

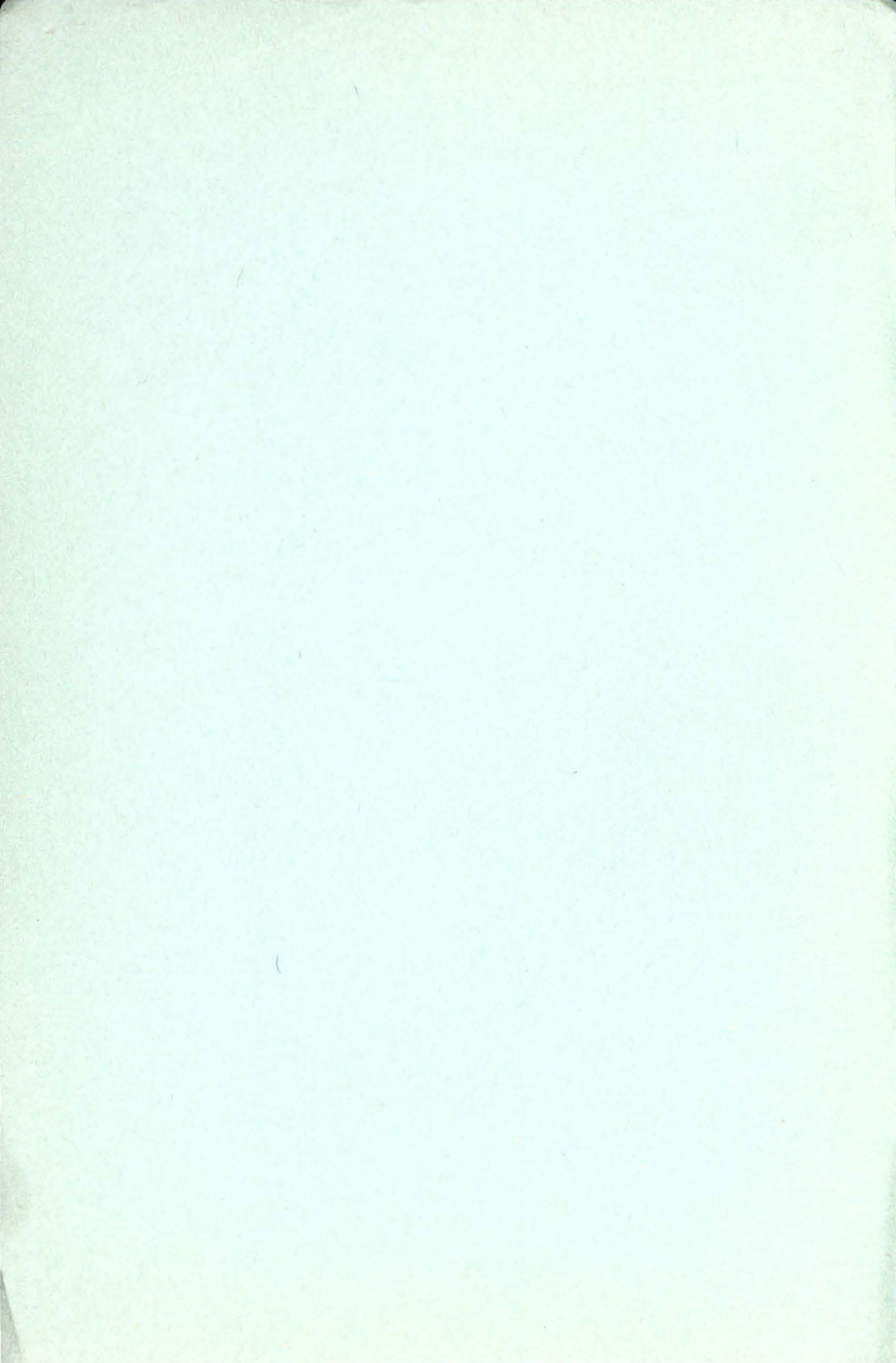

PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Seventy-Ninth Annual Session of the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, met with the church at Saints Delight, Greene County, Nov. 9, 10, and 11, 1927.

The introductory sermon was preached by Rev. C. J. Harris of Greenville, N. C. Text: 11 Cor. 3:6.

At 1:15 P. M., conference was called to order by the vice moderator, D. A. Windham. Prayer by Rev. M. E. Tyson.

The list of ministers was called.

The moderator appointed Rev. W. B. Nobles to write an obituary of Rev. C. L. Little.

On Motion Rev. A. Tyson was excommunicated for departing from the faith. Rev. W. H. Lathinghouse was appointed to demand his license and credentials.

On motion, Union Grove church, Beaufort County, was received by letter from the Eastern Conference.

On motion, the report of the Executive committee was accepted.

On motion, the conference appointed a committee to arrange the work for Maury Church. Committee appointed: W. H. Lathinghouse, E. C. Hines, and S. K. Jackson. Said committee is to sell the property if they think best after they have tried to have preaching there.

The Ordaining Council met in Ayden, N. C., April 1, 1927 and ordained L. W. Humbles and R. C. Ange. This report was adopted and the above names added to the list of ordained ministers.

The devotional committee report that Eld. J. R. McCaskey open and M. E. Tyson preach to night.

On motion, C. J. Harris was elected assistant moderator for this conference. Conference adjourned till 9:30 A. M. Thursday.

THURSDAY A. M. 9:30

Conference met according to adjournment. Prayer by Rev. A. H. Outlaw. Minutes of Wednesday read and approved.

The following Program committee was appointed: M. E. Tyson, R. H. Mason, and A. H. Outlaw.

Rev. J. C. Moye was appointed to fill the vacancy of R. F. Pittman on the educational board.

Rev. M. A. Woodard resigned as a member of the educational board and Levi Hill was elected in his place.

The Educational board of this conference is as follows: M. B. Prescott, C. G. Little, Thos. E. Beaman, Levi Hill, and J. C. Moye.

On motion the executive board were allowed their expenses in attending the different called meetings.

At 11 A. M. Prof. R. B. Spencer and the Glee Club of Eureka College entertained us.

On motion, this conference endow Eureka College with \$17,000.00.

THURSDAY P. M.

Conference was called to order. Prayer by C. J. Harris.

On motion, T. F. Davenport and J. D. Vernelson were added to the list of licensed preachers.

At 2:30 Rev. J. C. Griffin made an address in behalf of the orphanage

At 2:50, Bro. C. K. Dunn made an appeal for the Printing Company.

The Conference took \$300.00 stock in the Printing Company.

The devotional committee report that J. C. Griffin preach to night.

A vote of thanks was extended to Eureka College and the Glee Club.

Conference adjourned till Friday A. M.

FRIDAY A. M.

Conference called to order. Prayer by Rev. W. H. Oliver. Minutes of Thursday read and approved.

On motion the committee appointed to handle the Maury Church property condition confer with the Finance Committee in regard to funds to support the work.

Bro. P. S. Walston was appointed to serve on the ministerial character committee in Bro. G. V. Boyd's place for today.

The following resolutions were adopted :

RESOLUTION:

Whereas, the four North Carolina Conferences, viz., The Eastern, Central, Western and Cape Fear, and united under one form of church government, and,

Whereas, by mutual agreement, this form of government cannot be changed only by action of the four constituent bodies, and,

Whereas, different interpretations carried into execution are equal to changes in said government which tend to bring on confusion, and,

Whereas, there has arisen a difference of opinion about, and interpretation of our fundamental law relative to the ministry, especially to the conference membership of ministers, therefore, be it resolved:

That the Central Conference now in session at Sts. Delight Church, Greene county, N. C., express a desire for a joint session of the Executive Committees of the four conferences concerned and ask that they meet jointly at such time and place as may be arranged by said committees, the committee of this conference taking the initiative, for the purpose of canvassing the question under consideration, and others that may be presented at the time, with a view to reaching a state of unity in action, whereby the peace and prosperity of the church may be maintained in the future. The paramount question is: Is it proper and legal under our Discipline for a minister to maintain his local church membership within the bounds of one of said conferences and his conference membership in another?

RESOLUTIONS:

Realizing that the Auxiliary work of our conference can never be any stronger than our leaders.

Therefore, Be it resolved,

1. That we prayerfully ask the cooperation of every minister who pastors a church within our conference.

2. That this conference recommend that each pastor organize work in every church which is not already organized, and we advise that the societies represent at the Auxiliary convention.

3. That one hour be set apart during the last day of the conference for a musical program to be arranged by the instructor and choirs that he builds up, or with which he works.

IN MEMORY OF ELD. C. L. LITTLE
