We further recommend that this plan be presented to the associational body for its adoption or rejection during the quarterly meeting in February, 1982.

Item #4

A public address system has been purchased for the association. The system consists of an amplifier, two microphones, two microphone stands, two column speakers and two horn speakers. In order to receive the most benefit from this equipment, we recommend that church and associational groups within the Center Association be allowed to borrow this system for church or associational sponsored activities subject to the following guidelines:

- 1) Associational activities are given the highest priority
- 2) All use is coordinated with the Board of Trustees
- 3) The user group must be instructed in the proper set-up and use of the system

- 4) Any damage to the equipment as a result of misuse or improper care will be the responsibility of the user.

Item # 5

Four items were stolen from the camp kitchen on July 7, 1981. Stolen were a freezer, refrigerator, washer and dryer. Estimated value of these appliances was \$800.00. The theft occurred between 10:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. the following day. The theft was reported to and is being investigated by the Pontotoc County Sheriff's office. The insurance policy on the camp did not cover the loss of these items. The present policy covers structures only. A used refrigerator has been donated to the camp to replace the stolen refrigerator. A washer, dryer, and freezer were loaned to the association for use during the 1981 youth camp.

Item # 1

The Board of Trustees recommends the adoption of the attached "Rules Governing Use of Camp Property". We suggest that these rules be added to those rules already listed in the minutes.

5. Only church sponsored groups may use the camp facilities.
6. Camp property may be used only upon permission of the Board of Trustees.
7. Camp property shall be cleaned following each activity. This shall be the responsibility of the group using the property. Any damages to or problems with camp facilities must be reported to the Board of trustees. The trustees or their designated representative shall ascertain the condition of the camp at the conclusion of each camp activity.
8. Camp facilities may not be used between November 1 and March 31 of each year except by special permission of the Board of Trustees.
9. A report describing camp utilization will be made to the association at each annual meeting. This report shall include:
 - a) a list of groups using the camp
 - b) total number using camp
 - c) financial report
 - d) proposed changes in the rental agreement

Item # 2

We recommend the adoption of the attached "Camp Rental Agreement". This agreement sets forth the conditions to be followed for renting the camp to groups outside our association.

- I. Rental Fee
\$2.00 per camper per day with a minimum of \$75.00 per day.
- II. Deposit
A deposit of \$100.00 is required to cover damages and/or cost of camp cleaning. This deposit will be returned to lessee if no damages are incurred during the rental period and if the camp facilities and property are cleaned by the lessee. Damages in excess of \$100.00 will be added to the rental fee and must be paid by the lessee.

Rules Governing Camp Property

The following rules must be obeyed.

1. No camping will be allowed on the west side of the brook.
2. No use of drugs or alcoholic beverages.
3. No smoking or use of tobacco in any form in any camp building.
4. No dancing.
5. No shorts, bare backs or halter tops. All campers must dress modestly at all times.
6. The leasee must have insurance covering all campers.
7. No fireworks of any type will be permitted on camp property.
8. No cutting or whittling on camp property will be allowed.

RULES GOVERNING CAMP GROUND PROPERTY

1. No camping will be allowed on the west side of the brook that runs across the property.
2. No person or persons will be allowed to take up residence, permanent or temporary, on the property, unless by special permission by the Board of Trustees.
3. Lots shall be located and numbered beginning with Lot 1, on east side of brook where it comes into property on north side and numbered eastward consecutively to the NE corner of property, thence southward still consecutively along the east side of property to the SE corner of said property, said lots shall be 40 feet square. A plat of same shall be kept by Board of Trustees, also a record of the disposal of lots.
4. Any Free Will Baptist belonging to any Church in our Association may build a cabin on this property subject to the following regulations:
 - A. No cabin or permanent camps shall be built on any part of the property except on lots mentioned in Rule No. 3.
 - B. No person may build a cabin or permanent camp without getting permission from the Board of Trustees.
 - C. No person shall have the right to move any cabin or permanent camp off the property at any time or for any purpose.
 - D. If and when the owner of a cabin or permanent camp shall move out of the State of Oklahoma he shall offer for sale said cabin or permanent camp and if not sold within one year from the date of his departure to some person who is a member of some church in the Center Association it shall become the property of the Association or he may give it to the Association or to some person, if such person is a member of some church in the Center Association.
5. Only church sponsored groups may use the camp facilities.
6. Camp property may be used only upon permission of the Board of Trustees.
7. Camp property shall be cleaned following each activity. This shall be the responsibility of the group using the property. Any damages to or problems with camp facilities must be reported to the Board of Trustees. The trustees or their designated representative shall ascertain the condition of the camp at the conclusion of each camp activity.
8. Camp facilities may not be used between November 1 and March 31 of each year except by special permission of the Board of Trustees.
9. A report describing camp utilization will be made to the association at each annual meeting. This report shall include:
 - a) a list of groups using the camp
 - b) total number using camp
 - c) financial report
 - d) proposed changes in the Rental Agreement

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

From long experience, we the members of the Center Association of Free Will Baptists being regularly baptised upon the profession of faith in Jesus Christ and being convinced of the necessity of combination of churches to perpetuate a union and communion among us, and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, we do therefore ordain this Constitution for better associational government.

ARTICLE I—MEMBERSHIP

The Center Association of Free Will Baptists shall be composed of Free Will Baptist Churches in Oklahoma which maintain gospel order and are in agreement with denominational doctrines and practices.

Voting members shall include ordained ministers and deacons who are members in good standing of member churches in the Association, elected officers of the Association, and delegates chosen by the different churches in the union, not to exceed three (3) delegates from each church, who upon presentation of letters from their respective church to each meeting shall be entitled to seats.

ARTICLE II—LETTERS OF REPRESENTATION

* Letters from each church giving information requested on letter forms supplied by the associational clerk shall be presented at the annual session. Letters from each church to quarterly meetings shall include only the names of delegates and alternates from the churches.

ARTICLE III—FEES

Each church should send \$10.00 to the annual meeting for printing of minutes which shall be distributed at the discretion of the Clerk. Each church should share in the support of the Association with a \$10.00 love offering to each quarterly and annual meeting.

No board or individual, except the Executive Board in time of emergency, within the framework of the Association shall have the authority to set, designate, or levy any certain amount of fees or finance upon any individual, church, or group without the approval of the associational body while in regular session.

ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS AND STANDING BOARDS

OFFICERS: Officers of the Association shall include a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk-Treasurer who shall be chosen by suffrage of members present at the close of each annual session and shall serve for the ensuing associational year.

STANDING BOARDS: All boards shall be composed of five (5) members who shall be elected at the annual meeting to terms of 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 year. No individual shall serve on more than one standing board at one time. Board members with two consecutive absences from the Quarterly Meetings without notifying by letter or telephone, will be eliminated and replaced from the respective board. Vacancies in the boards may be filled at the Quarterly Meetings of the Association. Standing boards and duties are as follows:

BOARD OF TRUSTEES: This board shall hold title to all real property owned by the Association. It shall be responsible for the upkeep and maintainance of the associational property.

EXECUTIVE BOARD: This board shall act for and in behalf of the Association when not in session. It shall examine all churches desiring to unite with the Association and shall act as an organizational council for newly constituted churches.

This board shall have the authority to call the Association into special session by notifying member churches at least ten (10) days in advance of the called session.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD. This board shall be responsible for arranging the program and selecting workers for the annual youth camp. They shall promote the Sunday School and Church Training Service programs in the member churches of the Association.

Examining Board: This board shall examine all ministers for license and ordination including those who shall come from other Associations. It shall examine all deacons for ordination. The time of examination of candidates shall be at the discretion of the board with a written recommendation to be presented to the next meetings of the Association following the examination for approval by the body.

All candidates for ordination to the Gospel Ministry shall be required by the board to answer the questions as adopted by the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists entitled "Questionnaire for Ministers to be Ordained" as printed in the minutes of the State Association.

"This board shall have the duty and right to investigate reports of and alleged errors in doctrine or practice within our licensed and ordained ministers contrary to those outlined in the Free Will Baptist Treatise.

ARTICLE V—PETITIONARY LETTERS

Any church, including newly constituted churches, may be admitted into the Association at any regular meeting when the names of delegates and a letter petitioning for membership are presented, and when the church has been examined by the Executive Board of the Association and are found orthodox and orderly.

ARTICLE VI—QUESTIONS

No question from any church in the Association shall come under the consideration of the Association except it has first been discussed in its own church conference.

ARTICLE VII—MOTIONS

Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it be withdrawn by the person making the motion.

ARTICLE VIII—CLERK

It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of the Association in a book to be kept by the Association for that purpose.

ARTICLE IX—SIGNATION

The minutes of the Association shall be read, corrected when necessary, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk at the close of the annual Association.

ARTICLE X—MEETINGS

The meeting date of this Association shall be Friday Morning before the second Sunday in August of each year. Quarterly meetings of the Association shall meet on the third Saturday of November, February, and May of each calendar year.

No decision or ruling made and carried in the annual meeting shall be reversed by the quarterly meeting.

ARTICLE XI—AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Constitution may be made at any annual meeting by a 2/3 majority vote when presented in writing at least one day in advance.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

ARTICLE I

Section 1. We believe God created man and gave him holy commandments. Whereby, we should live holy, but man voluntarily disobeyed the commandments of God, transgressed the law and fell under just condemnation of the same, whereby all mankind are sinners, but now by constraint, but by choice.—Gen 3: 1-13.

Section 2. Being partakers of the sinful nature attained by the fall.—Romans 5:14-19.

Section 3. And that man is unable to save himself with his own power; but we see Jesus by the suffering death, crowned with glory, that He by the Grace of God, tasted death for every man.—Heb. 2:9.

ARTICLE IV—PARDON

Section 1. We believe that Christ by His death, suffering and resurrection, purchased our pardon.—I Cor. 15:3.

Section 2. And offers it freely to all mankind upon the principle of repentance toward God with faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.—Eph. 5:2; Heb. 9:28.

Section 3. He now commands all men everywhere to repent; therefore, He sayeth: "Look unto me and be saved all the ends of the earth for I am God and there is none else."—Matt 4:17; Isa. 45:22; Acts 20:21, 17:30.

ARTICLE V—REGENERATION

We believe that all persons reaching the age of accountability, or the knowledge of right from wrong, must be regenerated and born of the Spirit of God if they inherit eternal life.—John 3:3, 1:12-13; Romans 5:1-13.

ARTICLE VI—INFANTS

We believe that infants and those who are never mentally capable of being accountable are saved upon the mercies of the Son of God.—Jonah 4:11; Mark 10:14; Luke 18:16; I John 2:12.

ARTICLE VII—APOSTASY

We believe all Christians should persevere in grace and be faithful to the end if they inherit eternal life. "For blessed are they that do His commandments, that they may have a right to the tree of life and enter in through the gates of that city."—Rev. 22:14; Gal 5:4; Heb. 12:14-28; James 5:19-20.

ARTICLE VIII—BAPTISMAL MODE

We believe that baptism by immersion is the apostolic mode, even the burial of believers in water, and that Christ, who is our life, showed His humble example to His children and bids us to walk therein.—Matt. 3:16, 28:19; Rom 6:4-5. (Latin to plunge, to submerge, baptizo; Greek, to dip, baptism: Greek, a dipper, bapton; Freek to wash, to dip.—Matt. 3:13-17, 28:19; Rom. 6:4-5; I Peter 3:21.

ARTICLE IX—MINISTRY CALL

We believe that God, in His goodness, displays His power of grace in a great degree in calling and qualifying His servants by the teaching of the Holy Ghost and by the instruction of His blessed word to go forth and proclaim life and salvation.—Eph. 3:7; I Tim. 1:8-9; Rom. 15:15-16.

ARTICLE X—COMMANDMENTS

We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper, and the washing of the Saint's feet, and keeping the Lord's Day holy, and to abstain from all worldly lust and carnal cares, and to assemble ourselves together, is an ornament which prepares and beautifies the soldiers of the cross to march onward in the army of the Lord.—Matt. 26:26-29; John 13:2-17; I Tim. 5:9-10; Luke 22:7-20.

ARTICLE XI—BAPTISMAL RIGHT

Section 1. We believe that none have the right to baptism only those who have obtained a living hope in the Lord Jesus Christ.—Acts 10:47.

Section 2. And none have the right to administer the same only those who are called of God and have come under hands of the presbytery of elders.—Acts 13:1-4; Matt. 28:19-20.

Section 3. And we shall receive none other.—Matt. 3:13-17; Titus 1:5; Acts 14:23.

ARTICLE XII—LORD'S SUPPER-DUTY

We believe it is the duty of each church as oft as they assemble themselves together for the observance of the Lord's Supper, and washing the Saint's feet, to invite all Christians to participate in the observance of the ordinances.—I Cor. 11:27-28.

ARTICLE XIII—WOMAN'S PRIVILEGE

We believe the Bible teaches woman's privilege to preach the Gospel.—Judges 4:4; Rom. 16:12; II Kings 22:14; Acts 2:17-18

ARTICLE XIV—FORNICATION

We believe that nothing but death and fornication, gives a scriptural right to a second marriage, and a second marriage under divorce for any other cause than fornication, is a sin of adultery and contrary to the will and Word of God.—Matt. 19:3-11, 5:32; Luke 16:18; Mark 10:11; Rom. 7:1-3; Prov. 5:19-20; I Cor. 7:10-11; Mal. 2:14-17.

ARTICLE XV—RESURRECTION

We believe in the resurrection of all dead both just and unjust.—John 5:28-29.

The resurrection of the just to glory and immortality in the presence of God.—Mat. 25:34; Job. 19:26.

And the unjust to everlasting shame and banishment from the presence of God.—Matt. 25:31-32; Matt. 25:41; I Cor. 15:52; 11 Thes. 1:4-11; Rev. 20:14-15.

Church Covenant

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give to one another by the will of God, in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanctions of use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church and the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprise supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling, that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprise, the support of missions, the success of Sabbath schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls and the conversion of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
