

Reassembled at 1:00 o'clock. Special musical program arranged by Elder R. P. Harris. Quartette by Elder R. P. Harris, E. D. Griffin, Sisters Ethel Moye and Carlos Walston.

Devotional committee reports, Elder Charlie Hamliton open and Elder Paul Jenkins to preach at 2:30 at the stage.

The following officers were elected for the coming year; Moderator, Elder W. L. Hart, Assistant Moderatar—Elder R. P. Harris, Clerk—E. C. Hines—Assistant Clerk, Leo Tripp. Executive Board—Elder M. A. Woodard, Treasurer—Brother M. H. Whichard. General Board—Elder J. C. Moye. Ordaining Council—Elder M. E. Tyson.

On motion all members of all boards be elected for a period of two years. The Clerk was asked to send a word of greeting from the Conference to Elder E. T. Phillips. Elder Chester Pelt was asked to lead a special prayer in his behalf.

OBITUARIES

REV. ARTHUR LEE DAVIDSON

I wish to say in the beginning that I do not feel worthy to undertake to write the obituary of such a worthy minister as Brother Davidson, but being called on by the chairman of the Obituary Committee of the Central Conference I will proceed to do the best I can.

Brother Davidson was born on July 2, 1892, in Wilcox County, Georgia. In 1916 he was married to Miss Daisy Adams, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Adams of Cordelle, Georgia. To this union were born, and now survive the following sons and daughters: Mrs. F. A. Nobles of Greenville, N. C., Elbert, Myra Nell, Nada and William Franklin Davidson, all residing in Ayden, N. C. He is also survived by the following brothers: Rev. J. R. Davidson, Bryan, Texas, E. C. and Albert Davidson of Glennville, Georgia.

He was ordained as a minister of the Free Will Baptist Church in the year 1921 and served as pastor of several churches in the state of Georgia. In the year 1928 he moved to this state where he was actively engaged in pastoral work until his death, January 14, 1938, making his stay on earth 45 years, 5 months and 14 days.

At the time of his death he was pastor of the following churches: Hickory Grove and Elm Grove in Pitt County, Little Creek in Greene County, and Smiths New Home in Lenoir County.

REV. ROBERT FRANKLIN PITTMAN

The subject of this sketch was born December 18, 1883. He united with Pleasant Hill Free Will Baptist Church sometime during the summer of 1903. In a very short while after his conversion he felt divinely impressed to preach the gospel of Christ his Savior. In obedienece to that call, he was licensed to preach on September 18, 1904.

In the early part of his ministry Brother Pittman realized that the harvest was truly great but the qualified laborers were few. Seeing the urgent ueed of a better qualified ministry, he entered the Free Will Baptist Seminary at Ayden in the fall of 1905, and became a student under the teaching of Dr. Thomas E. Peden. On October 3, 1905 he was fully ordained to the public ministry of the gospel of Christ.

Brother Pittman made great and telling efforts to fit himself for the high and noble work to which he aspired, and which he finally achieved. He attended the Moody Bible Institute in Chicago. Later he taught in the Seminary at Ayden of which he was a former student.

On June 10, 1913, he was married to Miss Jimmie L. Davis of Ayden. To this union two sons were born who, with their mother, survive.

In the year 1927 Brother Pittman attended the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore, Maryland. He was pastor of the Ayden, Bethany and Sweet Gum Grove Churches from fifteen years to more than twenty years. He organized the Sweet Gum Grove Church, and led the way at Bethany and at Ayden in the construction of splendid, substantial brick churches.

As an outstanding revivalist, Rev. R. F. Pittman was known far and near. In song service he was greatly admired by those who heard him. On the Fourth Sunday in May, 1938, he preached his last sermon in the Ayden Church, which was the dedicatory sermon in the new brick building. On the First Sunday in June, 1938, he preached his last in this life in the Sweet Gum Grove Church. On July 15, 1938, death claimed him in the hospital in Kinston, N. C. In his death, our church has suffered an irreparable loss. He possessed a fine personality, and his place will be hard to fill. He was congenial and tolerant in his church relations, in his home and in the community in which he lived. His death brought to a close a noble, consecrated life, but he will continue to live and bear fruit in the lives of those with whom he lived and labored, and through those who heard his message in word and song. May his work tell on through the ages, and tell for the Lord!

May God's richest blessings rest upon his dear family, his relatives and friends! Let us all bow in humble submission to the will of Him who doeth all things well! "For we know that all things work together for good to them that love God." God will supply all our needs in Christ Jesus. May we look to Him for comfort and consolation!
