PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Eighty-Fifth Annual Session of the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Piney Grove, Pitt County, N. C. on November 8-10-1933. Song service conducted by Eld. M. A. Woodard. Prayer by Eld. D. W. Alexander. The introductory sermon was preached by Eld. W. H. Laughinghouse. Text: Nehemiah 2 and 12. Subject: "The Condition of our People in the Present Day, and the Remedy." Dinner was served at 12:15 P. M.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

At 1:15, Conference was called to order by the Moderator, Eld. J. C. Moye. Praise by congregation. Prayer by D. W. Alexander.

After some timely remarks by the moderator for the good of the conference, the regular order of business was entered into.

Order of Business

On motion, all visiting ministers and delegates were invited to seats with us during the sitting of the conference. The following were present and made some timely remarks. Edwards from the Christian church, Sister S. K. Jackson from the Auxiliary of the Central Conference, Elds. J. W. Alford, J. R. Bennett, Duffy Toler of the Eastern Conference, and Elds. E. T. Phillips and J. H. Worley from the Western Conference.

At the close of the organization, prayer was offered by Eld. W. A. Dail. On motion Eld. W. B. Batts stand excommunicated and that the clerk be instructed to demand his credentials for departing from the Free Will Baptist faith.

On motion this conference give to Eld. Redding Proctor a letter of dismission and recommendation to join the Eastern Conference.

On motion this conference give a letter of dismission to Eld. W. R. Flowers.

The moderator asked the clerk to try and get information about all preachers not coming to the conference and report at the next conference.

Eld. M. A. Woodard, delegate to the Eastern Conference, reported that the Eastern had a splendid session.

The delegates appointed to attend the Western Conference reported that they did not go.

The delegate to the General Conference Eld. M. A. Woodard reported as follows:

We had the largest conference that we ever have had. Eld. R. F. Pittman reported, that the General Conference had appointed a committee, and that they were doing all that they could to unite the East and the West.

On motion, this conference pay \$30.00 on expenses of the General Conference.

On motion this conference appropriate \$50.00 instead of \$25.00 for Foreign Mission work.

On motion, the Board of Relief be disbanded,

On motion, Eld. D. W. Alexander be asked to make a written Educational report to-morrow (Thursday).

Conference called off till Thursday morning at 9:30 o'clock.

THURSDAY MORNING

Met at 9:30. Devotional services were conducted by Eld. M. L. Johnson of the Cape Fear Conference. Prayer by Eld. J. C. Griffin.

On motion we accept the Educational Committee's report, that we separate it from the recommendations.

On motion we accept the recommendation offered first; namely that the trustees be paid their expenses out of the School Fund as they demand.

On motion the second recommendation be tabled indefinitely.

On motion we accept the resignation of six members of the Educational Program; and that this conference grant a vote of thanks to these trustees, for their interesting efforts in behalf of this program.

On motion the women's Auxiliary of this conference be given a permanent page in our minutes without any cost to them.

At 11 o'clock the service was turned over to the young people, Eld. D. A. Windham taking charge.

After special music was rendered, Sister Bettie Willoughby brought us a wonderful message on the subject: "Fidelity." This message was a wonderful treat to all who were present.

On motion a rising vote of thanks was tendered to Sister Willoughby, requesting that it be printed in our Baptist paper.

Dinner was served at 12 o'clock.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

Conference reassembled at 1:15 with praise by the congregation. Prayer by Eld. W. B. Nobles.

On motion by Eld. C. J. Harris, this conference go back into the State Convention.

On motion, by request of Eld. J. C. Moye, we accept his resignation as moderator of this conference.

On motion, Eld. D. W. Alexander be appointed as moderator of this conference to fill the unexpired term of Eld. J. C. Moye with Eld. M. E. Tyson as his assistant.

On motion the matter pertaining to Elds. Pittman and Moye be left over till to-morrow.

Devotional committee report there will be no preaching to night. Conference called off till 9:30 Friday morning.

FRIDAY MORNING

Conference met as per adjournment. Praise by the congregation. Prayer by Eld. Vernelson.

On motion we pay \$2.00 to Free Will Baptist Press for ordination blanks.

On motion we allow \$50.00 to the General Conference; \$40.00 for delegates expenses, and \$10.00 to the conference.

On motion we send the delegates to the conference uninstructed as to how they shall vote.

On motion N. L. Gupton be recorded as a licensed minister.

On motion we give Elds. Alford and Bennett one hour from 11 o'clock to 12 o'clock to speak on the Orphanage or whatever they see fit.

There was a collection taken for the Orphanage at this time amounting to \$41.12.

Eld. Alford preached to us on the subject, Gen. 5:24. "Enoch walked with God, and was not for God took him. Dinner was served at 12 o'clock.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

Conference reassembled at 1:30. Praise by the congregation. Prayer by Eld. M. A. Woodard.

The matter pertaining to Elds. R. F. Pittman and J. C. Moye was considered, and a motion was passed that the matter be tabled till next conference.

Petitions for the next conference were taken up. Hull Road, Saratoga, Black Jack and Shiloh petitioned. After discussion it was voted to hold the next Annual Conference with Shiloh Church in Beaufort County. Eld. W. H. Laughinghouse was appointed to preach the introductory sermon and Eld. C. J. Harris on his failure.

A collection was taken for Eld. Hallet Brickhouse and \$16.00 was raised.

On motion, the following were appointed delegates to the State Convention, Bros. L. A. Arnold, Elias Nobles, A. W. Brickhouse, E. C. Hines and G. V. Boyd.

On motion we accept the Finance Committee and Treasurer's report.

On motion we adopt the report of the Ordaining Council (See report).

On motion we accept the resignation of M. A. Woodard on the Ordaining Council. The motion was tabled till next Conference.

On motion we have 1500 minutes printed instead of 1,000 as formerly.

A collection was taken for Riverside Church, amounting to \$1.77.

On motion we extend a rising vote of thanks to this church and other churches for their kindness in caring for this conference.

The Moderator appointed a committee of five as an Educational Committee as follows: Elds. J. E. Wooten, E. L. Abrams, W. L. Hart, M. E. Tyson, and Sister Sophia Hardee.

Bro. Marshall Joyner expressed his thanks to Marlboro church for the use of their house during the conference.

On motion we extend a rising vote of thanks to the presiding officers of this conference for their effective service rendered.

Eld. J. H. Worley was asked to close the conference in his own way. After this there was a special prayer offered for Eld. W. L. Hart's brother who is in the hospital.

On motion the conference close till next time in course.

There was a Minister's meeting called at the church in Greenville, N. C., April 18th, 1934. The meeting was presided over by Eld. W. H. Laughinghouse. On motion that we send a letter to Eld. Hallet Brickhouse, giving the results of this meeting, also telling him that there was a special prayer in his behalf, led by Eld. R. F. Pittman. E. C. Hines was appointed Secretary of the meeting. The following Ministers made talks asking that we forget the past and launch forward, and do some real constructive work in our conference: Elds. C. J. Harris, J. E. Wooten, M. E. Tyson, R. F. Pittman, D. W. Alexander, R. P. Harris, J. C. Moye, L. B. Manning, W. L. Hart, C. H.Denton, H. T. Sowers, W. A. Dail, M. A. Woodard, R. H. Mason.

Elds. R. F. Pittman, J. E. Wooten and M. A. Woodard were appointed a committee to draw up resolutions for us to work by. The committee offered the following report:

In order to preserve harmony and cooperation among our Ministers of the Central Conference, we the committee appointed by the chairman of this called meeting of the Ministers, hereby recommend the following: 1—That we request the Executive Committee of the Conference to call a meeting and rescind the action of the Conference, in returning to the State Convention, and that each local church shall decide the question for itself of returning to the Convention and also that it shall be left to the option

of the individual minister as to his returning. 2—That we appoint a committee of three of our men to work out a standard of Ministerial Ethics. That this committee make a report at a meeting provided for in third recommendation. 3—That there be held annually a Ministerial meeting, just prior to our Annual Conference, beginning before next Conference at which, plans for the Conference and the good of the church may be discussed, so that we may in the future avoid such wranglings and disputings as we have formally experienced.
