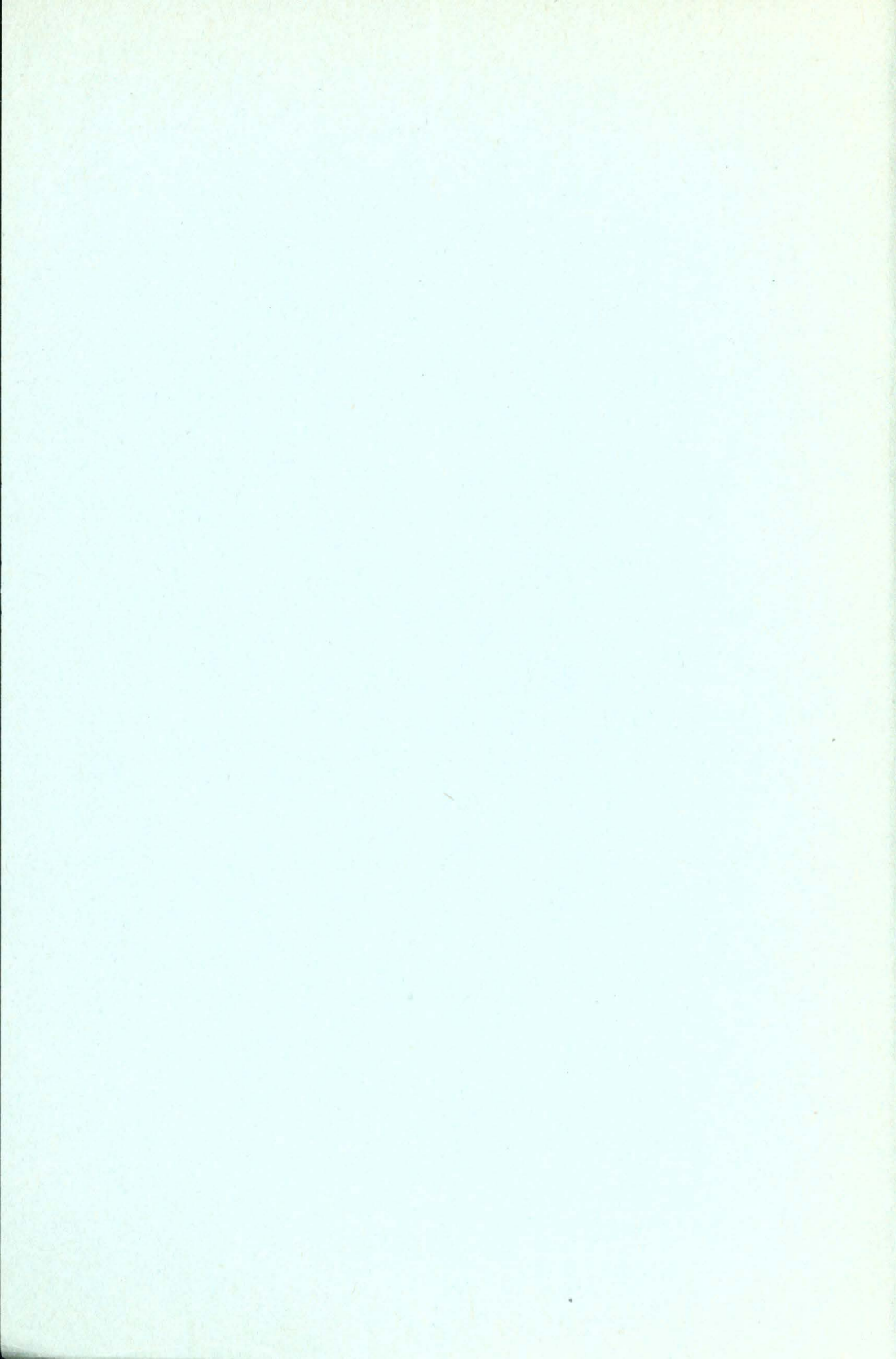

The One Hundred and Ninety-Second Annual Session of the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina convened with Antioch Church, Wayne County on November the 6-8, 1940.

Devotional services were conducted by Elds. D. W. Alexander and W. B. Nobles. The welcome address by Eld. W. L. Hart, conference host. Response by Eld. D. W. Alexander. Eld. W. L. Hart made a splendid talk on a four-fold challenge to our church.

The introductory sermon was preached by Eld. C. J. Harris, using for a text 1st Cor. 15: 1. The Devotional Committee was appointed as follows: Bro. Barney Kirby, Sisters Nora and Luby Edmondson.

On motion we accept the resignation of Eld. Levy Humbles on the Foreign Mission Board.

On motion we accept Eld L. E. Ballard as a member of this Conference from the French Broad Association.

Dismissed for dinner by Eld. J. P. Barrow.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Wooten, W. A. Dail, R. H. Mason, L. W. Humbles, R. P. Harris, N. D. Beaman, D. A. Windham and Bro. C. K. Dunn, Sr. of the Free Will Baptist Press.

Eld. R. P. Harris and several others entered into a round table discussion for the good of the conference. Eld. R. P. Harris is to preach tonight at 7:30 o'clock. Dismissed by Eld. P. C. Wiggs.

THURSDAY MORNING

Reassembled at 9:30 o'clock. Devotions by Eld. R. P. Harris. Prayer by Eld. J. C. Griffin. Special music by Rev. R. P. Harris and Sister Elma Hines Beddard.

A Resolution committee was appointed as follows: Elds. L. B. Manning, M. E. Tyson and P. C. Wiggs.

On motion Elds. D. W. Alexander and M. A. Woodard were asked to conduct a short memorial service for all members having died during the year.

Eld. M. E. Tyson made a few remarks about the condition of Rev. N. D. Wiggs, after which an offering was taken for him, amounting to \$35.00. Eld. L. E. Ballard made a special prayer in behalf of Rev. N. D. Wiggs.

Bro. C. K. Dunn, Sr. made a good talk about the F. W. B. paper and the Press in general.

Eld. J. C. Griffin preached to a large crowd on the outside of the church at 10:30. At the close of his service, Eld. D. A. Windham preached to a crowded house on the subject "The Bible and Its Attempted Mutilations."

Dismissed for dinner by Bro. E. D. Griffin.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Reassembled at 1:30 o'clock. Devotions by Eld. L. H. Wetherington. Orphanage address by Eld. James A. Evans, followed by special music, a trio of Orphanage girls and Rev. M. E. Tyson.

On motion we accept the letter of Eld. C. B. Thompson of the Cape Fear Association to become a member of this Conference.

On motion we retain the same committee on the new Treatise until they see fit to report.

Special music by quartette composed of Elds. R. P. Harris, N. D. Beaman, M. E. Tyson and Bro. Jimmie Barber.

Eld. J. C. Moye was appointed to prepare a budget for the churches of the Central conference and submit it to the same, which was accepted.

Eld. L. B. Manning is to preach tonight at 7:30 o'clock. Dismissed by Eld. L. E. Ballard.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

Reassembled at 9:30 o'clock. Devotions by Eld. N. D. Beaman. Prayer by Eld. J. E. Wooten. Eld. R. P. Harris, delegate to the Eastern Association stated that he attended and that they had a very enjoyable session. Eld. Levy Humbles stated that he was unable to attend the Western Association. Eld. R. P. Harris stated that he was unable to attend the French Broad Association, also Eld. M. A. Woodard stated the same relative to the Rock Fish Association.

Bro. Levi Hill made the following Foreign Mission report. Received \$106.39, paid out \$106.39. The report was accepted.

Bro. Levi Hill, chairman of the Board of Education, stated we had one meeting, but that nothing definite has been done, and they are urging the Ministers to support the Minister's Institute until something definite is started.

Bro. Levi Hill, our representative to the Press, stated that we have 173 shares in the same.

Moderator appointed Elds. L. B. Manning and P. C. Wiggs and Bro. N. A. Clark to fill places vacant on the committees.

Eld. D. W. Alexander being called away on account of death, Eld. J. H. Worley was asked to preach at 11:45. His text being Luke 9: 29.

Special music by Eld. R. P. Harris and Sister Ethel Moye.

On motion the account due the Press of \$1.50 for cards be paid.

On motion the clerk is to send a letter to Sister Pittman who is ill in the hospital, also that we take an offering for her. The offering amounted to \$9.47.

Dismissed for dinner by Eld. T. E. Beaman.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Reassembled at 1:00 o'clock. Devotions were held by Eld. R. P. Harris. Prayer by Eld. C. J. Harris.

On motion we give space in our minutes for a report of the Conference Sunday School Convention.

On motion we give a rising vote of thanks to this church for the fine way they have cared for the Conference especially for preparing ushers, amplifiers, and electric pump for our comfort.
