# PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Seventy-Seventh Annual Session of the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, met with the church at Sweet Gum Grove church, Pitt County, November 4, 5 and 6, 1925.

Sister Katie Sawyer Jackson addressed the Conference. Subject: "The Woman's Home Missionary Work."

The following resolution was adopted:

1st. Resolved, That we, the Central Conference, go on record as being opposed to the teaching in our schools, both public and denominational, any form of science or hypothesis that discredits and denounces the Holy Bible as being the inspired Word of God.

2nd. Should any minister preach a hypothesis that denies the inspired Word of God or the creation and fall of man, the consequences of death and

suffering brought upon the human family by the sin of Adam; the virgin birth of Jesus Christ; the atonement and literal death of Jesus Christ; His resurrection, ascension and the visible coming of the Lord Jesus to earth again. All of which are contradicted in spirit, if not in word by the modernist and evolutionist shall be dealt with as departing from the faith, once delivered unto the saints, and if found guilty, they shall be expelled from the ministry of our Conference. Provided, however, if at any time the said brother or brethren shall show repentance and ask for reinstatement. After examination, if found orthodox, shall be reinstated.

3rd. That we reaffirm our allegiance to the doctrine and principles of our church.
