The North Carolina Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina convened its Two Hundredth Anniversary session with Saints Delight Church at Ormondsville, Greene County, November 10th and 11th, 1948.

Devotions were led by Rev. Ralph Osborne. Prayer by Rev. C. L. Patrick. The welcome address was delivered by Rev. D. W. Alexander and the response by Rev. W. B. Nobles.

The Moderator's message was delivered by Rev. N. D. Beaman.

All ministers and delegates were asked to sit with us in this Conference.

A motion was made and carried that we accept the minutes of the Executive Board.

A motion was made and carried that we appoint a committee of three to investigate Dewie Tyson and other inactive ministers on our roll of ministers. The committee was Revs. D. W. Alexander, L. B. Manning and C. J. Harris.

The committee appointed to recommend qualifications for prospective licentiates made the following report. (See report.)

On motion the report was adopted.

The introductory message was delivered by Rev. D. A. Windham. Special music was rendered by the Spring Branch Quartet.

Dismissed for lunch by Rev. W. A. Dail.

Wednesday Afternoon

The Conference re-assembled at one-fifteen with devotions and song service by J. Albert Harris. Prayer by D. W. Alexander.

Special music was offered by Rev. J. Albert Harris and the Spring Branch Quartet.

Motion was made and carried that we give Bro. James A. Evans a rising vote of thanks for his splendid work at the Orphanage for the past years as Superintendent.

The Ordaining Council reported that they had ordained Rev. Ralph Osborne, and recommended that his name be added to the list of ministers. By motion the report was adopted.

A motion was made and carried that all officers, standing boards and committees be allowed five cents per mile both ways for special services of the conference, beginning with the 1947 session.

A motion was made and carried that we receive the report of Rev. D. W. Alexander pertaining to his work on the Revised Treatise.

The Moderator presented a bill for five dollars and fifty cents for Registration cards and envelopes which was referred to the finance committee.

Rev. D. W. Alexander presented a bill for ten dollars for flowers for Rev. L. W. Humbles and Rev. L. W. Weathington (deceased). This bill was also turned over to the finance committee.

On motion business was suspended for two minutes in silent prayer in memory of Rev. L. W. Humbles and Rev. L. W. Weathington (deceased). The prayer was concluded by Rev. Loy E. Ballard.

The music during the day was under the direction of Rev. R. N. Hinnant and Rev. J. Albert Harris.

There being nothing further we recessed until nine o'clock Thursday morning.

Thursday Morning

The North Carolina Central Conference re-assembled at nine o'clock Thursday morning, November 11, 1948.

The devotions were conducted by Rev. C. D. Hamilton. Prayer by Rev. R. N. Hinnant.

Minutes of yesterdays activities were read and approved.

Motion was made and carried that we accept Rev. R. B. Crawford as a member of this conference subject to his letter of recommendation from his conference. His name was to be added to the roll of ministers.

Motion was made and carried that we rescind the motion passed last year relative to the ministers paying ten dollars each for superannuation.

On motion that we take an offering for the purpose of helping purchase

a car for Miss Laura Belle Barnard, and the Missionaries in India. The offering amounted to eighty-three dollars and twenty-six cents.

The report of the Educational Committee was given by Rev. D. A. Windham, and the report was adopted. (See report.)

Rev. L. B. Manning gave a temperance report and by motion the report was accepted. (See Report.)

Rev. James A. Evans and the Orphanage Committee gave a brief report of the activities of the Orphanage. The committee recommended that we pledge ourselves to raise twelve thousand dollars which is the amount allocated the Central Conference. They also recommended that we take an offering and invited the public to visit the Orphanage Thanksgiving. They also asked that we pledge our support to the Board of Trustees and to the home.

On motion the report was adopted.

A collection was taken for the Orphanage amounting to eighty-one dollars and twenty-nine cents.

The speakers for the anniversary hour were introduced by Rev. D. W. Alexander. Rev. T. E. Beaman gave a historical narrative of the Free Will Baptist and the Central Conference.

Rev. L. R. Emis then delivered the anniversary message using as his subject, "The Church a Building and Temple of God."

The Memorial Program honoring those who have died since last Conference was conducted by Rev. D. A. Windham. Bro. Windham was assisted by a quartet composed of the Moye sisters, L. R. Ennis and R. N. Hinnant.

We were dismissed for lunch by Rev. J. W. Alford.

Thursday Afternoon

Re-assembled at one-fifteen with devotions and song service by Rev. L. R. Ennis. Prayer by Rev. Loy E. Ballard. Special music was rendered by little Miss Clark and a duet by the Moye sisters.

R. B. Spencer, Clarence Little, P. C. Wiggs and Ralph Osborne were appointed on the Finance Committee in the place of those absent.

Mrs. R. B. Spencer spoke in the interest of Cragmont and a motion was made and carried that we ask the Finance Committee to make an appropriation for this worthy cause.

Free Union in Greene County asked for the Conference for another year and it was unanimously voted to go there.

A motion was made and carried that we take an offering to show our appreciation to Mr. Ansley for the use of the amplifying system during the

conference and that we appoint a committee of three to investigate the purchase of a system for the Conference.

The committee was N. D. Beaman, D. W. Alexander and D. A. Windham. The offering was \$22.40.

Rev. R. N. Hinnant, L. R. Ennis and the Moye sisters rendered us a quartet.

The delegates from Free Union reported that Rev. R. B. Crawford preach the introductory sermon, Rev. James A. Evans to preach in his absence.

Motion was made and carried that we ask Rev. T. E. Beaman to send a copy of the historical narrative of the address made this morning to the Free Will Baptist Press for publication.

The Finance Committee's report was given and accepted. (See report.) The officers for the next two years were elected. (See list.)

On motor the conference send Ten Dollars to the State Convention.

COMMITTEE TO RECOMMEND QUALIFICATIONS OF PROSPECTIVE LICENTIATES

We, your Committee, appointed to recommend qualifications for Prospective Licentiates, make the following report:

- 1. That all applying to any of our churches for license to preach the Gospel, shall be able to read with a reasonable degree of accuracy.
 - 2. That he be able to use fairly creditable English.
- 3. That he be able to speak with a reasonable degree of fluency, emphasis, and expression.

In order to determine the foregoing qualifications, the pastor shall call into consultation, two other ministers, one to be a member of the Ordaining Council, and if in their judgment, he is qualified, the church may grant him a license.

And if in their judgment, he is unqualified to be licensed to preach, the church may grant him a letter of endorsement, that he may exort and engage in such religious activities, as an interested and consecrated lavman would feel moved to do.

All outstanding license are to be renewed under the foregoing requirements.

RESOLUTIONS FOR REV. L. W. WETHERINGTON

Rev. Lewis William Wetherington was born in Craven County, N. C., in A. D. 1869, the son of Abner and Penny Wetherington.

He was ordained to preach the gospel in early life by the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist.

In 1913 he came into the Central Conference. He served as pastor of a number of churches. He was first married to Miss Priscilla Vaniford in 1896. She died in 1907. Surviving this union is a daughter, Mrs. Henry Whitehurst of Stokes, N. C.

In 1908 he married Miss Massy Jackson of Pitt County. She died in 1923. Surviving this union are two sons and two daughters: Lewis Wetherington of Farmville, N. C., Glen, Perlie, and Queenie Wetherington of the home.

In 1926 he married Mrs. Myrtle Tripp of Vanceboro, N. C., who also survives him with a number of grandchildren and great-grandchildren, also a foster daughter, Mrs. Dora Bryant of Stokes, N. C.

Elder Wetherington died Feb. 4, 1948, age 79 years, 6 months, and 22 days.

His funeral was conducted by his pastor, Rev. D. W. Alexander, assisted by Rev. C. J. Harris.

We, your committee, find ourselves unable to pay fitting tribute to our departed brother, Rev. L. W. C., and he was assisted in the service by the Rev. Key Taylor, pastor of the Methodist Church in Walstonburg, N. C.

Brother Humbles was always active in prayer meetings, Sunday School, and all other church meetings. It can be said that he did his best.

He never made a fortune or noise in the world where men are seeking fame. But his mind and soul was rich in heavenly gain.

We consider both life and death a mystery but after all, as a man has lived and has died, that is what counts. Of Rev. L. W. Humbles we may always truly say that he played his part in the use of his talents in the world of men.
