

PROCEEDINGS

The North Carolina Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina convened its two hundredth first session with Free Union Church, Greene County, November 9th and 10th, 1949.

Devotions and prayer by Rev. W. L. Hart.

The welcome adress was delivered by Rev. N. D. Beaman and the response by Mrs. W. E. Gibson.

The Moderator's message was delivered by Rev. D. W. Alexander.

On motion all visiting Ministers and Brethren were asked to sit with us in this Conference.

By motion we accepted the minutes of the Executive Board.

A card of thanks was read from the family of J. P. Woodard. Rev. C. L. Patrick was elected as assistant moderator, Rev. N. D. Beaman was elected to serve on the ordaining council.

Rev. N. D. Beaman gave a report concerning the purchase of an amplifying system for this Conference and a motion was passed that the committee was asked to purchase such a system as they see fit.

A letter was read from Rev. Dewey Tyson asking that his name be dropped from the roll of Ministers and by motion the request was granted.

A motion was made and carried that the officers of the conference issue a statement if necessary asking the bank to turn over the funds of the Educational Committee to the conference treasurer as the committee treasurer was not physically able to write checks and transact business.

Memorial Tributes was conducted by Rev. D. A. Windham assisted by the local choir and Rev. M. L. Johnson.
