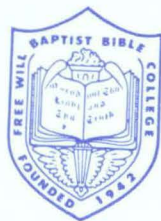

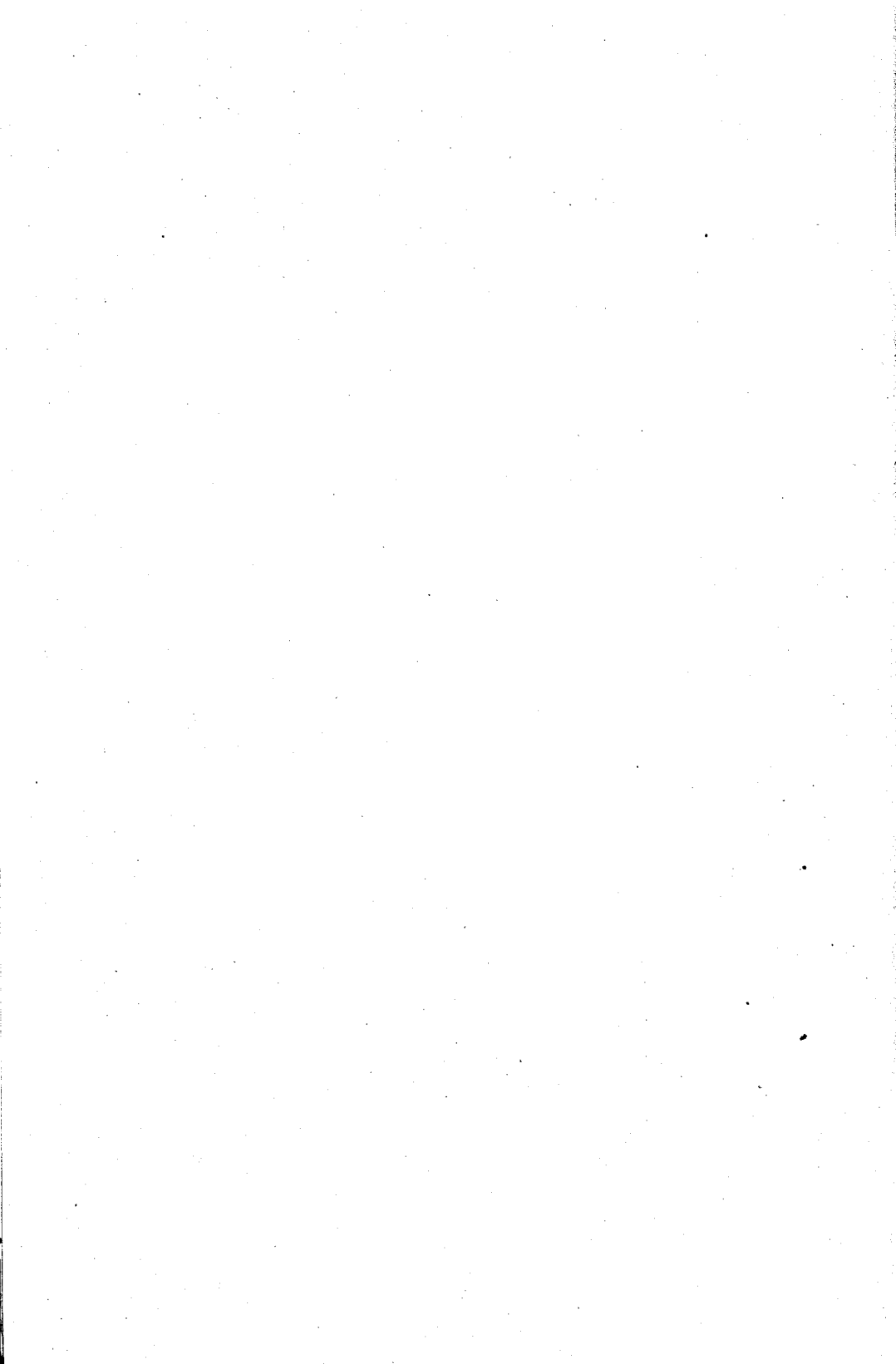

# PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Eighty-First Annual Session of the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, met with the church at Marlboro, Pitt county, N. C., Nov. 7, 8, 9, 1929.

The introductory sermon was preached by Rev. C. J. Harris of Greenville, N. C. Text: 1 Timothy 3:15.

## Report of Ordaining Council

The Ordaining Council of the Central Conference met in the office of Eureka College, on Monday after the fourth Sunday in May (May 27). Members present: R. F. Pittman, W. H. Lathinghouse, M. A. Woodard, Thos. E. Beaman, L. R. Ennis proxy for J. C. Moye.

The following were examined by the Council: H. J. Brickhouse, and K. B. Bland.

H. J. Brickhouse passed the examination and the Council asked T. E. Beaman to arrange for the ordination service.

We recommend that K. B. Bland be requested to give himself to prayer and study of the Word, and come before the Council at some future meeting.

The ordaining service was arranged for H. J. Brickhouse on June 20, at 4 o'clock P. M., in Greenville church. The service was conducted by Thos. E. Beaman, W. H. Lathinghouse, M. A. Woodard, and J. R. Davidson.

On motion the name of H. J. Brickhouse be enrolled on the list of ordained ministers.

The Devotional Committee report that Rev. R. E. Tripp preach at 11 o'clock. Sister Lillie Smith made a report of the Ladies' Work and urged the ladies to cooperate in the work.

On motion Bro. L. A. Arnold was appointed on the Executive Committee for one year.

Sister J. H. Oglesby of the Eastern Conference told of her work as a director of the Orphanage work in the State among the ladies and asked that the ladies cooperate with her in this great work.

On motion the clerk was asked to mail the minutes that he received from the other conferences to the ministers, officers and members as far as they will go.

## Report of Educational Committee

Re it Resolved, 1. That we stand behind the indorsers of the College Loan in an effort to pay the college debts, and that we adopt the plan of campaign, which has been outlined by the State Convention.

2. That we accept the allotment of \$10,000.00.

3. That we require each pastor serving churches in this Conference to execute the plan of the campaign and report to the Executive Committee.

4. That we require our campaign committee to allot each church its amount to raise without delay.

The Devotional Committee reports that Rev. W. T. Pollard open services and Rev. J. R. Davidson preach tonight.

The following resolution was adopted:

### Resolution

Whereas, in this day of progress and enlightenment it is necessary for people who would be successful in any given line of work, to be well informed and prepared as to the work they undertake, and whereas, the Church of Jesus Christ is the most important work known among men, and therefore needs the most highly skilled and cultured men and women for its services.

In order to meet the demands of the present hour and to take care of the needs of the future, Be it Resolved:

That the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist Church of North Carolina go on record at this time, as favoring a higher standard of efficiency for the ministry. Said standard to be as follows:

First.—That any man applying for ordination shall first satisfy the members of the ordaining council as to his call from God to the ministry.

Second.—He must fill the requirements laid down by Paul in his first letter to Tim. 3rd chapter, verses 2-7.

"A bishop (minister then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, vigilant, sober, of good behavior, given to hospitality, apt to teach; not given to wine, no striker, not greedy of filthy lucre; but patient, not a brawler, not covetous; one that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity;

"(For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the Church of God?)

"Not a novice, lest being lifted up with pride he fall into the condemnation of the devil.

"Moreover he must have a good report of them which are without; lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil."

Third.—That hereafter no man shall be ordained to the ministry unless he has the equivalent to a High school education, in addition to his qualifications as set forth above.

Fourth.—That the Conference assist all worthy men, who are aspiring to the ministry, in obtaining an education.

Fifth.—That these rules cannot be altered by the Ordaining Council, in any way unless the Conference as a whole shall approve such alterations or exceptions upon the recommendation of the Ordaining Council.

#### FRIDAY MORNING

Devotional services were conducted by Rev. J. E. Wooten. Prayer by Rev. W. H. Lathinghouse.

On motion we leave it with the Ordaining Council as to whether the examinations be written or oral.

*Resolved:* That all applicants for ordination hereafter be required to file their intention of coming before the Ordaining Council with the Ordaining Council at the sitting of the Conference.

On motion Rev. J. E. Wooten, Rev. M. C. Prescott, and Rev. J. E. Moye were appointed to consider the following matter:

This is to notify the Executive Board of the Central Conference that I have withdrawn as pastor from Saints Delight church, Greene county, N. C., on the ground that this church in special session or conference rejected the demand which I made of it concerning certain of its members operating their stores and filling stations on Sunday. The requirement as submitted in writing and rejected by the church is as follows:

"That the members of this church who are operating their stores and filling stations on the Lord's Day be required to close them all day on Sunday, or for this offence they be expelled from the church."

This drastic effort to close certain stores and filling stations on the Lord's Day was not made until repeated demands through personal contact had proved fruitless. One of the efforts to crush this menacing influence was my visitation of certain members who were patronizing these shops on Sunday. But, notwithstanding many agreed to cease patronizing these stores on the Sabbath, they took a position with the majority on the night of Oct. 21, 1929, in a rejection of the disciplinary measure quoted above and, thus, licensed Sabbath desecration among the members of the aforesaid church.

Now, I am anxious to know whether the Central Conference will tolerate and fellowship a church of this type.

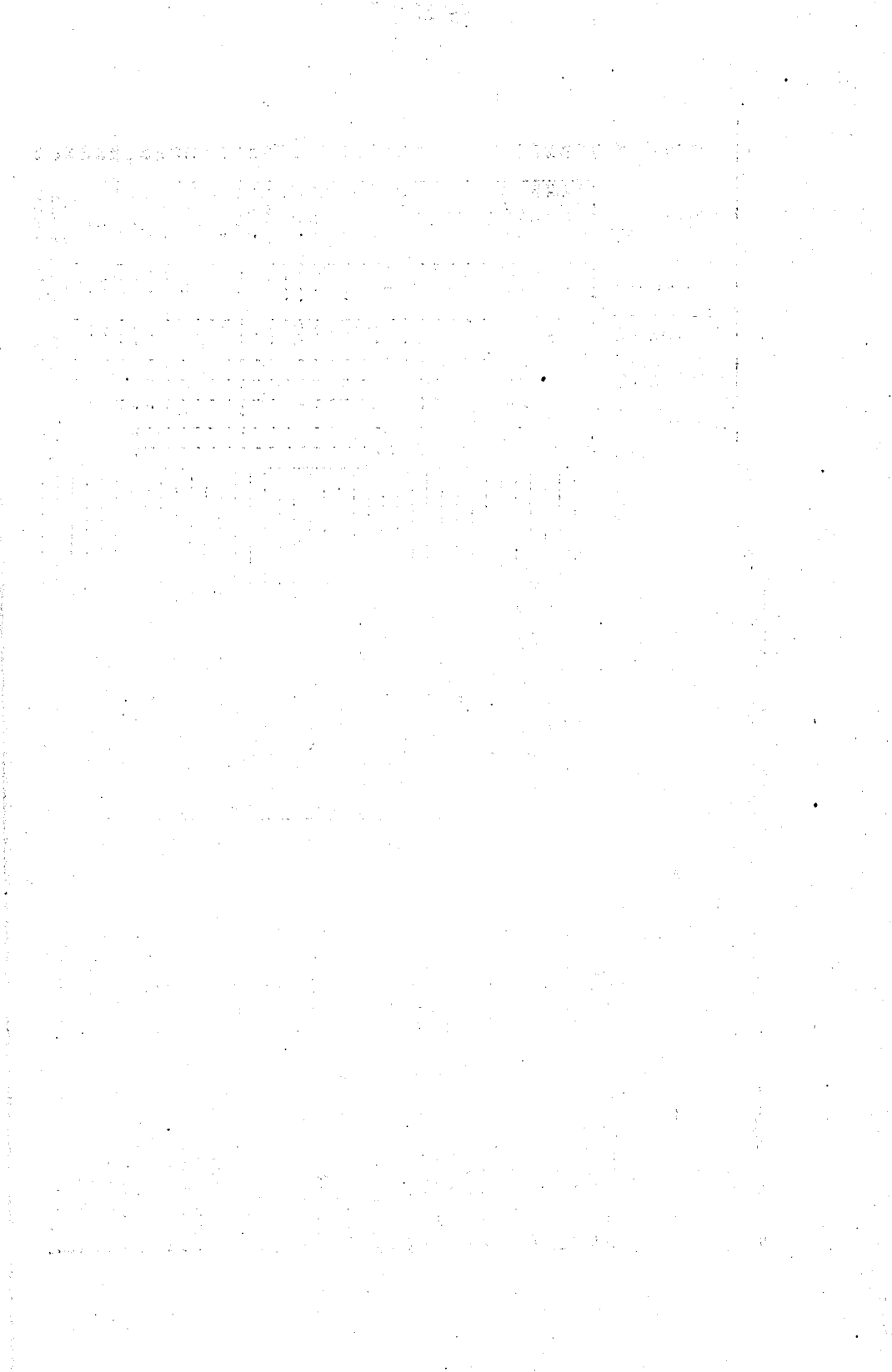
