

PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday Morning

The North Carolina Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened it's two hundred second session with Reedy Branch Church, Pitt County, November 8th. and 9th., 1950.

Devotions and prayer was led by Rev. Clarence Little.

The welcome address was delivered by the pastor of the local church, Rev. David W. Hansley, and the response by Mrs. Thomas Tyndall.

The Moderators message was delivered by Rev. D. W. Alexander.

On motion all visiting Ministers and Brethren were asked to sit with us in this conference.

By motion we accept the minutes of the Executive Board.

Rev. C. J. Harris was elected as Temporary Treasurer of the Conference to fill the unexpired term of M. H. Whichard.

The Committee appointed to purchase an amplifying set for the conference reported that they had made the purchase at a cost of eighty two dollars fifty two cents. As only seventy five dollars was allowed at the last conference it left a balance due of seven dollars fifty two cents. By a motion this amount was allowed. The Board of Trustees was asked to take care of the Amplifying set. The following committees were appointed.

Rev. Loy E. Ballard gave a report of the Ministers Meeting in Ayden on November 6, 1950. See Report.

On motion we endorse the proposed North Carolina Treatise as handed down to the Conferences and associations by the State Convention, and we recommend its adoption by the Central Conference. The Motion was adopted.

On Motion we petition the Central Conference to ask the North Carolina State Convention of Free Will Baptist to appoint a committee to draw up a uniform questionnaire for the examination of all candidates for ordination to the ministry in this State; the same to be passed on to all Ordaining Councils of the Conferences and Associations of the State with the request that they use it in their examination of candidates of the ministry, so that we will be more unified in qualifications for the ministry.

The above motion was adopted.

Rev. L. C. Johnson made a few remarks concerning the Free Will Baptist Bible College.

After a congregational hymn Rev. N. D. Beaman delivered the Introductory sermon. His subject was, "I will build my Church upon the Foundations of the Apostles and Prophets."

Rev. D. A. Windham, assisted by others, conducted a very impressive memorial service remembering all those who have died since last conference.

Dismissed for lunch by Rev. L. C. Johnson.

Wednesday Afternoon

The Conference re-assembled at one thirty with devotions and song service by Rev. N. Bruce Barrow. Special music by a mixed Quartet composed of Mrs. J. T. Beddard, Mrs. Guy Corbett, Mr. J. R. Shearin and Mr. Rufus Beaman. With J. Albert Harris at the Organ.

By a motion the Reading in the Memorial Tributes be printed in the minutes as an Obituary report. See report.

The Report of the ordaining council was given by Rev. D. W. Alexander stating that Rev. Clarence Little and Rev. David Wooten had been ordained and they recommended that their names be placed on the list of Ordained Ministers. By a motion the report was adopted.

Rev. J. C. Griffin made a few remarks in the interest of missions. Rev. Rashie Kennedy, Chairman of the Foreign Mission Board also spoke in the interest of missions.

Rev. J. W. Alford, State Mission Treasurer, made a few remarks on mission work.

Rev. J. Albert Harris asked for a letter of recommendation from this conference to the Albemarle Conference, and by a motion the letter was granted.

By a motion Rev. D. W. Alexander was asked to purchase additional cable for the amplifying set.

Rev. D. W. Hansley, the State Educational Treasurer, made a few remarks about the College Building Program.

Dismissed by Rev. J. C. Griffin.

Thursday Morning

The North Carolina Central Conference re-assembled at nine thirty o'clock Thursday morning, November 9th, 1950.

The devotions were conducted by Rev. Ralph Osborne. Prayer by Rev. D. A. Windham.

Minutes of yesterdays activities were read and approved.

Brother C. K. Dunn, business manager of the press gave a verbal report of the activities of the Press and by motion the report was received for information.

Rev. C. L. Patrick presented a Temperance resolution which was adopted by the Conference. (see Resolution)

On Motion we send Rev. C. L. Patrick to the state legislature to use his influence in some legislation against the liquor traffic and the Conference is to bear his expenses.

The Superintendent of the Orphanage gave a report of the activities at the Orphanage. By a motion this report was received as information.

An offering was taken for the Orphanage amounting to one hundred eighty dollars thirty four cents.

Special music was rendered by the local Church. Miss Ruth Little sang, "I am Satisfied," and she also rendered an Organ Solo.

Rev. L. B. Manning brought the Convention Sermon using as his text Exodus 14:15.

Dismissed for lunch by Rev. L. R. Ennis.

Thursday Afternoon

Re-assembled at one fifteen with devotions and prayer by Rex. C. J. Harris.

A request for prayer for a sick lady who was on her way to the Hospital. This prayer was offered by Rev. D. W. Alexander.

As there was only one petition for the next Conference it was unanimously voted to hold the nineteen hundred fifty one session with Rose Hill Church (Pitt County). Rev. M. L. Johnson was asked to preach the introductory sermon.

On motion we elect Rev. David W. Hansley as Publicity director of this Conference.

Rev. N. Bruce Barrow has returned from Texas and a motion was made and duly carried that we restore him to this Conference subject to his letter. (letter was received).

The report of the Orphanage Committee was given by Rev. R. B. Crawford and by a motion we adopted the report.

A joint offering was taken for Rev. Leroy Forlines and Rev. David Wooten, (ministerial students) amounting to ninety eight dollars twenty eight cents.

On motion Rev. C. T. Pugh be contacted by the Ordaining Council and whatever decision they make as it effects the Conference be final.

On motion the identification cards be given only to the ministers present or writes for them. If he fails to get his card for a period of three years that his name be dropped from the list of Ministers.

A rising vote of thanks was given to Reedy Branch Church, its Pastor and all those that had a part in making the Conference a success.

On motion we extend a rising vote of thanks to the officers of this Conference.

The Finance Committee gave their report and by a motion the report was adopted.

On motion the new Moderator present the matter pertaining to the Ministers Ordination to the State Convention.

On motion we have two members to represent the stock in the Press instead of one.

The officers of the Conference were elected. (see list)

The appointment of delegates to the various bodies was left in the hands of the Executive Committee.

Conference was dismissed by Rev. J. B. Narron.
