We had short talks by all the visiting ministers.

Bro. Jesse Gay was asked to serve on the Finance Committee.

Rev. J. R. Davidson made a fine talk about the Bible School in Nashville, Tenn.

By motion we accepted the program of the Educational Board.

Rev. J. E. Wooten offered his resignation on the Ordaining Council, but it was tabled.

By motion the account of \$2.50 for programs was paid, and Clerk is to have 500 printed each year.

The Orphanage report was accepted. (See Report.)

Rev. J. A. Evans made an extremely good report about the Orphanage. Rev. J. C. Moye continued the Orphanage report, showing what Our Conference had done for it during the past year. An offering was taken for the Orphanage, amount \$201.01.

We; your Committée on Education, beg to report:

There was turned over to us at last Conference \$116.74. We contacted Rev. L. R. Ennis, President of our Bible College, as to what students from our Conference were in need of funds, and he informed us that Miss Etheridge would need at least fifty dollars to complete the year and to graduate and we placed the amount to her credit, which she expressed thanks to this Conference. This leaves in our hands \$66.74.

We have held three Bible Institutes, two in Greenville, and one at Reedy Branch, at which we studied Christian Baptism, The Lord's Supper and regeneration, respectively.

For the lack of interest we decided the effort not justified and discontinued.
