

REPORT ON TEMPERANCE

We, your Committee on Temperance, beg to submit the following report: Through observation and the unmistakable evidences which speak in condemning terms of the liquor business, it is our belief that legalized control of the manufacture and sale of intoxicating beverages is worse than a failure; it is a tragedy enacted upon society. Various methods of control have proven insufficient to solve the liquor problem in a satisfactory way. Legislative bodies have never been able to rid the land of the evil. There is only one safe way for the individual; that is total abstinence. Therefore, we recommend

1. That this Conference now in session urge its members to refrain

from using or handling, in any way whatsoever, alcoholic beverages as such.

2. That this body urge the local churches which are members of the body to use such disciplinary measures as are justified by reason and New Testament teaching in dealing with members who are known to be guilty of violating these resolutions; and further, that this body sustain and uphold the local churches in following the injunctions herein set forth.

That this Conference now in session at Bethany Church, November 5, 1942, urge every person who is a member of the body, directly or indirectly, to discourage the use of intoxicants, wherever and whenever possible. This is intended to include balloting against legalized manufacture and sale

of all intoxicating liquors, when the opportunity to do so arises.

4. We further recommend that this body join all the people of God everywhere in prayer that the evil may be checked. Moses interceded for Israel and God heard him. He will hear the earnest prayer of His people today.
