

PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Eighty-Second Annual Session of the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Reedy Branch, Pitt county, N. C., Nov. 5, 6 and 7, 1930.

The introductory sermon was preached by Rev. J. C. Moye of Snow Hill, N. C. Text, John 15:6-7.

Wednesday Afternoon

Conference was called to order by the moderator, R. F. Pittman. Praise by the congregation. Prayer by W. A. Jackson, of the Cape Fear Conference.

The moderator made some very appropriate remarks, and read the constitution and By-Laws of the Conference.

Pittman, chairman; L. R. Ennis, Proxy for Thos. E. Beamon, and E. T. Phillips, proxy for M. A. Woodard.

Thursday Morning

Devotional services conducted by Rev. W. B. Batts. Prayer by Rev. R. E. Tripp. Praise by congregation. Remarks by moderator.

Minutes of Wednesday read and approved.

Devotional Committee reports that Rev. J. C. Griffin preach today at 11:00 and Rev. M. L. Cummings tonight.

The following resolution was read and adopted:

Whereas the Central Conference of the Free Will Baptist denomination in North Carolina is a regularly constituted deliberative body formed for the purpose of promoting the Church of Christ, and whereas this purpose thus obligates the use of every legitimate means in an effort to achieve this worthy aim.

Therefore be it resolved:

1st.—That, as provided in the Constitution and By-Laws of this Conference, the general assembly shall be composed of all officers, boards, standing committees, and all ordained and licensed ministers who hold membership with churches belonging to the said Central Conference. It being further established that all churches of the Conference shall duly represent through a delegation appointed by each church on the basis of one delegate for each one hundred members, or fraction thereof, enrolled in the respective churches.

2nd.—That this Conference shall elect at this session one of its members whose duty it shall be to call for a delegation from each Sunday school of the Conference to meet at such time and place as may be designated for the purpose of organizing a Conference-Wide Sunday School Convention.

It shall be required that the secretary of the Convention submit a general report of the Sunday school work at each annual session of the Conference, and that 10% of all funds received by the Convention accompany said report.

3rd.—That the Conference now in session elect a president and secretary of a Conference-Wide Free Will Baptist League Convention whose duty it shall be to perfect the organization herein named at such time and place as may be deemed best, and proceed thereafter to obtain an active league in every church of the Conference.

It being further understood that this Convention shall hold annual sessions, elect its own officers, and report through its secretary to this Confer-

ence during its annual sessions the attainments and problems of the league work, and also contribute 10% of the Convention's general funds to the Conference at its annual sessions.

4th.—That this Conference sha'l elect a Mission Board consisting of five members who shall put into effect a missionary program consistent with the Great Commission and the ability of the Central Conference.

5th.—That this Conference shall elect a Relief Board consisting of three members whose duty it shall be to apply funds appropriated by the Conference for benevolent purposes. It shall also be within the province of this board to make special and public appeals for the financial and material relief of aged and infirm ministers, widows, orphans, and those whose destitute circumstances may enjoin Christian charity. This board shall make no application of relief funds, obtained through the Conference or otherwise, to any person or persons without a written application, and such application shall be retained together with all other records pertaining to the deliberations of the board for the examination of the Conference.

O. K. by the Committee.

The following motion was adopted:

I hereby make a motion that we do not receive any minister into this Conference without first having a letter of recommendation from the Conference to which he belongs.

That no minister leave this Conference to join that of another without securing a letter of recommendation.

If any minister leave the denomination to take membership with another denomination, it shall be regarded as open excomunication and his license and credentials demanded by the clerk or moderator of this Conference.

- 2. That we advise our churches, Sunday schools, and Young People's Leagues that the best safeguard against Modernism and "sc ence falsely so-called" is a faithful study of God's Word (2 Tim. 2:15) and the use of our own literature published by the Free Will Baptist Press at Ayden, N. C.
- 3. That we indorse the Bible Correspondence School of the Moody Bible Institute, 153 Institute Place, Chicago, Ill., and encourage our ministers to enroll in such courses as they think would be most profitable to them.
