

We your committee on missions recommend that the churches increase the amounts sent to the conference and especially for education as we think our school at Ayden, N. C. is accomplishing a greater mission work than we can hope for at any other point.

EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE REPORT.

We your committee on education submit the following:

1st. We recommend that every man called to the ministry be required to take advantage of a literary education as far as opportunity permit.

2nd. We recommend that the pledge system for raising money for the Seminary be continued as we are in debt and the success of the denomination depends largely upon this institution.

3rd. We ask the Board of Directors together with all:

1st. We insist that total abstinence be required of all our members in the use of all alcoholic drinks as a beverage, that all who are known to tipole be under the censure of their church.

He has brought us through many difficulties and trials and preserved us up to the present time. In 1752 there was a change made in the name. I have seen some of the old history and the minutes from 1729 to the present. The minutes show that from 1729 to 1752 we were known as General or Free Will Baptist Association. In 1752 the words General and Association were dropped and we were known as the Original Free Will Baptist, the name we now have. Instead of the sixteenth annual session it should be the one hundred and sixty fourth annual session. I hope the next conference will instruct the clerk to change it to its right and legal session.
