

The One Hundred and Ninety-First Annual Session of the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with Black Jack Church, Pitt County on November the 8-9-10, 1939.

Devotional services were conducted by Rev. D. W. Alexander. Rev. W. L. Hart, our moderator, being late, Rev. R. P. Harris had charge of the business for a while. Welcome address made by Rev. J. C. Griffin, Pastor of the local church. Response was by Rev. C. J. Harris.

On motion we dispense with the Ways and Means Committee.

Moderator, Rev. W. L. Hart, made a splendid talk on building, stressing the truth that character is the one thing we should be more interested in building.

Rev. H. E. Rogers of the Baptist faith said he was pleased to be present and very much impressed by our methods of work.

On motion that we send a delegate to the State Meeting of the Christian Church and ask the State Association to endorse this delegate and that we pay his expenses to same.

Rev. J. C. Moye is the delegate, with M. E. Tyson alternate. The eleven o'clock sermon was opened by Rev. M. E. Tyson. Preaching was by J. C. Moye. Text: Isaiah 1 and 3. Subject: God complaining with his people. Prayer by Rev. W. L. Jernigan.

Special music by Sister Ethel Moye and dedicated to Rev. D. W. Alexander's grandmother. Elder J. C. Griffin made a few remarks relative to the dinner, insuring each one a hearty welcome. Dismissed for lunch by Rev. Levi Humbles.

Reassembled at one fifteen. Devotion by Rev. W. L. Jernigan. Prayer by Rev. W. B. Nobles. The following ministers were present: D. M. Ratcliff, C. J. Harris, D. A. Windham, J. C. Moye, D W. On motion a committee was appointed to investigate the new Treatise and report to the conference, and Elders D. W. Alexander, M. E. Tyson and C. J. Harris were the committee.

On motion we rescind the resolution relative to the ministers making reports. Special music by quartette as follows: Elders R. P. Harris, C. H. Denton, M. E. Tyson and Sister Ethel Moye. Rev. Chester Pelt being absent, Rev. J. P. Barrow brought us a splendid message on "Catching the Missionary Spirit."

Devotional Committee reports, Rev. W. L. Jernigan preach tonight. Dismissed by Rev. C. H. Denton.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

Reassembled at 9:30. Devotions conducted by Rev. J. P. Barrow. Prayer by Rev. A. C. Austin. Special music by Rev. R. P. Harris and Sister Elma Hines Beddard.

Rev. R. B. Spencer spoke concerning the Baptist paper. At this time all visitors and delegates were recognized and given a chance to speak and the following made a few remarks expressing pleasure in being with us: Brother W. A. Jackson, Elds. Duffy Toler, J. R. Bennett, N. D. Wiggs, L. H. Wetherington, S. A. Smith, A. C. Austin, A. R. Brothers, G. W. Davis, H. E. Rogers, E. B. Joyner, W. L. Moretz, J. R. Forrest, James Evans, M. E. Godwin, and C. B. Thompson.

On motion we receive R. B. Spencer as a member of our conference and his name be inserted on our roll of ministers, he coming to us from the Cape Fear Association.

On motion Rev. L. S. Tyson be excommunicated for departing from our Faith.

There was a splendid program rendered by the young people of the local church emphasizing the need of the country church and the country preacher. Prayer by Rev. C. B. Thompson. Sermon by Rev. M. E. Tyson. Text: Nehemiah 4:6. Subject, A Mind to Work. Rev. M. E. Tyson made a splendid report about the orphanage work after which there was an offering taken for same amounting to \$115.46. Dismissed for dinner by Rev. R. H. Mason.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Reassembled at 1:30. Devotional service by Rev. N. B. Barrow. Prayer by Rev. D. A. Windham. Special music by Sister Ethel Moye. Rev. D. M. Ratcliff offered a special prayer for Rev. S. H. Styron. Rev. D. W. Alexander stated that he could not go to the National Association on account of them advancing the time. Rev. J. E. Wooten, delegate to the French Broad Association, stated that he went and was very much impressed with the way they carried on the work.

An offering was taken for Rev. S. H. Styron amounting to \$38.84. Rev. J. C. Moye made a very earnest appeal in behalf of the orphanage. Rev. M. E. Tyson made a report of his visit to the National Association, saying that they had a wonderful time and that there was a great deal of enthusiasm manifested. On motion we pay to Rev. M. E. Tyson \$5.00 which he pledged to the Association from this conference. Rev. M. Joyner stated he did not go to the Rock Fish Association.

Rev. C. J. Harris said he went to the Eastern Association and enjoyed it very much.

Rev. W. L. Jernigan made a talk expressing himself, that from now on he is dedicating his entire life to the service.

On motion this conference goes on record as indorsing Rev. W. L. Jernigan as field Evangelist for the Central Conference of North Carolina and that we authorize the Mission Board to sponsor a campaign known as Home Mission funds of the Central Conference and that we ask for ten cents per member for this work.

On motion we accept the resignation of Rev. W. L. Jernigan from the Mission Board and Rev. D. W. Alexander was elected instead.

On motion the Orphanage report be adopted. Also, the report on Temperance and of the Ordaining Council.

On motion we pay to Rev. J. E. Wooten \$9.00 for expenses to the French Broad Association.

On motion we launch an educational campaign, beginning January 1, 1940 and lasting through February, asking for 15 cents per member.

On motion we send a telegram to Rev. W. T. Pollard and that we appropriate \$10.00 to him. On motion we send Rev. S. H. Styron a nice letter, insuring him of our sympathy.

Petitions were taken for the next conference. After discussion it was voted to go to Antioch, Wayne County and Rev. C. J. Harris is to preach the Introductory sermon and Rev. D. W. Alexander to be alternate. Conference adjourned till 9:30 tomorrow morning.

Foreign Mission: Brothers Levi Hill, W. M. Hardison, Levi Humbles. On motion we rescind the motion to conform to the National Association till after the Committee acts on the Treatise.

On motion Treasurer be empowered to pay for telegram sent to Rev. W. T. Pollard.

On motion we accept the report of the Woman's Auxiliary Work.

On motion Rev. W. A. Dail be elected Treasurer of the Superannuation Board. We had special music by the Greenville male quartette. The eleven o'clock sermon was preached by Rev. C. J. Harris from 2 Timothy 4:6. Dismissed by Rev. A. R. Brothers.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Special music arranged by D. A. Windham. Moderator appointed Bro. W. F. Owens on the finance committee in place of Rev. W. G. Ennis and Rev. M. Joyner in place of Rev. R. P. Harris.

On motion we pay to the F. W. B. Press \$2.25 for registration cards.

Rev. L. H. Wetherington made a very interesting talk in the interest of the Free Will Baptist Press.

On motion, if it is deemed wise, the Ordaining Council has the privilege of Ordaining Brother H. E. Rogers.

Rev. James Evans spoke concerning the Pittman Memorial Institute.

We the Orphanage committee wish to make the following recommendations:

First, That our people co-operate with and support our Orphanage Board of Directors and as much as lieth within us give of our finance to aid in the progress of the Institution.

Second, That we encourage our Superintendent in every way possible.

Third, Knowing the great need of a new building, we encourage our people to sacrifice and give for that purpose in order to make possible the completion of the building project as agitated a year ago.

Fourth, We recommend that each pastor to strive to raise at least \$.50 per member by February 1, 1940 as recommended by the Orphanage Board.

Temperance Resolutions-

In as much as drunkenness and immoral practices and other forms of intemperance are harmful to both the individual who indulges and to others whose lives the indulger may contact or influence.

Therefore, be it Resolved, by this Conference now in session at Black Jack Church, Pitt County:

- (1) That the body ask and urge its ministry to endeavor to adhere strictly to the New Testament teaching in regards to all forms of conduct that have to do with temperance, in both private and public conduct and teaching.
- (2) That the same urge be made upon all laymen as is made upon the ministers.
- (3) That all local churches belonging to this body be urged to exercise vigilance over its members in this respect, whether they be ministers or laymen, and use such disciplinary measures against offenders as the teaching of the New Testament warrants.
- (4) That the body condemn, in the Christian spirit, and use its influence against all places, public or private, which promote intemperance, or tend to lower the moral standards of society.
